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

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FOREWORD

THE INVENTORY OF COUNTY ARCHIVES OF ARIZONA IS ONE OF A NUMBER OF BIBLIOGRAPHIES OF HISTORICAL MATERIALS PREPARED THROUGHOUT THE UNITED STATES BY WORKERS ON THE HISTORICAL RECORDS SURVEY OF THE WORKS PROGRESS ADMINISTRATION. THE PUBLICATION HEREWITH PRESENTED, AN INVENTORY OF THE ARCHIVES OF PIMA COUNTY, IS NUMBER 10 OF THE ARIZONA SERIES.

THE HISTORICAL RECORDS SURVEY WAS UNDERTAKEN IN THE WINTER OF 1935-36 FOR THE PURPOSE OF PROVIDING USEFUL EMPLOY-MENT TO NEEDY UNEMPLOYED HISTORIANS, LAWYERS, TEACHERS, AND RESEARCH AND CLERICAL WORKERS. IN CARRYING OUT THIS OBJEC-TIVE, THE PROJECT WAS ORGANIZED TO COMPILE INVENTORIES OF HISTORICAL MATERIALS, PARTICULARLY THE UNPUBLISHED GOVERNMENT DOCUMENTS AND RECORDS WHICH ARE BASIC IN THE ADMINISTRATION OF LOCAL GOVERNMENT, AND WHICH PROVIDE INVALUABLE DATA FOR STU-DENTS OF POLITICAL, ECONOMIC, AND SOCIAL HISTORY. THE ARCHIVAL GUIDE HEREWITH PRESENTED IS INTENDED TO MEET THE REQUIREMENTS OF DAY-TO-DAY ADMINISTRATION BY THE OFFICIALS OF THE COUNTY AND ALSO THE NEEDS OF LAWYERS, BUSINESS MEN AND OTHER CITIZENS WHO REQUIRE FACTS FROM THE PUBLIC RECORDS FOR THE PROPER CONDUCT OF THEIR AFFAIRS. THE VOLUME IS SO DESIGNED THAT IT CAN BE USED BY THE HISTORIAN IN HIS RESEARCH IN UNPRINTED SOURCES IN THE SAME WAY HE USES THE LIBRARY CARD CATALOG FOR PRINTED SOURCES.

THE INVENTORIES PRODUCED BY THE HISTORICAL RECORDS SURVEY ATTEMPT TO DO MORE THAN GIVE MERELY A LIST OF RECORDS - THEY ATTEMPT FURTHER TO SKETCH IN THE HISTORICAL BACKGROUND OF THE COUNTY OR OTHER UNIT OF GOVERNMENT, AND TO DESCRIBE PRECISELY AND IN DETAIL THE ORGANIZATION AND FUNCTIONS OF THE GOVERNMENT AGENCIES WHOSE RECORDS THEY LIST. THE COUNTY, TOWN, AND OTHER LOCAL INVENTORIES FOR THE ENTIRE COUNTRY WILL, WHEN COMPLETED, CONSTITUTE AN ENCYCLOPEDIA OF LOCAL GOVERNMENT AS WELL AS A BIBLIOGRAPHY OF LOCAL ARCHIVES.

THE SUCCESSFUL CONCLUSION OF THE WORK OF THE HISTORICAL RECORDS SURVEY, EVEN IN A SINGLE COUNTY, WOULD NOT BE POSSIBLE WITHOUT THE SUPPORT OF PUBLIC OFFICIALS, HISTORICAL AND LEGAL SPECIALISTS, AND MANY OTHER GROUPS IN THE COMMUNITY. THEIR CO-OPERATION IS GRATEFULLY ACKNOWLEDGED.

PREFACE

THE SURVEY OF STATE AND LOCAL HISTORICAL RECORDS, KNOWN BY SHORT TITLE AS THE HISTORICAL RECORDS SURVEY, IS A NATION-WIDE UNDERTAKING INITIATED IN JANUARY 1936 AS A PART OF FEDERAL PROJECT NO. 1. THE SURVEY IN ARIZONA BEGAN OPERATIONS IN MARCH 1936 UNDER ADMINISTRATIVE SUPERVISION OF ROSS SANTE, STATE DIRECTOR OF THE FEDERAL WRITERS' PROJECT, AND UNDER TECHNICAL SUPERVISION OF ESTELLE LUTRELL, ASSISTANT STATE SUPERVISOR. IN OCTOBER 1936 THE SURVEY BECAME AN INDEPENDENT UNIT, OF WHICH ESTELLE LUTRELL WAS APPOINTED STATE DIRECTOR, BUT IT CONTINUED TO OPERATE AS A PART OF THE NATION-WIDE SURVEY.

IN ARIZONA THE SURVEY HAS AS ITS OBJECTIVE THE PREPARA-TION AND PUBLICATION OF COMPLETE INVENTORIES OF THE RECORDS OF THE STATE AND ITS COUNTIES, CITIES, AND OTHER LOCAL GOVERN-MENTAL UNITS. THE INVENTORIES CONTAIN ENTRIES FOR THE EXTANT RECORDS OF PUBLIC OFFICES FORMING THE GOVERNMENTAL ORGANIZA-TION. A SECTION IN THE INVENTORY IS DEVOTED TO EACH OFFICE. AND IN IT ARE LISTED BY SUBJECT THE ENTRIES FOR RECORDS OF THAT OFFICE. EACH ENTRY GIVES INFORMATION AS TO EXACT OR ASSIGNED TITLE OF THE RECORD, ITS LIMITING DATES, QUANTITY, LABELING, CONTENTS, ARRANGEMENT, INDEXING, METHOD OF RECORDING, CONDITION OF RECORD, SIZE, LOCATION OF THE RECORD IN THE COURTHOUSE, OR OTHER DEPOSITORY, AND CROSS REFERENCES TO OTHER ENTRIES BY THEIR NUMBERS. IN THE INDEX TO THE INVENTORY, RECORD ENTRIES ARE ARRANGED ALPHABETICALLY, WITH CROSS REFERENCES. PRECEDING THE RECORD ENTRIES FOR EACH OFFICE IS A BRIEF ESSAY ON THE HIS-TORY, FUNCTIONS AND RECORDS OF THE OFFICE, BASED UPON CONSTITU-TIONAL AND STATUTORY AUTHORITY, THE RECORDS THEMSELVES, AND OTHER SOURCES.

THE INVENTORY OF COUNTY ARCHIVES OF ARIZONA, WHEN COMPLETED, WILL FORM A SERIES IN WHICH EACH COUNTY INVENTORY BEARS
A SEPARATE NUMBER. THE UNITS OF THE SERIES ARE NUMBERED ACCORDING TO THE RESPECTIVE POSITION OF THE COUNTY IN AN ALPHABETICAL LIST OF THE COUNTIES. IN THIS SERIES, THE PIMA COUNTY
INVENTORY, HEREWITH PRESENTED, IS NO. 10. THE INVENTORIES OF
THE STATE ARCHIVES AND MUNICIPAL AND OTHER LOCAL RECORDS WILL
CONSTITUTE SEPARATE PUBLICATIONS.

LISTING OF PIMA COUNTY RECORDS BY THE SURVEY WAS BEGUN IN MARCH AND COMPLETED IN MAY 1936. THE COUNTY WAS REOPENED FOR ADDITIONAL RESEARCH AND RE-CHECKING FROM JANUARY TO APRIL 1938. IN THE COURSE OF THE SURVEY THE OFFICIALS OF PIMA COUNTY WERE HELPFUL AND COOPERATIVE. APPRECIATION FOR VALUABLE ASSISTANCE IS GRATEFULLY EXTENDED TO THEM, TO ALL OFFICIALS OF THE WORKS PROGRESS ADMINISTRATION IN ARIZONA, AND TO MR. SANTEE AND THE FEDERAL WRITERS' PROJECT. THE SURVEY IS ALSO INDEBTED TO DR. RUFUS KAY WYLLYS, ARIZONA STATE TEACHERS COLLEGE AT TEMPE, FOR


THE HISTORICAL RECORDS SURVEY

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1. HISTORICAL SKETCH

PIMA COUNTY WAS ONE OF THE FOUR ORIGINAL COUNTIES INTO WHICH THE TERRITORY OF ARIZONA WAS DIVIDED IN 1864, AND ITS BOUNDARIES WERE THEN SET AS FOLLOWS:

"ON THE EAST BY 109TH MERIDIAN OF LONGITUDE, ON THE LINE OF THE TERRITORY OF NEW MEXICO, ON THE NORTH BY THE MIDDLE OF THE MAIN BRANCH OF THE GILA RIVER, ON THE WEST BY THE LINE OF 1130 20' WEST LONGITUDE, AND ON THE SOUTH BY THE SONORA LINE."

THE ABOVE BOUNDED LANDS WERE ACQUIRED BY SPAIN THROUGH DISCOVERY AND EXPLORATION IN THE SIXTEENTH AND SEVENTEENTH CENTURIES AND BY OCCUPATION IN THE EIGHTEENTH AND NINETEENTH. THEY BECAME PART OF MEXICO IN 1821 BY HER WAR OF INDEPENDENCE WITH SPAIN, AND OF THE UNITED STATES BY THE GADSDEN PURCHASE FROM MEXICO PROCLAIMED IN 1854.

PIMA COUNTY INCLUDED ALL OF ARIZONA SOUTH OF THE GILA RIVER, NORTH OF THE MEXICAN BOUNDARY AND EAST OF YUMA COUNTY, OR NEARLY ALL OF THE GADSDEN PURCHASE. TUCSON HAS ALWAYS BEEN THE COUNTY SEAT. BEFORE 1854 MOST OF PIMA COUNTY, AS ORIGINALLY FORMED, AND ALL OF THE COUNTY AS IT NOW EXISTS, HAD BEEN PART OF PIMERÍA ALTA, NORTHERN PORTION OF SONORA UNDER SPAIN AND MEXICO. TUCSON WAS A PRESIDIO ON THE APACHE FRONTIER AND THE PRINCIPAL SETTLEMENT, ABOVE THE PRESENT SONORA LINE, IN PIMERÍA ALTA. NO SETTLEMENTS EXISTED PRIOR TO 1854 IN WHAT IS NOW ARIZONA NORTH OF THE GILA RIVER, OR BEYOND PIMERÍA ALTA. THE REGION WAS NAMED FOR THE PIMA INDIANS NATIVE TO IT. PIMA COUNTY'S NAME HAS THE SAME ORIGIN. THE NAME TUCSON IS DERIVED FROM THE PIMAN "SLUYK-SON", MEANING DARK OR BROWN SPRING.

DE NIZA PROBABLY CAME TO THIS REGION IN 1539. CORONADO AND HIS ARMY CROSSED IT IN 1540. A CENTURY AND A HALF LATER THE JESUIT, FATHER KINO, EXTENDED HIS EXPLORATIONS AND THE MISSION FIELD FROM PIMERÍA BAJA NORTHWARD TO THE GILA, MAK-ING HIS FIRST ENTRADA ACROSS THE MODERN SONORA LINE IN 1691. IN 1692 KINO ADDRESSED 800 SOBALPURI INDIANS AND BAPTIZED SOME OF THEIR CHILDREN AT A LARGE RANCHERÍA WHICH HE NAMED SAN XAVIER DEL BAC. IN THE VICINITY OF THIS RANCHERIA, KINO, IN 1700, LAID THE FOUNDATIONS OF THE NOTED MISSION OF THE SAME NAME. SAN XAVIER DEL BAC, NINE MILES FROM TUCSON, RECEIVED ITS FIRST PERMANENT MISSIONARY IN 1701, AND BECAME THE GREAT-EST MISSION IN WHAT IS NOW ARIZONA. IT IS STILL MAINTAINED, NOW BY THE FRANCISCAN ORDER. FOR PROTECTION AGAINST THE IN-DIANS, A PRESIDIO WAS ESTABLISHED AT TUBAC IN 1752, WHICH WAS MOVED ABOUT 1776 SOME FIFTY MILES NORTH TO THE PUEBLITO DE SAN AGUSTIN DEL TUCSON ON THE SANTA CRUZ RIVER. THE PRESIDIO WAS LATER MOVED A SHORT DISTANCE TO THE SITE WHERE IN MODERN

TUCSON THE COURTHOUSE NOW STANDS, AND THERE AN ADOBE PUEBLO AND CHURCH, AND A WALL TWELVE FEET HIGH WITH TOWERS AND FIRING PLATFORM FOR DEFENSE, WERE BUILT.

MEXICO OVERTHREW SPANISH RULE IN 1821, BUT BY 1846 WAS IN A WAR WITH THE UNITED STATES INVOLVING MEXICO'S NORTHERN POS-SESSIONS. FOLLOWING GENERAL KEARNMY TO CALIFORNIA, AFTER THE CONQUEST OF NEW MEXICO, LIEUTENANT COLONEL COOKE WITH THE MORMON BATTALION TOOK TUCSON IN DECEMBER 1846, THE MEXICAN GAR-RISON ABANDONING THE PRESIDIO. AFTER RATIFICATION OF THE GADS-DEN PURCHASE, CONGRESS ON AUGUST 4, 1854, ATTACHED THE AREA ACQUIRED THEREBY TO NEW MEXICO, WHICH BY ACT OF ITS LEGISLA-TURE ON JANUARY 18, 1855, ATTACHED IT TO DONA ANA COUNTY. THE UNITED STATES EFFECTED MILITARY POSSESSION OF THE PURCHASE ON MARCH 10, 1856, BY STATIONING FOUR COMPANIES OF DRAGOONS IN TUCSON. IN 1858-60 THE BUTTERFIELD OVERLAND STAGE LINE PASSED THROUGH TUCSON, AND AMERICAN POPULATION INCREASED TO SEVERAL THOUSANDS. CHARLES D. POSTON, OF TUBAC, IN 1856 WAS APPOINTED DEPUTY CLERK OF THE PROBATE COURT OF DONA ANA COUNTY, AND JUSTICES OF THE PEACE ACTED AT TUCSON AND ELSEWHERE. THE SET-TLERS FROM THE FIRST, HOWEVER, WERE DISSATISFIED WITH BEING JOINED TO DISTANT NEW MEXICO. A CONVENTION AT TUCSON IN 1856 MEMORIALIZED CONGRESS FOR ORGANIZATION OF THE TERRITORY OF ARIZONA AND ELECTED A DELEGATE TO CONGRESS, WHO WAS NOT SEATED. IN 1860 ANOTHER CONVENTION AT TUCSON FORMED A PROVISIONAL GOV-ERNMENT TO EXIST UNTIL CREATION OF SUCH A TERRITORY, ADOPTED A CONSTITUTION AND LAWS, ELECTED OFFICIALS, AND LAID OUT JUDICIAL DISTRICTS AND COUNTIES. THE PROCEEDINGS OF THIS CONVENTION WERE PRINTED AT TUCSON IN THE FIRST PAMPHLET PUBLISHED IN WHAT IS TODAY ARIZONA. THE NEW MEXICO LEGISLATURE IN 1860 CREATED FROM THE WESTERN PORTION OF DONA ANA COUNTY A NEW COUNTY, WHICH IT NAMED ARIZONA, WITH TUCSON AS THE COUNTY SEAT. BUT THIS ACT WENT UNNOTICED AND WAS REPEALED TWO YEARS LATER, AND THE AREA RESTORED TO DONA ANA COUNTY, OF WHICH IT REMAINED A PART UNTIL 1863. ANOTHER CONVENTION MET IN TUCSON IN 1861, AND SENTIMENT BEING FOR THE SOUTH, ELECTED A DELEGATE TO THE CONFEDERATE CONGRESS. IN FEBRUARY 1862, CAPTAIN HUNTER WITH A FORCE OF TEXANS OCCUPIED TUCSON FOR THE CONFEDERACY. IT WAS REGAINED, HOWEVER, IN MAY BY THE FIRST CALIFORNIA VOLUN-TEERS, UNDER COLONEL CARLETON, HUNTER RETIRING TO THE RIO GRANDE WITHOUT OPPOSITION. ON JUNE 8, AT TUCSON, CARLETON PROCLAIMED HIMSELF MILITARY GOVERNOR OF ARIZONA UNTIL SUCH TIME AS A CIVIL GOVERNMENT COULD BE ESTABLISHED.

CONGRESS PASSED THE ACT CREATING THE TERRITORY OF ARIZONA IN FEBRUARY 1863. PURSUANT TO THIS ACT, THE GOVERNOR BY PROCLAMATION ESTABLISHED A TEMPORARY LOCAL GOVERNMENT UNDER THREE JUDICIAL DISTRICTS, WHICH EXISTED FROM APRIL THROUGH DECEMBER 1864. AFTER THE FIRST ASSEMBLY PROVIDED FOR CREATION OF COUNTIES AND THEIR GOVERNMENTAL ORGANIZATION, THE GOVERNOR NAMED THE FOLLOWING FIRST OFFICIALS OF PIMA COUNTY, TO TAKE OFFICE JANUARY 1, 1865: CHARLES TRUMBULL HAYDEN, PROBATE JUDGE; GREGORY P. HARTE, COUNTY RECORDER; HILL DE ARMITTE, SHERIFF; JOHN C. CAPRON, COUNTY TREASURER. WILLIAM T. HOWELL WAS NAMED JUDGE OF THE FIRST JUDICIAL DISTRICT COURT TO BE HELD IN TUCSON.

THE PROBATE JUDGE, COUNTY RECORDER AND SHERIFF CONSTITUTED
THE FIRST BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, WHICH HELD ITS FIRST
MEETING ON FEBRUARY 1, 1865, IN THE RECORDER'S OFFICE AT
TUCSON. HERE THE ADOBE BUILDINGS HAD SPREAD OUTSIDE THE MILITARY WALL, THROUGH WHICH STREETS HAD BEEN CUT. TUCSON, ON
THE TRADE ROUTE BETWEEN THE EAST, CALIFORNIA AND SONORA, SERVED
AS MILITARY HEADQUARTERS FOR THE TERRITORY, AND CAPITAL DURING
1866-77. IT WAS REACHED BY THE SOUTHERN PACIFIC RAILROAD IN

CREATION OF NEW COUNTIES BY THE LEGISLATURE GREATLY REDUCED THE ORIGINAL AREA OF PIMA COUNTY. PORTIONS OF IT WERE INCLUDED IN MARICOPA AND PINAL COUNTIES, ON THE NORTH, BETWEEN 1873 AND 1877; IN GRAHAM AND COCHISE, ON THE EAST, IN 1881; AND IN SANTA CRUZ, ON THE SOUTHEAST, IN 1899. A COURT RULING IN 1928 RESTORED TO MARICOPA A SMALL AREA CLAIMED BY PIMA. PIMA COUNTY NOW COVERS 9,505 SQUARE MILES.

THE FIRST COUNTY OFFICIALS WERE HOUSED IN RENTED BUILD-INGS. IN 1868 A STONE-AND-ADOBE COURTHOUSE AND JAIL WAS BUILT IN THE MILITARY PLAZA. ADDITIONAL LAND WAS BOUGHT AND CONTRACT LET FOR A NEW BUILDING IN 1881. THE SITE WAS FURTHER EXTENDED IN 1928 FOR THE ERECTION OF THE PRESENT COURTHOUSE, THE SOUTH WALL OF WHICH ADJOINS THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF THE OLD PRESIDIO WALL.

FOR YEARS AFTER CREATION OF THE COUNTY, ITS SETTLEMENTS WERE MARKED BY THE CUSTOMS, RELIGION AND FESTIVALS OF THE SPANISH AND MEXICAN PEOPLE WHO WERE THE FIRST SETTLERS. SPANISH IS STILL SPOKEN BY THEIR DESCENDANTS. MINING OF NON-LISH IS STILL SPOKEN BY THEIR DESCENDANTS. MINING OF NON-LISH TIMES HAVE BEEN BASIC OCCUPATIONS. TUCSON, A CITY OF 32,500 AND THE SITE OF THE UNIVERSITY OF ARIZONA AND STATE MUSEUM, IS ALSO INTERNATIONALLY KNOWN AS A WINTER AND HEALTH RESORT, BECAUSE OF THE SUNSHINE AND DRY CLIMATE. MIGRATION TO THE SOUTHWEST FROM ALL SECTIONS OF THE COUNTRY HAS AIDED THE GROWTH OF THE COUNTY'S POPULATION FROM APPROXIMATELY 2,000 IN 1864 TO 17,007 IN 1880, TO 22,818 IN 1910, TO 55,776 IN 1930. PIMA IS SECOND IN POPULATION AND SIXTH IN SIZE AMONG THE FOURTEEN ARIZONA COUNTIES.

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2. GOVERNMENTAL ORGANIZATION AND RECORDS SYSTEM

SPAIN AND MEXICO

ALTHOUGH THE SPANISH BY 1540 HAD PENETRATED THE TERRITORY WHICH LATER BECAME PIMA COUNTY, THEY DID NOT BEGIN TO SETTLE IT UNTIL THE END OF THE NEXT CENTURY, WHEN IT WAS KNOWN AS PART OF PIMERIA ALTA. LOCAL GOVERNMENTAL PROVISIONS OF SPANISH RULE TO 1821, AND OF MEXICAN RULE FROM 1821 TO THE GADSDEN PURCHASE IN 1854, EXERTED INFLUENCE ON EARLY COUNTY GOVERNMENTAL ORGANIZATION IN THE TERRITORY OF ARIZONA. IN MATTERS AFFECTING MINING AND WATER RIGHTS, THE SUBSTANCE OF SUCH PROVISIONS HAS BEEN RETAINED TO THE PRESENT.

Dona Ana and Arizona Counties, New Mexico

AFTER THE GADSDEN PURCHASE HAD BEEN PROCLAIMED, CONGRESS (U. S. STATUTES AT LARGE, 1854, VOL. 10, P. 575) ADDED TO NEW MEXICO THE AREA ACQUIRED THEREBY, WHICH INCLUDED THE REGION LATER ERECTED INTO PIMA COUNTY. IN 1855 THE NEW MEXICO LEG-ISLATURE ATTACHED THE GADSDEN PURCHASE LANDS TO DONA ANA COUNTY (N. M. C. L., 1884, SEC. 277, APPROVED JANUARY 18, 1855). IN 1860 THE LEGISLATURE PASSED AN ACT CREATING, FROM THE WESTERN PORTION OF DONA ANA COUNTY, A COUNTY WHICH IT NAMED ARIZONA COUNTY, WITH TUCSON AS THE COUNTY SEAT. ARIZONA COUNTY DID NOT FUNCTION OWING TO DISPLACEMENTS OF THE CIVIL WAR. THIS ACT WAS REPEALED TWO YEARS LATER (IBID., 1865, P. 278, APPROVED JANUARY 18, 1862), AND THE REGION RESTORED TO DONA ANA COUNTY (IBID., 1884, SEC. 267, APPROVED JANUARY 18, 1862), OF WHICH IT THERE-AFTER REMAINED A PART UNTIL CREATION OF THE TERRITORY OF ARIZONA IN 1863. THE CLERK OF THE PROBATE COURT OF DONA ANA COUNTY APPOINTED A DEPUTY WHO FUNCTIONED IN THIS REGION. THE DEPUTY ACTED IN THE CLERK'S CAPACITY AS EX OFFICIO PUBLIC RE-CORDER OF THE COUNTY, KEEPING A SINGLE BOOK IN WHICH HE RE-CORDED VARIOUS INSTRUMENTS (N. M. C. L. 1865, P. 618, SECS. 1, 2, APPROVED JAN. 1, 1856). A TRACE OF ARIZONA COUNTY APPEARS IN GOVERNMENTAL ORGANIZATION
AND RECORDS SYSTEM

THIS BOOK IN THE FORM OF AN ACKNOWLEDGMENT, IN 1861, BY A NOTARY PUBLIC OF THAT COUNTY. JUSTICES OF THE PEACE ALSO ACTED IN THE REGION (BANCROFT, P. 504).

MILITARY DISTRICT OF WESTERN ARIZONA

TUCSON WAS CONTROLLED BY SOUTHERN SYMPATHIZERS IN 1861,
AND BY CONFEDERATE TROOPS UNTIL MAY 1862, WHEN THE CALIFORNIA
COLUMN ENTERED. MARTIAL LAW WAS DECLARED IN JUNE. GENERAL
ORDER NO. 1, ISSUED FROM THE HEADQUARTERS OF THE MILITARY DISTRICT OF WESTERN ARIZONA AT TUCSON ON AUGUST 5, 1862, MADE THE
RECORDING OF LAND CLAIMS IN THAT VICINITY A MILITARY REQUIREMENT, AND NAMED A REGISTER (SIC) AND RECORDER. THIS OFFICIAL
KEPT A SINGLE BOOK IN WHICH HE RECORDED SUCH CLAIMS AND OTHER
INSTRUMENTS, 1862-64. (SEE ENTRY 45).

FIRST JUDICIAL DISTRICT

IN THE ORGANIC ACT CREATING THE TERRITORY OF ARIZONA IN 1863 (U. S. STATUTES AT LARGE, VOL. 12, P. 664), CONGRESS PRO-VIDED THAT POWERS, DUTIES AND TERMS OF OFFICIALS SHOULD BE THE SAME AS SET FORTH IN THE ORGANIC ACT OF NEW MEXICO PASSED IN 1850 (IBID., VOL. 9, P. 446) AND ACTS AMENDATORY THERETO, AND CONTINUED IN FORCE ALL LEGISLATIVE ENACTMENTS OF THE TERRITORY OF NEW MEXICO NOT INCONSISTENT WITH THE ORGANIC ACT OF ARIZONA UNTIL REPEALED OR AMENDED BY FUTURE LEGISLATION. PURSUANT TO SUCH AUTHORITY, THE GOVERNOR BY PROCLAMATIONS OF APRIL 9 AND 11, 1864, ESTABLISHED A TEMPORARY LOCAL GOVERNMENT FOR ARIZONA BY DIVIDING THE TERRITORY INTO THREE JUDICIAL DISTRICTS AND PROVIDING OFFICES THEREOF. THE FIRST JUDICIAL DISTRICT CON-SISTED OF THE SAME AREA WHICH THE FIRST ASSEMBLY IN THE FALL OF THE YEAR ERECTED INTO PIMA COUNTY, EXCEPT THAT THE WESTERN BOUNDARY OF THE DISTRICT WAS ESTABLISHED AS 1140 WEST LONGI-TUDE WHILE THAT OF THE COUNTY WAS 113 20' (HOWELL CODE, 1864, CH. 2, SEC. 1). (SECRETARY OF THE STATE OF ARIZONA, RECORD-ORGANIZING THE TERRITORY OF ARIZONA, PP. 20-22). THE FOLLOW-ING OFFICES WERE PROVIDED FOR THE JUDICIAL DISTRICTS: PROBATE JUDGE, CLERK OF THE PROBATE COURT, DISTRICT COURT JUDGE, SHER-IFF, ALCALDES (JUSTICES OF THE PEACE), AND CONSTABLES. THE CLERK OF THE PROBATE COURT WAS EX OFFICIO RECORDER. ALL WERE FILLED BY APPOINTMENT OF THE GOVERNOR, EXCEPT THE JUDGE OF THE DISTRICT COURT, WHO WAS APPOINTED BY THE PRESIDENT AND ASSIGNED TO THE DISTRICT BY THE GOVERNOR, AND WERE EMPOWERED AS UNDER NEW MEXICO LAWS (N. M. C. L. 1865, WITH PROVISIONS FROM KEARNEY CODE, PAMPHLET, 1846). THE PROBATE JUDGE, WHO IN NEW MEXICO WAS ALSO REFERRED TO AS THE PREFECT, IN ADDITION TO HIS JUDICIAL DUTIES WAS THE LOCAL EXECUTIVE AND LEGISLATIVE AUTHOR-ITY, AND ADMINISTERED THE FINANCIAL AFFAIRS OF THE DISTRICT. THESE OFFICES WERE CONTINUED BY THE FIRST TERRITORIAL ASSEMBLY OF ARIZONA, AND THEIR FUNCTIONS AND DUTIES, AND THOSE OF OF-FICES SUBSEQUENTLY CREATED, ARE DESCRIBED IN THE ESSAYS THEREON IN THIS INVENTORY. THE JUDICIAL DISTRICTS FUNCTIONED TO THE END OF DECEMBER 1864.

