



Long lines likely to meet students needing IDs

Meals, tickets, other University functions require new card

Students who do not have the new UK ID can expect long lines when school starts. Although about 17,000 IDs have been issued already, UK officials are expecting at least 800 to 1,000 students to wait in lines the first week of school.

Rhonda Strouse, assistant director of student activities, said the majority of incoming students have IDs, but many returning

students failed to have theirs made in the spring.

Bryan Conder, a student worker at the ID, said 50 to 100 people a day have had new IDs made this summer.

"During freshman orientation they come in groups of 300 to 400," Conder said. "The beginning of fall will be real busy."

Students may wait less if they visit the ID offices early in the morning, said Frank Harris, director of the Student Center.

Many students like Jessica Kawaja, an undeclared sophomore, say they haven't had time to get a new ID made. But students without the ID will find it difficult to function at the University.

For example, University Food Services will require students to have the new card to use their meal plans.

"In the beginning, to insure that every student has access to the Vend-Plus and for meals, the old card will be accepted," said Carol Raitz, Acting Director of Food Services. "(But) only for a few days."

To obtain football tickets to the UK/Louisville game, students must also use the new ID. Ticket officials will swipe the card through a "reader" which will indicate whether or not the ID is valid.

The new ID will also replace other cards, including: library card, health service card, student activities card and copy card. The ID will also be needed to enter some residence halls.

Strouse said more terminals and workers have been added to the ID sites at both UK and Lexington Community College.

The new card does not require a valida-

tion sticker. For students this means no more waiting in line at Student Billings. When the University receives payment on the student's tuition, the ID is automatically activated.

The new ID may also make going to the Health Clinic less of a hassle. A student only has to show the new ID instead of both the health service card and a validated ID.

The ID has been in the planning stages for two years, said Robert Hemenway, chancellor for the Lexington Campus. He said it's a good example of how the University focuses on student concerns.

"As a large University, everyday we should think how to serve the students better," Hemenway said.

Phone registration problems erased

The day-long busy signals, 10-minute holds for no reason and borderline chaos during phone registration last year could be just a bad memory as Fall semester Add/Drop begins, a UK official says.

The wrinkles in the UK-VIP Network that annoyed about 3,000 students last fall were mostly solved in April, said Lisa Collins, assistant registrar for registration.

"We're not going to let this system crash and leave the students dangling," Collins said.

In fact, Collins said operators expect the only troubles students should have this fall are forgetting to press the # sign after each entry and remembering their four-digit Personal Access Codes.

"That would be quite a different story than when phone registration began last August. Some students waited all day for an open line into the phone system, and then experienced a myriad of problems once they got through."

Collins said she heard numerous complaints from students such as Chris Kozenski, then a chemical engineering freshman. As Kozenski tried to add a class, a voice prompt told him that class was unavailable and gave him a list of alternative courses. The class he

originally tried to add was among the system's suggestions.

Another student, biology freshman Juva Sizemore, said she heard a "beep, beep" signal the first time she called.

"So I hung up and called back," she said, "and the voice said there was an unexpected error and gave me another number to call."

"I called that number, but it was always busy."

But it wasn't just the students who were surprised and annoyed with the glitches. Collins said her office was caught off guard, too.

"We didn't know what to expect," she said. "We really didn't know what (the system) was going to do to everyone."

By January's second semester Add/Drop deadlines, however, the network was more under control despite multiple ice storms push-

ing back final dates, she said.

"Even with the (weather) circumstances, registration went smoothly."

April's early registration period, however, was a "night and day situation" from the fall to the spring.

Collins said her office answered few complaints in the spring, and despite a few hours when the system became too busy to service all callers, the network was a success.

"April went beyond our wildest expectations," she said. "It was a success story."

The majority of students opted to use the phone registration system that month, Collins said.

There will be no physical registration sites for this semester's Add/Drop. Registration officials will be available for consultation this week at the Registration Center in 6 Funchouser Building.

"If students need help, we'll be there," Collins said. "But we're asking all students to add/drop over the telephone."

Officials will be set up terminals if students experience problems with phone registration.

Collins hopes the network permanently replaces terminal sites, because students don't have to face parking hassles, transportation problems and long lines. Also, she said, the network's hours—7 a.m. to 8 p.m. on weekdays and 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Saturdays—make registration available beyond normal office hours.

