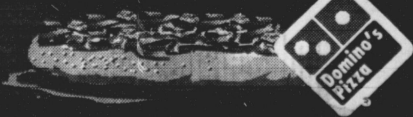

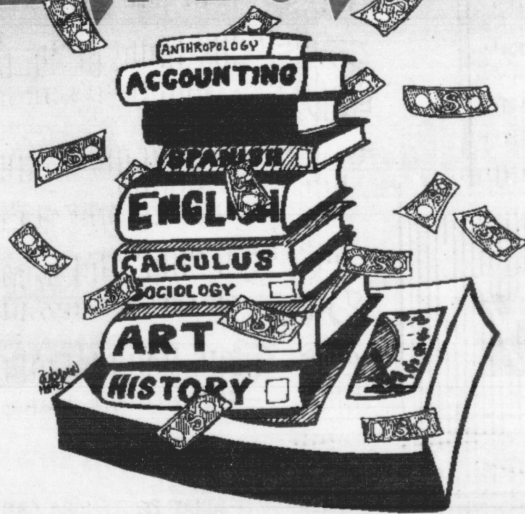

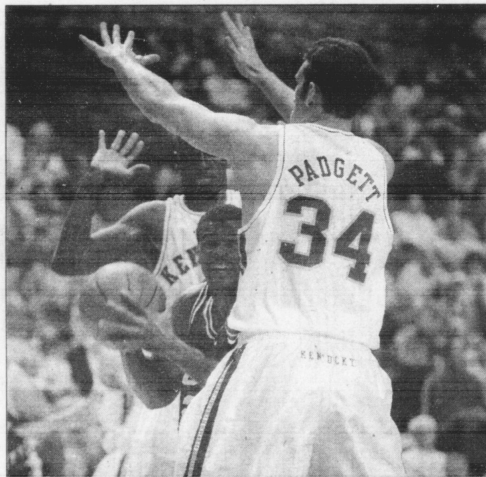

## Studying on road part of being a Cat

Evans, a social work junior who attended Manhattan college his first two seasons, remembers his first finals week as well. It found him slammed by a heavy workload even though he'd done well in the classroom all semester. "I had a good semester, I was cruising along, but when finals came it was pretty tough," he said. Since his freshman year, Evans, who's a senior academically, has learned to balance basketball and the books.

It's hard to feel sorry for UK basketball players. Celebrities in their late teens and early 20s, they lead a life that, viewed from outside, seems a fuzzy shade of blue.

But consider your schedule over the past few weeks. Chances are you've had syllabi peppered with papers and projects, all due over the course of the past three weeks. In that respect, you're no different than, say, Heshimu Evans or Scott Padgett.

The difference is that you probably didn't have to squeeze in trips to Hawaii, Phoenix, Chicago, Indianapolis and Buffalo.

"It's tough, but it weighs on probably our freshmen more than anybody," Padgett said. "(Upperclassmen) know what (they) have to do."

Padgett remembers vividly his first finals week. The 6-foot-9 forward was forced to sit out a year after not meeting academic standards after his first season.

"My freshman year, finals killed me," said Padgett, a social work junior. "We were traveling and I fell behind and I thought I'd just study the night before the test and I'd be OK. It doesn't work like that. You're not going to learn a whole semester in one night."

Padgett has since rallied in the academic arena, earning better than a 3.0 grade point average each semester last year.

"I figured out that, especially with all the travel we do, you have to keep up with your acad-

emics," Padgett said. "As soon as I got back from the Indiana game, I had to get some work done," Padgett said. "I had some papers to turn in, which I did. It's good that we get a break around finals so that we can get those kinds of things done."

After a game against Georgia Tech last Saturday, UK takes the week off. The Wildcats won't play again until they play host to Tulsa Saturday. That's a relief for UK coach Tubby Smith, who puts an emphasis on his team's academic success.

"It has been tough getting adjusted to being back off the road, especially with some of our players being behind in class," Smith said.

That includes the freshmen, even if they won't want to listen.