COUNTY ORGANIZATION

THE FIRST TERRITORIAL ASSEMBLY, MEETING FROM SEPTEMBER 29 TO NOVEMBER 10, 1864, ADOPTED A MINING LAW, AND A GENERAL CODE OF LAWS, CALLED THE HOWELL CODE. PROVISION WAS MADE IN THE CODE FOR THE "FORMATION AND RIGHTS OF COUNTIES", WHICH WERE ESTABLISHED AS BODIES CORPORATE AND POLITIC FOR THE FOLLOWING PURPOSES: TO SUE AND BE SUED; TO PURCHASE AND HOLD REAL AND PERSONAL ESTATE FOR THE USE OF THE COUNTY; TO BORROW MONEY FOR THE PURPOSE OF ERECTING AND REPAIRING COUNTY BUILDINGS, AND FOR BUILDING OF BRIDGES; TO MAKE ALL NECESSARY CONTRACTS, AND TO DO ALL OTHER NECESSARY ACTS IN RELATION TO THE PROPERTY AND CONCERNS OF THE COUNTY (HOWELL CODE, P. 25, SEC. 3). THE FIRST COUNTY OFFICIALS TOOK OFFICE JANUARY 1, 1865.

CONGRESS PASSED THE ENABLING ACT IN 1910 (U. S. STATUTES AT LARGE, 1910, CH. 310), AND ARIZONA ENTERED THE UNION OF STATES IN 1912. THE STATE CONSTITUTION CONTINUED THE COUNTY AS A BODY POLITIC AND CORPORATE WITH SIMILAR POWERS (CONST., ART. 112, SEC. 1).

OFFICES

COUNTY OFFICES CREATED BY THE FIRST ASSEMBLY WERE AS FOL-LOWS: PROBATE JUDGE, SHERIFF AND RECORDER, WHO TOGETHER CON-STITUTED THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, AND JUSTICE OF THE PEACE, CORONER, CONSTABLE AND TREASURER. THE PROBATE JUDGE WAS CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS. THE RE-CORDER WAS CLERK OF THE BOARD, AND ALSO EX OFFICIO CLERK OF THE PROBATE COURT. THE SHERIFF WAS EX OFFICIO ASSESSOR AND EX OFFICIO TAX COLLECTOR. (HOWELL CODE, 1864, CH. 3-9). ALL COUNTY OFFICES WERE ELECTIVE EXCEPT THAT OF PROBATE JUDGE, WHO WAS APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR (IBID., P. 435). PIMA COUNTY WAS CONSTITUTED THE FIRST JUDICIAL DISTRICT (IBID., CH. 44, P. 286). THE JUDGE OF THE DISTRICT COURT CONTINUED TO BE AP-POINTED BY THE PRESIDENT AND ASSIGNED TO THE DISTRICT BY THE GOVERNOR AS BEFORE (IBID., CH. 45, PART 3). THE TERRITORIAL ATTORNEY-GENERAL, APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR, ACTED AS PROSE-CUTING ATTORNEY IN THE DISTRICT COURTS (IBID., CH. 16, SEC. 2).

ADMINISTRATIVE

THE OFFICE OF BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS WAS THE EXECUTIVE AND LEGISLATIVE AUTHORITY OF THE COUNTY, AND ADMINISTERED ITS FINANCIAL AFFAIRS (IBID., CH. 9). IN 1865 THIS BOARD WAS ABOLISHED. ITS DIRECT SUCCESSOR IN FUNCTIONS AND DUTIES WAS THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS, CONSISTING OF THREE ELECTIVE MEMBERS INDEPENDENT OF ANY OTHER OFFICE (L. 1865, P. 24, SEC. 1). THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS HAS CONTINUED TO THE PRESENT WITHOUT MATERIAL CHANGE BY SUBSEQUENT STATUTES AND THE STATE CONSTITUTION. COUNTIES EXERCISE THEIR POWERS ONLY THROUGH THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS (R. C. 1928, PARS. 760-761). THE BOARD EXERCISES GENERAL

SUPERVISION OVER ALL OTHER COUNTY OFFICES OTHER THAN THOSE PERTAINING TO THE SUPERIOR COURT; TABULATES AND CANVASSES ELECTION RETURNS; MANAGES THE COUNTY FINANCES; SUPERVISES CONSTRUCTION OF ROADS AND HIGHWAYS, COUNTY INSTITUTIONS, PUBLIC BUILDINGS AND PROPERTY; UNDER STATUTORY REGULATIONS FIXES THE RATE AND SUPERVISES COLLECTION OF TAXES; DENIES OR ALLOWS ALL CLAIMS AGAINST THE COUNTY; MANAGES FOR THE COUNTY ALL LITIGATION TO WHICH THE COUNTY IS A PARTY; AND UNDER ITS DELEGATED LEGISLATIVE AUTHORITY ENACTS ORDINANCES NECESSARY FOR THE PUBLIC PEACE AND SAFETY (L. 1931-32, 1st. S.S., CH. 7, PAR. 1).

THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS ALSO ACTS AS THE BOARD OF EQUALIZATION (L. 1865, P. 27, SEC. 11); EITHER ACTS AS, OR APPOINTS, A TEMPORARY COUNTY HIGHWAY COMMISSION (L. 1917, CH. 31; L. 1922, S. S. CH. 32, 32A); APPOINTS THE THREE MEMBERS OF THE COUNTY BOARD OF SOCIAL SECURITY AND PUBLIC WELFARE, ONE OF WHOM MUST BE A MEMBER OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS (L. 1937, CH. 69, SEC. 10, SUBD. A); APPOINTS THE COUNTY SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH (L. 1903, P. 100, SEC. 6), THE COUNTY ENGINEER (R. S. 1913, TITLE 10, CH. 13), AND MAY APPOINT AN IMMIGRATION COMMISSIONER, BUT DOES NOT IN PIMA COUNTY AT PRESENT (L. 1899, P. 57). THE CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS IS EX OFFICIO PRESIDENT OF THE COUNTY BOARD OF HEALTH (L. 1903, PP. 99-100, SECS. 6-7).

THE CLERK OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS IS THE MINISTERIAL AND SECRETARIAL OFFICER OF THE BOARD (L. 1865, P. 27, SEC. 12). HE IS ALSO EX OFFICIO CLERK OF THE BOARD OF EQUALIZATION (L. 1871, SECS. 18-19, PP. 97-98).

RECORDING

THE OFFICE OF RECORDER HAS ALWAYS EXERCISED THE FUNCTION OF RECORDING INSTRUMENTS REQUIRED OR PERMITTED BY LAW TO BE RECORDED (Howell Code, ch. 5). When the BOARD OF COUNTY COM-MISSIONERS WAS ABOLISHED, THE RECORDER CONTINUED TO ACT AS THE CLERK OF ITS SUCCESSOR OFFICE, THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS, UNTIL 1879 (L. 1879, p. 32, Sec. 6). IN 1866 REGISTRY OF MINES WAS TRANSFERRED FROM THE PROBATE COURT TO THE RECORDER (L. 1866, p. 31). THE RECORDER CEASED TO BE EX OFFICIO CLERK OF THE PROBATE COURT IN 1871, WHEN THE JUDGE THEREOF BECAME CLERK OF HIS COURT (L. 1871, p. 50). THE RECORDER REGISTERS ELECTORS OF THE COUNTY AND KEEPS THE SUFFRAGE RECORDS (L. 1933, Ch. 62, SEC. 2). ON NOTIFICATION BY THE CLERK OF SUPERIOR COURT, THE RECORDER WITH THE SHERIFF ATTENDS THE DRAWING OF JURORS (L. 1912, Ch. 3, p. 8).

JUDICIAL

THE FIRST JUDICIAL OFFICERS IN THE TERRITORY OF ARIZONA WERE THREE SUPREME COURT JUSTICES APPOINTED BY THE PRESIDENT (U. S. STATUTES AT LARGE, 1863, VOL 12, P. 664). EACH OF THESE JUSTICES WAS ASSIGNED TO HOLD COURT IN ONE OF THE THREE JUDICIAL DISTRICTS INTO WHICH THE TERRITORY WAS DIVIDED. PIMA COUNTY WAS ORIGINALLY CONSTITUTED THE FIRST DISTRICT (HOWELL

CODE, CH. 44, P. 286), AND REMAINED WITHIN THE FIRST DISTRICT DURING THE LIFE OF THE DISTRICT COURT. THE DISTRICT COURT HAD ORIGINAL JURISDICTION IN CIVIL AND CRIMINAL MATTERS ABOVE THE JURISDICTION OF THE JUSTICE OF THE PEACE (HOWELL CODE, 1864, P. 289; L. 1865, P. 24, SEOS. 2, 3). THIS JURISDICTION ALSO EXTENDED TO ALL ISSUES OF FACT JOINED IN THE PROBATE COURT AND TAKEN INTO THE DISTRICT COURT FOR TRIAL. THE DISTRICT COURT HAD APPELLATE JURISDICTION FROM ORDERS AND JUDGMENTS IN PROBATE COURT, AND IN APPEALS FROM JUSTICE OF THE PEACE COURTS (HOWELL CODE, 1864, P. 289).

The probate court had jurisdiction in all probate matters, mining controversies, and registry of mining claims. In 1865 jurisdiction in mining controversies was transferred to the district court (L. 1865, p. 44), while registry of mines was transferred to the recorder as above stated. Justices of the peace were given jurisdiction in minor misdemeanors and minor civil matters (L. 1865, p. 24, secs. 2, 3), which jurisdiction has continued with slight variation to the present.

IN 1885 THE COUNTY COURT OF PIMA COUNTY WAS CREATED, AND A JUDGE AND CLERK THEREOF, THE LATTER TO BE COUNTY CLERK AND EX OFFICIO CLERK OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS (L. 1885, P. 305). THE COUNTY COURT WAS GIVEN JURISDICTION IN CIVIL AND CRIMINAL MATTERS ABOVE THE LIMITED JURISDICTION OF JUSTICE OF THE PEACE COURTS AND EQUAL IN CONCURRENT COMMON LAW, EQUITABLE AND STATU-TORY JURISDICTION WITH THE DISTRICT COURT, AND JURISDICTION IN ALL MATTERS OF PROBATE, THE ACT PROVIDING FOR THE ABOLISHING OF THE PROBATE COURT ON JANUARY 1, 1887 (L. 1885, PP. 306-308). BUT IN 1887 THE LEGISLATURE REVERSED ITS ACTION BY ABOLISHING THE COUNTY COURT AND REESTABLISHING THE PROBATE COURT WITH ITS FORMER JURISDICTION. ALL PROBATE MATTERS PENDING IN THE COUNTY COURT WERE TRANSFERRED TO THE PROBATE COURT, AND ALL OTHER MATTERS TO THE DISTRICT COURT. (R. S. 1887, APPENDIX, p. 894, SECS. 18-22). THE STATE CONSTITUTION DID NOT PROVIDE FOR EITHER A DISTRICT OR PROBATE COURT. IN LIEU THEREOF IT CREAT-ED FOR EACH COUNTY A SUPERIOR COURT, WHICH SUPERSEDED THE DIS-TRICT COURT (CONST., ART. 22, SEC. 7), AND WAS GIVEN JURIS-DICTION IN PROBATE MATTERS (IBID., ART. 6, SEC. 6). CAUSES IN THE DISTRICT COURT, WHICH WOULD HAVE BEEN WITHIN THE EX-CLUSIVE JURISDICTION OF UNITED STATES COURTS, WERE EXCEPTED FROM THE JURISDICTION OF THE SUPERIOR COURT (CONST., ART. 22: SEC. 7). THE JUDGE OF THE SUPERIOR COURT IN PIMA COUNTY AP-POINTS A COURT COMMISSIONER (CONST., ART. 6, SEC. 19), A BAIL-IFF WHO IS A DEPUTY SHERIFF (R. S. 1913, TITLE 10, PAR. 2549), REPORTER (R. C. 1928, SECS. 3705-3707), AND MATRON OF THE DE-TENTION HOME FOR JUVENILES (L. 1919, CH. 103, SEC. 5). THE CLERK OF THE SUPERIOR COURT IS THE CHIEF CLERICAL OFFICER OF THE SUPERIOR COURT AND THE CUSTODIAN OF ITS RECORDS (R. S. 1913, SEC. 351).

IN 1887 THE RECORDER WAS REQUIRED TO ISSUE MARRIAGE LICENSES AND CERTIFICATES (R. S. 1887, TITLE 34, CH. 1), BUT IN 1889 THIS FUNCTION WAS TRANSFERRED TO THE CLERK OF THE PROBATE COURT (L. 1889, p. 58), AND IS NOW PERFORMED BY THE CLERK

OF SUPERIOR COURT (R. S. 1913, PARS. 3834, 3836), WHO ALSO KEEPS RECORDS OF NOTARIAL COMMISSIONS AND BONDS (IBID., PAR. 134, 136).

THE ELECTIVE OFFICE OF CORONER, WITH THE USUAL DUTIES OF INVESTIGATING DEATHS OF VIOLENCE OR SUSPECTED TO BE OF CRIMINAL NATURE, WAS AT FIRST AN INDEPENDENT OFFICE (Howell Code, CH. 4). In 1867 the office of public administrator was established. The public administrator was also ex officio coroner. (L. 1867, p. 29, sec. 1). This official acted as administrator of all estates except those of testates whose executors qualified (1910., p. 29, sec. 3). In 1887, however, the office of public administrator was abolished. The justice of the peace became ex officio coroner and has remained such to the present. (R. S. 1887, sec. 459).

FROM 1864 TO 1866 ALL CRIMINAL PROSECUTIONS WERE CONDUCTED BY THE TERRITORIAL ATTORNEY GENERAL (Howell Code, ch. 16, sec. 2). In 1866 THE ELECTIVE OFFICE OF DISTRICT ATTORNEY WAS CREATED FOR EACH COUNTY. This office was charged with the prosecution of all crime, prosecution or defense of all suits to which the county was a party, and gave legal advice to all public officers (L. 1866, pp. 22-24). It was succeeded at statehood by that of the county attorney (Const., art. 12, sec. 3) which has substantially the same functions and duties.

LAW ENFORCEMENT

THE SHERIFF, SINCE THE ORGANIZATION OF ARIZONA TERRITORY, HAS BEEN THE PRINCIPAL LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER OF THE COUNTY AND SERVER OF PROCESS FOR COURTS OF RECORD (HOWELL CODE, CH. 3). THE CONSTABLE, ALSO A PEACE OFFICER, IS THE MINISTERIAL OFFICER OF JUSTICE OF THE PEACE COURT (HOWELL CODE, CH. 8, SEC. 7, P. 42). WITH THE ENACTMENT OF LEGISLATION IN 1907 FOR PRO-MOTION OF THE WELFARE OF DEPENDENT, NEGLECTED, DELINQUENT AND INCORRIGIBLE CHILDREN, THERE WAS CREATED THE OFFICE OF JUVENILE PROBATION OFFICER TO BE APPOINTED BY THE JUDGE OF THE DISTRICT COURT AND TO ACT UNDER COURT SUPERVISION (L. 1907, CH. 78, SEC. 4). This officer, now appointed by the judge of superior court, HAS THE STATUS OF A PEACE OFFICER, AND IS REQUIRED TO KEEP A RECORD OF JUVENILE CASES (L. 1919, CH. 103, SECS. 1, 4). IN COUNTIES HAVING NO CRIMINAL DIVISION OF THE SUPERIOR COURT, THE OFFICES OF ADULT AND JUVENILE PROBATION OFFICERS ARE COMBINED UNDER THE LATER TITLE (L. 1927, CH. 69), AND THESE OFFICES ARE NOW SO CONDUCTED IN PIMA COUNTY. THE ADULT PROBATION OFFICER IS CHARGED WITH SEEING THAT PERSONS ADMITTED TO SUSPENDED SEN-TENCES PERFORM THE CONDITIONS IMPOSED BY THE COURT. HE IS ALSO REQUIRED TO KEEP A RECORD OF MATTERS PERTAINING TO SUCH CASES. (10.).

TAXATION

ON THE FORMATION OF COUNTY GOVERNMENT, THE SHERIFF WAS EXPOSFICIO TAX COLLECTOR AND EX OFFICIO ASSESSOR (HOWELL CODE, CH. 3, SEC. 18), WITH AUTHORITY TO HEAR COMPLAINTS AS TO, AND MAKE

NECESSARY CHANGES ON, THE TAX ROLL (IBID., CH. 33, SEC. 18). IN 1865 THE NEWLY CREATED BOARD OF SUPERVISORS WAS EMPOWERED TO ACT AS A BOARD OF EQUALIZATION (L. 1865, SEC. 11, P. 27). WHICH WAS MADE AN EX OFFICIO CAPACITY OF THE SUPERVISORS IN 1871. THE CLERK OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS BEING MADE EX OFFICIO CLERK OF THE BOARD OF EQUALIZATION (L. 1871, PP. 97-98. SECS. 18-19). THIS ARRANGEMENT HAS CONTINUED TO THE PRES-ENT. IN 1885 THE TERRITORIAL LEGISLATURE CREATED THE SEPARATE OFFICE OF ASSESSOR FOR PIMA COUNTY (L. 1885, SECS. 1-2, P. 178), AND MADE THE TREASURER EX OFFICIO TAX COLLECTOR (IBID., PP. 178-183), AN ARRANGEMENT WHICH ALSO HAS CONTINUED TO THE PRESENT TIME. AFTER MAKING UP THE YEARLY ASSESSMENT ROLL, THE ASSESSOR SENDS IT TO THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS, WHICH CONSIDERS MATTERS OF EQUALIZING ASSESSMENTS, AND THEREAFTER ASSESSES AND COMPUTES THE TAXES. AFTER FINAL REVIEW BY THE STATE BOARD OF EQUALIZATION, THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS SENDS THE ASSESSMENT AND TAX ROLL TO THE COUNTY TREASURER WITH WARRANT AFFIXED COMMANDING HIM TO COLLECT THE TAXES (R. C. 1928, SECS. 3085, 3086, 3091, 3093, 3094). RECENT LEGISLATURES HAVE TENDED TO USE THE TITLE OF TREASURER IN PROVISIONS FOR COLLECTION OF TAXES, RATHER THAN THAT OF TAX COLLECTOR. THE ASSESSOR COLLECTS TAXES ON PERSONAL PROPERTY UNSECURED BY REAL ESTATE (L. 1875, SEC. 16, P. 62). HE IS THE AGENT IN THE COUNTY OF THE MOTOR VEHICLE DIVISION OF THE STATE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT AND ISSUES AUTOMOBILE LICENSES AND DRIVERS' PERMITS (L. 1927, 4TH S. S., CH. 4, SEC. 5).

The county treasurer was required to receive, have custody of, and disburse all county funds by order of the board of county commissioners, later the board of supervisors, and under statutory authorization (Howell Code, 1864, ch. 6, secs. 5-10). Since 1885 in Pima County he has been ex officio tax collector (L. 1885, pp. 178-183). He is ex officio treasurer of irrigation and drainage districts (L. 1921, ch. 149, sec. 16, subd. A), and of the recently created Federal grazing districts (L. 1937, ch. 11, sec. 3B). In this office rests the power to collect taxes on personal property by distraint (R. C. 1928, par. 3112), and to sell real property on which taxes are delinquent (L. 1931, ch. 103).

EDUCATION

EDUCATION IN THE COUNTY IS UNDER THE SUPERVISION OF THE OFFICE OF COUNTY SCHOOL SUPERINTENDENT, WHICH WAS CREATED IN 1868 WITH POWERS AND DUTIES SIMILAR TO THOSE OF THE OFFICE TODAY (L. 1868, p. 42, ff.). IN 1871 THE PROBATE JUDGE WAS MADE EX OFFICIO SCHOOL SUPERINTENDENT (L. 1871, pp. 71-72), BUT BEGINNING IN 1899 SCHOOL SUPERINTENDENTS OF FIRST-CLASS COUNTIES, INCLUDING PIMA COUNTY, WERE MADE ELECTIVE FOR TWO-YEAR TERMS (L. 1897, p. 113). THE BASIS OF EDUCATION THROUGHOUT THE STATE IS THE SCHOOL DISTRICT. THE SCHOOL SUPERINTENDENT EXAMINES SCHOOLS IN THE COUNTY, EXCEPT SCHOOLS EMPLOYING A PRINCIPAL OR OTHER CITY SUPERINTENDENT, AND CONDUCTS TEACHERS' EXAMINATIONS. HE ALLOCATES SCHOOL DISTRICT SCHOOL FUNDS, AND, ON ORDERS OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF ANY DISTRICT, DRAWS WARRANTS ON THE

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COUNTY TREASURER AGAINST THE SCHOOL FUND OF SUCH DISTRICT, KEEP-ING A REGISTER OF SUCH WARRANTS (R. C. 1928, PARS. 992-993).

HEALTH

THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS WAS IN 1865 REQUIRED TO CARE FOR THE INDIGENT SICK (L. 1865, P. 26). TO THIS WERE ADDED THE DUTIES OF CARING FOR THE DEPENDENT POOR OF THE COUNTY, PROVID-ING OFFICE AND HOSPITAL THEREFOR, AND A FARM, AT THE BOARD'S DISCRETION, IN CONNECTION WITH THE COUNTY HOSPITAL (R. S. 1887, PAR. 397). IN 1903 THE COUNTY BOARD OF HEALTH WAS CREATED, THE OFFICERS AND MEMBERS OF WHICH ARE AS FOLLOWS: PRESIDENT, CHAIR+ MAN OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS; VICE-PRESIDENT, COUNTY ATTORNEY; SECRETARY, COUNTY SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH. THE SUPERIN-TENDENT IS APPOINTED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS (L. 1903, ACT 65, PP. 99-100, SECS. 6, 7). THE BOARD IS VESTED WITHIN ITS SPHERE WITH POWERS GRANTED TO THE STATE BOARD OF HEALTH, GEN-ERALLY THE PREVENTION AND CURE OF CONTAGIOUS DISEASES AMONG PER-SONS OR DOMESTIC ANIMALS, CONDEMNATION OF IMPURE FOODS, AND MAKING OF SANITARY REGULATIONS (R. C. 1928, PARS. 2679, 2683, 2686). THE BOARD HAS BROAD POWERS TO HOUSE AND GIVE MEDICAL CARE TO THE INDIGENT SICK (LBID., SEC. 811). THE COUNTY SUPER-INTENDENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH IS THE MINISTERIAL AND SECRETARIAL OFFICER OF THE BOARD, AND KEEPS A RECORD OF ITS PROCEEDINGS. HE REPORTS HIS OFFICIAL ACTS EACH MONTH TO THE STATE SUPERIN-TENDENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH, OR OFTENER WHENEVER THE HEALTH OF THE COMMUNITY IS ENDANGERED. (L. 1903, ACT 65, PP. 99-102). HE IS ALSO LOCAL REGISTRAR OF VITAL STATISTICS FOR THE TUCSON DISTRICT. THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS ALSO APPOINTS A COUNTY PHYSI-CIAN, WHO HAS CHARGE OF A CLINIC AND DISPENSARY LOCATED IN THE COURTHOUSE, AND APPOINTS THE SUPERINTENDENT OF THE PIMA COUNTY HOSPITALS

WELFARE WELFARE

IN 1917 THE BOARD OF CHILD WELFARE, THE MEMBERS OF WHICH WERE APPOINTED BY THE SUPERIOR COURT JUDGE, WAS CREATED AND EMPOWERED TO GRANT RELIEF TO CHILDREN OF WIDOWED MOTHERS (L. 1917, CH. 70, SECS. 1-5), WHICH WAS EXTENDED IN 1921 TO IN-CLUDE ANY ORPHAN, WAIF, ABANDONED OR NEGLECTED CHILD (L. 1921, CH. 53, SEC. 12).

THIS BOARD WAS ABOLISHED IN 1933 (L. 1933, CH. 35, SEC, 12) WHEN STATE AND COUNTY BOARDS OF PUBLIC WELFARE WERE CREATED WHICH TOOK OVER WELFARE AND RELIEF FUNCTIONS, INCLUDING THOSE RELATING TO CHILDREN. THE MEMBERS OF THE COUNTY BOARD WERE APPOINTED BY THE STATE BOARD AND FUNCTIONED UNDER ITS SUPERVISION. (L. 1933, CH. 35, SEC. 10). IN THE SAME YEAR THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS WAS CONSTITUTED THE COUNTY OLD AGE PENSION COMMISSION, WHICH RECEIVED AND ACTED ON APPLICATIONS FOR SUCH PENSIONS (L. 1933, CH. 34). IN 1937 BOTH THE STATE AND COUNTY BOARDS OF PUBLIC WELFARE (L. 1937, CH. 69, SEC. 16), AND THE COUNTY OLD AGE PENSION COMMISSION (IBID., CH. 70, SEC. 28), WERE ABOLISHED ON CREATION OF THE PRESENT STATE AND COUNTY BOARDS OF SOCIAL SECURITY AND PUBLIC WELFARE (L. 1937,

CH. 69, P. 298). THE COUNTY BOARD, COMPOSED OF ONE MEMBER OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS, AND TWO MEMBERS APPOINTED BY THE SUPERVISORS, ACTS DIRECTLY UNDER THE SUPERVISION OF THE STATE BOARD, ASSISTING THE STATE BOARD IN ADMINISTRATION OF WELFARE AND RELIEF. (IBID., SEC. 10, SUBD. A). THE STATE BOARD ADMINISTERS THE ACTS FOR ASSISTING THE NEEDY BLIND (IBID., CH. 71), ASSISTING DEPENDENT CHILDREN (IBID., CH. 72), AND FOR OLD AGE ASSISTANCE (IBID., CH. 70). THE BOARD SUPERVISES THE TUBERCULOSIS PREVENTORIUM FOR CHILDREN, WHICH IS UNDER MEDICAL DIRECTION OF THE COUNTY SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH.

ROADS AND SURVEYING

COUNTY ROADS AND HIGHWAYS ARE UNDER CONTROL OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS (L. 1865, SEC. 8, SUBD. 4, P. 26). IN 1868 THE ELECTIVE OFFICE OF COUNTY SURVEYOR WAS CREATED. THE COUNTY SURVEYOR CONDUCTED SURVEYS AS REQUIRED BY LAW, KEEPING A REC-ORD OF THE PLAT AND FIELD NOTES OF EACH SURVEY, WHICH HE DE-LIVERED TO HIS SUCCESSOR. (L. 1868, PP. 22-23). IN 1871 THE LEGISLATURE WAS AUTHORIZED TO DIVIDE THE COUNTY INTO ROAD DIS-TRICTS AND APPOINT A ROAD OVERSEER FOR EACH DISTRICT. WITHIN HIS DISTRICT, THE ROAD OVERSEER COLLECTED ROAD TAXES. HE SUPERVISED IMPROVEMENTS ON COUNTY ROADS, AND LET MINOR CONTRACTS FOR THE CONSTRUCTION AND REPAIR THEREOF. (L. 1871, pp. 116, 117). IN 1909 THIS OFFICE WAS ABOLISHED (L. 1909, CH. 63, SEC. 3) AND THE OFFICE OF SUPERINTENDENT OF ROADS CREATED. THE CON-STITUTION CONTINUED THE OFFICE OF SURVEYOR AND COUNTY SUPERIN-TENDENT OF ROADS (CONST., ART. 12, SEC. 3), BUT BOTH WERE AB-OLISHED EFFECTIVE JANUARY 1, 1915 (R. S. 1913, TITLE 10, CH. 13), AND THE OFFICE OF COUNTY ENGINEER CREATED. THE COUNTY ENGINEER IS APPOINTED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS AND HAS CHARGE OF CONSTRUCTING ROADS AND OF OTHER ENGINEERING UNDER-TAKINGS OF THE COUNTY UNDER DIRECTION OF THE BOARD, AND FURN-ISHES MAPS AND PLANS AS THE BOARD MAY REQUIRE (R. C. 1928, SEC. 883). IN 1917, PROVISION WAS MADE FOR A COUNTY HIGHWAY COM-MISSION (L. 1917, CH. 31). WHENEVER A COUNTY BOND ISSUE FOR HIGHWAY CONSTRUCTION OR IMPROVEMENT IS FOR TWO MILLION DOLLARS OR MORE, THE BOARD IS REQUIRED TO APPOINT A COMMISSION OF THREE MEMBERS; IF FOR A SUM LESS THAN TWO MILLION DOLLARS, THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS IS EX OFFICIO COUNTY HIGHWAY COMMISSION (R. C. 1928, PARS. 1709-1710).