Already, some pockets of campus are fully committed to phone registration. Collins said, such as the College of Agriculture's 100 percent usage.

"We're still growing and expanding with what the system does," she said.

But the phone system has a few limitations it will probably never solve, such as preventing students from overlapping their courses and college advisers who use paper release permits from courses with specific restrictions.

A couple of tips she said could help this year are to start calling early in the morning and to keep calling if the line is busy on the first try.

UK lifts S. Africa boycott

A new political era in South Africa means UK will end its eight-year policy of not making investments in the country.

According to a Board of Trustees decision made in 1985, UK made it a policy not to deal with the country because of the state-imposed apartheid system.

However, at the ending of their first meeting of the 1994-95 school year on Tuesday, board members voted unanimously to rescind the policy because "the conditions that existed in 1985 have changed significantly," the proposal said.

That means UK financial planners have slightly more flexibility when they choose to invest in major American companies, said Henry Clay Owen, UK comptroller and treasurer.

"It simply adds more companies to the list," he said.

A national business index named only 53 major U.S. corporations that still have ties to the African nation in 1993, which is down from 166 companies in 1985.

Owen said the corporations represent various industries from pharmaceutical companies to major oil and gas producers.

South Africa held free elections this year, marking a change of its longstanding policy of apartheid against blacks.

In other action at Tuesday's meeting:

Board members approved the early resignation of Donald Clapp, former vice chancellor for administration. Clapp left his UK post to become chairman of Gov. Breton Jones' health policy board.

Two replacements will fill Clapp's position for at least a year. The board approved George DeBlin as the chief financial officer and Robert Lawson as chief administrative officer.

Richard E. Plymale was named general counsel by the board.

Plymale, a partner in the Lexington law firm of Brown, Todd and Heyburn, will be responsible for the management and oversight of legal affairs for UK, advising the president, administrators and trustees on legal matters.

Plymale previously served as assistant deputy attorney general for the Commonwealth of Kentucky and deputy federal defender for the Eastern District of Kentucky. He replaces the late John C. Darsie Jr. as UK's top legal adviser.

Michael Reed, professor of agricultural economics, was named director of the Office of International Affairs.

Susan Bordo and William Freehling were named co-holders of the Otis A. Singletary Chair in the Humanities.

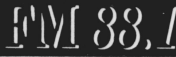

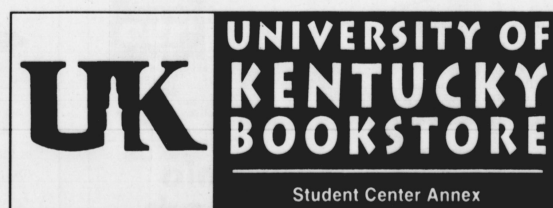

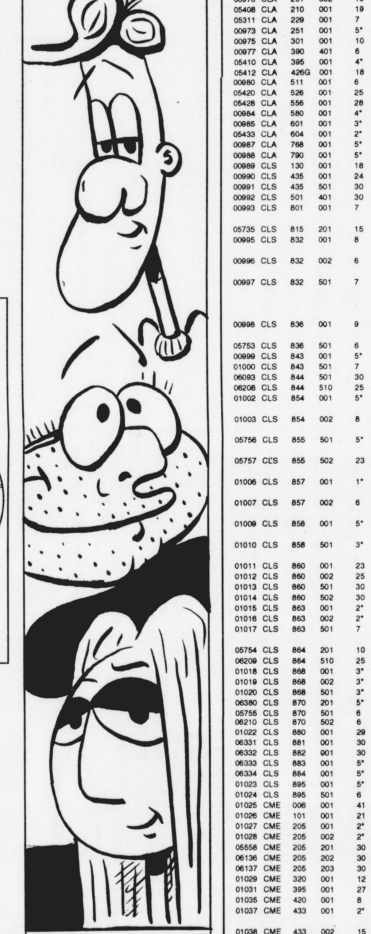

STUDENT GROUP HEALTH INSURANCE FALL 1994 ENROLLMENT

The Student Group Health Insurance Plan for 1994-95 continues with Mega Life and Health Insurance Company. Some changes have occurred and you are urged to review the information below to know how these changes may affect you.

