The faculty met in regular session March 12, 1917, President Barker presiding. Quorum present.

The minutes of the last meeting were read by the Secretary and approved.

Dr. Terrell, Chairman of the Committee on Proposed Faculty Legislation, read the following report:

ROUTINE BUSINESS.

A. A. Skidmore was permitted to transfer from the College of Agriculture to the College of Law.

G. W. ^{J. M.} McGowan was given permission to transfer from College of Mechanical Engineering to the College of Arts and Science.

DEBATABLE CLASS.

Recommendation from the special committee appointed at the faculty meeting in January was amended and adopted as follows:

RESOLVED: That results of examinations (which shall be held as scheduled) be filed with the Registrar within forty-eight hours after the examinations have been completed, with the exception of those held the last examination day, which shall be sent in within twenty-four hours. That examinations shall begin on Saturday and end on the following Friday. That all forenoon examinations shall close not later than twelve o'clock. The results of examinations shall be reported to students as soon as possible after their receipt by the registrar.

The following suggestion from the Committee on Proposed Faculty Legislation was amended and adopted:

We recommend that (no written examination shall continue longer than three hours.)

The following report from the Committee of Deans was amended and adopted as follows:

Each dean, with the consent of the Commandant or Physical Director (as the case may be), shall have authority in arranging the schedule of a student to postpone the time when Physical Education and Drill be taken, if, in his judgement, the circumstances warrant it.

REPORT FROM THE SPECIAL COMMITTEE.

Sec. A. Students absent from classes immediately preceding or following a holiday or examination period, are automatically dropped from the University. For reinstatement they must pay a fee of \$5.00 unless, in the opinion of the Committee on Student Attendance, such absences were unavoidable.

Sec. B. Resolved that the President be asked to appoint a Committee on Student Attendance to consider absences before and after holidays.

In compliance with the above request, President

Bafer appointed the Dean of Men, the Dean of Women and the Registrar.

The following suggestion was made by Dr. Terrell:

We strongly recommend that the chapel periods as scheduled at the beginning of the school year be strictly adhered to and no departures therefrom be even considered.

After a general discussion Dr. Terrell withdrew the above resolution stating that the Chapel Committee now knew the sentiment of the faculty and that was all he desired.

Motion was made and seconded the adjourn.
