Grayhawk protest atypical, but at least homeless benefit

Generally, protest is thought of as a labor of love, made possible only by the protesters' strong belief in the cause.

The protesters near campus who are targeting the construction company Grayhawk LLC may be all for higher wages for carpenters, but they have another incentive to stand in the picket line: an \$8 an hour wage from the Indiana-Rentucky Regional Council of Carpenters, the Kernel reported April 4.

Ormally, what makes a protest powerful is that the people participating are all giving up their time and money to voice their concerns to the public. That's not exactly the case when the people involved are being paid to do it.

Another apparent irony is that while the protesters are making \$8 an hour from the union, they're calling for Grayhawk to pay carpenters about \$20 an hour. What's unfair for one group is perfectly fine for another in the union's eyes. Nevertheless, there's nothing wrong with what the carpenter's union is doing — in fact, it might be a good thing overall for the local community.

First, remember that it's a free-market economy. If there are people willing to protest for pay and a sponsor willing to pay for protesters, there's no reason why that economic exchange shouldn't take place.

Second, many of the protesters


