C. Faculty Committees

3. Staff Development and Continuing Education Committee

The Staff Development and Continuing Education Committee shall develop programs or make recommendations to enable the Library system to most effectively use its personnel and resources to fulfill Library functions in University academic programs and to assist in the development of enrichment programs for faculty and staff. It shall also identify study, and recommend continuing education activities for Library personnel. These may include cooperative efforts with other Kentucky libraries and with the College of Library and Information Science. The chair of the Staff Development and

Continuing Education Committee shall serve as Library representative on the Continuing Education Advisory Committee of the College of Library and Information Science.

Toni Powell will serve as moderator at the session on International Cooperation to Improve Agricultural and Rural Information Services at the annual ASIS meeting in Las Vegas this coming October.
