Field Orders  
No. 1.

(Map, East Half sheet 3, West Half sheet 4)

1. The enemy occupies JAUREZ and vicinity in force. The regular U.S. Infantry and Cavalry, supported by Field Artillery will attack. Our 10th and 11th Divisions will occupy FORT BLISS and vicinity, the city of EL PASO and patrol the BOUNDARY from LASCA - FORT QUITMAN, TEXAS, to NORIA, N. M., both inclusive.

2. This Brigade, less dets. reinforced by the 10th Divisional Cavalry the detachments now on the BOUNDARY stations and the Kentucky and Colorado Signal Troops, will patrol the BOUNDARY from FORT QUITMAN, TEXAS, to NORIA, N. M., both inclusive, and that portion of the city of EL PASO south of the TEXAS and PACIFIC tracks, and the line UNION STATION - HARTS MILL - CEMENT PLANT - COURCHESNE BRIDGE.

3. (a) Col. Butler, 1st Ga. Inf. is assigned to the command of the section NORIA - GEORGIA BRIGADE CAMP inclusive. The 1st Ga. Inf. is assigned to duty in this section.

(b) Col. Thomas, Jr., 2nd Ga. Inf. is assigned to the command of the section GEORGIA BRIGADE CAMP exclusive, to LASCA - FORT QUITMAN, TEXAS, inclusive. The 2nd Ga. Inf. is assigned to duty in this section.

(c) The 5th Ga. Inf. Col. Hall, 5th Ga. Comdg., as Brigade reserves will remain in this camp.

(d) The Prov. Cavalry Regiment will cover both flanks of the lines and reconnoiter our front, keeping in touch with our attacking forces.

(e) The Signal dets. will establish telegraphic communication between the several elements of each section and with Brigade Headquarters.

(X) The Section Commanders are charged with the safety of all powder magazines, bridges, tunnels, railroads, telephone and telegraph lines in their respective sections.

4. Field, Combat and Sanitary Trains with their organizations.

5. Brigade Headquarters at Camp Cotton, to which point messages will be sent, Phone 7235.