RURAL ECONOMY

IN 1915 THE LEGISLATURE (L. 1915, CH. 25) ACCEPTED THE ADVANTAGES OF THE SMITH-LEVER ACT PASSED BY CONGRESS IN 1914 (U.
S. STATUTES AT LARGE, VOL. 38, PART 1, P. 372). PURSUANT TO
THIS LEGISLATION, A COUNTY AGRICULTURAL AGENT AND A HOME DEMONSTRATION AGENT ARE APPOINTED BY THE EXTENSION SERVICE OF THE
COLLEGE OF AGRICULTURE OF THE UNIVERSITY OF ARIZONA, WITH APPROVAL OF THE BOARD OF REGENTS. THE DUTIES OF THE AGENTS CONSIST OF DIFFUSING AMONG THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE USEFUL INFORMATION ON AGRICULTURE, HOME ECONOMICS AND RURAL LIFE, WITH PRACTICAL DEMONSTRATIONS OF THE SAME. THE AGENTS ARE LOCATED IN
THE SAME OFFICE, FOR THE ADMINISTRATION OF WHICH THE COUNTY AGRICULTURAL AGENT IS RESPONSIBLE. THE PIMA COUNTY AGENTS ALSO

ACT FOR THE ADJOINING SANTA CRUZ COUNTY. APPROPRIATIONS ARE MADE BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS TO THE BOARD OF REGENTS FOR THIS WORK.

PRESENT STRUCTURE

IN THE PRESENT STRUCTURE OF COUNTY GOVERNMENT IN ARIZONA, THE COUNTY HAS LOST NONE OF ITS POWERS AND IMPORTANCE AS A LOCAL GOVERNMENTAL UNIT. IN FACT, THE TREND HAS BEEN TOWARD EXPANSION OF ITS FUNCTIONS.

WITH THE EXCEPTION OF THE OFFICES OF CLERK OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS, COUNTY ENGINEER, COUNTY SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH, COUNTY BOARD OF SOCIAL SECURITY AND PUBLIC WELFARE, JUVENILE PROBATION OFFICER, AND CERTAIN MINOR OFFICIALS, ALL OFFICES IN PIMA COUNTY ARE NOW FILLED BY ELECTION. THE EXCEPTIONS NAMED ARE FILLED BY APPOINTMENT BY ELECTED COUNTY OFFICIALS.

ALL ELECTIVE OFFICIALS OF THE COUNTY ARE ELECTED ON A COUNTY-WIDE BASIS, EXCEPT THE MEMBERS OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS, WHO ARE ELECTED FROM SUPERVISORIAL DISTRICTS, AND THE JUSTICE OF THE PEACE AND CONSTABLE, WHO ARE ELECTED FROM PRECINCTS. ELECTIVE OFFICIALS SERVE TWO-YEAR TERMS, EXCEPT THE JUDGE AND THE CLERK OF SUPERIOR COURT, WHO SERVE FOUR-YEAR TERMS. COUNTY OFFICIALS, LIKE ALL OTHER OFFICIALS OF ARIZONA, ARE SUBJECT TO RECALL ON PETITION OF THE ELECTORATE (CONST., ART. 8, SEC. 1). ON PAGE 18 IS A CHART SHOWING PRESENT (1938) OFFICES OF PIMA COUNTY.

RECORD SYSTEM

RECORD-KEEPING DUTIES OF EACH OFFICE WILL BE DISCUSSED IN THE SECTION OF THIS INVENTORY DEVOTED TO THE OFFICE. PROVISIONS HAVE BEEN MADE FOR THE QUALITY OF PAPER ON WHICH THE PERMANENT PUBLIC RECORDS OF ALL COUNTY OFFICES SHALL BE KEPT, FOR THE MANNER OF THE TRANSCRIPTION OF SUCH RECORDS WHEN NECCESSARY, AND THE RESTORATION THEREOF WHEN LOST OR DESTROYED.

Paper used must be grade number one ledger or bond paper, the content of which is one hundred per cent new rags, white, cream or unbleached (L. 1931, ch. 48, sec. 1). Whenever records or indexes of the county are in a condition endangering their preservation, the board of supervisors is authorized to procure good and well-bound books and require the recorder to transcribe the endangered records or indexes into such books, with standard ink of a permanent black color. The contents and designation of such transcribed records are required to conform exactly with the originals. At the conclusion of the transcription the recorder is required to gertify the correctness thereof. Such transcribed record has the same force and effect as the original records. The recorder is required to keep the originals as other archives of his

OFFICE. (R. C. 1928, PAR. 2751). THESE PROVISIONS ARE MADE APPLICABLE TO CLERKS OF COURTS OF RECORD AND OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS IN RESPECT TO THEIR OWN RECORDS (IBID., PAR. 2751).

RESTORATION OF RECORDS

RESTORATION AND SUBSTITUTION OF LOST OR DESTROYED INSTRU-MENTS AND RECORDS REQUIRED OR PERMITTED BY LAW TO BE ACKNOWL-EDGED OR RECORDED, OR ANY JUDGMENT, ORDER OR DECREE OF A COURT OF RECORD, OR THE RECORDS OR MINUTES THEREOF, MAY BE EFFECTED THROUGH AN ACTION IN THE SUPERIOR COURT OF THE COUNTY IN WHICH THE LOSS OR DESTRUCTION OCCURRED. THE ACTION MUST BE TAKEN BY THE PLAINTIFF AGAINST THE PARTIES INTERESTED IN THE INSTRUMENT, OR ADVERSE TO THE PLAINTIFF AT THE TIME OF THE RENDITION OF THE JUDGMENT, OR AGAINST THE HEIRS OR LEGAL REPRESENTATIVES OF such parties (IBID., par. 2752). If the action is sustained BY THE COURT, A JUDGMENT IS ENTERED WHICH CONTAINS A DESCRIP-TION OF THE CONTENTS OF THE LOST OR DESTROYED RECORD. A CER-TIFIED COPY OF SUCH JUDGMENT MAY BE RECORDED, AND STANDS IN THE PLACE OF THE ORIGINAL INSTRUMENT WITH THE SAME FORCE AND EFFECT (IBID., PAR. 2753). THE SAME APPLIES TO THE RECORDS OF A COUNTY FROM WHICH A NEW COUNTY WAS CREATED, WHEN THE LOSS OF THE ORIGINAL HAS BEEN ESTABLISHED (IBID., PAR. 2754).

When original papers have been preserved, but the records thereof Lost or destroyed, they may again be recorded within four years of date of the Loss or destruction of such records, and the last registration has the same force and effect from the date of the original registration. Certified copies from any record so authorized to be made may be received in evidence with the same effect as certified copies of the original record (1810., par. 2755).

STATE SUPERVISION

THE KEEPING OF ACCOUNTS OF COUNTY OFFICES IS SUPERVISED BY THE STATE THROUGH THE OFFICE OF THE STATE EXAMINER, CREATED IN 1912 (L. 1912, 1st S. S., CH. 17). THE STATE EXAMINER IS APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR. HE HAS POWER TO ORDER AND ENFORCE A CORRECT AND UNIFORM SYSTEM OF BOOKKEEPING BY COUNTY OFFICERS AND TO INSTRUCT THEM IN THE PROPER MODE OF KEEPING THE ACCOUNTS OF THEIR OFFICES. HE ASCERTAINS THE FINANCIAL STANDING OF THE SURETIES ON THE OFFICIAL BONDS OF COUNTY OFFICERS, AND MAY RE-JECT SUCH SURETIES AND REQUIRE NEW BONDS TO BE FILED. HE MAY REQUIRE COUNTY TREASURERS AND CUSTODIANS OF COUNTY FUNDS TO MAKE A VERIFIED STATEMENT OF THEIR ACCOUNTS WHENEVER HE DEEMS IT NECESSARY. HE VISITS EACH COUNTY SEAT AT LEAST TWICE A YEAR, AT IRREGULAR INTERVALS, WITHOUT NOTICE, AND INVESTIGATES THE BOOKS, ACCOUNTS AND VOUCHERS OF ALL COUNTY AND PRECINCT OFFICERS AT LEAST ONCE A YEAR, ASCERTAINING IN DETAIL THE VAR-IOUS ITEMS OF RECEIPTS AND EXPENDITURES. HE INSPECTS AND VERI-FIES THE CHARACTER AND AMOUNT OF ALL MONEYS, SECURITIES AND

GOVERNMENTAL ORGANIZATION AND RECORDS SYSTEM

OTHER ASSETS HELD BY SUCH OFFICERS AND GUSTODIANS ON PUBLIC ACCOUNT, AND ASCERTAINS THE CHARACTER AND AMOUNT OF ALL CLAIMS BY, OR ALLOWANCE TO, SUCH OFFICERS, AND REPORTS TO THE ATTORNEY GENERAL THE REFUSAL OR NEGLECT OF ANY COUNTY OFFICER TO OBEY HIS INSTRUCTIONS. HE REPORTS TO THE GOVERNOR THE RESULTS OF HIS EXAMINATIONS AS OFTEN AS REQUIRED BY THE PUBLIC INTEREST. THE GOVERNOR MAY TAKE SUCH ACTION FOR THE PUBLIC SAFETY AS THE EXIGENCY MAY DEMAND, AND MAY SUSPEND ANY SUCH OFFICER FROM THE FURTHER PERFORMANCE OF HIS DUTIES. (R. C. 1928, SEC. 2910). ALL COUNTY AND PRECINCT OFFICERS ARE REQUIRED TO AFFORD ALL REASONABLE AND NEEDED FACILITIES, AND TO MAKE RETURNS AND EXHIBITS, TO THE STATE EXAMINER UNDER OATH AND IN SUCH FORM AS HE MAY PRESCRIBE (IBID., SEC. 2911).


THE STATE EXAMINER IS REQUIRED TO BE A PUBLIC ACCOUNTANT, VERSED IN BOOKKEEPING, AND MUST GIVE BOND IN THE SUM OF TEN THOUSAND DOLLARS (IBID., SEC. 2909).

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3. HOUSING, CARE, AND ACCESSIBILITY OF THE RECORDS

THE RECORDS OF PIMA COUNTY ARE HOUSED IN A MODERN THREE-STORY COURTHOUSE, BUILT OF REINFORCED CONCRETE AND HOLLOW BRICK, ERECTED IN 1928 AT TUCSON, THE COUNTY SEAT. THE BUILD-ING IS NINETY-FIVE PER CENT FIREPROOF AND IS PROTECTED AGAINST FLOODS.

Some of the Earlier Records, Badly Damaged by water while stored in the Basement of the Former Courthouse Building, were rendered useless and discarded. A few of the Early Unbound Records were deposited in the University of Arizona Library. Tucson, at the time of Removal from the Old Courthouse. Some Early Records are also kept by the Arizona Pioneers Historical Society at Tucson. These records have been included in the Inventory. The Current Records are kept in the Respective Offices; other active Records are shelved in Adjacent Vaults. The Older Records are Removed to a Basement Vault.

COUNTY OFFICES HOUSED ON THE FIRST FLOOR OF THE COURT-HOUSE ARE THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS, RECORDER, JUSTICE OF THE PEACE COURT OF TUCSON PRECINCT, SHERIFF, ASSESSOR, TREASURER, SCHOOL SUPERINTENDENT, COUNTY BOARD OF PUBLIC HEALTH, COUNTY PHYSICIAN, AND COUNTY ENGINEER. ON THE SECOND FLOOR ARE OFFICES OF THE JUDGE OF SUPERIOR COURT, CLERK OF SUPERIOR COURT, COUNTY ATTORNEY, JUVENILE PROBATION OFFICER, THE COUNTY LAW LIBRARY AND THE COUNTY JAIL, THE LATTER OCCUPYING ALSO THE THIRD FLOOR OF THE NORTH WING OF THE BUILDING AND PART OF THE THIRD FLOOR OF THE CENTRAL PORTION. IN THE DOME ARE HOUSED, IN THE SAME OFFICE, THE COUNTY AGRICULTURAL AGENT AND HOME DEMONSTRATION AGENT. IN THE BASEMENT IS THE PIMA COUNTY DIS-PENSARY, AND ALSO AN OFFICE OF THE STATE HIGHWAY PATROL. A DETENTION HOME FOR JUVENILES IS MAINTAINED AT 332 EAST FOURTH STREET, TUCSON. THE PIMA COUNTY HOSPITAL AND PIMA COUNTY PREVENTORIUM ARE LOCATED AT TUCSON. ALL OFFICES IN THE COURT-HOUSE ARE EQUIPPED WITH MODERN FURNITURE, FILING CABINETS, AND LIGHTING FACILITIES. ACCOMMODATIONS FOR USERS ARE FAIRLY ADEQUATE.

THE RECORDS IN THE MAIN DEPARTMENTAL OFFICES ARE KEPT IN STEEL SHELVING AND STEEL FILE DRAWERS, AND ARE MADE READILY ACCESSIBLE TO ALL THROUGH THE SERVICES OF THE OFFICIALS IN CHARGE, THE BASEMENT VAULT IS IN AN OVERCROWDED CONDITION AND NEEDS BETTER FILING EQUIPMENT. THE EARLIER RECORDS STORED IN THIS VAULT ARE NOW BEING ARRANGED AND LABELED. WHEN THIS WORK IS COMPLETED, THESE RECORDS WILL BE MORE ACCESSIBLE.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

THE BASIC PRINCIPLE ON WHICH THIS BOOK IS ARRANGED IS THAT OF GOVERNMENTAL FUNCTION. THERE IS HEREIN A SEPARATE NUMBERED SECTION FOR EACH COUNTY OFFICE. THESE OFFICES ARE GROUPED BY FUNCTIONS, SUCH AS ADMINISTRATIVE, JUDICIAL, AND LAW ENFORCEMENT. THE SEQUENCE OF THE GROUPS THEMSELVES ALSO IS ON A FUNCTIONAL BASIS; THE JUDICIAL GROUP, FOR EXAMPLE, IS FOLLOWED BY THAT FOR LAW ENFORCEMENT. WITHIN THIS FRAMEWORK, THE GOVERNMENTAL PROCESS IS FOLLOWED AS CLOSELY AS POSSIBLE. IN THE TAXATION GROUP, FOR EXAMPLE, THE OFFICE OF ASSESSOR IS FIRST, FOLLOWED BY THE BOARD OF EQUALIZATION, THEN TAX COL-LECTOR, AND LAST THE AGENT OF THE MOTOR VEHICLE DIVISION OF THE STATE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT. IN THE SECTION FOR EACH OFFICE, THE ENTRIES FOR ITS EXTANT RECORDS ARE ARRANGED UNDER SUB-JECT AND SUB-HEADINGS IN THE ORDER OF THE OFFICE PROCEDURE. IN THE COURT SECTIONS, FOR EXAMPLE, THE ENTRIES FOR CASE FILES ARE FIRST AND THE JUDGMENT BOOK LAST, WITH INTERVENING ENTRIES IN THE ORDER OF COURT BUSINESS. WHERE FUNCTIONAL TREATMENT IS NOT POSSIBLE, ENTRIES ARE ARRANGED IN ORDER OF IMPORTANCE. IN ACCORDANCE WITH ARCHIVAL PRINCIPLES, RECORDS ARE LISTED UNDER THE OFFICE OF ISSUE, WITH CERTAIN EXCEPTIONS. REPORTS FROM ONE OFFICE TO ANOTHER, AND RECORDS INITIATED BY ONE OR MORE OFFICES AND ADDED TO AND COMPLETED BY ANOTHER OFFICE, ARE LISTED UNDER THE OFFICE FINALLY RECEIVING THEM.

IN THE RECORD ENTRIES, TITLES OF RECORDS ARE GIVEN EXACTLY AS THEY ARE ON THE RECORDS THEMSELVES. IF THIS TITLE IS VAGUE OR MISLEADING, THE EDITORS HAVE ADDED EXPLANATORY WORDS IN LOWER CASE WITHIN PARENTHESES, ADJOINING OR BREAKING INTO THE EXACT TITLE, AS THE NEED MAY BE. IF THERE IS NO TITLE ON THE OUTSIDE OF THE VOLUME, FILE BOX OR OTHER CONTAINER, A TITLE IS ASSIGNED BY THE EDITORS, AND IS GIVEN IN UPPER CASE WITHIN PARENTHESES. MOST RECENT TITLE IS GIVEN, EARLIER TITLES BEING SHOWN AS VARIATIONS.

IF THE RECORDS, IN VOLUME OR UNBOUND FORM, ARE LABELED, SUCH LABELING IS SHOWN IN PARENTHESES IMMEDIATELY FOLLOWING THE QUANTITY ITEM IN THE TITLE LINE OF THE ENTRY. IF THE LABELING IS COMPLEX, IT IS DESCRIBED IN A SEPARATE PARAGRAPH IMMEDIATELY FOLLOWING THE TITLE LINE. THE WORDS "NUMBERED" OR "LETTERED" ARE OMITTED.

IF THE INDEX IS CONTAINED WITHIN THE RECORD, IT IS DE-SCRIBED IN THE RECORD ENTRY. IF THE INDEX IS SEPARATE, REFER-ENCE TO IT IS MADE IN THE ENTRY FOR THE RECORD WHICH THE INDEX SERVES. ABBREVIATIONS, SYMBOLS, AND (FIRST ENTRY, P. 28) EXPLANATORY NOTES

THE CONDITION OF RECORDS SHOULD BE ASSUMED TO BE GOOD UN-LESS OTHERWISE SPECIFIED IN THE ENTRIES.

AS ALL MEASUREMENTS OF RECORDS GIVEN IN THIS BOOK ARE IN INCHES, THE SYMBOL FOR INCHES (") HAS BEEN OMITTED AFTER THE NUMBERS. THE DIMENSIONS FOR VOLUMES AND BUNDLES ARE GIVEN IN THE SEQUENCE OF HEIGHT, WIDTH, THICKNESS; FOR FILE CASES, BOXES AND OTHER CONTAINERS, IN THE SEQUENCE OF HEIGHT, WIDTH, DEPTH.

THE AVERAGE SIZE OF VOLUMES AND FILE DRAWERS IS GIVEN IN THE ENTRIES WHEN THERE IS MODERATE VARIATION. WHEN THE VARIA-TION IS EXTREME, THE TWO EXTREMES ARE LISTED.

LOCATION OF RECORDS IS THAT AT THE TIME THE SURVEY WAS MADE. UNLESS OTHERWISE DESIGNATED, RECORDS ARE LOCATED IN THE COUNTY COURTHOUSE. WHEN THE TERM "OFFICE" OR "VAULT" IS USED. IT SIGNIFIES THAT THE RECORD IS LOCATED IN THE OFFICE UNDER WHICH THE ENTRY IS LISTED. IF LOCATED ELSEWHERE, THE LOCATION IS FULLY SPECIFIED.

TITLE-LINE CROSS REFERENCES ARE USED IN ORDER TO COMPLETE A RECORD SERIES WHICH HAS BEEN KEPT INDEPENDENTLY FOR A PERIOD OF TIME, AND IN OTHER RECORDS FOR DIFFERENT PERIODS OF TIME. THEY ARE ALSO USED IN ALL ARTIFICIAL ENTRIES, WHICH ARE MADE FOR RECORDS THAT HAVE BEEN KEPT IN OTHER FILES OR RECORDS AP-PEARING ELSEWHERE IN THE INVENTORY. IN BOTH INSTANCES, THE DESCRIPTION OF THE MASTER ENTRY SHOWS THE TITLE AND ENTRY NUM-BER OF THE RECORD FROM WHICH THE CROSS REFERENCE IS MADE. DATES SHOWN IN THE DESCRIPTION OF THE MASTER ENTRY ARE ONLY FOR THE PART OR PARTS OF THE RECORD CONTAINED THEREIN, AND ARE SHOWN ONLY WHEN THEY VARY FROM THOSE OF THE MASTER ENTRY.

THIRD PARAGRAPH CROSS REFERENCES BETWEEN ENTRIES, AND "SEE ALSO" REFERENCES UNDER SUBJECT AND SUB-HEADINGS, ARE USED TO SHOW PRIOR, SUBSEQUENT, OR RELATED RECORDS NOT PART OF THE SAME SERIES.

THE TERM "REVISED STATUTES" REFERS TO CIVIL CODE UNLESS OTHERWISE SPECIFIED.

1. BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

THE FIRST TERRITORIAL ASSEMBLY CREATED THE ORIGINAL COUNTIES, INCLUDING PIMA, AND ENACTED PROVISIONS FOR THE GOVERNMENTAL ORGANIZATION AND RECORDS SYSTEM OF COUNTIES. IT PROVIDED FOR ADMINISTRATION OF LOCAL AFFAIRS BY CREATING FOR EACH COUNTY A BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS COMPOSED OF THE PROBATE JUDGE, THE SHERIFF, AND THE RECORDER, WHO WERE REQUIRED TO MEET AT THE OFFICE OF THE RECORDER TO TRANSACT THE COUNTY'S BUSINESS. THE PROBATE JUDGE WAS EX OFFICIO CHAIRMAN, AND THE RECORDER, OR HIS DEPUTY, EX OFFICIO CLERK OF THE BOARD. THE BOARD WAS REQUIRED TO EXAMINE THE RECORDS OF THE TREASURER'S OFFICE, AND IN THE EVENT OF MALFEASANCE ON HIS PART, TO DISCHARGE HIM AND APPOINT A SUCCESSOR; TO KEEP THE COURTHOUSE AND OTHER PUBLIC BUILDINGS IN PROPER REPAIR; TO PROVIDE AMPLE JAIL FACILITIES; AND TO PUBLISH A FINANCIAL STATEMENT OF AFFAIRS OF THE COUNTY. (HOWELL CODE, 1864, CH. 9).

THE BOARD HAD POWER TO PURCHASE REAL ESTATE FOR COUNTY BUILDINGS; DETERMINE THE SITES OF BUILDINGS; SELL OR LEASE REAL ESTATE BELONGING TO THE COUNTY; ERECT COUNTY BUILDINGS OR RENT SUITABLE BUILDINGS FOR COUNTY OFFICES; BORROW MONEY OR RAISE MONEY BY TAXATION, UNDER LIMITATIONS; FIX COMPENSA-TION FOR SERVICES RENDERED; ADJUST CLAIMS AGAINST THE COUNTY; SUPERVISE OTHER OFFICES OF THE COUNTY; REPRESENT THE COUNTY AND HAVE CARE AND MANAGEMENT OF ALL COUNTY BUSINESS NOT OTHER-WISE PROVIDED FOR; INCORPORATE VILLAGES; FILL VACANCIES IN THE OFFICE OF CONSTABLE; ESTABLISH ELECTION PRECINCTS; CONTROL COUNTY ROADS AND EXERCISE THE RIGHT OF EMINENT DOMAIN IN SECUR-ING LAND NEEDED FOR ROADS OR OTHER COUNTY PURPOSES; AND APPROVE OR DISAPPROVE THE BONDS OF OTHER COUNTY OFFICERS (ID.). THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS WAS CONSTITUTED TRUSTEES OF PUB-LIC SCHOOLS (L. 1864, PP. 41-42, SEC. 6). ON ORDER OF THE GOV-ERNOR, WHO WAS COMMANDER-IN-CHIEF OF THE MILITIA, THE BOARD DRAFTED PERSONS FOR MILITARY DUTY (HOWELL CODE, CH. 21, SEC. 13). THE MINUTE BOOK OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS IN PIMA COUNTY BEGINS FEBRUARY 1, 1865, AND ENDS MARCH 10, 1866.

IN 1865 THE ASSEMBLY ABOLISHED BOARDS OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS AND CREATED BOARDS OF SUPERVISORS FOR THE SEVERAL COUNTIES, COMPOSED OF THREE MEMBERS ELECTED FOR A TERM OF THREE YEARS, AND TO BE INDEPENDENT OF ANY OTHER OFFICE. MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS IN PIMA COUNTY BEGIN MARCH 19, 1866 AND CONTINUE TO THE PRESENT. ALL THE POWERS AND DUTIES CONFERRED UPON THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS WERE MADE PREROGATIVES OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS, BUT THE ALLOWING AND AUDITING OF ITS OWN ACCOUNTS WAS BY THE ACT MADE A DUTY OF THE PROBATE JUDGE, WHO ALSO WAS REQUIRED TO CANVASS ELECTION RETURNS FOR THE BOARD. REGULAR MEETINGS OF THE BOARD WERE TO BE HELD ON THE FIRST MONDAY OF JANUARY, APRIL, JULY, AND OCTOBER, AND TO CONTINUE FROM TIME TO TIME UNTIL THE DISPOSAL OF ALL BUSINESS. THE BOARD WAS EMPOWERED TO EXAMINE, SETTLE AND ALLOW ALL

ACCOUNTS LEGALLY CHARGEABLE AGAINST THE COUNTY, AND TO LEVY TAXES ON THE ASSESSED VALUATION OF PROPERTY IN THE COUNTY. IT WAS ALSO REQUIRED TO CONTROL THE PROSECUTION AND DEFENSE OF ALL SUITS TO WHICH THE COUNTY WAS A PARTY, TO CANVASS AND DECLARE ELECTION RETURNS, TO ACT AS A BOARD OF EQUALIZATION IN MATTERS OF TAXATION. (L. 1865, PP. 24-27). IN 1871 THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS WAS MADE EX OFFICIO THE BOARD OF EQUALIZATION, AND ITS CLERK WAS MADE EX OFFICIO CLERK OF THE BOARD OF EQUALIZATION. (L. 1871, PP. 97-98, SECS. 18-19).

WHEN PROVISION FOR PUBLIC SCHOOLS WAS MADE IN 1868, BOARDS OF SUPERVISORS IN THE SEVERAL COUNTIES WERE CONSTITUTED BOARDS OF EDUCATION, AND WERE GIVEN MANY OF THE POWERS AND DUTIES OF THE PRESENT STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION (L. 1868, P. 42, FF.). THE ACT CREATING A TERRITORIAL BOARD OF EDUCATION, HOWEVER TRANSFERRED TO THIS CENTRAL BOARD SUCH PREROGATIVES, AND RE-PEALED THE PROVISIONS OF THE EARLIER STATUTE CONFERRING THESE FUNCTIONS UPON BOARDS OF SUPERVISORS (L. 1871, Pp. 68-78). FOUR YEARS LATER THE BOARD WAS EMPOWERED TO LEVY ANNUALLY A school TAX (L. 1875, P. 80, SEC. 2) THE BOARD WAS AUTHORIZED, IN 1887, BY ORDINANCE ADOPTED AT LEAST THREE MONTHS PRIOR TO A GENERAL ELECTION, TO DISUNITE OR CONSOLIDATE ANY OF THE FOL-LOWING COUNTY OFFICES: SHERIFF AND TAX COLLECTOR; SHERIFF AND ASSESSOR; SHERIFF, ASSESSOR AND TAX COLLECTOR; TREASURER AND TAX COLLECTOR; ASSESSOR AND TAX COLLECTOR (R. S. 1887, PARS. 460, 461).

IN 1868 THE PROBATE JUDGE WAS REQUIRED TO MAKE APPOINT-MENTS TO FILL VACANCIES IN THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS (L. 1868, P. 40). IN 1877 THE PROBATE JUDGE WAS REQUIRED TO DO THIS IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS AND THE TREASURER (L. 1877, P. 105, AND LATER WITH THE REMAINING BOARD MEMBERS (R. S. 1901; TITLE 14, CH. 2, P. 964). IN 1873 THE LEGISLATURE PROVIDED FOR TWO-YEAR TERMS FOR TWO MEM-BERS AND A FOUR-YEAR TERM FOR THE THIRD MEMBER, TO BE DETER-MINED BY LOT (L. 1873, P. 46). LATER THE MEMBER RECEIVING THE HIGHEST NUMBER OF VOTES HELD OFFICE FOR FOUR YEARS, AND THE OTHERS FOR TWO YEARS (R. S. 1901, PART 963). THE STATE CONSTITUTION PROVIDED FOR A BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THREE MEMBERS TO BE ELECTED, WHOSE DUTIES SHOULD BE PRESCRIBED BY LAW (CONST., ART. 12, SEO. 3). THE FIRST STATE LEGISLATURE MADE THE TERMS OF OFFICE THE SAME AS HAD BEEN PROVIDED IN 1901, AND REQUIRED THE FIRST BOARDS AFTER STATEHOOD TO DIVIDE THEIR RESPECTIVE COUNTIES INTO SUPERVISORIAL DISTRICTS AND REFER THE MATTER TO THE ELECTORS (R. S. 1913, PARS. 2400-2401). IT WAS PROVIDED THAT VACANCIES IN THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS SHOULD BE FILLED BY THE REMAINING SUPERVISORS, TOGETHER WITH THE COUNTY RECORDER, OR IF THERE WERE NO SUPERVISORS, BY THE SHERIFF, TREASURER AND RECORDER (R. S. 1913, SEC. 2405). THE LEGISLATURE, IN 1921 AND 1922, MADE MANDATORY THE DIVIDING OF THE COUNTIES INTO SUPER-VISORIAL DISTRICTS AND PROVIDED FOR A SUPERVISOR TO BE ELECTED FROM EACH DISTRICT EVERY TWO YEARS (L. 1921, CH. 45; L. 1922, он. 9).