"You try to (help prepare freshmen for finals), but — and I know I was the same way — they're like, 'Yeah, yeah, whatever,'" Padgett said. "They think you're b.s.-ing them. They'll learn one way or another, though."

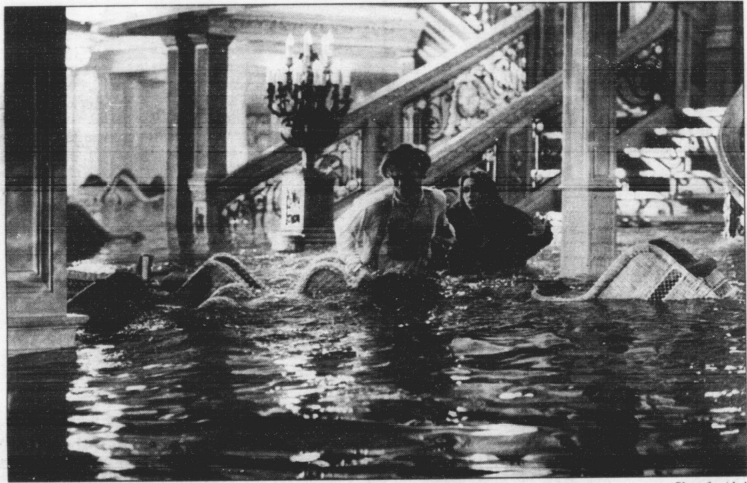

## Films get in holiday spirit

Those looking for the perfect antidote to cold winter weather need to look no further than the friendly confines of your local multiplex. Also those looking for torture worse than a candy cane anal probe need to look no further than your local multiplex.

As usual this year's holiday season in film runs the gamut of potential winners and losers. Thankfully, however, the winter is traditionally the season of Oscar contenders and this year again boasts the top draws from Hollywood's top talents.

The biggest draws make appearances as industry giants Stephen Spielberg, Quentin Tarantino and James Cameron bring three of the year's most anticipated films. Spielberg takes us to the 1839 African slave ships with another attempt at ditching his mass medium filmmaking for more art house. Four of film's top veterans, Anthony Hopkins, Nigel Hawethorne, Morgan Freeman and Pete Postlewaite join Matthew McConaughey and newcomer Djimon Hounsou

for this abolitionist movement courtroom drama *Amistad*.


Action guru Cameron finally debuts his over-ambitious \$200 million tank *Titanic* this weekend. If anyone exists who hasn't seen one of the numerous theatrical trailers over the last year, may note the paradoxical pairing of charming beauty Kate Winslet and annoying winer Leonardo DiCaprio.

Those who can't get enough of or just got over film's consistent Tarantino ejaculation, can raise an eyebrow at his Christmas day release of *Jackie Brown*. Based on the Elmore Leonard novel, this tribute to '70s blaxploitation stars genre queen Pam Grier as well as Robert DeNiro, Samuel L. Jackson and Michael Keaton. What you won't see, however, are other cult pop media icons Joel and Ethan Coen and their film *The Big Lebowski* as it was shelved until March 6.

Other good investments include Martin Scorsese's tale of the Dali Lama featuring a cast of novice actors *Kundun*, the latest in Ian Fleming's James Bond franchise *Tomorrow Never Dies*, Barry Levinson's DeNiro/Dustin Hoffman pic *Wag the Dog*, Woody Allen's latest *Deconstructing Harry*, the *Great Expectations* update starring Gwyneth Paltrow and Ethan Hawke, and the Emily Watson/Daniel Day Lewis film *The Boxer*.

The prospect for gold, however, is counteracted with an equal amount of fool's gold. Leslie Nielsen's *Mr. Magoo*, Kevin Costner's cornball futuristic action epic *The Postman* and the horror/comedy/semi-sequel *An American Werewolf in Paris* may end up tasting like the candy cane after the aforementioned anal probe.

# A Buffett Christmas

It only seems natural that Jimmy Buffett would put out a Christmas album. He was born on December 25 after all.

His *Christmas Island* CD could be one of the best, most original holiday albums of all time.

Buffett combines snappy renditions of traditional favorites, remakes of obscure Christmas songs, and of course a few originals thrown in for good measure.