Plan Benefits: This is a traditional insurance plan with two options. You may choose to use any doctor or facility that pay a deductible and co-payment (the plan pays 80%—the patient pays 20% up to a specified limit; then the plan pays 100% to the policy maximum). Or, you may choose to use the University of Kentucky Hospital and Kentucky Medical Services physicians as a Preferred Provider and receive the benefit of 100% payment for covered expenses after you have met the deductible, for inpatient care, and a 25% discount for outpatient care. Always read the "exclusions and limitations" of the policy so you are familiar with items not covered.

Major Medical coverage from \$50,000 to \$100,000 may be purchased for an additional premium. This extended benefit must be purchased when a student enrolls in the plan—it CANNOT be added after initial enrollment during a calendar year.

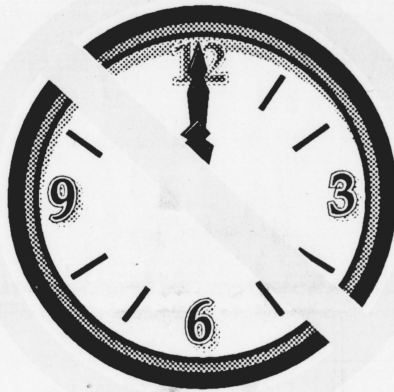

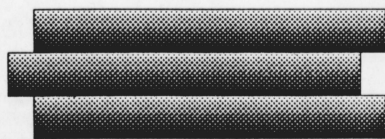

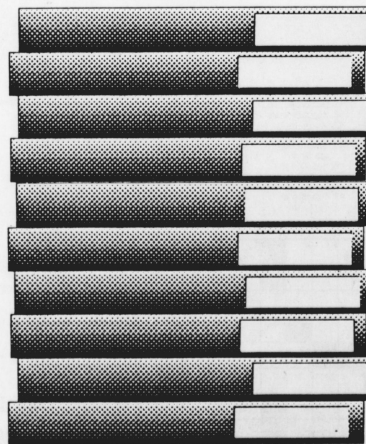

Curry, fans pumped over pigskin

UK fans are excited. Season ticket sales are at a record pace. Players are talking of post-season play and individual awards. Trash talk about a matchup with Louisville is flying.

But it's not even close to basketball season. This summer, the hype at UK has focused on backfields, not backcourts. That's because the Cats open their season with U of L on Sept. 3, the first time the in-state rivals have met on the gridiron in 70 years.

Fans are pumped over pigskin, and it seems roundball can wait — at least until October. And Bill Curry couldn't be happier about it.

"If you play (U of L) the first game of the year, from spring practice on, what are people going to be talking about?" the UK football coach said. "They're going to be talking about this game."

"And maybe that will get these kids around the state who have grown up saying, 'I'd love to play for the Wild-

cats in Rupp Arena or the Cardinals in Freedom Hall" to say, 'I really want to play in that game.'"

That growing interest is a major step, Curry says, in the uphill climb to build a winner at UK.

"When people around you are expecting you to win, you are more inclined to do what it takes to win," he said. "I've built expectations, I'll continue to build expectations, and eventually, we'll reach them."

This year, those expectations are somewhat higher than normal. UK is coming off its first bowl bid in nine seasons, and last year's 6-6 mark was the Cats' best under Curry.

This year, the team plays what Curry calls one of the toughest schedules in school history, with matchups against rivals Louisville and Indiana in addition to road games against three of last year's Top 10 schools — Florida, Auburn and Tennessee.

"It's fun to throw yourself up

against the best week after week after week and let the chips fall where they may," Curry said. "If you look at the whole thing with trepidation and say, 'Gee, what if we have a losing record, that's no fun. That's a bummer.'"

Curry is ignoring the possibility of a sub-.500 slate. Excitement is at an all-time high in his rebuilding process, and the fifth-year coach has no fear of a letdown.

"The University has made a commitment to football, in terms of dollars and support staff, like it's never made before — ever," Curry said. "And... (UK) has this fan base like I've never seen in my life for a program that hasn't been a championship program year in and year out."

"Those are tremendous advantages that we have. And that's why we'll make it."

Notes:

Some, if not most, of the UK players have been enjoying the lime-light football is receiving around the state. Damon Hood is certainly one of them.

Hood has noticed a major surge in fan interest this season.

"People can talk about something besides basketball recruiting," Hood said. "Our school is a basketball school, but now hopefully people will realize you don't have to come to Kentucky and shoot hoops. You can come see the football Cats play — and win."