COUNTY BOND ISSUE FOR HIGHWAY CONSTRUCTION OR IMPROVEMENT WAS FOR TWO MILLION DOLLARS OR MORE, THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS WAS REQUIRED TO APPOINT A COUNTY HIGHWAY COMMISSION OF FIVE MEM-BERS FOR A TERM OF TWO YEARS, TO BE REMOVABLE BY THE BOARD FOR CAUSE. IF, HOWEVER, THE BOND ISSUE IS FOR LESS THAN TWO MIL-LION DOLLARS, THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS ACTS AS THE COUNTY HIGH-WAY COMMISSION. UPON COMPLETION OF THE PROJECT, OR EXPENDITURE OF THE MONEY THEREFOR, THE TERM OF OFFICE OF THE COMMISSIONERS EXPIRES. (L. 1917, CH. 31; L. 1922, CH. 32 CH. 32A). MEMBERSHIP OF SUCH COMMISSION, WHEN EXISTING, IN 1922 WAS REDUCED TO THREE (L. 1922, S. S., CH. 32, CH. 32A). THERE IS NO COUNTY HIGHWAY COMMISSION FUNCTIONING AT PRESENT IN PIMA COUNTY. IN 1927 THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS WAS EMPOWERED TO SELL OR GRANT TO THE UNITED STATES TITLE TO TOLL ROADS WITHIN NATIONAL PARKS, TO MAKE AGREEMENTS WITH THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT FOR CONSTRUCTION AND MAINTENANCE OF HIGHWAYS (L. 1927, 4TH S. S., CH. 26), AND TO ESTABLISH AND CONDUCT PUBLIC AVIATION FIELDS (L. 1927, CH. 55).

THE POWERS OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS HAVE REMAINED ES-SENTIALLY THE SAME. ITS FUNCTIONS IN THE EXERCISE OF THESE POWERS HAVE BEEN EXPANDED IN THE COURSE OF TIME TO CONFORM WITH CHANGING SOCIAL, ECONOMIC AND MECHANICAL CONDITIONS. THE BOARD LEVIES MOST OF THE LOCAL TAXES; ACTS AS BOARD OF EQUAL-IZATION; CARES FOR THE PUBLIC REVENUES; HOUSES THE COUNTY OF-FICES IN PROPER BUILDINGS WHICH IT MAY HAVE BUILT; PASSES ON ALL CLAIMS AGAINST THE COUNTY; SUES AND IS SUED IN THE COUNTY NAME; PROTECTS THE COUNTY HEALTH, CARING FOR THOSE UNABLE TO CARE FOR THEMSELVES; SUPERVISES THE OFFICIAL CONDUCT OF COUNTY OFFICES, BEING EMPOWERED TO INVESTIGATE EVERY COUNTY OFFICE CHARGED WITH HANDLING OF COUNTY FUNDS; FILLS BY APPOINTMENT VACANCIES OCCURRING IN COUNTY OR PRECINCT OFFICES; DESIGNATES THE VOTING PRECINCTS, APPOINTS ELECTION BOARDS, PREPARES AND DELIVERS BALLOTS, TABULATES AND CANVASSES ELECTION RETURNS, AND ISSUES CERTIFICATES OF ELECTION FOR ALL COUNTY AND PRECINCT CONTESTS; MAKES AND ENFORCES ALL LOCAL, POLICE, SANITARY AND OTHER REGULATIONS NOT IN CONFLICT WITH GENERAL LAWS; AND PER-FORMS ALL OTHER ACTS AND THINGS NECESSARY TO THE FULL EXERCISE OF ITS DUTIES AND THE POWERS DELEGATED TO IT AS THE LEGISLATIVE AUTHORITY OF THE COUNTY GOVERNMENT (L. 1931-32, 1st S. S., CH. 7, SEC. 1). THE COUNTY CAN EXERCISE ITS POWERS ONLY THROUGH THE SUPERVISORS (R. C. 1928, PARS. 760-761). IN PIMA COUNTY, THE COUNTY COMPTROLLER, A CERTIFIED PUBLIC ACCOUNTANT EMPLOYED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS, AUDITS THE ACCOUNTS OF THE COUNTY OFFICES. HE MAKES MONTHLY, SEMI-ANNUAL, AND ANNUAL REPORTS TO THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS, AND ASSEMBLES AND PREPARES DATA FOR THE ANNUAL REPORT OF THE CLERK THEREOF (R. C. 1928, PARS. 808-809).

RECORDS OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS ARE KEPT AMONG RECORDS OF ITS SUCCESSOR, THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS. A LIST OF RECORDS, WHICH ARE GENERALLY KEPT BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS UNDER STATUTORY AUTHORITY, FOLLOWS: FINANCIAL REPORTS OF COUNTY OFFICIALS OR REPORT OF FEES COLLECTED (R. C. 1928, SEC. 1496); REGISTER OF WARRANTS (R. C. 1928, SEC. 867);

THE COUNTY RECORDER WAS A MEMBER OF, AND EX OFFICO CLERK OF, THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS WHICH PRECEDED THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS (HOWELL CODE, 1864, CH. 9). HIS DUTIES AS SUCH CLERK WERE TO RECORD ALL PROCEEDINGS OF THE BOARD; PRESERVE AND FILE ALL ACCOUNTS ACTED UPON BY THE BOARD; CERTIFY UNDER HIS SEAL OF OFFICE COPIES OF SUCH PROCEEDINGS WHEN REQUIRED BY ANY MEMBER, THE ATTORNEY GENERAL, OR ANY OTHER PERSON; AND TO PERFORM SUCH OTHER DUTIES AS THE BOARD MIGHT REQUIRE (IBID., CH. 9, SEC. 3).

WHEN THE TERRITORIAL LEGISLATURE CREATED THE BOARD OF SUPER-VISORS FOR EACH COUNTY IN 1865, IT PROVIDED THAT THE RECORDER SHOULD BE CLERK OF THE BOARD (L. 1865, PP. 24-27, SEC. 2) AND THAT ALL DUTIES IMPOSED UPON THE CLERK OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS WERE TO BE IMPOSED UPON THE CLERK OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS (IBID., P. 27, SEC. 12). IN 1868 THE CLERK, IM-MEDIATELY AFTER EACH QUARTERLY SETTLEMENT OF THE COUNTY TREAS-URER WITH THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS, WAS REQUIRED TO PREPARE A STATEMENT OF THE AMOUNT OF MONEY COLLECTED FROM ALL SOURCES AND PAID OVER TO THE BOARD, SHOWING THE PORTION THEREOF BELONGING TO THE TERRITORY, AND TRANSMIT IT TO THE TERRITORIAL TREASURER (L. 1868, P. 37, SEC. 4). HE WAS ALSO REQUIRED TO TRANSMIT AN-NUALLY A STATEMENT OF THE AMOUNT DUE THE TERRITORY FROM THE AN-NUAL TAX AS APPEARED FROM THE COMPUTATIONS OF THE BOARD TO THE TERRITORIAL TREASURER, AS WELL AS THE AMOUNT OF DELINQUENT TAXES (IBID., PP. 37-38, SECS. 5 AND 6). TRANSMITTAL OF SUCH STATEMENT, NOW TO THE STATE TREASURER, IS STILL A DUTY OF THE CLERK (R. C. 1928, PARS. 798, 3095). SINCE 1871 THE CLERK OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS HAS BEEN EX OFFICIO CLERK OF THE BOARD OF EQUALIZATION (L. 1871, P. 97, SEC. 18).

IN 1879, THE LEGISLATURE INSTRUCTED EACH BOARD OF SUPER-VISORS TO ELECT A CLERK, WHO SHOULD KEEP RECORDS, BOOKS AND

ACCOUNTS OF THE BOARD IN HIS OFFICE AT THE COUNTY SEAT, PERFORM ALL DUTIES REQUIRED BY THE BOARD, FURNISH BOND APPROVED BY THE CHAIRMAN, AND NOT HOLD ANY OFFICE VOTED FOR BY THE QUALIFIED VOTERS OF THE COUNTY AT A GENERAL ELECTION (L. 1879, P. 31, secs. 1-5). From JAN. 1, 1886 TO JULY 1, 1887, HOWEVER, COUNTY CLERK IN PIMA COUNTY WAS EX OFFICIO CLERK OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS (L. 1885, P. 305, SEC. 2). IN 1887 THE ASSEMBLY EMPOWERED BOARDS OF SUPERVISORS EITHER TO ELECT A CLERK OR AP-POINT THE COUNTY RECORDER TO THAT OFFICE (R. S. 1887, TITLE 13, ch. 2, sec. 390). No such appointment was made in Pima County, ALTHOUGH IN THE CLERK'S ABSENCE THE RECORDER ACTED AS CLERK. IN 1895 AND 1901, THE ASSEMBLY PROVIDED THAT IN COUNTIES OF THE FIRST CLASS, BOARDS OF SUPERVISORS SHOULD ELECT A CLERK OF THE BOARD, AND THAT IN ALL OTHER COUNTIES THE RECORDER SHOULD BE EX OFFICIO CLERK OF THE BOARD (L. 1895, P. 69; R. S. 1901, PAR. 966), AS PIMA WAS A FIRST-CLASS COUNTY DURING THIS TIME, THE CLERK CONTINUED TO BE ELECTED BY THE BOARD. THE FIRST STATE LEGISLATURE ENACTED THAT IN COUNTIES FROM THE FIRST TO TENTH CLASSES AND IN THOSE OF THE TWELFTH AND FOURTEENTH CLASSES, THE SUPERVISORS SHOULD ELECT THEIR CLERKS, BUT THAT IN COUNTIES OF THE ELEVENTH AND THIRTEENTH CLASSES THE RECORDER SHOULD BE EX OFFICIO CLERK OF THE BOARD. BY THE POPULATION OF PIMA COUNTY DECLARED IN THIS ACT, PIMA BECAME A THIRD-CLASS COUNTY, AND THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS THEREFORE CONTINUED TO ELECT ITS CLERK. (R. S. 1913, PARS. 2407, 3226-7). THIS METHOD OF FILLING THE OFFICE HAS BEEN FOLLOWED TO THE PRESENT (R. C. 1928, PAR. 769).

THE CLERK IS REQUIRED TO SIGN ALL ORDERS MADE AND WARRANTS ISSUED BY ORDER OF THE BOARD FOR PAYMENT OF MONEY, WHICH ARE ALSO SIGNED BY THE CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD; TO RECORD REPORTS OF THE COUNTY TREASURER ON DISBURSEMENTS AND RECEIPTS; TO PRESERVE AND FILE ALL PETITIONS AND ACCOUNTS ACTED UPON BY THE BOARD; AND TO RECORD ALL ORDERS LEVYING TAXES (R. S. 1901, PAR. 970).

Under direction of the board of supervisors, and prior to the board's January meeting, the clerk of the board annually prepares a statement in duplicate, known among the various counties as the clerk's annual report, and showing the indebtedness of the county, funded and floating; the amount of and rate of interest dorne by each class of indebtedness or any part thereof, and the amount of money in the county treasury subject to the payment of such indebtedness; a concise description of all property owned by the county, with an estimate of the value thereof; and the rate of taxation for county purposes, as shown by the last levy made by the board. One of these statements is filed with the board at the opening of the January meeting and another forwarded immediately to the state treasurer, who includes in his report to the governor a digest of such statement (R. C. 1928, par. 793).

II. RECORDER

THE ANCIENT OFFICE OF RECORDER WAS THE FIRST COUNTY OF-FICE TO FUNCTION IN WHAT IS NOW ARIZONA, AND IN THE AREA AC-QUIRED BY THE GADSDEN PURCHASE, MOST OF WHICH WAS LATER FORMED INTO PIMA COUNTY. AFTER THE NEW MEXICO LEGISLATURE IN 1855 HAD ADDED THE GADSDEN PURCHASE LANDS TO DONA ANA COUNTY (N. M. C. L. 1884, SEC. 277, APPROVED JANUARY 18, 1855), A DEPUTY CLERK OF THE PROBATE COURT OF DONA ANA COUNTY WAS APPOINTED AT TUBAC, SOUTH OF TUCSON. AT THAT TIME CLERKS OF THE PROBATE COURTS OF NEW MEXICO WERE EX OFFICIO PUBLIC RECORDERS IN THEIR RESPECTIVE COUNTIES (N. M. C. L. 1865, P. 618, APPROVED JANUARY 1, 1856). ACTING IN SUCH CAPACITY OF PUBLIC RECORDER, THIS DEPUTY CREATED THE ONLY EXTANT REC-ORDS OF DONA ANA COUNTY IN WHAT IS NOW ARIZONA. HE KEPT ONE GOOD-SIZED BOOK IN WHICH HE RECORDED ALL PAPERS AND DOCUMENTS, 1856-60, PRESENTED TO HIM FOR RECORDING (IBID). (SEE ENTRY 44). IN THE VOLUME IS ALSO AN INSTRUMENT ACKNOWLEDGED IN 1861 BY A NOTARY PUBLIC OF ARIZONA COUNTY, WHICH DURING 1861-62 HAD LEGAL EXISTENCE BUT DID NOT FUNCTION. DURING THE CIVIL WAR, A REGISTER AND RECORDER OF LAND CLAIMS FUNCTIONED IN TUCSON, RECORDING BY MILITARY ORDER IN ONE BOOK SUCH CLAIMS AND OTHER INSTRUMENTS PRESENTED FOR RECORDING, 1862-64. UPON ORGANIZATION OF THE TERRITORY OF ARIZONA IN 1864 A TEMPORARY PRE-COUNTY FORM OF GOVERNMENT UNDER JUDICIAL DISTRICTS WAS ESTABLISHED, WHICH FUNCTIONED FROM APRIL THROUGH DECEMBER 1864. THE FIRST JUDICIAL DISTRICT COMPRISED VIRTUALLY THE SAME AREA LATER IN THE YEAR ERECTED INTO PIMA COUNTY BY THE FIRST ASSEMBLY. DISTRICT OFFICERS WERE APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR, AMONG THEM A PROBATE JUDGE. A CLERK OF THE PROBATE COURT, WHO WAS EX OFFICIO RECORDER, WAS NOMINATED BY THE PRO-BATE JUDGE AND COMMISSIONED BY THE GOVERNOR ON APRIL 11, 1864 FOR THE FIRST JUDICIAL DISTRICT. (FOR FURTHER DETAILS CON-CERNING THE OFFICE OF RECORDER FROM 1856 THROUGH DECEMBER 1864, SEE GOVERNMENTAL ORGANIZATION AND RECORDS SYSTEM, P. 7).

THE FIRST TERRITORIAL ASSEMBLY CREATED THE ORIGINAL COUNTIES, INCLUDING PIMA, AND ENACTED PROVISIONS FOR GOVERNMENTAL ORGANIZATION AND RECORDS SYSTEM OF COUNTIES. THE FIRST

county officials took office January 1, 1865. A county recorder was provided for each county, to keep an office at the county seat, styled "the recorder's office" (Howell Code, 1864, oh. 5, sec. 1). He was permitted to appoint a deputy (1810., ch. 5, sec. 4).

THE RECORDER WAS REQUIRED TO RECORD DEEDS, MORTGAGES OF REAL ESTATE AND RELEASES OF THE SAME, POWERS OF ATTORNEY TO CONVEY REAL ESTATE, LEASES FOR PERIODS OF OVER ONE YEAR, MAR-RIAGE CERTIFICATES AND MARRIAGE CONTRACTS, WILLS ADMITTED TO PROBATE, OFFICIAL BONDS, ALL NOTICES OF PENDENCY OF AN ACTION AFFECTING REAL ESTATE, AND PREEMPTION CLAIM NOTICES (IBID., CH. 5, SEC. 8). ALL RECORDS WERE TO BE SUITABLY INDEXED (IBID., CH. 5, SECS. 8-10). HE WAS TO RECORD IN A SEPARATE BOOK CONVEYANCES OF LAND WITHIN THE TERRITORY PRIOR TO ENACT-MENT OF THE HOWELL CODE, OR PREVIOUSLY RECORDED BY ANY PRO-BATE COURT OF THE TERRITORY OF ARIZONA, OR IN THE TERRITORY OF NEW MEXICO OR THE REPUBLIC OF MEXICO. HE WAS REQUIRED TO KEEP SUITABLE AND WELL-BOUND BOOKS AND TO RECORD THEREIN IN FAIR, LARGE, AND LEGIBLE HAND ALL INSTRUMENTS IN WRITING AUTHORIZED AND REQUIRED TO BE RECORDED. (1810., CH. 5, SEC. 9; CH. 42, SEC. 44).

THE RECORDER WAS MADE EX OFFICIO A MEMBER AND CLERK OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, WHICH WAS REQUIRED TO MEET IN THE OFFICE OF THE RECORDER (IBID., CH. 9, SEC. 3). IN 1865 THE ASSEMBLY REPLACED THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS WITH A BOARD OF SUPERVISORS TO BE ELECTED IN EACH COUNTY (L. 1865, PP. 24-27). THE RECORDER, HOWEVER, CONTINUED TO BE EX OFFICIO CLERK OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS UNTIL FEBRUARY 1879, WHEN THE ASSEMBLY REQUIRED BOARDS OF SUPERVISORS OF THE SEVERAL COUNTIES TO ELECT THEIR CLERKS (L. 1879, ACT 24, SEC. 1, P. 31). THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS IN 1887 WAS EMPOWERED EITHER TO ELECT ITS CLERK OR APPOINT THE COUNTY RECORDER TO THAT OFFICE (R. S. 1887, TITLE 13, CH. 2, SEC. 390). NO SUCH AP-POINTMENT WAS MADE IN PIMA COUNTY, ALTHOUGH IN THE CLERK'S ABSENCE THE RECORDER ACTED AS CLERK. THE LEGISLATURE SUB-SEQUENTLY PROVIDED THAT IN COUNTIES OF CERTAIN CLASSIFICA-TIONS THE RECORDER SHOULD BE EX OFFICIO CLERK OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS, BUT PIMA COUNTY WAS NOT AMONG THESE (L. 1895, P. 69; R. S. 1901, PAR. 966; R. S. 1913, PAR. 3227).

THE FIRST TERRITORIAL LEGISLATURE MADE THE COUNTY RECORDER ALSO EX OFFICIO CLERK OF THE PROBATE AND COUNTY COURTS (L. 1864, p. 46). By an act approved February 11, 1871, the county recorder ceased to be ex officio clerk of the probate court (Comp. L. 1864-71, p. 294). No county courts were created, however (L. 1864, p. 46), until 1885 when the assembly created county courts in several counties, including Pima (L. 1885, p. 305, sec. 1), but also provided for election of a county clerk, who should be clerk of the county court (IBID., p. 305, sec. 2).

Effective January 1, 1867, registry of mining Locations was transferred to the recorder from the probate court (L.

1866, p. 31). REGISTRIES OF MINES PREVIOUS TO THIS TIME, HOWEVER, ARE FOUND IN THE RECORDS OF THE RECORDER. IN 1887
MARRIAGE LICENSES, REQUIRED FOR THE FIRST TIME IN ARIZONA,
WERE TO BE OBTAINED FROM THE RECORDER, WHO WAS REQUIRED TO
KEEP A RECORD OF SUCH MARRIAGE LICENSES AND THE CERTIFICATES
THEREOF (R. S. 1887, TITLE 34, CH. 1). THIS ACT, WITH THE
REQUIREMENT OF LICENSES, WAS REPEALED IN 1889, AND THE DUTY
OF RECORDING MARRIAGE CERTIFICATES TRANSFERRED FROM THE RECORDER TO THE CLERK OF THE PROBATE COURT (L. 1889, p. 58).

THE CONSTITUTION OF THE STATE OF ARIZONA CONTINUED THE OFFICE OF RECORDER FOR EACH COUNTY, AND PROVIDED THAT DUTIES THEREOF SHOULD BE PRESCRIBED BY LAW. THE RECORDER IS ELECTED FOR A TWO-YEAR TERM. (CONST., ART. 12, SEC. 3). TO THE RECORDER IS DELEGATED THE DUTY OF REGISTERING THE QUALIFIED ELECTORS IN THE COUNTY, AND HE MAY BE ASSISTED IN THIS BY THE VARIOUS JUSTICES OF THE PEACE (L. 1933, CH. 62, SEC. 2). HE IS ALSO REQUIRED TO DISBURSE BALLOTS TO ABSENTEE AND DISABLED VOTERS AND TRANSMIT THE SAME TO THE RESPECTIVE ELECTION BOARDS (L. 1933, CH. 82, AMENDING R. C. 1928, PARS. 1309, 1311-12). ON NOTIFICATION BY THE CLERK OF SUPERIOR COURT, THE RECORDER WITH THE SHERIFF IS REQUIRED TO ATTEND THE DRAWING OF JURORS AT THE TIME APPOINTED (L. 1912, CH. 3, P. 8; R. C. 1928, PAR. 1912).

III. DISTRICT COURT

IN ORGANIZING THE TERRITORY OF ARIZONA PURSUANT TO THE ORGANIC ACT, THE GOVERNOR BY PROCLAMATION OF APRIL 9, 1864, DIVIDED THE TERRITORY INTO THREE JUDICIAL DISTRICTS. THE FIRST JUDICIAL DISTRICT COMPRISED VIRTUALLY THE SAME AREA LATER IN THE YEAR ERECTED INTO PIMA COUNTY BY THE FIRST ASSEMBLY. BY THE SAME PROCLAMATION HE APPOINTED A JUDGE OF THE FIRST JUDICIAL DISTRICT COURT, WHICH WAS TO BE HELD AT TUCSON TWICE YEARLY, THE FIRST TERM BEGINNING THE FIRST TUESDAY IN MAY, AND THE SECOND TERM ON THE LAST TUESDAY IN OCTOBER, BOTH TERMS TO CONTINUE FOR TWO WEEKS. (FOR FURTHER DETAILS SEE GOVERNMENTAL ORGANIZATION AND RECORDS SYSTEM, P. 7).

THE FIRST TERRITORIAL ASSEMBLY CREATED THE ORIGINAL COUNTIES, INCLUDING PIMA, AND ENACTED PROVISIONS FOR THE GOVERNMENTAL ORGANIZATION AND RECORDS SYSTEM OF THE COUNTIES. THE TERRITORY WAS AGAIN DIVIDED INTO THREE JUDICIAL DISTRICTS, AND IT WAS PROVIDED THAT ONE SUPREME COURT JUDGE SHOULD BE ASSIGNED TO PRESIDE OVER EACH DISTRICT COURT (HOWELL CODE, 1864, CH. 45, PART 3, P. 289). PIMA COUNTY WAS CONSTITUTED THE FIRST JUDICIAL DISTRICT (IBID., CH. 44, P. 286), AND DURING THE LIFE OF THE DISTRICT COURT WAS ALWAYS WITHIN THE FIRST JUDICIAL DISTRICT.

IN ADDITION TO THE JURISDICTION CONFERRED BY VIRTUE OF THE FEDERAL CONSTITUTION AND LAWS OF CONGRESS, THE ORIGINAL JURISDICTION OF THE DISTRICT COURT EXTENDED TO ALL CIVIL CASES WHEREIN THE AMOUNT OF PLAINTIFF'S DEMAND EXCEEDED ONE HUNDRED DOLLARS, EXCLUSIVE OF INTEREST, TO CASES INVOLVING TITLE OR RIGHT TO POSSESSION OF REAL PROPERTY, TO ALL ISSUES OF FACT JOINED IN THE PROBATE COURT AND TAKEN INTO DISTRICT COURT FOR TRIAL, AND TO CRIMINAL MATTERS FOR WHICH NO OTHER PROVISION WAS MADE (IBID., P. 289).

IN 1865 THE LIMITED CRIMINAL JURISDICTION OF JUSTICE OF THE PEACE COURTS WAS DEFINED, ALL OTHER CRIMINAL MATTERS ABOVE SUCH LIMITATION BEING WITHIN JURISDICTION OF THE DISTRICT COURT (L. 1865, P. 23). THE APPELLATE JURISDICTION OF THE DISTRICT COURT EXTENDED TO HEARING ON APPEAL ACTIONS FROM COURTS OF JUSTICES OF THE PEACE, AND ORDERS AND JUDGMENTS IN THE PROBATE COURT IN CASES PRESCRIBED BY STATUTE. THE COURT WAS EMPOWERED TO ISSUE WRITS OF CERTIORARI TO INFERIOR COURTS, BOARDS OR OFFICERS, AND TO RENDER JUDGMENT OR MAKE ANY ORDER NECESSARY THEREON. IN CHAMBERS, THE COURT, EITHER IN OR OUT OF TERM TIME, COULD HEAR AND DETERMINE WRITS OF MANDAMUS, CERTIORARI, AND QUO WARRANTO, HEAR AND DISPOSE OF ALL APPLICATIONS FOR ORDERS AND WRITS ENTITLED TO BE HEARD IN EX-PARTE PROCEEDINGS, AND

could, in its discretion, hear applications to discharge such writs. (Howell Code, 1864, pp. 289-290). JurisDiction of mining matters, originally vested in the probate court, in 1865 was transferred to the district court (L. 1865, pp. 44-45). The district court judge was empowered to appoint a clerk of the court and a court commissioner (Howell Code, 1864, ch. 45, secs. 23, 30). He heard election contests in cases involving county offices (Howell Code, ch. 24, secs. 45-48). With the probate judge and the sheriff, he called the grand jury (1810., ch. 47, sec. 2). The district judge approved appointments made by the board of county commissioners (1810., ch. 22, sec. 5, p. 168).

THE CLERK OF THE DISTRICT COURT WAS AUTHORIZED TO APPOINT ONE OR MORE DEPUTIES. HE WAS REQUIRED TO ATTEND IN PERSON OR BY DEPUTY SESSIONS OF DISTRICT COURT; KEEP HIS OFFICE AT THE COUNTY SEAT; CARE FOR ALL BOOKS, PAPERS, AND RECORDS FILED IN HIS OFFICE; ISSUE ALL WRITS AND PROCESS; ENTER, UNDER COURT DIRECTION, ALL ORDERS, JUDGMENTS AND DECREES; KEEP A DOCKET IN WHICH A RECORD OF EACH CASE SHOULD BE ENTERED; AND KEEP OTHER BOOKS OF RECORDS REQUIRED BY LAW OR COURT RULE. HE WAS PROHIBITED FROM PRACTICING LAW. (IBID., CH. 46, PP. 292, 293).

THE DISTRICT COURT WAS ABOLISHED AT STATEHOOD, 1912, WHEN ALL MATTERS WITHIN ITS JURISDICTION PASSED TO THE SUPERIOR COURTS OF THE COUNTIES (CONST. ART. 6, SEC. 23) EXCEPT FEDERAL MATTERS (IBID., ART. 22, SEC. 7). THE CLERK OF THE DISTRICT COURT WAS REQUIRED TO TRANSMIT TO THE CLERK OF THE SUPERIOR COURT ALL PAPERS, RECORDS AND PROPERTY IN HIS POSSESSION BELONGING TO THE JURISDICTION OF THE NEW SUPERIOR COURT. (ID.) DISTRICT COURT RECORDS ARE IN THE CUSTODY OF THE SUPERIOR COURT, AND ARE LISTED THEREUNDER IN THIS INVENTORY.

IV. PROBATE COURT

A DEPUTY OF THE CLERK OF THE PROBATE COURT OF DONA
ANA COUNTY, New Mexico, was the first resident county official
TO FUNCTION WITHIN WHAT IS NOW PIMA COUNTY AND ARIZONA. (FOR
FURTHER DETAILS, SEE GOVERNMENTAL ORGANIZATION AND RECORDS
SYSTEM, P. 6).

THE CLERKS OF THE PROBATE COURTS OF NEW MEXICO WERE EX OFFICIO RECORDERS IN THEIR RESPECTIVE COUNTIES, AND IN THIS CAPACITY WERE REQUIRED TO KEEP A GOOD-SIZED BOOK FOR RECORDING ALL PAPERS AND DOCUMENTS PRESENTED TO THEM FOR RECORDING (N. M. C. L., 1865, p. 618, SECS. 1, 2, APPROVED JANUARY 1, 1856). THE CLERK, AS SUCH, WAS REQUIRED TO KEEP A REGISTER OF MARKS AND BRANDS (IBID., p. 58, SEC. 2, APPROVED JULY 20, 1851) AND TO KEEP MARRIAGE RECORDS (IBID., p. 536,, SEC. 7, APPROVED FEB. 2, 1860).