To those who are not familiar with Jimmy Buffett, he is well known for his own unique style of music, that is extremely tough to categorize.

the end of the songs. "A day or two ago/I thought I'd make a run/To Port Antonio/I be cruisin' in the sun/The radio was loud/The chicken jerked and fried/And all I had to do that day was drive on the left side." That is the reason this is one of the most fun renditions of the classic Christmas carol.

"A Sailor's Christmas" is one of the songs that Buffett wrote specifically for this album. It is the perfect example of classic Buffett songwriting.

Listening to "A Sailor's Christmas" inspires images of lounging on the deck of a boat anchored in the secluded harbour of some banana republic

with Christmas garland and lights strung throughout the rigging.

Another of the original songs is "Ho Ho Ho and a Bottle of Rhum." This song gives Santa Clause a whole new image.

It's about poor old Chris Cringle getting tired of his yearly routine and taking off for the islands of the Caribbean.

This is something anyone who has ever dreamed of leaving everything behind and running off to some tropical paradise.

While this might not be a traditional Christmas album by any stretch of the imagination, it is one that is a must have for any true Parrothead.

## 7Mary3 hits A1A near end of tour

Seven Mary Three, which released such hits as "Cumber- some" and "Water's Edge" will visit A1A Thursday for a nearly two-hour concert.

The stop will be one of the band's last during its tour of small venues, those holding 500 to 1,000 people, that started early this summer. The tour brought the band to Louisville's Thunderdome July 11.

"Our shows are like coming to a show 30 years ago before people had gimmicks," said Jason Pollock, the band's lead guitar. "It's a rock 'n' roll show."

For the band's stop in Louisville, the crowd, a mob of about 1,600, was packed into the Thunderdome. They were a glob of moshing and screaming fans sweating on the band, said lead singer Jason Ross.

"We didn't take it lightly," Ross said. "We went in, and we played the show. That's how you find out who your audience is. You can actually see them — you

can hear them, you can feel them.

"They're sweating on you, you're sweating on them," he said.

The time on the road has been good to the band, Pollock said, because the band has been writing songs. Seven Mary Three plans to hit the studio after the tour to record its next album in February. Pollock said the band has the tunes ready.

"It'll be a lot more light-hearted," Pollock said of the band's third album, which will contrast the darkness of the second album, "Rock Crown." The first album, "American Standard," sold more than one million copies and feature such hits as "Cumber-some", "Water's Edge", "My My" and "Devil Boy."

Some people said the band had lost the bite on its second album that it had in its first, but

Ross liked the second album more than the first.

"I think so much of our first album was in the middle," he said. "I didn't like it in the middle."

Through touring after the first album and after the second album, the band has continued to grow, and its sound has continued to mature, Pollock said. But he said the second or third albums aren't necessarily quieter than the first.

"We're on a quest," he said. "A patient quest to find our extreme. We're setting ourselves away from the trends. We're living our lives."

Being on the road for most the year playing two-hour shows five days a week has taken a toll on the band, though, Pollock said.

"I'm ready for a break," he said. "Being on the road is like being an organized hermit — at times it's very lonely."

But being on the road touring small venues of about 1,000 people has its advantages.

"It's more tangible, more real," Pollock said. "And the fans are a regular sort of people who like good honest music."