Junior college transfer Daymon Carter didn't waste much time in getting himself noticed.

The day the highly-touted tailback arrived on campus, he announced that his goal is to win the Heisman Trophy.

"O.J. (Simpson) came from junior college and won it, I think I can, too," Carter said. "When I broke his records (at City College of San Francisco), I said, 'If he can do it, why can't I?'"

Carter, who said he'd like to rush for "at least 1,300 yards," didn't stop with personal goals.

"Hopefully, we can go 10-0," Carter said, apparently forgetting that, unlike in junior college, Division I schools play 11 games. "I've never been on a losing team before, so I want us to strive to get undefeated."

Gray leaves Cats again, won't return this time

For the better part of six months, Eric Gray and UK have been the Tom and Roseanne of college football.

And now, like the portly Hollywood pair, Gray and the Cats seem to have run into irreconcilable differences.

For the second time, the junior college quarterback has left the team — and this time it seems to be for good.

On Aug. 12 — just two days after returning to campus — Gray was gone. In a brief statement issued through the school's sports information department, Gray cited personal reasons for his latest split from UK.

A highly-regarded prospect from City College of San Francisco, Gray first came to UK in the spring late and overweight.

The 6-4, 220-pounder with a rifle arm showed flashes of brilliance during spring practice, but he missed part of the semester when he went home to Houston for the birth of his second child.

Gray announced his intentions to leave UK shortly after the spring semester, citing the need to be closer to his family.

Midway through the summer, though, the quarterback told Coach Bill Curry his departure from UK was part of, as Curry said, "a big misunderstanding."

Gray told Curry he planned to return to UK in the fall.

Though Gray's academic performance in the spring rendered him ineligible, he arrived in Lexington on Aug. 10 with the intention of spending a year on the scout team.

Gray's most recent departure from UK came as a surprise to his former coach, CCSF's George Rush.

"I haven't talked to Eric, so I don't have much knowledge of the situation," Rush said. "I don't know if he just decided to leave or if he was asked to go or what."

"I'm disappointed for him. He's a tremendous athletic talent, but apparently things just couldn't work out."

Carter still waiting to meet "Juice"

Daymon Carter's two seasons at City College of San Francisco were impressive from a numbers standpoint.

The halfback from Henderson, Ky., racked up 3,230 yards rushing on 377 carries. He averaged 161.5 yards per game and 8.6 yards per carry.

All those numbers were school records, all previously held by former CCSF standout O.J. Simpson. Carter said he admired Simpson, who goes on trial next month on charges that he killed his former wife and her friend.

Carter set a goal upon arriving at CCSF to shatter Simpson's records.

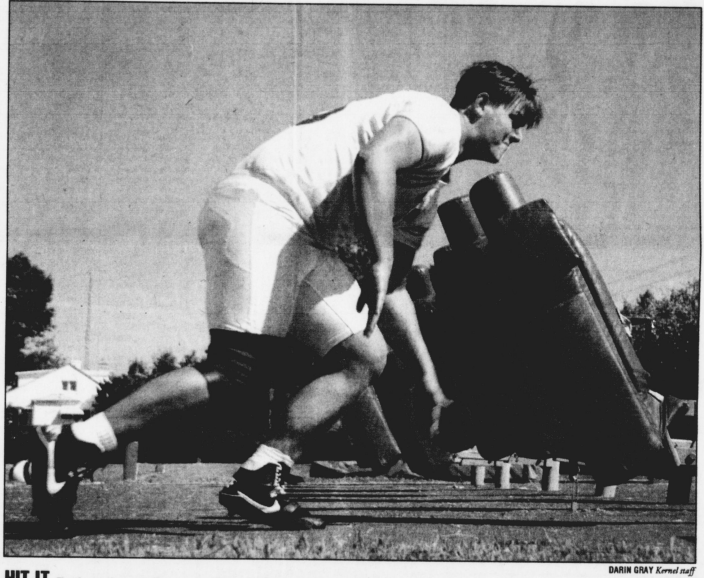
Before settling on UK, Carter even went on a recruiting visit to Southern California, where "the Juice" won the Heisman Trophy.

So did the CCSF record breakers get a chance to meet?