IN ORGANIZING THE TERRITORY OF ARIZONA, PURSUANT TO THE ORGANIC ACT, THE GOVERNOR BY PROGLAMATIONS ESTABLISHED A TEMPORARY GOVERNMENT UNDER THREE JUDICIAL DISTRICTS, AND APPOINTED OFFICIALS THEREOF TO SERVE FROM APRIL THROUGH DECEMBER 1864. THE FIRST JUDICIAL DISTRICT CONSISTED OF VIRTUALLY THE SAME AREA LATER IN THE YEAR ERECTED INTO PIMA COUNTY BY THE FIRST ASSEMBLY. OFFICIALS FOR THIS DISTRICT WERE APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR ON APRIL 11, 1864, AMONG THEM A JUDGE AND A CLERK OF THE PROBATE COURT, BOTH OF TUCSON. (IBID., P. 7). (FOR FURTHER DETAILS, SEE GOVERNMENTAL ORGANIZATION AND RECORDS SYTEM, P. 7).

THE PROBATE JUDGE WAS EMPOWERED AS UNDER NEW MEXICO LAWS, BY WHICH HE WAS ORIGINALLY STYLED THE "PREFECT", AND IN NEW MEXICO WAS ELECTED IN EACH COUNTY FOR A TWO-YEAR TERM (N. M. C. L., 1865, P. 120, FROM KEARNEY CODE, 1846, PAMPHLET, P. 50). HE HAD ORIGINAL AND EXCLUSIVE JURISDICTION OF ALL PROBATE MATTERS (IBID., P. 122, FROM KEARNEY CODE, 1846, PAMPHLET, P. 100), AND ALSO WAS THE LEGISLATIVE AUTHORITY OF AND ADMINISTERED THE FINANCIAL AFFAIRS OF THE DISTRICT. HE MADE AN ANNUAL REPORT TO THE SECRETARY OF THE TERRITORY RESPECTING THE FINANCIAL AFFAIRS OF THE COUNTY (IBID., PP. 132, 134, APPROVED DEC. 28, 1861).

THE PROBATE JUDGE WAS REQUIRED TO DETERMINE THE AMOUNT OF, LEVY, AND ORDER COLLECTED A PROPERTY TAX, AND TO ISSUE COMMER-CIAL LICENSES (IBID., P. 648, FROM KEARNEY CODE, 1846, PAMPHLET P. 92); TO ADMIT, ADJUST, AND SETTLE ALL ACCOUNTS TO WHICH THE COUNTY WAS A PARTY (IBID., P. 126, FROM KEARNEY CODE, 1846, PAMPHLET, P. 102). TO HIM THE TREASURER, SHERIFF, CONSTABLES, ALL CLERKS AND COLLECTORS WERE REQUIRED TO RENDER THEIR ACCOUNTS AND TO SETTLE THEM WITH HIM. THE PROBATE JUDGE APPOINTED THE COUNTY TREASURER. (IBID., PP. 122-124, FROM KEARNEY CODE, 1846, PAMPHLET, P. 100). THE PROBATE JUDGE FURTHER WAS REQUIRED TO SUPERINTEND PUBLIC ROADS AND APPOINT A ROAD OVERSEER (1810., P. 122, FROM KEARNEY CODE, 1846, PAMPHLET, P. 50); TO APPOINT ELECTION JUDGES AND ISSUE ELECTION PROCLAMATIONS (1810., P. 432, APPROVED 1851, PAMPHLET, P. 196); TO SUPERVISE DISPOSITION OF VAGRANTS (IBID., P. 122, SEC. 3, FROM KEARNEY CODE, 1846, PAMPHLET, P. 50); PUNISH DISOBEDIENT CHILDREN (IBID., P. 126, APPROVED FEB. 16, 1864, PAMPHLET, P. 140), AND EXAMINE INTO INDIAN DEPREDATIONS (IBID., P. 132, APPROVED JAN. 30, 1856). HE HAD JURISDICTION IN CIVIL SUITS UPON OPEN AND LIQUIDATED ACCOUNTS, REPLEVIN, DEBTS OF ANY NATURE WHERE THE CLAIMED SUM DID NOT EXCEED FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS, AND CONCURRENT JURISDICTION WITH JUSTICES OF THE PEACE IN CRIMINAL MATTERS (1810., 1865, P. 130, APPROVED 1860). THE PROBATE JUDGE WAS CHARGED WITH THE APPREHENSION OF FUGITIVES FROM JUSTICE. UPON THE ESCAPE OF ANY PRISONER FROM JAIL, HE WAS TO REQUIRE OFFICIALS OF OTHER COUN-TIES TO APPREHEND THE FUGITIVE (IBID., P. 414, APPROVED JAN. 7,

THE RECORDS OF THE PROBATE COURT OF THE FIRST JUDICIAL DISTRICT ARE IN THE CUSTODY OF THE RECORDER.

THE FIRST TERRITORIAL ASSEMBLY CREATED THE FOUR ORIG-INAL COUNTIES, INCLUDING PIMA, AND ENACTED PROVISIONS FOR THE GOVERNMENTAL ORGANIZATION AND RECORDS SYSTEM OF COUNTIES. IT PROVIDED FOR EACH COUNTY A PROBATE COURT (HOWELL CODE, 1864, P. 435, SEC. 5), THE JURISDICTION OF WHICH EXTENDED TO ADMINISTRATION OF ESTATES OF DECEASED PERSONS (IBID., P. 193); RELIEF AND DETERMINATION OF STATUS OF INDIGENTS (1810., P. 426); REGISTRY AND DENOUNCEMENT OF ALL MINES, MINERAL AND AUXILIARY LANDS, AND ALL DISPUTES AND QUESTIONS OF WHATSO-EVER NATURE BETWEEN ADVERSE CLAIMANTS TO THE SAME (1810., P. 391); AND JOINT JURISDICTION WITH JUSTICES OF THE PEACE OF SUPERVISION AND CARE OF INDIAN CHILDREN OF BOTH HOSTILE AND PEACEABLE TRIBES (IBID., P. 428). THE JURISDICTION OF THE DIS-TRICT COURT EXTENDED TO ALL ISSUES OF FACT JOINED IN THE PRO-BATE COURT AND TAKEN FOR TRIAL INTO THE DISTRICT COURT (! BID . , P. 289). APPEAL TO THE DISTRICT COURT WAS PROVIDED FROM ORDERS AND JUDGMENTS IN THE PROBATE COURTS IN CASES PRESCRIBED BY STATUTES (IBID., P. 289). IN 1871 THE PROBATE COURT WAS EM-POWERED TO APPOINT GUARDIANS OF THE ESTATES OF INSANE PERSONS, BUT ONLY FOR THE PURPOSE OF OBTAINING PAYMENT OF THE EXPENSES ATTENDING THE EXAMINATION, COMMITTMENT AND MAINTENANCE OF THE INSANE PERSON (COMP. L. 1864-1871, P. 580, APPROVED FEB. 17, 1871). Two YEARS LATER THE COURT WAS AUTHORIZED TO APPOINT GUARDIANS FOR THE PERSONS AND ESTATES OF INSANE PERSONS (L. 1873, P. 31) AND MINORS (IBID., P. 28), AND TO LEGALIZE ADOPTIONS (IBID., P. 90).

THE PROBATE JUDGE WAS CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, BY WHICH THE AFFAIRS OF THE COUNTY WERE FIRST ADMINISTERED (HOWELL CODE, 1864, CH. 9). UPON ABOLISHMENT OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS AND CREATION IN ITS PLACE OF AN ELECTED BOARD OF SUPERVISORS, THE PROBATE JUDGE WAS RE-QUIRED TO AUDIT ELECTION RETURNS FOR THE BOARD (L. 1865, P. 27, SEC. 13). IN 1868, THE PROBATE JUDGE WAS REQUIRED TO MAKE APPOINTMENTS TO FILL VACANCIES IN THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS (L. 1868, P. 40). IN 1877 HE WAS REQUIRED TO DO THIS IN CONJUNC-TION WITH THE CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS AND THE TREAS-URER (L. 1877, P. 105), AND LATER WITH THE REMAINING BOARD MEMBERS (R. S. 1901, SEC. 964). WITH THE DISTRICT COURT JUDGE AND THE SHERIFF, THE PROBATE JUDGE CALLED THE GRAND JURY (Howell Code, ch. 47, sec. 2). From 1864 UNTIL 1879 THE JUDGE OF THE PROBATE COURT WAS APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR (Howell Code, P. 435), BUT IN 1879 THE OFFICE WAS MADE ELEC-TIVE (L. 1879, P. 38). IN 1885 THE LEGISLATURE CREATED A COUNTY COURT FOR PIMA COUNTY (L. 1885, P. 305, SEC. 1), AND ABOLISHED THE PROBATE COURT IN THAT COUNTY, EFFECTIVE JANUARY 1, 1887 (1310., P. 308, SEC. 10). IN 1887, HOWEVER, THE COUNTY COURTS WERE IN TURN ABOLISHED AND THE PROBATE COURTS AGAIN ES-TABLISHED (R. S. 1887, SEC. 1210), THE SAME ACT AUTHORIZING THE GOV-ERNOR, WITH THE CONSENT OF THE COUNCIL, TO APPOINT A PROBATE JUDGE

IN CASE OF VACANCY, PENDING AN ELECTION (R. S. 1887, APPENDIX, P. 894).

ON ORGANIZATION OF THE COUNTY, THE RECORDER WAS REQUIRED TO ACT AS CLERK OF THE PROBATE COURT (L. 1864, P. 46), AND SO CONTINUED TO ACT UNTIL 1871, WHEN THE PROBATE JUDGE WAS REQUIRED TO ACT AS CLERK OF THE COURT (L. 1871, P. 50). IN THE SAME YEAR THE PROBATE JUDGE BECAME EX OFFICIO COUNTY SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC SCHOOLS (IBID., P. 71), AND SERVED AS SUCH IN PIMA COUNTY UNTIL 1899 (L. 1897, P. 113).

THE CLERK OF THE PROBATE COURT, THEN COUNTY RECORDER, WAS ALSO MADE EX OFFICIO RECORDER OF MINES AND ALL MINERAL AND AUXILIARY LANDS IN THE COUNTY, AND THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS WERE REQUIRED TO PROVIDE HIM WITH AN OFFICE TO BE KNOWN AS "THE RECORDER'S OFFICE" (HOWELL CODE, 1864, p. 392). THE CLERK WAS REQUIRED TO PROVIDE THREE BOOKS OF MINING RECORDS. IN BOOK A HE WAS REQUIRED TO GATHER, COLLECT AND RECORD ALL REGISTRIES, DENOUNCEMENTS AND CLAIMS OF MINES MADE PRIOR TO THE PASSAGE OF THE HOWELL CODE IN 1864, AND MAKE COMPLETE INDICES OF THE SAME. IN BOOK B HE WAS TO RECORD ALL FIRST OR PRELIMINARY REGISTRIES AND DENOUNCEMENTS OF MINES MADE AFTER THE PASSAGE OF THIS ENACTMENT. IN BOOK C WERE TO BE RECORDED ALL SECONDARY REGISTRIES, AFTER THE SINKING OF THE SHAFT, THE CHARTERS OF ALL MINING COMPANIES AND THEIR OFFICERS, LOCATION OF THEIR OFFICES AND MINES, DESCRIPTION OF THEIR MACHINERY AND LIST OF THEIR PROPERTY, AND CONVEYANCES AND PARTNERSHIP AGREEMENTS PERTAINING TO MINES. (IBID., P. 392, secs. 5-7; P. 393, SEC. 10). JURISDICTION TO TRY TITLE TO MINING PROPERTY, NEVER MORE THAN A POSSESSORY RIGHT AT THAT TIME, WAS TRANSFERRED IN 1865 TO THE DISTRICT COURT (L. 1865, P. 44). REGISTRY OF MINING LOCATIONS WAS TRANSFERRED TO THE COUNTY RECORDER EFFECTIVE JANUARY 1, 1867 (L. 1866, P. 31).

IN 1889 THE RECORDING OF MARRIAGE CERTIFICATES WAS TRANSFERRED FROM THE RECORDER TO THE CLERK OF THE PROBATE COURT (L. 1889, P. 58). THE NEXT LEGISLATURE REQUIRED THE OBTAINING FIRST OF A MARRIAGE LICENSE FROM SUCH CLERK, AND REQUIRED HIM TO KEEP A RECORD OF SUCH LICENSES ISSUED BY HIM AND THE CERTIFICATES THEREOF (L. 1891, p. 95, SEC. 3). THE CLERK OF THE PROBATE COURT WAS FURTHER REQUIRED TO KEEP A MINUTE BOOK OF ALL ORDERS AND DECREES OF THE PROBATE COURT; SIGN AND SEAL CITATIONS AND ISSUE CERTAIN CITATIONS (R. S. 1901, SECS. 1928-1929); FILE WILLS AND CERTIFICATES OF PROOF THEREOF, TOGETHER WITH ALL TESTIMONY TAKEN, AND TO RECORD SAME IN A BOOK TO BE KEPT FOR THAT PURPOSE (IBID., SEC. 1618); SIGN LETTERS TESTAMENTARY, OR OF ADMINISTRATION (IBID., SEC. 1646); PUBLISH NOTICES OF HEARING OF APPLICATION FOR APPOINT-MENT AS ADMINISTRATOR OR EXECUTOR (IBID., SEC. 1655); KEEP A REGISTER OF CLAIMS (IBID., SEC. 1746); AND A FEE BOOK (IBID., SEC. 2645).

The constitution did not continue the probate court. Jurisdiction in probate matters was given to the superior court. (Const., art. 6, sec. 18). The clerk of superior court has custody of court records of the defunct probate court of Pima County, the records of which are listed in the section devoted to the superior court in this inventory. V. COUNTY COURT

IN 1885 THE TERRITORIAL LEGISLATURE ESTABLISHED COUNTY COURTS, SIMILAR TO THE PRESENT SUPERIOR COURT, IN MOHAVE, APACHE, COCHISE, AND PIMA COUNTIES (L. 1885, PP. 95, 254, 284, 305). WITHIN ONE DAY AFTER THE PASSAGE OF THE ACT CREATING SUCH COURT FOR PIMA COUNTY, THE GOVERNOR WAS INSTRUCTED TO APPOINT, BY AND WITH THE ADVICE OF THE COUNCIL OF THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY, A JUDGE OF THE COUNTY COURT OF PIMA COUNTY TO HOLD OFFICE UNTIL JANUARY 1, 1887, AT THE GENERAL ELECTION IN 1886, A JUDGE OF THE COUNTY WAS TO BE ELECTED BY QUALIFIED VOTERS OF THE COUNTY TO HOLD OFFICE FOR FOUR YEARS. THE QUALIFICATIONS FOR OFFICE REQUIRED THE INCUMBENT TO BE AN ATTORNEY AT LAW, A RESIDENT OF THE TERRITORY FOR TWO YEARS AND A CITIZEN OF THE UNITED STATES. VACANCIES IN THE OFFICE FROM WHATEVER CAUSE WERE TO BE FILLED BY GUBERNATORIAL APPOINTMENT. (1810, P. 305, SEC. 1).

THE COURT WAS ESTABLISHED AS A COURT OF RECORD, HAVING A SEAL. IT HAD ORIGINAL CONCURRENT JURISDICTION WITH THE DISTRICT COURT IN ALL CASES IN EQUITY, AND IN ALL CASES AT LAW WHICH INVOLVED THE TITLE TO OR POSSESSION OF REAL PROPERTY, OR THE LEGALITY OF ANY TAX, IMPOST, ASSESSMENT, TOLL OR MUNICIPAL FINE, AND IN ALL OTHER CASES IN WHICH THE DEMAND OR VALUE OF THE PROPERTY IN CONTROVERSY AMOUNTED TO ONE HUNDRED DOLLARS OR MORE; IN ALL CRIMINAL CASES AMOUNTING TO FELONY, AND CASES OF MISDEMEANOR NOT OTHERWISE PROVIDED FOR; ACTIONS OF FORCIBLE ENTRY AND DETAINER; PROCEEDINGS IN INSOLVENCY; ACTIONS TO PREVENT OR ABATE A NUISANCE; ALL MATTERS OF PROBATE, DIVORCE, MARRIAGE ANNULMENTS, AND MATTERS INCIDENTAL THERETO; AND SUCH SPECIAL CASES AND PROCEEDINGS AS NOT OTHERWISE PROVIDED FOR. IT HAD THE POWER OF NATURALIZATION AND TO ISSUE PAPERS THEREFOR. (1810., P. 306, SEC. 4).

THE COURT HAD APPELLATE JURISDICTION IN ALL CASES ARISING IN JUSTICE COURT AND OTHER INFERIOR COURTS IN THE COUNTY, IN THE SAME MANNER AND EXTENT AS THE DISTRICT COURTS.

ITS PROCESSES EXTENDED THROUGHOUT THE TERRITORY, PROVIDING THAT ALL ACTIONS FOR RECOVERY OR POSSESSION OF, QUIETING TITLE TO, OR ENFORCEMENT OF LIENS UPON REAL ESTATE, HAD TO BE COMMENCED IN THE COUNTY WHEREIN THE REAL ESTATE, OR ANY PART THEREOF AFFECTED, WAS SITUATED. (IBID., PP. 306-307, SEC. 4).

THE JUDGE OF THE COUNTY COURT HAD POWER TO ISSUE WRITS OF MANDAMUS, CERTIORARI, INJUNCTION, PROHIBITION, QUO WARRANTO, AND HABEAS CORPUS ON PETITION BY OR ON BEHALF OF ANY PERSON IN ACTUAL CUSTODY IN THE COUNTY (ID.). HE WAS ALSO GIVEN AUTHORITY TO APPOINT A COURT COMMISSIONER AND A COURT REPORTER (IBID., P. 307, SEC. 6; P. 309, SEC. 13). APPEALS FROM THE COUNTY COURT TO THE SUPREME COURT WERE TAKEN IN THE SAME MANNER AS FROM DISTRICT COURTS, AND ALL ACTS AND PARTS OF ACTS PRESCRIBING CIVIL AND CRIMINAL PROCEDURE IN THE DISTRICT COURTS WERE MADE APPLICABLE TO THE COUNTY COURTS (IBID., P. 307, SEC. 4). THE SAME ENACTMENT PROVIDED FOR A COUNTY CLERK WHO SHOULD BE CLERK OF THE COUNTY COURT AND EX OFFICIO CLERK OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS. THE CLERK WAS TO HOLD OFFICE AND BE ELECTED CONCURRENTLY WITH THE JUDGE (IBID., PP. 305-306, SEC. 2).

THE ACT FURTHER ABOLISHED THE PROBATE COURT IN PIMA COUNTY EFFECTIVE JANUARY 1, 1887 (IBID., P. 308, SEC. 10). BUT, IN 1887, THE YEAR NAMED FOR ABOLISHING THE PROBATE COURT, THE ASSEMBLY REVERSED THE SITUATION, ABOLISHED THE COUNTY COURT AND RE-ESTABLISHED PROBATE COURTS, ALL PROBATE PROCEEDINGS PENDING IN ANY COUNTY COURT WERE REQUIRED TO BE TRANSFERRED TO THE PROBATE COURT OF SUCH COUNTY, AND ALL OTHER CASES PENDING IN THE COUNTY COURT WERE TO BE TRANSFERRED TO THE DISTRICT COURT FOR THE COUNTY (R. S. 1887, APPENDIX P. 894, SECS. 18-22). BOTH THE PROBATE AND DISTRICT COURTS WERE SUPERSEDED AT STATEHOOD IN 1912 BY THE SUPERIOR COURT, AND RECORDS OF THE COUNTY COURT ARE IN CUSTODY OF THE CLERK OF SUPERIOR COURT. SUCH RECORDS IN THIS INVENTORY ARE LISTED IN THE SECTION DEVOTED TO THE SUPERIOR COURT.

VI. SUPERIOR COURT

CONGRESS PROVIDED IN THE ENABLING ACT THAT ALL CASES PENDING IN THE DISTRICT COURT AT THE TIME OF THE ADMISSION OF ARIZONA AS A STATE, AND NOT TRANSFERABLE TO SOME OTHER UNITED STATES COURT, SHOULD BE HEARD AND DETERMINED BY THE PROPER COURT OF THE STATE, CRIMINAL OFFENSES COMMITTED BUT NOT PROSECUTED BEFORE STATEHOOD WERE TO BE PROSECUTED IN THE STATE COURTS. (U. S. STATUTES AT LARGE, 1910, OH. 310, SECS. 18-34).

THE CONSTITUTION CREATED FOR EACH COUNTY OF THE STATE A SUPERIOR COURT WHICH SUPERSEDED THE DISTRICT COURT (CONST., ART. 22, SEC. 7) AND PROBATE COURT, (1810., ART 6, SEC. 6), BOTH OF WHICH BECAME DEFUNCT AT THE END OF THE TERRITORIAL PERIOD. COUNTIES WITH A CENSUS ENUMERATION GREATER THAN THIRTY THOUSAND HAVE ONE ADDITIONAL SUPERIOR COURT FOR EACH ADDITIONAL THIRTY THOUSAND OF POPULATION OR MAJOR FRACTION THEREOF (1810., ART. 6, SEC. 5). THE PROCEDURE, PLEADING AND PRACTICE NOW EMPLOYED IN THE SUPERIOR COURT DIFFERS ONLY SLIGHTLY FROM THAT USED IN THE DISTRICT COURT. PLEADING IS BY COMPLAINT, ANSWER AND REPLY, WITH THE USUAL MOTIONS AND DEMURRERS (R. C. 1928, PAR. 3737). CIVIL ACTIONS ARE LITIGATED WITHOUT ANY DISTINCTION AS TO ACTIONS AT LAW AND EQUITY (R. S. 1913, SEC. 425). ALL CRIMINAL ACTIONS OVER WHICH THE SUPERIOR COURT HAS ORIGINAL JURISDICTION MUST BE PROSECUTED BY INDICTMENT OR INFORMATION (CONST., ART. 2, SEC. 30), AND ALL MISDEMEANORS MAY BE SO PROSECUTED (PENAL CODE, 1913, SEC. 898).

THE ORIGINAL JURISDICTION OF THE SUPERIOR COURT EXTENDS TO ALL CASES IN LAW OR EQUITY WHICH INVOLVE THE TITLE TO, OR THE POSSESSION OF, REAL PROPERTY, OR THE LEGALITY OF ANY TAX, IMPOST, ASSESSMENT, TOLL, OR MUNICIPAL FINE, AND IN ALL OTHER CASES IN WHICH THE DEMAND OR THE VALUE OF THE PROPERTY IN CONTROVERSY AMOUNTS TO TWO HUNDRED DOLLARS EXCLUSIVE OF INTEREST AND COSTS; ALL CRIMINAL CASES AMOUNTING TO FELONY; ACTIONS OF FORCIBLE ENTRY AND DETAINER; PROCEEDINGS IN INSOLVENCY; ACTIONS TO PREVENT OR ABATE A NUISANCE; ALL MATTERS OF PROBATE, DIVORCE AND ANNULMENT OF MARRIAGE; ALL PROCEDINGS AFFECTING NEGLECTED, DELINQUENT, OR INCORRIGIBLE CHILDREN; AND ALL SPECIAL PROCEEDINGS NOT OTHERWISE PROVIDED FOR; AND CONCURRENT JURISDICTION WITH THE JUSTICE OF THE PEACE RELATIVE TO CERTAIN MISDEMEANORS. THE APPELLATE JURISDICTION OF THE SUPERIOR COURT RUNS TO ALL ACTIONS FROM THE COURTS OF JUSTICES OF THE PEACE AND OTHER INFERIOR COURTS, OFFICERS AND BOARDS AS ALLOWED BY LAW. (CONST., ART. 6, SEC. 6).

Special statutes provide for the arbitration of civil controversies and the use of the court, its officers and resources for this purpose, the procedure requiring each of the litigants to appoint an arbitrator before whom the trial is to be had. In event such arbitrators are unable to agree, the court then appoints an umpire, or the parties by agreement may select the umpire. (R. S. 1913, secs. 1480, 1488; R. C. 1928, secs. 4294, 4298). By consent of the parties to any civil cause, except divorce cases, trial of such cause may be had before a referee or referees appointed by the court not exceeding three in number, the trial thereafter being conducted in like manner as if tried before the court (R. S. 1913, sec. 664; R. C. 1928, sec. 3877).

Each superior court judge may make and promulgate rules not inconsistent with Law or rules adopted by the state supreme court, for the regulation of practice in the superior court, for its government, and the government of its officers, and in addition to powers conferred by statute may proceed according to the common Law (R. S. 1913, sec. 664; R. C. 1928, secs. 3700-3701).

THE JUDGE IN PIMA COUNTY APPOINTS A COURT COMMISSIONER. WHO IS EMPOWERED TO HEAR AND DETERMINE EX-PARTE MOTIONS FOR ORDERS AND WRITS EXCEPT ORDERS FOR PERMANENT INJUNCTIONS; TO TAKE PROOF AND REPORT HIS CONCLUSIONS AS TO ANY MATTERS OF FACT OTHER THAN ISSUES OF FACT RAISED BY THE PLEADINGS; TO APPROVE BONDS AND EXAMINE THE SURETIES THEREON; TO TAKE AFFIDAVITS, DEPOSITIONS, PROOF OF DEEDS, ACKNOWLEDGMENTS; TO ADMINISTER OATHS AND AFFIRMATIONS, AND TO USE A SEAL (CONST., ART. 6, SEC. 19; R. S. 1913, SEC. 378; R. C. 1928, SECS. 3705-3706). THE JUDGE APPOINTS A COURT REPORTER, WHO MUST PASS AN EXAMINATION AS TO COMPETENCY, AND WHOSE DUTIES ARE TO ATTEND COURT HEARINGS, MAKE STENOGRAPHIC NOTES OF ORAL PROCEEDINGS, AND, UPON PAYMENT OF PROPER FEES, FURNISH CERTIFIED, TYPEWRITTEN TRANSCRIPTS OF COURT PROCEEDINGS. (R. C. 1928, SEOS. 3705-3709). THE SHERIFF OR HIS DEPUTY MAY ACT AS COURT BAILIFF. IT IS THE PRACTICE IN PIMA COUNTY FOR THE JUDGE OF THE SUPERIOR COURT TO APPOINT THAT OFFICER, WHO IS THEN DEPUTIZED BY THE SHERIFF. THE BAILIFF'S DUTIES ARE TO ATTEND COURT SESSIONS, ACT AS ORIER, SUMM ON WITNESSES AND OTHER PERSONS REQUIRED TO APPEAR BY THE COURT AND MAKE PROCLAMATIONS OF THE OPENING AND ADJOURNMENT OF THE COURT, AND OF OTHER MATTERS UNDER ITS DIRECTION. (R. S. 1913, TITLE 10, PAR. 2549; R. C. 1928, PAR. 837). THE JUDGE ALSO APPOINTS THE MATRON OF THE DETENTION HOME FOR JUVENILES (L. 1919, CH. 103, SEC. 5), WHICH IS LOCATED AT 332 EAST FOURTH STREET, TUCSON.

ALTHOUGH THE COUNTY SEAT IS AT TUCSON, BECAUSE OF CERTAIN GEOGRAPHICAL FEATURES OF PIMA COUNTY, THE SUPERIOR COURT IS AUTHORIZED TO HOLD SESSIONS OF THE COURT BOTH AT TUCSON AND AJO. ALL PERSONS CHARGED WITH CRIME COMMITTED WITHIN THAT PORTION OF THE COUNTY LYING WEST OF THE GILA AND SALT RIVER MERIDIAN, AND ALL CIVIL ACTIONS INVOLVING TITLE TO, OR THE RIGHT TO POSSESSION OF, LANDS LYING IN THAT PORTION OF THE COUNTY, ARE TRIED AT AJO UNLESS THE COURT OTHERWISE ORDERS. ANY OTHER CIVIL ACTION MAY BE TRIED AT AJO BY AGREEMENT OF THE PARTIES. AND CIVIL, CRIMINAL AND PROBATE MATTERS MAY BY ORDER OF THE COURT BE TRANSFERRED FROM AJO TO TUCSON AND FROM TUCSON TO AJO (L. 1919, CH. 35).

THE OFFICE OF JUDGE OF THE SUPERIOR COURT WAS CREATED BY THE STATE CONSTITUTION. THE JUDGE IS ELECTED FOR A TERM OF FOUR YEARS AT THE GENERAL ELECTION WITHOUT PARTISAN DESIGNATION. (CONST., ART. 6, SEC. 5). HE MUST BE LEARNED IN THE LAW, AT LEAST TWENTY-FIVE YEARS OF AGE, SHALL HAVE

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BEEN ADMITTED TO PRACTICE BEFORE THE HIGHEST COURT OF ARIZONA FOR AT LEAST TWO YEARS, AND SHALL HAVE BEEN A RESIDENT OF ARIZONA FOR TWO YEARS PRECEDING HIS ELECTION (1810., ART. 6, SEC. 13).