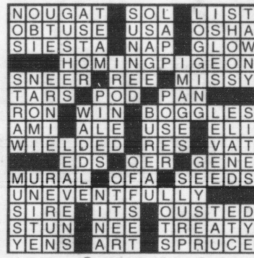

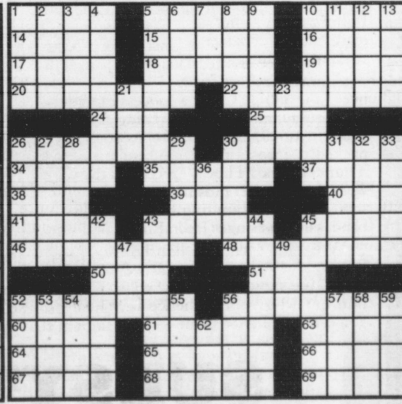
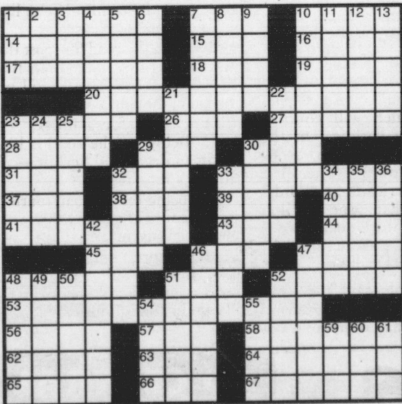

# Stressing out

## Students offer ways to handle burnout

You are being chased by an enormous blue boogie. You turn the corner and your professor is frowning down on you, telling you it is time to turn in your final. You start to scream that you aren't finished, you need more time, when all of a sudden, you wake up.

It was all just a terrible dream.

Or was it?

With finals week creeping up, students are experiencing stress levels at an all-time high. Even when students sleep, they find worries filling their dreams. For some students, it seems like there is no end to the stress, but many others have found alternative ways to cope.

Instead of hitting the bottle or heading to the refrigerator, many students have found that exercise is a good way to relieve stress.

Laura Booklin, a pre-pharmacy junior, finds that running is the per-

fect way to relieve her stress. "Running helps me get away for awhile," she said. "It gives me energy and I come back rejuvenated."

Kristin Wells, an economics junior, relies on a four-mile power walk with friends to relieve her stress. "It's a break from the day that makes you feel good," she said. "I also vent about my classes when I'm walking."

Amy Ruberson, a finance sophomore, pays \$35 a semester to go to aerobics classes that the University offers.

"Aerobics relieves stress, burns calories and gives me a chance to take time out of my busy day for myself," she said. "I also like the music and the dancing. It makes me feel better about myself."

Aerobics classes are offered three times a day during the week and once on Saturday and Sunday. They are taught by certified instructors on both North Campus and South Campus.

Chris Vandegger, a sociology senior takes advantage of a different form of stress relief offered by UK. Every Monday he meets in the Commons Complex at 7 p.m. to take a Tao

Te Chi class offered by an instructor from the INF Medicine Wheel. The class consists of an hour of martial arts training and an hour of meditation.

"In finals week, you tend to focus on three papers and five tests and get completely overwhelmed," Vandegger said. "When I leave classes, I feel like my life is more in perspective."

Vandegger points to meditation as his method of conquering stress.

"It's a process that you have to train yourself to do," he said. "When I start to stress about papers and tests, I make myself focus on the little things, like the direction people are walking or the color of the sky."

Tao Te Chi instructor Matt Brammetter said martial arts is a good way to relieve stress.

"Tao Te Chi is a process of understanding your body," he said. "It involves a deep body relaxation. Since stress arises in the mind and manifests itself in the body, exercise is the perfect way to release."

In addition to martial arts classes, yoga is also offered at the Commons from 7-9 p.m. on Thursday nights.

Cate Pearson, a Learning Skills instructor from UK's Counseling and Testing Center, agrees that meditation is a good form of therapy and a great way to relieve stress.

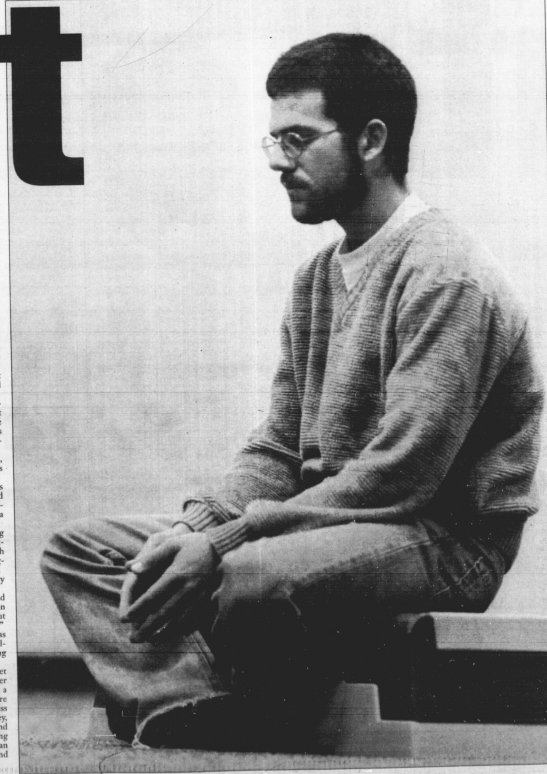
She also suggests deep breathing exercises, progressive muscle relaxation, and thought stopping. Each technique focuses on redirecting negative thoughts towards positive ones.

