In the absence of Prof. White, Prof. Matthews
Secretary of the Scientific Faculty, submitted ^{the names of} the

Prof. Anderson recommended ^{as candidates} for the degree

C. C. Loevenhart, and T. S. Hamilton,
and for the degree of Bachelor of Mech. Eng.,
Messrs, C. C. Jett, P. P. Johnston, T. W. Scholtz,
and A. J. Vance, He also submitted the
names, of W. L. Bronaugh, ^{and} J. W. Hughes as
candidates contingent upon their passing
satisfactorily in ^{the} History and Heat
respectively, on or before December 15th

Prof. Brooks, recommended ^{as candidates} for the degree
Bachelor of Civil Engineering Messrs L. B. Allen
A. C. Copland, J. E. Davidson, R. L. Maddox,

Prof. Neville was not ready to submit his list,

A communication from Mr. E. B. Buffington
of Salisbury Ky relative to the degree of Master of Arts
was referred to the Classical faculty with Prof
Rork as advisor

The President called attention to the order of
the Board relative to the prompt submission
of monthly reports on grades and recommended
the matter to the serious and earnest attention
of all present.

On motion of Prof Anderson ordered "that the 193
second term of the collegiate year, be ten weeks in
extent beginning with the first Monday after January
1st. That the third term be the remainder of the year.
That the term grades for the second and third terms be
made up of two months and two weeks, that the grades
for the latter two weeks be given the same value
as each of the preceding two months."

On motion of Prof. Neville the request
of Capt M. B. Jones was relative to
a Masters degree was referred to the
Scientific faculty.

After several motions relative to the beginning
and ending of the month,

Prof Neville moved that reports be made
for calendar months, Carried

Some questions arose relative to the period during which the president
grades should be maintained.
On motion of Prof. Mathews ordered that
the interpretation of the rule governing
athletics be left to the committee on
Athletics.

Voted on motion of Prof Miller that Mr J. B. Turner be allowed Biology as a major, and German and English Literature as minors leading to the degree of Master of Science

Prof. Roark submitted, without recommendation, a request from Mr. Felix Herrick to the effect that he be considered a candidate, for the degree of Bachelor of Pedagogy, on work all of which ^{should} be done away from the College.

Voted on motion that the request be not granted.