ALTHOUGH ELECTED BY THE ELECTORATE OF A SINGLE COUNTY, SUPERIOR COURT JUDGES ARE REGARDED AS STATE RATHER THAN COUNTY OFFICIALS (R. S. 1913, SEC. 3222). VACANCIES IN THE OFFICE ARE FILLED BY APPOINTMENT OF THE GOVERNOR (CONST., ART. 6, SEC. 5). WHENEVER A JUDGE OF THE SUPREME COURT IS DISQUALIFIED FROM ADTING IN ANY CAUSE BROUGHT BEFORE THAT COURT, THE REMAINING JUDGES THEREOF ARE REQUIRED TO CALL ONE OF THE JUDGES OF THE SUPERIOR COURT TO SIT WITH THEM ON THE HEARING OF SUCH CAUSE (IBID., ART. 6, SEC. 3). A JUDGE OF THE SUPERIOR COURT MAY HOLD COURT IN ANOTHER COUNTY UPON A REQUEST OF THE SUPERIOR COURT JUDGE OF SAID COUNTY, OR UPON AN INSTRUCTION ISSUED BY THE GOVERNOR (CONST., ART. 6, SEC. 7).

THE JUDGE OF THE SUPERIOR COURT MAY SIT AT CHAMBERS AT ANY TIME AND PLACE WITHIN HIS COUNTY, OR IN ANY OTHER COUNTY WHERE HE HAS BEEN CALLED TO PRESIDE, AND WHILE SO SITTING MAY GRANT, DISSOLVE, OR MODIFY TEMPORARY INJUNCTIONS, HEAR AND DETERMINE APPLICATIONS FOR WRITS OF MANDAMUS, CERTIORARI, INJUNCTIONS, AND HABEAS CORPUS, AND DISCHARGE SUCH OTHER DUTIES OR EXERCISE SUCH OTHER POWERS AS MAY BE CONFERRED UPON A JUDGE IN CONTRADISTINCTION TO A COURT (R. C. 1928, SEC. 3696). SUPERIOR COURT JUDGES ARE MAGISTRATES BEFORE WHOM CRIMINAL COMPLAINTS MAY BE LAID (PENAL CODE, 1913, SECS. 834, 835). A GRAND JURY MAY BE SUMMONED ONLY BY ORDER OF A JUDGE OF THE SUPERIOR COURT (CONST., ART. 6, SEC. 6). THE JUDGE HAS SPECIAL DISCRETIONARY POWERS IN JUVENILE CASES; HE MAY HOLD HEARINGS OF SUCH CASES IN CHAMBERS, AND IN HIS DISCRETION MAY SUSPEND CRIMINAL PROSECUTIONS THEREOF (R. C. 1928, SEC. 1923). SUPERIOR COURT JUDGES ARE DESIGNATED AS TRUSTEES FOR INHABITANTS MAKING TOWNSITE ENTRIES UPON THE PUBLIC LANDS (IBID., SEO. 3193). LIKE OTHER PUBLIC OFFICIALS OF ARIZONA, SUPERIOR COURT JUDGES ARE SUBJECT TO RECALL UPON PETITION OF THE ELECTORATE, AND IT IS NOT NECESSARY THAT SUCH JUDGE WHOSE RECALL IS SOUGHT HAVE BEEN GUILTY OF MISFEASANCE, MALFEASANCE OR ANY MISCONDUCT IN OFFICE (CONST., ART. 8, SEC. 1; L. 1913, CONST. AM., P. 1; ABBEY VS. GREEN, 28 ARIZ. 53).

COURT, TO TAKE OVER DUTIES THERETOFORE PERFORMED BY CLERKS OF BOTH OF THE FORMER COURTS. THE CLERK IS ELECTED AT THE TIME OF THE ELECTION OF THE JUDGE OF THE SUPERIOR COURT AND FOR THE SAME TERM, FOUR YEARS (CONST., ART. 6, SEC. 18).

THE FIRST LEGISLATURE PROVIDED THAT THE CLERK OF SUPE-RIOR COURT SHOULD SAFELY KEEP ALL BOOKS, PAPERS AND RECORDS R. S. 1913, SEC. 367). HE WAS REQUIRED TO ATTEND IN PERSON OR BY DEPUTY EACH SESSION OF SUPERIOR COURT (IBID., SEC. 371). HE MAY NOT PRACTICE LAW (IBID., SEC. 375), AND CAN BE REMOVED FOR MISCONDUCT OR NEGLECT OF DUTIES (IBID., SEC. 374). THE CLERK APPOINTS DEPUTIES, THE INSTRUMENTS OF APPOINTMENT BEING FILED IN THE OFFICE OF THE COUNTY RECORDER (1810., SEC. 368). HE WAS REQUIRED TO ISSUE ALL WRITS AND PROCESS; ENTER, UNDER ORDER OF THE COURT, ALL ORDERS, JUDGMENTS, AND DECREES; KEEP A DOCKET IN WHICH SHOULD BE ENTERED THE TITLE OF EACH CAUSE, DATE OF COMMENCEMENT, MEMORANDUM OF EVERY SUBSEQUENT PROCEED-ING, ALL FEES COLLECTED, AND OTHER RECORDS AS THE COURT MAY REQUIRE (IBID., SEC. 372). HE WAS REQUIRED TO ISSUE MARRIAGE LICENSES, AND RECORD MARRIAGE LICENSES AND RETURNS (1810., SECS. 3834, 3836), AND TO FILE OATHS OF NOTARIES PUBLIC AND DELIVER THEIR COMMISSIONS (1810., SECS. 134 AND 136). VII. JUSTICE OF THE PEACE

IN THE PERIOD FROM 1854 TO 1863, WHEN THE AREA NOW WITH-IN PIMA COUNTY WAS PART OF NEW MEXICO, JUSTICES OF THE PEACE APPEAR TO HAVE FUNCTIONED IN TUCSON AND ELSEWHERE. IN ORGANIZING THE TERRITORY OF ARIZONA PURSUANT TO THE ORGANIC ACT, THE GOVERNOR BY PROCLAMATIONS ESTABLISHED A TEMPORARY PRECOUNTY LOCAL GOVERNMENT UNDER THREE JUDICIAL DISTRICTS, AND APPOINTED OFFICIALS THEREOF WHO SERVED FROM APRIL THROUGH DECEMBER 1864. THE FIRST JUDICIAL DISTRICT COMPRISED ALMOST THE SAME AREA LATER IN THE YEAR ERECTED INTO PIMA COUNTY BY THE FIRST ASSEMBLY. OFFICIALS OF THE FIRST JUDICIAL DISTRICT WERE APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR ON APRIL 11, 1864, AMONG THEM ALCALDES, OR JUSTICES OF THE PEACE. (FOR FURTHER DETAILS, SEE GOVERNMENTAL ORGANIZATION AND RECORDS SYSTEM, P. 7).

THE FIRST TERRITORIAL LEGISLATURE PROVIDED FOR TWO JUSTICES OF THE PEACE TO BE ELECTED FROM EACH ELECTION PRECINCT FOR TERMS OF ONE YEAR (HOWELL CODE, 1864, CH47). DUTIES AND JURISDICTION WERE THEN NOT VERY SPECIFICALLY DEFINED, BUT THE FOLLOWING YEAR THE ASSEMBLY PROVIDED THAT JUSTICE COURTS SHOULD HAVE JURISDICTION IN CIVIL ACTIONS NOT EXCEEDING ONE HUNDRED DOLLARS IN DEMAND, EXCEPT THAT IN NONE OF SUCH ACTIONS SHOULD TITLE TO REAL PROPERTY BE IN CONTROVERSY. CRIMINAL JURISDICTION WAS EXTENDED TO PROCEEDINGS RESPECTING VAGRANTS AND DISCORDERLY PERSONS, PETIT LARGENY, ASSAULT AND BATTERY, BREACHES

of the peace and riots, and all misdemeanors punishable by fine not exceeding one thousand dollars or imprisonment not exceeding one year (L. 1865, pp. 23-24). In 1871 the legislature enlarged the jurisdiction of justices of the peace in civil actions to the amount of three hundred dollars, and reduced it in misdemeanors to those punishable by fine of not more than three hundred dollars (L. 1871, pp. 30-31).

THE JUSTICE OF THE PEACE WAS REQUIRED TO INITIATE PRO-CEEDINGS FOR THE CARE OF INDIGENT PERSONS EITHER BY RELATIVES OR BY THE COUNTY (HOWELL CODE, CH. 56, SECS. 10-11). HE WAS A REGISTRATION OFFICER UNDER THE COUNTY RECORDER (COMP. L. 1877, CH. 24, SEC. 6, P. 238). REGULATION OF APPEALS TO THE DISTRICT COURT WAS PROVIDED IN 1879 (L. 1879, ACT No. 46). A SYSTEM OF PROCEDURE IN JUSTICE COURTS SIMILAR TO THAT OF THE PRESENT TIME WAS SET UP IN THE REVISION OF THE LAWS IN 1887. ACTIONS WERE TO BE BEGUN BY COMPLAINT, A DOCKET HAD TO BE KEPT, AND PROCEDURE OF DISTRICT COURTS WAS FOLLOWED AS FAR AS POSSIBLE. (R. S. 1887, PENAL CODE, TITLE 22). BY THE SAME STATUTORY REVISION, THE JUSTICE OF THE PEACE WAS MADE EX OFFICIO CORO-NER (IBID., TITLE 13, CH. 3, SEC. 459), AND HAS REMAINED SUCH TO THE PRESENT. THE JUSTICE OF THE PEACE HAD FORMERLY BEEN REQUIRED TO ACT AS CORONER IN CASE OF VACANCY OR ABSENCE FROM OFFICE OF THE PUBLIC ADMINISTRATOR (L. 1867, PP. 29-31). IN 1885 JUSTICES OF THE PEACE WERE GIVEN JURISDICTION OVER ALL CONTROVERSIES RELATING TO LIVESTOCK MARKS AND BRANDS (L. 1885, P. 33). THE LAW OF 1897 CREATING THE TERRITORIAL LIVESTOCK SANITARY BOARD GAVE THE JUSTICES OF THE PEACE COGNIZANCE, WITHIN THE LIMITS OF THEIR JURISDICTION, OF ALL CASES ARISING UNDER PROVISIONS OF THE LAW (L. 1897, PP. 27, 33).

THE CONSTITUTION CONTINUED THE OFFICE OF JUSTICE OF THE PEACE (CONST., ART. 6, SEC. 9). ITS JURISDICTION HAS REMAINED ESSENTIALLY THE SAME. THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS IS REQUIRED TO DIVIDE THE COUNTY INTO JUSTICE PRECINCTS (L. 1912, CH. 42, SEC. 1). EACH PRECINCT ELECTS A JUSTICE OF THE PEACE AND CONSTABLE FOR TWO YEARS (R. S. 1913, SEC. 2508). THE CONDUCT AND PROGEDURE OF JUSTICE COURTS FOLLOWS THE SUPERIOR COURT AS NEARLY AS POSSIBLE (R. C. 1928, PAR. 4209). CIVIL CASES TRIED IN SUCH COURTS MAY BE WITH A JURY OF SIX PERSONS, UNLESS BY CONSENT OF LITIGANTS THIS NUMBER IS REDUCED TO AS FEW AS THREE. CRIMINAL ACTIONS REQUIRE A JURY OF TWELVE. (IBID., PAR. 1904). THE JUSTICE OF THE PEACE CANNOT INSTRUCT THE JURY (IBID., PAR. 4209). HE MAY ENFORCE JUDGMENTS BY WRIT OF EXECUTION ON PERSONAL PROPERTY (IBID., PAR. 4200).

THE JURISDICTION OF JUSTICE OF THE PEACE COURTS NOW EXTENDS TO ALL CIVIL ACTIONS OF AMOUNTS LESS THAN TWO HUNDRED DOLLARS, EXCEPT WHERE ORIGINAL JURISDICTION HAS BEEN CONFERRED UPON THE SUPERIOR GOURT. THEY HAVE JURISDICTION CONCURRENT WITH THE SUPERIOR COURTS IN CASES OF FORCIBLE ENTRY AND DETAINER WHERE THE RENTAL VALUE DOES NOT EXCEED TWENTY-FIVE DOLLARS PER MONTH AND WHERE THE DAMAGE IS LESS THAN TWO HUNDRED DOLLARS, AND IN CRIMINAL CASES, OTHER THAN FELONIES, WHERE THE

PEA

PUNISHMENT IS A FINE OF LESS THAN THREE HUNDRED DOLLARS, OR IMPRISONMENT OF LESS THAN SIX MONTHS IN THE COUNTY JAIL. THEIR JURISDICTION ALSO COVERS DISPUTES OVER THE POSSESSION OF REAL PROPERTY WHERE THE TITLE THERETO IS NOT A MATTER OF CONTENTION. (R. C. 1928, SEC. 4178). WITH JUDGES OF HIGHER COURTS AND POLICE MAGISTRATES, JUSTICES OF THE PEACE ARE MAGISTRATES BEFORE WHOM CRIMINAL ACTION MAY BE BROUGHT BY COMPLAINT IN WRITING AND UNDER OATH (R. C. 1928, SECS. 4927, 4928). THEY MAY EXAMINE THE COMPLAINANT UNDER OATH, AND MAY ALSO SUBPOENA AND EXAMINE WITNESSES, AND, UPON FINDING REASONABLE GROUNDS, CAUSE THE ARREST OF THE DEFENDANT BY ISSUING A WARRANT THEREFOR (IBID., PAR. 4929).

THE JUSTICE OF THE PEACE IS REQUIRED TO KEEP BOTH CIVIL AND CRIMINAL DOCKETS, COVERING IN DETAIL THE VARIOUS MATTERS FILED IN COURT, AND INCLUDING JUDGMENTS RECORDED AT LENGTH (IBID., SECS. 4180, 4197). OTHER RECORDS REQUIRED TO BE KEPT BY THIS OFFICE INCLUDE: RECORD OF ESTRAYS, AFFIDAVITS OF ESTRAYS (IBID., PAR. 2137); FEE BOOK (IBID., PAR. 1491); REPORTS OF PERSONAL PROPERTY BELONGING TO DECEDENTS (IBID., PAR. 888).

VIII. COUNTY ATTORNEY

THE DUTIES OF PROSECUTOR IN THE DISTRICT COURTS AT FIRST WERE PERFORMED BY THE TERRITORIAL ATTORNEY GENERAL (Howell Code, 1864, ch. 16, sec. 2). IN 1866 A DISTRICT ATTORNEY WAS CREATED FOR EACH COUNTY TO BE ELECTED FOR A TERM OF TWO YEARS. THE DISTRICT ATTORNEY WAS REQUIRED TO BE PUBLIC PROSECUTOR IN HIS COUNTY, AND, IN CONNECTION THERE-WITH, TO ATTEND THE DISTRICT COURT, AND ALSO THE JUSTICE COURT, UPON REQUEST OF THE JUSTICE OF THE PEACE; TO DRAW INDICTMENTS WHEN REQUIRED BY THE GRAND JURY; TO PROSECUTE AND DEFEND IN CIVIL SUITS TO WHICH THE COUNTY WAS A PARTY; TO ACCOUNT FOR ALL MONEY AND PROPERTY RECEIVED BY HIM AND TO PAY SUCH MONEY TO THE COUNTY TREASURER AND FILE WITH HIM AN ACCOUNT OF THE SAME; TO ADVISE OTHER COUNTY OFFICIALS AND ATTEND MEETINGS OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS WHEN AUDIT-ING ACCOUNTS AND CLAIMS AGAINST THE COUNTY. (L. 1866, PP. 22-24).

THE OFFICE OF COUNTY ATTORNEY WAS CREATED BY THE CON-STITUTION, TO BE ELECTIVE FOR A TWO-YEAR TERM, AND DUTIES THEREOF TO BE PRESCRIBED BY LAW. (CONST. ART. 12, SEC. 3). THE DUTIES OF THIS OFFICE ARE SIMILAR TO THOSE OF ITS PRED-EGESSOR, THE DISTRICT ATTORNEY. THE COUNTY ATTORNEY IS EX-OFFICIO VICE-PRESIDENT OF THE COUNTY BOARD OF HEALTH, AS WAS THE DISTRICT ATTORNEY. (L. 1903, CH. 65, SEC. 6; R. C. 1928, PAR. 2682). Upon request of the attorney general, or by his DIRECTION . THE COUNTY ATTORNEY MUST PROSECUTE AND ENFORCE ANY OF THE PROVISIONS GOVERNING MONEY DUE THE STATE WORKMAN'S COMPENSATION FUND (R. C., 1928, PAR. 1449). TOGETHER WITH THE ATTORNEY GENERAL, HE MUST ENFORCE THE STATUTORY PRO-VISIONS WHICH PROHIBIT TRUSTS AND COMBINATIONS IN RESTRAINT OF TRADE (IBID., PAR. 3213). WHEN REQUIRED BY THE STATE EX-AMINER AND TREASURER, HE MUST AID IN INVESTIGATIONS CONDUCTED BY THOSE OFFICERS (IBID., PARS. 2911, 3177).

HE IS REQUIRED TO CONDUCT THE PROSECUTION IN CRIMINAL BASTARDY PROCEEDINGS (IBID., SEC. 881); IN MATTERS OF ADOPTION TO DRAW THE PETITION AND OTHER NECESSARY PAPERS AND APPEAR IN COURT FOR THE PETITIONERS, FOR WHICH HE RECEIVES NO ADDITIONAL COMPENSATION (IBID., SEC. 118); WHEN REQUESTED, TO CONDUCT THE EXAMINATION OF WITNESSES AT CORONER'S INQUESTS (IBID., SEC. 881); TO RENDER OPINIONS OF LAW, WHEN SO REQUESTED BY COUNTY OFFICERS, ON MATTERS RELATING TO THE DUTIES OF THEIR OFFICES (IBID., SEC. 881); TO PROSECUTE ACTIONS ON BEHALF OF THE STATE IN ESCHEAT PROCEEDINGS (IBID., SEC. 4305); TO ATTEND ALL HEARINGS ON INSANITY (IBID., SEC. 5123); TO INSTITUTE OF HIS OWN VOLITION, OR UPON COMPLAINT OF A CITIZEN, QUO WARRANTO PROCEEDINGS (1810., SEC. 4406). HE MAY APPEAR BEFORE THE GRAND JURY TO GIVE INFORMATION OR ADVICE, AND MAY INTERROGATE WITNESSES BEFORE IT (IBID., SEC. 4972). HE IS REQUIRED TO DRAW ALL INDICTMENTS RETURNED BY THE GRAND JURY AND ALL IN-FORMATIONS IN MATTERS OF FELONY OR MISDEMEANOR (1810., SECS. 881 AND 4976).

ALL COUNTY ATTORNEYS IN THE STATE AND THEIR OFFICES ARE UNDER THE GENERAL SUPERVISION OF THE STATE ATTORNEY GEN-ERAL (IBID., SEC. 52). THE COUNTY ATTORNEY IS REQUIRED BY STATUTE TO BE A LICENSED ATTORNEY IN GOOD STANDING IN THE STATE (IBID., PAR. 880). HIS TERM OF OFFICE IS FOR TWO YEARS. PRESENT DUTIES OF HIS OFFICE GENERALLY ARE: TO INSTITUTE CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS BY PREPARING AND FILING INFORMATIONS; TO REPRESENT THE COUNTY IN ALL PROSECUTIONS AND IN ALL CIVIL MATTERS TO WHICH THE COUNTY IS A PARTY; TO ACT AS LEGAL ADVISOR OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS; TO ACT AS ATTORNEY FOR ALL SCHOOL DISTRICTS AND BOARDS OF TRUSTEES. HE KEEPS THE FOLLOWING RECORDS: A REGISTER OF OFFICIAL BUSINESS SHOWING EVERY ACTION, CRIMINAL OR CIVIL, PROSECUTED OFFICIALLY AND PROCEEDINGS THEREOF (R. C. 1928, SEC. 881); PETITIONS FOR ADOPTION (IBID., SEC. 118); GRIMINAL COMPLAINTS (IBID., SEC. 881).

IX. JUVENILE PROBATION OFFICER

THE FIRST LEGISLATION ENACTED IN THE TERRITORY FOR THE WELFARE OF DEPENDENT, NEGLECTED, INCORRIGIBLE, AND DELINQUENT CHILDREN, PASSED IN 1907, GAVE THE JUDGES OF THE DISTRICT

COURTS ORIGINAL AND EXCLUSIVE JURISDICTION TO HEAR, TRY, AND DETERMINE IN ANY PROCEEDINGS BROUGHT BEFORE THEM ALL MATTERS AFFECTING CHILDREN UNDER SIXTEEN YEARS OF AGE CHARGED WITH THE VIOLATION OF ANY LAW OF THE TERRITORY. THE SAME STATUTE FURTHER AUTHORIZED THE DISTRICT JUDGE TO APPOINT ONE OR MORE DISCREET PERSONS TO ACT AS PROBATION OFFICERS, TO WHOSE CUSTODY OR UNDER WHOSE CARE AND SUPERVISION THE COURT MIGHT ADMIT THE ACCUSED OR CONVICTED CHILD TO PROBATION, THE STATUTE PROVIDING THAT THE PROBATION OFFICERS SO APPOINTED WERE TO ACT WITHOUT COMPENSATION. (L. 1907, CH. 78).

BEGINNING WITH STATEHOOD, JUDGES OF SUPERIOR COURTS WERE GIVEN EXCLUSIVE JURISDICTION IN ALL PROCEEDINGS AFFECTING NEG-LECTED, INCORRIGIBLE, OR DELINQUENT CHILDREN, OR CHILDREN UNDER THE AGE OF EIGHTEEN YEARS ACCUSED OF CRIME, AND WERE AUTHORIZED TO APPOINT PROBATION OFFICERS (L. 1912, 1st. S. S., ch. 63; R. S. 1913, PARS. 3562-3). IN 1917 PROVISION WAS MADE FOR LIMITED USE OF RECORDS IN JUVENILE CASES, AND FOR THEIR DESTRUCTION, EX-CEPT UNDER CERTAIN CONDITIONS, ON ORDER OF THE JUDGE OF THE SUPER-IOR COURT TO THE CLERK THEREOF (L. 1917, CH. 18, SEC. 1). SUCH RECORDS OF JUVENILE CASES ARE KEPT IN A SEPARATE DOCKET (R. C. 1928, PAR. 1928). IN 1919 THE SUPERIOR COURT JUDGE WAS PER-MITTED TO APPOINT AS MANY VOLUNTEER PROBATION OFFICERS AS DEEMED ADVISABLE, ONE TO BE DESIGNATED AS CHIEF PROBATION OFFICER AND TO RECEIVE A REGULAR SALARY. THE CHIEF PROBATION OFFICER WAS INSTRUCTED TO KEEP A RECORD OF EVERY JUVENILE CASE, GIVING NAME AND AGE OF CHILD, PLACE OF BIRTH, AND PARENTS! NAMES, SO FAR AS SUCH INFORMATION WAS OBTAINABLE. (L. 1919, CH. 103, SECS. 1, 4).

Subsequent Legislation provided for appointment of deputy Juvenile probation officers who should be discreet persons of Good Moral Character (L. 1929, Ch. 64, Sec. 3). In 1933 the Juvenile probation officer was required to pass a competitive examination touching child welfare, Juvenile delinquency and dependency, and subjects associated with social science, prescribed and given by a committee of at least three members appointed by the Judge, and composed of persons acquainted with welfare work. The Judge May also appoint a deputy probation officer and office assistant. (L. 1933, Ch. 53, Sec. 1).

THE PROBATION OFFICER HAS THE AUTHORITY OF A PEACE OFFICER.

HE IS REQUIRED TO LOOK AFTER THE INTEREST OF NEGLECTED, DEPENDENT, OR DELINQUENT CHILDREN; MAKE INVESTIGATIONS AND FILE
PETITIONS; BE PRESENT IN COURT TO REPRESENT THE INTERESTS OF
SUCH JUVENILES; FURNISH THE COURT SUCH INFORMATION AND ASSISTANCE AS IT MAY REQUIRE, AND ASSIST IN THE COLLECTION OF MONEY
ORDERED PAID FOR THE SUPPORT OF CHILDREN. THE EXPENSE OF OPERATING THE JUVENILE PROBATION OFFICE IS A COUNTY CHARGE.
WHEN THE COURT COMMITS A DELINQUENT CHILD TO ITS PARENTS OR
PLACES IT WITH SOME OTHER FAMILY, THE JUVENILE PROBATION
OFFICER MAY VISIT SUCH HOME OR FAMILY AS OFTEN AS REQUIRED,
AND, AT ALL TIMES, SUCH CHILD IS UNDER HIS SUPERVISION AND

LOTE

REPORTS TO HIM. (L. 1929, CH. 64, SECS. 3-5). HE IS REQUIRED TO KEEP A CHILD CARE RECORD RELATING TO CHILDREN OF DIVORCED PARENTS (R. C. 1928, SEC. 5108), AND TO KEEP REPORTS OF DEPUTY PROBATION OFFICERS (IBID., SEC. 1930).

IN COUNTIES OF THE FIRST CLASS HAVING A CRIMINAL DIVI-SION OF SUPERIOR COURT, THE JUDGE PRESIDING OVER THE SAME MAY APPOINT AN ADULT PROBATION OFFICER. IN OTHER COUNTIES THE JUVENILE PROBATION OFFICER IS REQUIRED TO ACT AS ADULT PROBATION OFFICER (L. 1927, CH. 69). AS PIMA COUNTY HAS NO CRIMINAL DIVISION OF SUPERIOR COURT, ITS JUVENILE PROBATION OFFICER ACTS ALSO AS ADULT PROBATION OFFICER. THE ADULT PRO-BATION OFFICER KEEPS A RECORD OF ALL CASES OF PERSONS PLACED UNDER SUSPENDED SENTENCE BY THE COURT, AND OF REPORTS MADE TO HIM IN ACCORDANCE WITH CONDITIONS IMPOSED BY THE COURT. HE EXERCISES GENERAL SUPERVISION AND OBSERVATION OF SUCH PERSONS, UNDER THE COURT'S JURISDICTION AND DIRECTION, AND SERVES WARRANTS, MAKES ARRESTS AND BRINGS SUCH PERSONS BEFORE THE COURT IN MATTERS OF SUSPENDED SENTENCE. HE RECEIVES ALL MONEYS PAID INTO THE COURT UNDER PROVISIONS OF SUSPENDED SENTENCES, DISBURSES THE SAME IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH, AND KEEPS A RECORD OF SUCH RECEIPTS AND DISBURSEMENTS. (R. C. 1928, SEC. 5106).

PURSUANT TO A BLANKET CONGRESSIONAL ENACTMENT GIVING CON-SENT OF CONGRESS TO COMPACTS BETWEEN TWO OR MORE STATES TO PER-MIT COOPERATION BETWEEN THEM IN THE SUPERVISION OF PROBATIONERS AND PAROLEES FOR THE PREVENTION OF CRIME, (U. S. STATUTES AT LARGE, 1934, VOL. 48, CH. 406, P. 909), THE LEGISLATURE IN 1937 DIRECTED THE GOVERNOR TO ENTER INTO SUCH COMPACT WITH OTHER STATES RATIFYING IT. ARIZONA HAS JOINED IN SUCH A COMPACT WITH TWENTY-FOUR OTHER STATES. THE COMPACT REQUIRES ARIZONA TO ASSUME DUTIES OF VISITATION AND SUPERVISION OF PAROLEES AND PROBATIONERS FROM SENDING STATES ALLOWED TO RESIDE IN A RECEIVING STATE, AND PROVIDES THAT THEY SHALL BE SUBJECT TO THE STATUTES GOVERNING SUCH CASES IN THE RECEIVING STATE. THE OPERATION OF THIS COM-PACT, RATIFIED BY THE LEGISLATURE, IMPOSES UPON PROBATION OFFI-CERS THE ADDITIONAL DUTIES OF VISITATION AND SUPERVISION OF PERSONS UNDER SUSPENDED SENTENCES AND PAROLEES FROM OTHER STATES. (L. 1937, CH. 42). THE ADULT PROBATION OFFICER, OR THE JUVENILE PROBATION OFFICER, ACTING IN THAT CAPACITY, IS REQUIRED TO KEEP THE FOLLOWING RECORDS: FILE OF RECORDS OF SUSPENDED SENTENCES; REPORTS, VERBAL AND WRITTEN, OF PERSONS UNDER SUSPENDED SENTENDE; RECEIPTS AND DISBURSEMENTS OF SUPPORT OR ALIMONY (R. C. 1928, PAR. 5108).