Janis, Jimi and Co. coming to UK Art Museum

Exhibit offers '60s rock stars' memorabilia

Those who didn't have the money to catch Woodstock '94 can get a taste of what the original event was like when the "We Saw the Music: Rock and Roll" photo exhibit comes to the UK Art Museum on Friday.

The exhibit will feature 70 photos of 1960s rock 'n' roll icons by Baron Wolman and Jim Marshall, who took pictures for Rolling Stone during the magazine's golden years. Memorabilia on display includes Jimi Hendrix' velvet jacket, Janis Joplin's Mexican-style shirt and Bob Dylan's acoustic guitar and harmonica.

The free exhibit will begin at 6 a.m. with a live broadcast by 98.1 FM — WKQQ. The exhibit will stay at UK until Oct. 23.

At the opening, viewers will be treated to music by the performers

immortalized in the exhibit's photographs and hear first-hand accounts of what it was like being with them, said museum director Harriet Fowler.

Nowadays, Fowler said, rock music photographers are considered "necessary parasites." But in the '60s, photographers were part of an "entourage" which traveled with the performers and took pictures of rock stars in more relaxed moments, even in their homes, she said.

"These photographers had a different role then," she said. "Photographers were in an inner circle and enjoyed a privileged position."

The travelling exhibit opened at the Tampa Museum of Art in March 1993. Museum registrar Kay Morris said the popular sub-

ject matter was instrumental in attracting people who might not have otherwise visited an art museum.

The exhibit was conceived by Louise Weaver, a Tampa-based rock aficionado who owned about 30 of the photographs and knew the featured photographers, said Tampa museum director Andrew Maass.

Weaver first approached history and art museums in St. Petersburg, Fla., where she lived, but the museums were not interested in exhibit, Maass said.

Maass, a fan of '60s rock himself, was more than delighted to

have such a show. "I had known for years about Wolman," he said. "I had known he was an original photographer for Rolling Stone."

From there Weaver and Maass obtained more photographs from Wolman and Marshall. They also thought it would be a good idea to include rock memorabilia, and so they contacted the Hard Rock Cafe storage headquarters in Orlando, Mass. said.

There were also other formalities to be taken care of, he said, like getting approval from the estates of Jimi Hendrix and Frank Zappa for T-shirts that would be sold at the event.

The elements meshed together to create a popular — if only temporary — exhibit. The Tampa Museum of Art even threw a party which featured local bands to promote it.

"Working with rock and roll and classic, classic images is a good way to open up people's idea about what is art and history," Maass said.

From Tampa the exhibit went to Edison Community College in Fort Myers, Fla. in January 1994 where it was also extremely popular, Morris said.

with Fowler. He approached her with the idea, and she was delighted. UK will be the second stop of the exhibit's tour.

Fowler said she hopes younger viewers will receive it as more than just another nostalgic reference to the original Woodstock and the era of flower power. "I hope they have a sense of

what the era was about," she said. "It was a rather special time to be young in America. There was some truly wonderful music being made."

The Tampa Museum of Art is currently negotiating with other sites where the exhibit may be shown but no definite plans have been made, said Morris.

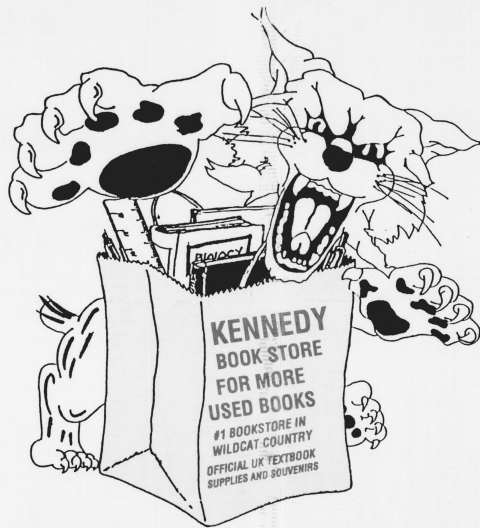

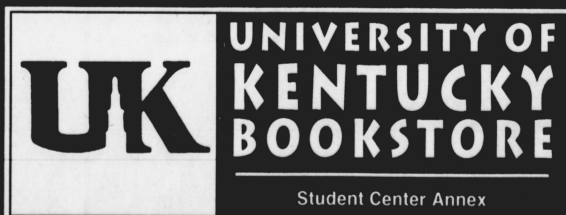
