These cases were referred to Pres. Patterson. Permission was given to Messrs Hendricks and Seigle to change their boarding houses. Mr. Whitlock's request for an honorable discharge was refused on the grounds that he had neglected his duties for the past week. He was allowed to withdraw. Permission was given Mr. Mercer to leave the labor department.