Pearson also recommends a worry box.

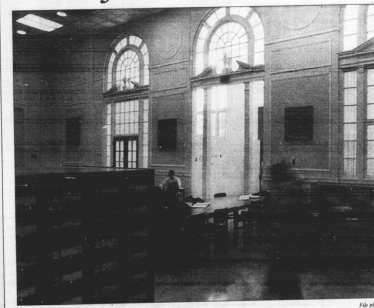
"You write down your worries and put them in a box," she said. "Then you aren't allowed to worry about them until you get the box back out."

Materials on stress relief tactics as well as personal counselors are available to students at the Counseling and Testing Center.

Instead of letting your stress get the best of you, fight back, whether it's in the form of a karate kick or a cardboard box full of worries. There are many ways to relieve your stress that take little time and no money, and they help you to concentrate and to relax your studies. By finding ways to relieve your stress, you can put an end to the nightmares and begin to see the end in sight.

"It's the end of the semester, and students are stressed. It's almost a classical saying. It's also a constant in college student lives.

Come the end of classes, students everywhere head to the libraries for all-nighters, late-night coffee breaks, and caffeine overdoses.

"I can't sleep," said Sarah True, a French junior. "I want to pull my hair out."

Spanish senior Stefanie Watson isn't quite to the breaking point yet.

"I'm not really stressed right now," Watson said. "I just want to get it over with. My mental state is pretty normal right now."

True also faces extra pressure because of her part-time job as assistant manager at a restaurant.

"It really cuts down on my time to study," she said. "I work late afternoons through nights. When I get home I don't feel like studying."

True has been through all this before. Others aren't quite so lucky.

The freshmen on campus are going through their first finals week, and some say they aren't as troubled as they thought they would be.

"I was pretty much prepared because of all the rumors and myths I had heard," said Lanesha Rowe, an undeclared freshman.

"It's not really that bad because I'm only taking 11 hours this semester. Next semester, I'll have 18 hours. It's more like this semester is tiring me out by where next semester will be a whole lot different."

Students all have different ways of knowing when they are approaching the stress level. Some lose sleep, some can't stay awake, some can't eat, others overindulge.

According to pamphlets available at the Counseling and Testing Center, some of the best methods for dealing with this are deep muscle relaxation, meditation, and deep breathing.

When asked how she copes with her stress, True had a simple answer.

"I don't," she said.

"I try to organize my studies as much as possible. I also try to maximize my study time to where I'm not stressed before my finals, like I always am."

Watson actually does more with her time when she's stressed.

She chooses to take advantage of the Seaton Center weight room, working out at

least three to four times weekly. She admits that increases when the stress grows.

"When I'm really stressed out, I sometimes go every day, anywhere from around 30-45 minutes at a time," Watson said.

Rowe sees changes in her schedule as well.

"I'm tired a lot," she said. "It's harder to stay up and study. I just try to get plenty of rest."

Watson tries to rest as well, choosing to play on her strengths in studying.

"I study better in the morning," Watson said, "so that's what I try to do. Go to bed early and wake up early. I try to plan my study time better during finals time."

Students, infamous for their procrastination, also see postponing studies as an enemy.

Rowe has imposed a self-regulated improvement.

"I don't leave my room as much," she said. "I try to eat my meals in my room, because if I go to the Commons I might see some of my friends, and then it's 9:30 or 10 before I realize it."