X. CORONER

Two coroners at first were elected in each county for terms of two years. Their duties consisted of investigating circumstances surrounding deaths suspected to be of a griminal nature. The coroner was required to summon a jury of from nine to fifteen to view the body of the deceased and inquire into the cause of death; to subpoen witnesses, including physicians and surgeons, to testify as to facts they may have ascertained; to issue warrant of arrest for any person found by the jury to have unlawfully contributed to or to have caused such death; to assume the custody of and deliver the money or property of the deceased to the county treasurer, if not claimed by a legal representative; and to cause the body of

THE DECEASED TO BE DECENTLY INTERRED, WHEN THE SAME WAS A COUNTY CHARGE. IN COUNTIES HAVING NO SHERIFF OR UNDER-SHERIFF, THE DISTRICT COURT JUDGE DESIGNATED ONE OF THE CORONERS TO ACT IN THAT CAPACITY. WHEN THE SHERIFF WAS FOR ANY CAUSE COMMITTED TO THE JAIL, THE CORONER LIVING NEAREST THE JAIL WAS TO BE THE JAILER. IN CASE OF VACANCY OR ABSENCE FROM OFFICE OF THE CORONER, THE JUSTICE OF THE PEACE WAS REQUIRED TO ACT IN THAT CAPACITY. (Howell Code, 1864, ch. 4).

IN 1867, THE ASSEMBLY CREATED THE ELECTIVE OFFICE OF PUBLIC ADMINISTRATOR, WHO WAS ALSO TO BE EX OFFICIO CORONER IN AND FOR HIS COUNTY, AND WHILE ACTING IN THAT CAPACITY WAS GOVERNED BY THE SAME LAWS BY WHICH JUSTICES OF THE PEACE HAD BEEN, AND RECEIVED THE SAME FEES (L. 1867, PP. 29-31). A QUESTION AROSE AS TO WHETHER IT WAS THE INTENT OF THIS ACT TO ABOLISH THE SEPARATE OFFICE OF CORONER. VARYING PRACTICES RESULTED IN THE SEVERAL COUNTIES. THE MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF PIMA COUNTY SHOW THE FOLLOWING ELECTIONS TO THESE OFFICES IN THAT COUNTY: 1868, 1872, 1876, PUBLIC ADMINISTRATOR ONLY; 1874, PUBLIC ADMINISTRATOR AND EX OFFICIO CORONER; 1880 AND 1882, PUBLIC ADMINISTRATOR, AND ONE CORONER; 1884 AND 1886, PUBLIC ADMINISTRATOR AND TWO CORONERS. IN 1885 THE GOVERNOR IN HIS MESSAGE (JOURNAL, 1885 LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY, P. 158) ASKED THE LEGISLATURE TO MAKE THE LEGIS-LATION MORE DEFINITE, WHICH IT DID IN 1887, WHEN THE PUBLIC ADMINISTRATOR WAS ABOLISHED AND JUSTICES OF THE PEACE WERE MADE EX OFFICIO CORONERS. THEY HAVE CONTINUED AS SUCH TO THE PRESENT TIME. (R. S. 1887, SECS. 456-459).

WHO DIED INTESTATE, OF DECEASED STRANGERS, OF DECEASED TESTATES WHEN NO EXECUTOR WAS APPOINTED OR IF APPOINTED FAILED TO QUALIFY, UNLESS ADMINISTERED UPON WITHIN ONE MONTH AFTER DEATH BY A RELATIVE, OR BY CREDITORS, PURSUANT TO LAW (1810., P. 29, SEC. 3).

IN DECEMBER AND JUNE OF EACH YEAR THE PUBLIC ADMINISTRATOR WAS REQUIRED TO MAKE A WRITTEN REPORT TO THE PROBATE JUDGE OF ALL SUCH ESTATES WHICH HAD OFFICIALLY PASSED INTO HIS HANDS FOR ADMINISTRATION, SHOWING THE VALUE OF SUCH ESTATES, ANY EXPENSES PAID THEREON, AND THE BALANCE OF PROPERTY, EFFECTS OR MONEY REMAINING IN HIS HANDS. THE PROBATE JUDGE CAUSED THIS REPORT TO BE MADE PUBLIC, EITHER BY PUBLICATION OR POSTING (1810., PP. 29-30, SEC. 4).

IN 1887 THE OFFICE OF PUBLIC ADMINISTRATOR WAS ABOLISHED, AND THE JUSTICE OF THE PEACE WAS CONSTITUTED EX OFFICIO CORONER. (R. S. 1887, SECS. 456-459).

XII. SHERIFF

IN ORGANIZING THE TERRITORY OF ARIZONA, PURSUANT TO THE ORGANIC ACT, THE GOVERNOR BY PROCLAMATIONS ESTABLISHED A TEMPORARY PRE-COUNTY LOCAL GOVERNMENT UNDER THREE JUDICIAL DISTRICTS, AND APPOINTED OFFICIALS THEREOF WHO SERVED FROM APRIL THROUGH DECEMBER, 1864. THE FIRST JUDICIAL DISTRICT COMPRISED ALMOST THE SAME AREA LATER IN THE YEAR ERECTED INTO PIMA COUNTY BY THE FIRST ASSEMBLY. OFFICIALS OF THE FIRST JUDICIAL DISTRICT WERE APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR ON APRIL 11, 1864, AMONG THEM A SHERIFF. (FOR FURTHER DETAILS, SEE GOVERNMENTAL ORGANIZATION AND RECORDS SYSTEM, p. 7).

THE FIRST TERRITORIAL ASSEMBLY CREATED THE FOUR ORIGINAL COUNTIES, INCLUDING PIMA, AND ENACTED PROVISIONS FOR GOVERNMENTAL ORGANIZATION AND RECORDS SYSTEM OF COUNTIES. IT PROVIDED FOR EACH COUNTY A SHERIFF TO BE ELECTED FOR A TWO-YEAR TERM. HE WAS TO MAINTAIN OFFICE AT THE COUNTY SEAT, AND GIVE BOND FOR TEN THOUSAND DOLLARS, WITH SURETIES NOT LESS THAN THREE IN NUMBER, AS THE JUDGE OF THE DISTRICT COURT OR THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS SHOULD APPROVE. THE SHERIFF WAS AUTHORIZED TO APPOINT A CHIEF DEPUTY, STYLED "UNDER-SHERIFF," AND OTHER DEPUTIES AS NEEDED, AND WAS, IN ALL RESPECTS, RESPONSIBLE FOR HIS DEPUTIES. (HOWELL CODE, 1864, OH. 3).

THE SHERIFF WAS A PEACE OFFICER AND HAD CHARGE OF JAILS AND PRISONERS (IBID., P. 28). HE WAS REQUIRED TO SERVE OR EXECUTE ALL LEGAL PROCESSES, WRITS, PRECEPTS, AND ORDERS (IBID., P. 29), INCLUDING DRAFT OF MEN INTO MILITARY SERVICE (IBID., PP. 165, 166). HE WAS PERMITTED TO ENLIST SUITABLE AID IN THE SERVICE OF PROCESS, THE PRESERVING OF THE PEACE, OR IN THE APPREHENDING OR SECURING OF ANY PERSON FOR FELONY OR BREACH OF THE PEACE. HE ALSO WAS A MEMBER OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS AND, IN THE ABSENCE OF THE PROBATE JUDGE, WAS TEMPORARY CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD. HE WAS NOT PERMITTED TO PRACTICE LAW. (IBID., PP. 29, 42). WITH THE DISTRICT COURT JUDGE AND THE PROBATE COURT JUDGE, HE CALLED THE GRAND JURY (IBID., CH. 47, SEC. 2). SINCE 1866 HE HAS BEEN COLLECTOR OF FEES AND LICENSES FOR CERTAIN BUSINESSES AND AMUSEMENTS, THE MONEYS BEING PAID TO THE COUNTY TREASURER (L. 1866, P. 53).

PENDING THE CONSTRUCTION OF A TERRITORIAL PENITENTIARY, THE SHERIFF HAD CHARGE OF PRISONERS SENTENCED TO THE PENITENTIARY AND WAS REQUIRED TO PROVIDE THEM SUITABLE BEDDING, CLOTHING, BOARD, AND MEDICAL ATTENTION. HE HAD POWER TO DISCIPLINE THEM. (COMP. L. 1864-71, CH. 12, SEC. 2). A STATUTE OF 1867 AUTHORIZED THE SHERIFF TO EMPLOY CONVICTS SENTENCED TO THE COUNTY JAIL (L. 1867, P. 19). THE LEGISLATURE, IN THE CODIFICATION OF THE STATUTES IN 1901, PERMITTED SUCH EMPLOYMENT ON THE PUBLIC STREETS AND HIGHWAYS WHERE THE SAME WOULD NOT CONFLICT WITH FREE LABOR (R. S. 1901, TITLE 15, PAR. 1197). THE SHERIFF WAS EX OFFICIO ASSESSOR AND EX OFFICIO TAX COLLECTOR OF PIMA COUNTY DURING 1864-1885.

THE STATE CONSTITUTION PROVIDED FOR A SHERIFF TO BE ELECTED IN EACH COUNTY FOR A TWO-YEAR TERM, DUTIES TO BE PRESORIBED BY

LAW (CONST., ART. 12, SEC. 3). HIS POWERS AND DUTIES REMAIN SUBSTANTIALLY THE SAME. UNDER THE PRESENT LAW THE SHERIFF'S FIRST DUTY IS TO PRESERVE THE PEACE. HE IS REQUIRED TO MAKE ARRESTS FOR PUBLIC OFFENSES, PREVENT AND SUPPRESS ALL AFFRAYS, BREACHES OF THE PEACE, RIOTS, AND INSURRECTIONS, PREVENT ORIME AND APPREHEND CRIMINALS. (R. C. 1928, PAR. 837). HE SERVES ALL PROCESS AND NOTICES OF THE SUPERIOR COURT IN THE MANNER PRESCRIBED BY LAW (IBID., SEC. 837). ON NOTIFICATION BY THE OLERK OF SUPERIOR COURT, THE SHERIFF WITH THE RECORDER IS RE-QUIRED TO ATTEND THE DRAWING OF JURORS AT THE TIME APPOINTED (IDID., PAR. 1912). BY AND WITH THE CONSENT OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS, THE SHERIFF APPOINTS RANGER DEPUTIES (L. 1912, CH. 93, SEC. 21). EMPLOYMENT OF PRISONERS IS NOW LIMITED TO WORK IN OR ABOUT THE COURTHOUSE (R. C. 1928, PAR. 848). THE SHERIFF IS REQUIRED TO KEEP THE FOLLOWING REGORDS: FEE BOOK (R. XIII. CONSTABLE

IN THE ORGANIZATION OF THE TERRITORY OF ARIZONA, PUR-SUANT TO THE ORGANIC ACT, THE GOVERNOR BY PROCLAMATIONS ESTAB-LISHED A TEMPORARY PRE-COUNTY LOCAL GOVERNMENT UNDER THREE JUDICIAL DISTRICTS AND APPOINTED OFFICIALS THEREOF TO SERVE FROM APRIL THROUGH DECEMBER, 1864. THE FIRST JUDICIAL DIS-TRIGT COMPRISED ALMOST THE SAME AREA LATER IN THE YEAR ERECTED INTO PIMA COUNTY BY THE FIRST ASSEMBLY, ON APRIL 11, 1864 OFFICIALS FOR THE FIRST JUDICIAL DISTRICT WERE APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR, AMONG THEM CONSTABLES FOR TUCSON AND FOR THE PIMA VILLAGES. (FOR FURTHER DETAILS, SEE GOVERNMENTAL ORGANIZATION AND RECORDS SYSTEM, P. 7).

THE FIRST TERRITORIAL ASSEMBLY CREATED THE ORIGINAL COUNTIES AND ENACTED PROVISIONS FOR GOVERNMENTAL ORGANIZATION AND RECORDS SYSTEM OF COUNTIES. IT PROVIDED FOR ONE AND NOT MORE THAN TWO CONSTABLES TO BE ELECTED FROM EACH PRECINCT AN-NUALLY TO HOLD OFFICE UNTIL A SUCCESSOR SHOULD BE ELECTED AND QUALIFIED. (HOWELL CODE, CH. 8, SEC. 1). HE WAS THEN, AS NOW, A MINISTERIAL OFFICER OF THE JUSTICE OF THE PEACE. WHEN PROP-ERLY NOTIFIED BY THE SHERIFF, HE WAS REQUIRED TO ATTEND SES-SIONS OF THE DISTRICT COURT IN HIS COUNTY (IBID., SEC. 7). THE CONSTABLE HAS ALWAYS BEEN A PEACE OFFICER. HE WAS REQUIRED TO SERVE ALL WARRANTS, NOTICES, PROCESS, WRITS OR ORDERS LAWFULLY DIRECTED TO HIM IN ANY TOWNSHIP OF HIS COUNTY, (IBID., SECS, 5, 6). THE CONSTABLE AND HIS SURETIES WERE LIABLE FOR HIS NEGLECT OR DEFAULT IN THE SERVICE OR RETURN OF ANY PROCESS DE-LIVERED TO HIM FOR SERVICE OR COLLECTION, AND SUCH SURETIES HAD TO BE APPROVED BY THE PROBATE JUDGE OR JUSTICE OF THE

PEAGE (IBID., SEC. 3). THE CONSTABLE COULD NOT ASSIST IN CONDUCTING ANY SUIT OR PROCEEDING IN JUSTICE COURT, NOR PURCHASE OR BE INTERESTED IN ANY CLAIMS PURCHASED FOR THE PURPOSE OF BEING PROSECUTED IN SUCH COURTS, OR BE A PURCHASER OR INTERESTED IN ANY WAY IN PROPERTY SOLD BY HIM ON ANY PROCESS ISSUED BY THE JUSTICE OF THE PEAGE (IBID., SEC. 2).

IN 1871 THE OFFICE BECAME ELECTIVE FOR EACH TOWNSHIP FOR A TERM OF TWO YEARS AND IT WAS REQUIRED THAT THE CONSTABLE'S BOND OF ONE THOUSAND DOLLARS BE APPROVED BY THE CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS (L. 1871, PP. 25-26). THE LAW WAS AGAIN CHANGED IN 1887, WHEN ONE CONSTABLE WAS ELECTED FOR EACH JUSTICE OF THE PEACE PRECINCT (R. S. 1887, PAR. 457). THE ACT RELATING TO SHERIFFS, SO FAR AS IT WAS APPLICABLE, GOVERNED THE POWERS, DUTIES, AND LIABILITIES OF CONSTABLES (1BID., PAR. 569). CONSTABLES WERE MADE SANITARY OFFICERS OF SANITARY DISTRICTS, OREATED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS, IN WHICH THEY RESPECTIVELY RESIDED (R. S. 1901, TITLE 64, SEO. 4017).

THE CONSTITUTION PROVIDED FOR PAYMENT OF A FIXED SALARY TO THE CONSTABLE (CONST., ART. 22, SEG. 17). ONE CONSTABLE IS ELECTED FROM EACH JUSTICE OF THE PEAGE PRECINCT (L. 1912, CH. 42, P. 195). THE CONSTABLE IS REQUIRED TO KEEP THE FOLLOWING RECORDS: FEE BOOK (R. C. 1928, SEG. 1491); DOG TAX BOOK (1810., SEG. 1982); COPIES OF MONTHLY REPORTS TO BOARD OF SUPERVISORS AND TREASURER OF FEES COLLECTED (1810., SEG. 1496).

FOR RECORDS OF PROCESS SERVED AND FEES COLLECTED BY CON-STABLE, SEE ENTRIES 276, 281.

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XIV. ASSESSOR

THE FIRST TERRITORIAL LEGISLATURE PROVIDED THAT THE SHER-IFF SHOULD BE EX OFFICIO ASSESSOR. THE ASSESSOR'S DUTY WAS TO ASSESS ALL TAXABLE PROPERTY WITHIN THE COUNTY ACCORDING TO THE PROVISIONS OF THE LAW (HOWELL CODE, 1864, CH. 3, SEC. 18). HE WAS ALSO TO HEAR COMPLAINTS AND MAKE NECESSARY CHANGES IN THE ASSESSMENT ROLL (IBID., CH. 33, SEC. 18), BUT THIS POWER WAS TRANSFERRED IN 1865 TO THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS, ACTING AS A BOARD OF EQUALIZATION (L. 1865, P. 27, SEC. 11). IN 1885 THE ASSEMBLY PASSED AN ACT CREATING FOR PIMA COUNTY THE SEPARATE OFFICE OF COUNTY ASSESSOR, IN THE FIRST INSTANCE TO BE APPOINT -ED BY THE CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS, PROBATE JUDGE, RECORDER, DISTRICT ATTORNEY AND TREASURER WITHIN THIRTY DAYS OF THE PASSAGE OF THE ACT, AND WHO WAS TO HOLD OFFICE UNTIL JANUARY 1, 1887, AND UNTIL HIS SUCCESSOR WAS DULY ELECTED AND QUALIFIED. THE TERM OF THE ELECTED OFFICIAL WAS TO BE TWO YEARS. (L. 1885, P. 178, SECS. 1 AND 2).

IN 1887 IT WAS PROVIDED THAT THE OFFICE OF ASSESSOR MIGHT BE CONSOLIDATED WITH OR DISUNITED FROM THAT OF THE SHERIFF OR TAX COLLECTOR BY ORDINANCE OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS ADOPTED AND RECORDED AT LEAST THREE MONTHS PRIOR TO A GENERAL ELECTION (R. S. 1887, PARS. 460, 464). NO SUCH ORDINANCE, AFFECTING THE OFFICE OF ASSESSOR, WAS FOUND IN RECORDS OF THE PIMA COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS. THE LAW ALSO PROVIDED THAT SUCH OFFICES AS WERE NOT CONSOLIDATED BY SUCH AN ORDINANCE WERE TO BE ELECTIVE FOR A TERM OF TWO YEARS, AND THAT THE ASSESSOR SHOULD NOT BE EITHER APPOINTED OR ELECTED TO SUCCEED HIMSELF, NOR SHOULD ANY NEWLY-ELECTED ASSESSOR EMPLOY AS HIS DEPUTY ANY PERSON WHO SO ACTED AS DEPUTY FOR HIS PREDECESSOR (1810., PARS. 465, 467).

IN 1895 THE OFFICE OF ASSESSOR WAS MADE APPOINTIVE BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS IN ALL COUNTIES OF THE FIRST AND SECOND CLASSES, WHICH INCLUDED PIMA COUNTY AT THE TIME AND UNTIL STATE-HOOD, THE TERM OF OFFICE TO BE FOR ONE YEAR (L. 1895, SEC. 1, SUBD. 4TH, P. 64). TWO YEARS LATER THE OFFICE WAS MADE ELECTIVE, BEGINNING JANUARY 1, 1899 (L. 1897, P. 61). BUT IN 1899, BY AMENDMENT OF THE LEGISLATURE, IT WAS MADE APPOINTIVE BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS IN FIRST AND SECOND-CLASS COUNTIES FOR THE YEARS OF 1899 AND 1900. THE LEGISLATURE FURTHER PROVIDED THAT IN THE YEAR OF 1900, AND BIENNIALLY THEREAFTER, THE ASSESSOR IN FIRST AND SECOND-CLASS COUNTIES, WAS TO BE ELECTED AT THE SAME TIME AND IN THE SAME MANNER AS OTHER COUNTY OFFICERS (L. 1899, P. 72).

WITH REVISION OF THE STATUTES OF 1901, THE OFFICE WAS MADE APPOINTIVE BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS FOR A TERM OF FOUR YEARS IN COUNTIES OF THE FIRST, SECOND AND THIRD CLASSES (R. S. 1901, PAR. 1053). NO ASSESSOR WAS TO SUCCEED HIMSELF FOR MORE THAN ONE TERM (IBID., PAR. 1058). IN 1907 ASSESSORS OF FOURTH-CLASS COUNTIES WERE ALSO MADE APPOINTIVE, THE LAW GRANTING THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS IN COUNTIES OF ALL FOUR CLASSES THE POWER OF RE-

MOVAL FOR CAUSE, AND THE OPPORTUNITY FOR APPEAL OF SUCH ACTION TO THE DISTRICT COURT BY THE ASSESSOR REMOVED (L. 1907, PP. 120, 121). THE CONSTITUTION CONTINUED THE OFFICE OF ASSESSOR, TO BE ELECTIVE IN ALL COUNTIES FOR A TWO-YEAR TERM, AND PROVIDED THAT DUTIES THEREOF SHOULD BE PRESCRIBED BY LAW (CONST., ART. 12, SEC. 3).

THE PRINCIPAL DUTY OF THE ASSESSOR IS ASCERTAINING AND VALUING ASSESSABLE PROPERTY (ARIZONA COPPER COMPANY VS. STATE OF
ARIZONA, 15 ARIZ. 9. 14; 137 PAG. 417), WHICH HAS BEEN THE FUNCTION OF THIS OFFICE SINCE ITS INCEPTION. SINCE 1875, THE ASSESSOR HAS BEEN REQUIRED TO COLLECT PERSONAL PROPERTY TAXES NOT
SECURED BY REAL ESTATE (L. 1875, P. 62, SEC. 16). HE IS REQUIRED TO COOPERATE WITH THE STATE TAX COMMISSION (R. C. 1928,
PAR. 3059). AND MUST PREPARE AN ASSESSMENT ROLL IN SUCH FORM AS
PRESCRIBED BY THE STATE TAX COMMISSION. THIS INCLUDES ALL THE
REAL AND PERSONAL PROPERTY ASSESSED, AND MUST BE CERTIFIED BY
THE ASSESSOR AND DELIVERED TO THE CLERK OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS TO BE ACTED UPON BY THE COUNTY AND STATE BOARDS OF
EQUALIZATION, AND THEREAFTER TO CONSTITUTE THE BASIS OF THE
STATE AND COUNTY PROPERTY TAX LEVY. (1810., SECS. 3083, 3085).

THE ASSESSOR IS REQUIRED TO HAVE PREPARED AND TO KEEP MAPS OF THE VARIOUS BLOCKS OF ANY CITY OR TOWN AND THE SUBDIVISIONS THEREOF, TOGETHER WITH MAPS OF SURVEYED MINES OF EACH MINING DISTRICT, FOR THE PURPOSE OF CHECKING OFF THE VARIOUS SUBDIVISIONS AS THEY ARE ASSESSED, MARKING THEREON THE NAMES OF THE PERSONS TO WHOM THE PROPERTY IS ASSESSED (R. S. 1913, SEC. 4876; R. C. 1928, SEC. 3084).

THE FIRST ASSEMBLY MADE PROVISION FOR THE EQUALIZATION OF TAX ASSESSMENTS. THE SHERIFF, WHO WAS THEN EX OFFICIO TAX ASSESSOR, WAS REQUIRED TO DEPOSIT THE COUNTY ASSESSMENT ROLL, WHEN COMPLETED, IN THE OFFICE OF THE COUNTY RECORDER. THERE IT WAS SUBJECT, FOR A SPECIFIED TIME, TO INSPECTION BY ALL INTERESTED PRSONS. THE ASSESSOR WAS REQUIRED TO HEAR COM-PLAINTS AND, IF JUSTIFIABLE, MAKE NECESSARY CHANGES IN THE ASSESSMENT ROLL. (HOWELL CODE, 1864, CH. 33, SEC. 18). THE NEXT LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY, IN CREATING BOARDS OF SUPERVI-SORS, PROVIDED THAT THEY SHOULD ACT AS BOARDS OF EQUALIZATION IN THEIR RESPECTIVE COUNTIES. AFTER THE ASSESSOR HAD MADE AND RETURNED AN ASSESSMENT OF THE TAXABLE PROPERTY WITHIN THE COUNTY, THE BOARD OF EQUALIZATION WAS REQUIRED TO CON-VENE FOR THE PURPOSE OF HEARING ANY OBJECTIONS TO THE ASSESS-MENT OF PROPERTY. IT WAS GIVEN THE POWER TO REDUCE, INCREASE, OR EQUALIZE THE VALUATION OF ANY PROPERTY AS THE JUSTICE OF THE CASE MIGHT REQUIRE. (L. 1865, P. 27, SEC. 11).

IN 1871 BOARDS OF SUPERVISORS WERE CONSTITUTED EX OFFICIO BOARDS OF EQUALIZATION FOR THE COUNTIES, AND THE CLERKS OF THE VARIOUS BOARDS OF SUPERVISORS WERE CONSTITUTED CLERKS EX OFFICIO OF THE BOARDS OF EQUALIZATION. THIS ARRANGEMENT HAS CONTINUED TO THE PRESENT. THE BOARD OF EQUALIZATION MET THE FIRST MONDAY IN JULY AND CONTINUED IN SESSION NOT LATER THAN THE LAST DAY OF JULY. IT HAD POWER TO DETERMINE COM-PLAINTS REGARDING ASSESSED VALUATION OF ANY PROPERTY, AND TO MAKE ANY CHANGES OR CORRECTIONS IN VALUATIONS AFTER NO-TICE TO THE OWNER AND A REASONABLE TIME FOR HEARING, IR-REGARDLESS OF WHETHER THE VALUATION WAS FIXED BY THE AS-SESSOR OR THE OWNER OF THE PROPERTY, UNLESS THE OWNER HAD REFUSED TO GIVE THE ASSESSOR A LIST OF PROPERTY UNDER OATH, IN WHICH CASE NO REDUCTION WAS TO BE MADE IN THE ASSESSMENT MADE BY THE ASSESSOR. THE RECORDER FURNISHED AN ABSTRACT OF ALL UNSATISFIED MORTGAGES AND LIENS. THE BOARD MADE USE OF SUCH ABSTRACT, AND ANY OTHER INFORMATION, IN EQUALIZING THE ASSESSMENT ROLL, AND TO ADD TO THE ASSESSMENT ROLL ANY PRO-PERTY NOT ASSESSED. THE CLERK OF THE BOARD OF EQUALIZATION

NOTED ALL CHANGES MADE AND REPORTED THEM TO THE COUNTY TREASURER, WHO REPORTED SUCH CHANGES TO THE TERRITORIAL AUDITOR. THE ASSESSMENT ROLL SO CHANGED WAS CALLED THE DUPLICATE ASSESSMENT ROLL. (L. 1871, PP. 97-98, SECS. 18-19).

IN 1887 THE LEGISLATURE GAVE THE BOARD POWER TO ISSUE COMPULSORY PROCESS TO COMPEL ANY PERSON SUSPECTED OF HAVING KNOWLEDGE OF THE VALUE OR AMOUNT OF ANY PROPERTY TO ATTEND ITS MEETINGS, AND BE EXAMINED UNDER OATH IN RELATION THERETO, AND LIMITED THE JULY MEETING TO THE TWENTIETH DAY OF THAT MONTH (R. S. 1887, PAR. 2654). THE CLERK OF THE BOARD WAS REQUIRED TO FILE AN ABSTRACT OF THE ASSESSMENT ROLL WITH THE TERRITORIAL BOARD OF EQUALIZATION (IBID., PAR. 2655). APPEAL FROM DECISIONS OF THE BOARD TO THE DISTRICT COURTS WAS LATER PROVIDED, BUT TAXES HAD TO BE PAID BEFORE APPEAL WAS TAKEN (R. S. 1901, PAR. 3875). THE BOARD OF EQUALIZATION WAS PROHIBITED FROM ASSESSING ANY LAND LESS THAN SEVENTY-FIVE CENTS AN ACRE (1810., PAR. 3874). THE CLERK OF THE BOARD IS NOW REQUIRED TO FURNISH AN ABSTRACT OF THE ASSESSMENT ROLL TO THE STATE BOARD OF EQUALIZATION, WHICH HAS POWER TO MAKE SUCH CHANGES IN THE ASSESSMENTS AS IT MAY DEEM NECES-SARY. MEETINGS ARE HELD THE FIRST DAY IN JUNE TO CONTINUE UNTIL THE BUSINESS OF EQUALIZATION IS COMPLETED, OR UNTIL JUNE 10. A SECOND MEETING IS HELD THE FIRST MONDAY IN JULY, WHEN THE BOARD DETERMINES WHETHER THE INCREASES IN ASSESSMENTS PROPOSED AT THE JUNE MEETING SHALL STAND. NOTICES OF INCREASES IN ASSESSMENTS ARE PUBLISHED NO LATER THAN THE TWENTIETH DAY OF JUNE IN THE OFFICIAL NEWSPAPER OF THE COUNTY. ANY PERSON WHO HAS HAD THE ASSESSED VALUATION OF PROPERTY INCREASED, MAY APPEAR AT THE JULY MEETING AND RESIST SUCH INCREASE (R. C. 1928, PAR. 3088). APPEAL FROM THE BOARD'S DECISION MAY BE HAD TO THE SUPERIOR COURT (IBID., SEC. 3090).