Yiu, himself a Christian, said Christmas is celebrated in Hong Kong, but more as a holiday, not as a religious festival.

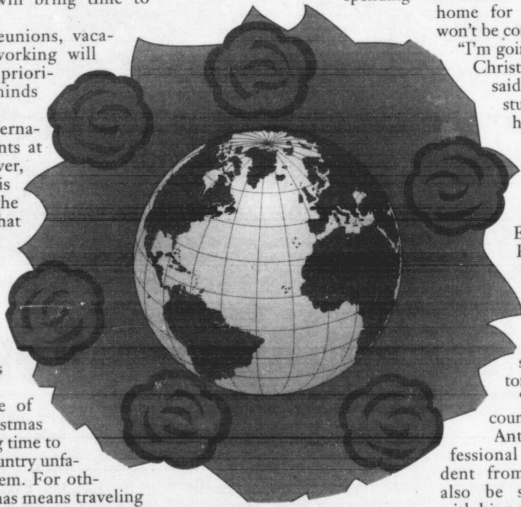

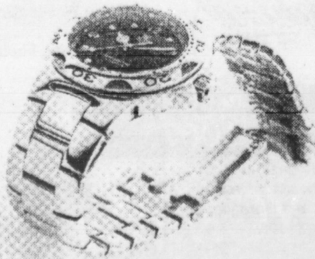

# Charities storm campus for needy

Despite the pressures of finals, papers and holiday preparations, hundreds of UK students, faculty and staff still donate their time, money and energy to charity.

And they need your help.

The UK chapter of Big Brothers/Big Sisters matches a child from a single-parent family with a volunteer role model who spends three to five hours with them every week.

"We are in desperate need of male volunteers," said Tiffany Yerian, president of the organization. "It's unbelievable how much a college student can get out of this."

The UK chapter falls under the jurisdiction of Big Brothers/Big Sisters of the Bluegrass, which has more than 150 boys on the waiting list, she said.

"Our primary goal is to recruit new volunteers," Yerian said.

While the application process involves three interviews and reference checks, which can take up

to four to six months, at-risk children such as Yerian's little, Doneisha, benefit with better grades and more self-esteem, she said.

And "students benefit from seeing the other end of the world," Yerian said. "You realize how much you take for granted ... how important little things are."

Craig Brunson, a UK systems programmer said, "Every little gift helps. There will always be a need for this."

The University program, in conjunction with the UK hospital, sponsored more than 1,400 children. The vice-chancellor for Student Affairs and the Women's Forum Outreach Committee help sponsor the University side of the program.

"It really helps to make the holiday," said Debbi Scott, co-chairwoman of the program.

Although the program culminates at Christmas, financial support is accepted year-round to help purchase gifts for unsponsored children.

"We'll take donations anytime," Scott said.

And for students who want a variety of ways to donate their time, Alpha Phi Omega, a UK service fraternity, offers opportunities and leadership development in multiple service areas.

"Most of our projects are in conjunction with other organizations in Lexington," said Andrea McAtee, president of the fraternity.

Fraternity membership is open to everyone, but new members must join at the beginning of the semester. New pledges must attend weekly meetings and perform 10 hours of community service in a variety of service events.

The fraternity's 42 active members and 23 pledges sponsor several major projects throughout the year including a Holiday Outreach Program during the winter, house repairs in Leslie County over Spring Break and a year-round Drug Awareness Program.

Most projects are short-term, and the fraternity is always searching for opportunities to serve the community, McAtee

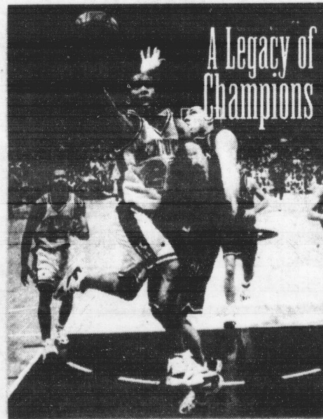

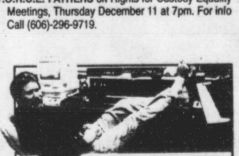