AN ACT OF THE THIRTEENTH LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY MADE THE COUNTY TREASURER EX OFFICIO TAX COLLECTOR OF PIMA COUNTY (L. 1885, CH. 77. SEC. 6). THE CHANGE TO STATEHOOD DID NOT AFFECT THE CONSOLIDATION OF THESE OFFICES. ALL COUNTY TREASURERS OF ARIZONA ARE EX OFFICIO TAX COLLECTORS. (R. S. 1913, PAR. 2503).

UPON THE ORGANIZATION OF THE TERRITORY THE TAX COLLECTOR WAS EMPOWERED TO SEIZE AND SELL GOODS AND CHATTELS OF ANY PER-SON FOR NEGLECTING OR REFUSING PAYMENT OF TAXES IMPOSED (HOWELL CODE, CH. 33, P. 244, SEC. 26). IF TAXES REMAINED UNPAID ON ANY PARCEL OF LAND, IT WAS THE DUTY OF THE TAX COLLECTOR TO MAKE A STATEMENT TO THAT EFFECT IN WRITING TO THE COUNTY TREAS-URER (1810. P. 245, SEC. 36). WHO, AFTER NOTICE, WAS TO SELL THE LAND FOR COLLECTION OF DELINQUENT TAXES AND INTEREST AND CHARGES THEREON (IBID., PP. 247-248, SECS. 48-52). IN 1881 CONDUCT OF TAX SALES WAS MADE A FUNCTION OF THE TAX COLLECTOR (L. 1881, PP. 150-154). THE LEGISLATURE IN 1887 AUTHORIZED THE TAX COLLECTOR TO ADD TO THE TAX ROLL ANY PROPERTY OMITTED FROM IT, ASSESS THE SAME AND COLLECT THE TAXES THEREON (R. S. 1887, PAR. 2672). IN 1903 HE WAS AUTHORIZED, WITH THE APPROVAL OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS, TO EMPLOY AN ATTORNEY TO ENFORCE THE TAX LIENS (L. 1903, P. 152, SEC. 86). IN RECENT YEARS THE LEGISLA-TURE HAS MADE THE SALE OF PROPERTY FOR THE COLLECTION OF UNPAID TAXES AND CHARGES THEREON A FUNCTION OF THE TREASURER AS SUCH, AND NOT IN HIS CAPACITY AS EX OFFICIO TAX COLLECTOR (L. 1927, CH. 94, SEC. 1; R. C. 1928, PARS. 3112-3123). SINCE 1875 THE ASSESSOR HAS BEEN REQUIRED TO COLLECT TAXES ON PERSONAL PROP-ERTY UNSECURED BY REAL ESTATE (L. 1875, SEC. 16, P. 62).

ON OR BEFORE MAY 20TH OF EACH YEAR, THE ASSESSOR COMPLETES THE ASSESSMENT ROLL OF REAL ESTATE AND IMPROVEMENTS THEREON, AND PERSONAL PROPERTY. HE ATTACHES HIS CERTIFICATE THERETO, AND DELIVERS IT WITH A CROSS-INDEX OF ASSESSED REAL ESTATE AND MINES AND ALL ASSESSMENT LISTS FROM WHICH THE ASSESSMENT ROLL WAS MADE, TO THE CLERK OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS (R. C. 1928, PARS. 3083, 3085). THE ASSESSMENT ROLL IS OPEN FOR INSPECTION, AND THE SU-PERVISORS AS A BOARD OF EQUALIZATION CONSIDER MATTERS OF EQUAL-IZING ASSESSMENTS FROM THE FIRST TO THE TENTH OF JUNE, AT WHICH TIME THEY MAY CHANGE ANY VALUATION, WHETHER FIXED BY ASSESSOR OR OWNER. ADJOURNMENT IS TAKEN ON THAT DATE UNTIL THE FIRST MONDAY IN JULY FOLLOWING. THE BOARD AT THAT TIME DETERMINES THE CHANGES IN ASSESSMENT PROPOSED AT THE JUNE MEETING. IT MAY REMAIN IN SESSION NOT LATER THAN THE SECOND MONDAY IN JULY. IMMEDIATELY AFTER ADJOURNMENT, THE CLERK OF THE BOARD MAKES IN DUPLICATE AN ABSTRACT OF THE ASSESSMENT ROLL, ONE COPY TO BE FILED IN THE OFFICE OF THE SUPERVISORS, THE OTHER TO BE TRANS-MITTED WITHIN TEN DAYS TO THE STATE BOARD OF EQUALIZATION. THE STATE BOARD MAY INCREASE OR DECREASE ASSESSMENTS ON THE LIST, AND THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MUST MAKE CHANGES ORDERED BY THE STATE BOARD (IBID., PARS. 3085-3086, 3091, 3093).

AS SOON AS THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS HAS FINALLY DETERMINED THE ESTIMATE PROVIDED FOR IN THE ASSESSMENT ROLL, IT ASSESSES TAXES FOR THE AMOUNT ESTIMATED, COMPUTES AND CARRIES OUT IN SEPARATE COLUMNS ALL TAXES AND TOTALS, AND CORRECTLY FOOTS UP THE COLUMNS THEREIN. THIS CONSTITUTES THE ASSESSMENT AND TAX ROLL FOR THE YEAR. Upon completion of the ASSESSMENT AND TAX ROLL, THE CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS IMMEDIATELY AFFIXES THERETO A WARRANT COMMANDING THE COUNTY TREASURER TO COLLECT THE TAXES THEREIN IN TWO INSTALLMENTS, DUE ON OR BEFORE THE FIRST MONDAYS IN NOVEMBER AND MAY OF EACH YEAR. THE BOARD OF

SUPERVISORS CHARGES THE TREASURER, IN A RECORD KEPT FOR THAT PURPOSE, THE TOTAL OF ALL TAXES LEVIED IN THE ASSESSMENT AND TAX ROLL. THIS ROLL, WITH THE CROSS-INDEX, IS DELIVERED TO THE TREASURER ON OR BEFORE THE FIRST MONDAY IN SEPTEMBER. THE ROLL WITH THE WARRANT AFFIXED IS AUTHORITY FOR COLLECTION OF TAXES LEVIED FOR THE YEAR. (1810., PAR. 3094).

THE EXPENSE FOR MAINTAINING THIS WORK IS PAID BY AN ALLOWANCE TO THE ASSESSOR OF FIFTY CENTS OF EACH ORIGINAL REGISTRATION FEE. (L. 1927, 4TH S. S., CH. 4, SEC. 5; R. C. 1928, SECS. 1629-72). THE STATE MOTOR VEHI-CLE DIVISION IS REQUIRED TO TRANSMIT SUCH AMOUNT TO THE COUNTY TREASURER TO BE PLACED IN A SPECIAL FUND TO BE USED EXCLUSIVELY BY THE ASSESSOR IN CARRYING OUT THIS PROVISION. THE FIRST ASSEMBLY CREATED THE OFFICE OF TREASURER FOR EACH COUNTY, TO BE ELECTIVE FOR A TERM OF TWO YEARS (HOWELL CODE, 1864, CH. 6, SEC. 1). THE TREASURER WAS REQUIRED TO RECEIVE AND DISBURSE ALL MONEYS ON BEHALF OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS AND ACCOUNT TO THE BOARD FOR ALL TRANSACTIONS MADE BY HIS OFFICE, THROUGH WHICH WERE CLEARED THE CREDITS OF THE VARIOUS COUNTY OFFICES (1810, CH. 6, SECS. 5-10). HE WAS REQUIRED TO SELL REAL ESTATE FOR DELINQUENT TAXES AND INTEREST AND CHARGES THEREON (1810, CH. 33, P. 248). Such sale in 1881 was made a function of the TAX COLLECTOR (L. 1881, P. 151, SEC. 4). In 1885 THE TREASURER BECAME EX OFFICIO TAX COLLECTOR IN PIMA COUNTY (L. 1885, CH. 77, SEC. 6).

THE CONSTITUTION CONTINUED THE OFFICE OF COUNTY TREAS-URER, AND PROVIDED THAT DUTIES THEREOF SHOULD BE PRESCRIBED BY LAW (CONST., ART. XII, SEC. 3). ALL COUNTY TREASURERS OF ARIZONA HAVE BEEN EX OFFICIO TAX COLLECTORS SINCE STATEHOOD (R. S. 1913, PAR. 2503). THE STATUTES NOW PROVIDE THAT THE TREASURER SHALL SELL REAL PROPERTY ON WHICH TAXES ARE DELIN-QUENT AS PROVIDED BY LAW (L. 1927, CH. 94, SEC. 1; L. 1931, CH. 103). HE COLLECTS, BY DISTRAINT AND SALE, UNPAID TAXES ON PERSONAL PROPERTY (R. C. 1928, PAR. 3112). THE TREASURER IS EX OFFICIO DISTRICT TREASURER OF IRRIGATION DISTRICTS. HE RECEIVES, COLLECTS, AND DISBURSES DISTRICT MONEYS AND TAXES LEVIED THEREFOR, IN THE SAME MANNER AS HE DOES ANY COUNTY FUNDS AND UNDER THE SAME OBLIGATIONS AND PENALTIES (L. 1921, CH. 149, SEC. 16, SUBD. A). WHEN FEDERAL GRAZING DISTRICTS CAME INTO EXISTENCE (U. S. STATUTES AT LARGE, VOL. 48, P. 1269) AS A RESULT OF RECENT FEDERAL CONSERVATION POLICIES WITH RESPECT TO PUBLIC DOMAIN, THE LEGISLATURE IN 1937 RE-QUIRED THE TREASURER TO BE EX OFFICIO DISTRICT TREASURER OF SUCH DISTRICTS, TO RECEIVE, COLLECT, RECEIPT, AND ACCOUNT FOR ALL FUNDS THEREOF, AND TO PAY OUT THE SAME ON THE WARRANT OF THE GRAZING DISTRICT SIGNED BY THE CHAIRMAN AND VICE-CHAIRMAN OF THE DISTRICT AND THE REGIONAL GRAZIER (L. 1937, CH. 11, SEC. 3).

THE POWERS AND DUTIES OF THE COUNTY TREASURER AS THE FISCAL OFFICER OF THE COUNTY HAVE REMAINED IN ESSENCE THE SAME. HE IS REQUIRED TO RECEIVE ALL MONEY OF THE COUNTY, AND ALL OTHER MONEY DIRECTED BY LAW TO BE PAID TO HIM, AND APPLY, PAY AND ACCOUNT FOR RECEIPTS AND EXPENDITURES OF SUCH MONEY IN BOOKS PROVIDED FOR THAT PURPOSE, IN WHICH MUST BE ENTERED THE AMOUNT, TIME, TO WHOM AND ON WHAT ACCOUNT DIS-BURSEMENTS WERE MADE BY HIM. HE MUST KEEP HIS BOOKS SO THAT AMOUNTS RECEIVED AND PAID OUT ON ACCOUNT OF SEPARATE FUNDS OR SPECIFIC APPROPRIATIONS APPEAR IN SEPARATE ACCOUNTS, AND TOTAL RECEIPTS AND EXPENDITURE IN ONE GENERAL OR CASH AC-COUNT; ENTER NO MONEY RECEIVED FOR THE CURRENT YEAR ON HIS ACCOUNT WITH THE COUNTY FOR THE PAST FISCAL YEAR, UNTIL AFTER HIS ANNUAL SETTLEMENT FOR THE PAST YEAR HAS BEEN MADE WITH THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS; AND DISBURSE THE COUNTY MONEY ON COUNTY WARRANTS ISSUED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS, SIGNED

BY THE CHAIRMAN AND CLERK OF SUCH BOARD, OR AS PROVIDED BY LAW. (R. C. 1928, PAR. 864). UPON PROPER ORDER HE TRANSFERS MONEY FROM THE COUNTY GENERAL FUND TO THE EXPENSE FUND TO PAY EXPENSES OF MAINTAINING THE COUNTY GOVERNMENT (IBID., PAR. 775). THE TREASURER MAY CORRECT ERRORS OR OMISSIONS IN THE TAX ROLL (IBID., PAR. 3113), COMPUTE AND RECORD AMOUNTS OF DELINQUENT AND BACK TAXES, AND ENFORCE COLLECTION THEREOF (IBID., SECS. 3115-3123). IN RECENT YEARS THE DISTINCTION BETWEEN THE TREASURER AND TAX COLLECTOR HAS BEEN LESSENING, THE LEGISLATURE TENDING TO ASSIGN TO THE FORMER FUNCTIONS PREWYIOUSLY EXERCISED IN THE NAME OF THE LATTER.

THE TREASURER CANNOT BE ELECTED OR APPOINTED TO SUCCEED HIMSELF FOR MORE THAN ONE SUCCEEDING TERM (R. S. 1901, PAR. 1058). HE IS REQUIRED TO KEEP THE FOLLOWING RECORDS: AS-SESSMENT AND TAX ROLL (R. 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XIX. SCHOOL SUPERINTENDENT

THE FIRST TERRITORIAL LEGISLATURE PROVIDED FOR CREATION OF A COMMON SCHOOL SYSTEM WHEN SUFFICIENT FUNDS FOR THE PURPOSE HAD BEEN ACCUMULATED AND THE NECESSITY THEREFOR EXISTED, BY MEANS OF A SCHOOL TAX WHICH WAS TO BE LEVIED BY THE VARIOUS SCHOOL DISTRICTS (HOWELL CODE, 1864, CH. 23, SECS. 11-13). THE METHOD OF ESTABLISHING SCHOOL DISTRICTS WAS NEXT ENACTED (L. 1867, Pp. 37-38). BOARDS OF SUPERVISORS WERE CONSTITUTED BOARDS OF EDUCATION FOR THE SEVERAL COUNTIES (L. 1868, P. 42, FF.), BUT CEASED TO BE SO WHEN THE TERRITORIAL BOARD OF EDUCATION WAS CREATED IN 1871 (L. 1871, Pp. 68-78). (FOR FURTHER DETAILS ON BOARDS OF EDUCATION, SEE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS, P. 24).

IN 1868 THE OFFICE OF COUNTY SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS WAS CREATED, TO BE ELECTIVE FOR ONE YEAR. THE SUPERINTENDENT SERVED FROM NOVEMBER 1 UNTIL THE END OF THE SCHOOL YEAR. HE WAS ALLOWED FOUR DOLLARS A DAY FOR DAYS SPENT IN DISCHARGE OF HIS DUTIES, BESIDES A REASONABLE SUM FOR HIS ANNUAL REPORT TO THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE COUNTY. THE COUNTY SUPERINTEND-ENT OF SCHOOLS HAD CHARGE OF THE COMMON SCHOOL INTERESTS OF THE COUNTY. LIKE OTHER COUNTY OFFICERS, HE WAS TO FURNISH A BOND TO BE APPROVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS, ON THE FIRST MONDAY IN APRIL OF EACH YEAR, THE TREASURER INFORMED THE COUN-TY SCHOOL SUPERINTENDENT OF THE AMOUNT OF MONEY IN THE COUNTY TREASURY WHICH BELONGED TO THE SCHOOL FUND, AND PAID THE SAME TO THE VARIOUS SCHOOL DISTRICTS UPON ORDER OF THE SUPERINTEN-DENT. THE SUPERINTENDENT ALLOCATED THE MONEY TO THE VARIOUS SCHOOL DISTRICTS WITHIN THE COUNTY IN PROPORTION TO THE NUMBER OF CHILDREN RESIDING IN EACH BETWEEN THE AGES OF FOUR AND TWENTY-ONE YEARS. (ID.).

HE WAS REQUIRED TO VISIT ALL THE COMMON SCHOOLS WITHIN THE COUNTY AT LEAST ONCE A YEAR AND EXAMINE INTO THE STATE AND CONDITION OF SUCH SCHOOLS IN RESPECT TO THEIR METHODS OF GOVERNMENT; GIVE ADVICE TO THE TEACHERS AS TO THE COURSE OF INSTRUCTION TO BE FOLLOWED; ADOPT REQUISITE MEASURES FOR IN-SPECTION, EXAMINATION AND REGULATION OF SUCH SCHOOLS; AND TO TAKE A CENSUS OF ALL CHILDREN BETWEEN THE AGES OF FOUR AND TWENTY-ONE YEARS RESIDING IN THE COUNTY. THE CHOICE OF PROPER TEACHERS FOR ALL THE COMMON SCHOOLS OF THE COUNTY FELL TO THE SCHOOL SUPERINTENDENT. HE HELD EXAMINATIONS TWICE A YEAR FOR THOSE PERSONS WHO SOUGHT TO TEACH ORTHOGRAPHY, READING, WRIT-ING, ARITHMETIC, GEOGRAPHY, AND ENGLISH GRAMMAR. WHEN THESE INSTRUCTORS HAD QUALIFIED TO THE SATISFACTION OF THE SUPERIN-TENDENT, HE WAS AUTHORIZED TO ISSUE CERTIFICATES TO THEM FOR NOT LESS THAN THREE MONTHS NOR LONGER THAN ONE YEAR. AT THE CONCLUSION OF EACH YEAR, THE COUNTY SCHOOL SUPERINTENDENT WAS REQUIRED TO MAKE A FULL REPORT TO THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS, STATING IN THAT REPORT THE NUMBER OF CHILDREN BETWEEN THE AGES OF FOUR AND TWENTY-ONE YEARS WITHIN THE SCHOOL DISTRICTS OF THE COUNTY; THE NUMBER OF QUALIFIED TEACHERS EMPLOYED; THE LENGTH OF TIME EACH DISTRICT SCHOOL HAD BEEN TAUGHT, TOGETHER WITH THE KIND OF TEXTBOOKS USED; AND THE AMOUNTS EXPENDED IN EACH DISTRICT FOR THE YEAR. (10.).

LATER, THE TERRITORIAL SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION WAS EMPOWERED TO APPOINT THREE COMPETENT PERSONS IN EACH COUNTY TO CONSTITUTE A BOARD OF EXAMINERS TO PASS ON THE QUALIFICATIONS OF APPLICANTS FOR TEACHING POSITIONS IN THE COUNTY SCHOOLS. THE COUNTY SUPERINTENDENT WAS TO BE A MEMBER OF THE BOARD AND EX OFFICIO CHAIRMAN THEREOF. (L. 1871, p. 77, SEC. 30; COMP. L. 1864-71, p. 229, ch. 23, SEC. 30). BY ACT OF THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY, APPROVED FEBRUARY 18, 1871, THE PROBATE JUDGES BECAME EX OFFICIO COUNTY SCHOOL SUPERINTENDENTS IN ALL COUNTIES (L. 1871, P. 71, SEC. 15; COMP. L. 1864-71, CH. 23, SEC. 15, P. 225). BEGINNING JANUARY 1, 1899, HOWEVER, COUNTY SCHOOL SUPERINTENDENTS SERVING TWO-YEAR TERMS WERE ELECTED IN COUNTIES OF THE FIRST CLASS, INCLUDING PIMA COUNTY (L. 1897, P. 113). THEREAFTER TO STATEHOOD THE OFFICE WAS ELECTIVE IN THIS COUNTY. THE CONSTITU-TION PROVIDED FOR THE OFFICE OF SCHOOL SUPERINTENDENT, TO BE ELECTIVE IN ALL COUNTIES FOR A TWO-YEAR TERM, DUTIES THEREOF TO BE PRESCRIBED BY LAW (CONST., ART. 12, SEC. 3).

TODAY THE SCHOOL SUPERINTENDENT MUST HOLD A REGULAR CERTIFICATE TO TEACH IN THE SCHOOLS OF ARIZONA. HE APPORTIONS THE MONEY OF THE SCHOOL FUND TO THE VARIOUS SCHOOL DISTRICTS; ISSUES, UPON THE ORDER OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF ANY SCHOOL DISTRICT, WARRANTS ON THE COUNTY TREASURER FOR THE PAYMENT OF NECESTRY EXPENSES AND TEACHERS' SALARIES; PRESIDES OVER TEACHERS' INSTITUTES HELD IN HIS COUNTY AND SECURES LECTURERS COMPETENT TO INSTRUCT IN THE ART OF TEACHING; ENFORCES THE COURSES OF STUDY AND USE OF TEXTBOOKS; CONDUCTS EXAMINATIONS OF APPLICANTS FOR TEACHING POSITIONS; APPOINTS TRUSTEES OF SCHOOL DISTRICTS TO FILL ALL VACANCIES; EXAMINES EACH SCHOOL IN THE COUNTY AT LEAST TWICE A YEAR EXCEPT IN SCHOOLS EMPLOYING A PRINCIPAL OR CITY SUPERINTENDENT; AND MAY REQUIRE SCHOOL BUILDINGS TO BE REPAIRED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE PARTICULAR DISTRICT (R. C. 1928, SECS. 992, 993, 995).

XX. COUNTY BOARD OF HEALTH

PROVISION FOR CARING FOR HEALTH IN THE COUNTIES WAS NOT MADE AT THE TIME OF THEIR ORGANIZATION IN 1864. CARE OF THE INDIGENT SICK, HOWEVER, WAS MADE A DUTY OF THE BOARD OF SUPER-VISORS UPON ITS CREATION (L. 1865, P. 26). IN 1887 THE AS-SEMBLY REQUIRED BOARDS OF SUPERVISORS TO PROVIDE FOR THE CARE AND MAINTENANCE OF THE INDIGENT, OR THE OTHERWISE DEPENDENT POOR OF THE COUNTY, AND ALSO TO ERECT OFFICES AND MAINTAIN HOSPITALS THEREFOR, OR OTHERWISE PROVIDE FOR THE SAME. THEY WERE ALSO TO PROVIDE, AT THEIR DISCRETION, A FARM IN CONNEC-TION WITH THE COUNTY HOSPITAL, AND TO MAKE REGULATIONS REGARD-ING IT (R. S. 1887, PAR. 397). IN 1903 THE COUNTY BOARD OF HEALTH WAS CREATED, OFFICERS OF WHICH ARE AS FOLLOWS: PRESI-DENT, CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS; VICE-PRESIDENT, COUNTY ATTORNEY; SECRETARY, COUNTY SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH. (L. 1903, CH. 65, SECS. 6, 7). THE SUPERINTENDENT, A PRACTICING PHYSICIAN, IS APPOINTED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVI-SORS. THE COUNTY BOARD OF HEALTH, WITHIN ITS PARTICULAR SPHERE, HAS THE POWERS GRANTED TO THE STATE BOARD OF HEALTH (R. C. 1928, SEC. 2683), WHICH IS TO MAKE REGULATIONS FOR THE PREVENTION AND CURE AS WELL AS TO PREVENT THE SPREAD OF ANY CONTAGIOUS OR INFECTIOUS DISEASE AMONG PERSONS OR DOMESTIC ANI-MALS; ESTABLISH QUARANTINE IN SUCH CASES AS IT MAY DEEM NECES-SARY; AND CONDEMN OR CAUSE TO BE CONDEMNED ANY IMPURE OR DIS-EASED ARTICLE OF FOOD THAT MAY BE OFFERED FOR SALE (1810., SEC. 2679). IT MAY ALSO MAKE SUCH SANITARY REGULATIONS AS ARE NECESSARY FOR PUBLIC HEALTH AND SAFETY (1810., SEC. 2686). THE BOARD MAY ENTER ANY BUILDING WITHIN ITS JURISDICTION FOR THE PURPOSE OF DETERMINING WHETHER ANY DANGER TO PUBLIC HEALTH EXISTS THEREIN, AND IF SUCH CONDITION IS FOUND, ANY MEMBER OF THE BOARD MAY MAKE A COMPLAINT BEFORE A JUSTICE OF THE PEACE. SUCH JUSTICE THEN ISSUES A WARRANT DIRECTED TO THE SHERIFF OR OTHER PEACE OFFICER EMPOWERING HIM TO HAVE SUCH DANGER RE-MOVED UNDER THE DIRECTION OF THE MEMBER OF THE BOARD OF HEALTH, WHO MUST ACCOMPANY THE OFFICER (IBID., SEC. 2688). IT MAY PROVIDE A LOCAL HOSPITAL FOR PERSONS AFFLICTED WITH INFECTIOUS OR CONTAGIOUS DISEASE, AND CONTROLS AND REGULATES SUCH HOSPITALS (IBID., SEC. 2697). THE LOCAL BOARD MAY CALL IN PHYSICIANS FOR THE CARE OF THOSE SO AFFLICTED, AND PROVIDE THE NECESSARIES OF LIFE. IF PATIENTS ARE UNABLE TO PAY FOR THIS CARE, IT IS A COUNTY CHARGE. (1810., SEC., 2699).

THE OFFICE OF THE COUNTY BOARD OF HEALTH IN FIMA COUNTY IS ALSO LOCALLY REFERRED TO AS THE "HEALTH DEPARTMENT". ITS MEDICAL FUNCTIONS ARE SOLELY PREVENTIVE, THE COUNTY PHYSICIAN AND HIS ASSISTANT HAVING SUPERVISION OF CURATIVE MEDICINE. THE BOARD ACTS IN COOPERATION WITH THE STATE, CITY OF TUCSON, CHILDREN'S BUREAU OF THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF LABOR, AND THE UNITED STATES PUBLIC HEALTH SERVICE. IN ITS OFFICE ARE MEDICAL RECORDS OF 1200 SCHOOL CHILDREN IN OTHER THAN CITY SCHOOLS. RECORDS OF SOME 15,000 SCHOOL CHILDREN IN CITY SCHOOLS ARE KEPT AT CITY SCHOOL HEADQUARTERS.

AS A MEMBER OF THE COUNTY BOARD OF HEALTH, THE SUPERINTENDENT ACTS AS ITS SECRETARY AND KEEPS A RECORD OF ALL FROCEEDINGS OF THE BOARD. HE MUST ALSO MAKE A REPORT OF HIS OFFICIAL ACTS EACH MONTH TO THE STATE SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH, AND REPORT TO THE STATE HEALTH OFFICER WHENEVER ANY CONTAGIOUS OR INFECTIOUS DISEASES OCCUR WHICH MIGHT ENDANGER THE HEALTH OF THE COMMUNITY. (L. 1903, CH. 65, SEC. 7; R. C. 1928, PAR. 2682). HE COULD, AT ONE TIME, ESTABLISH A QUARANTINE WITHIN HIS COUNTY, IF IN HIS JUDGMENT HE THOUGHT IT NECESSARY, OR ACT IN ANY MANNER HE DEEMED BEST (L. 1903, CH. 65, SEC. 10). THIS POWER WAS LATER GIVEN TO THE BOARD AS A BODY (R. S. 1913, FARS. 4390, 4391, 4399).

THE COUNTY SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH IS MEDICAL DIRECTOR OF THE TUBERCULOSIS PREVENTORIUM FOR CHILDREN. HE IS ALSO THE LOCAL REGISTRAR OF VITAL STATISTICS, AND HIS DEPUTY AT AJO IS THE LOCAL REGISTRAR FOR THE LATTER DISTRICT

MED-ICAL CARE IS GIVEN UNDER THE BROAD POWERS OF THE BOARD OF SU-FERVISORS TO EMPLOY MEDICAL ATTENDANCE AND PROVIDE MEDICINE, FOOD AND LODGING FOR INDIGENTS AT THE EXPENSE OF THE COUNTY (R. C. 1928, PAR. 811). ALL PATIENTS FOR THE COUNTY HOSPITAL ARE CLEARED THROUGH THE CLINIC. THE OFFICE OF COUNTY REGISTRAR OF VITAL STATISTICS WAS CREATED IN 1909. THE SECRETARY OF EACH COUNTY BOARD OF PUB-LIC HEALTH, WHO IS THE COUNTY SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH, WAS DESIGNATED THE COUNTY REGISTRAR. (L. 1909, P. 149, SEC. 5). THE ACT CREATING THE OFFICE ESTABLISHED EACH CITY AND INCOR-PORATED TOWN AS A PRIMARY REGISTRATION DISTRICT. FOR THAT POR-TION OF EACH COUNTY OUTSIDE OF CITIES AND INCORPORATED TOWNS, THE SEVERAL COUNTY BOARDS OF HEALTH WERE REQUIRED TO DEFINE AND DESIGNATE THE BOUNDARIES OF A SUFFICIENT NUMBER OF RURAL REGISTRATION DISTRICTS, WHICH THE BOARD MIGHT CHANGE FROM TIME TO TIME AS NECESSARY TO INSURE THE CONVENIENCE AND COMPLETE-NESS OF THE REGISTRATION (IBID., P. 189, SEC. 4). LOCAL REG-ISTRATION OF VITAL STATISTICS IS NOW UNDER CONTROL OF A STATE REGISTRAR, WHO DEFINES THE DISTRICTS NOT INCLUDED IN INCORPO-RATED TOWNS (L. 1925, CH. 37, SECS. 4, 5). THE STATE REGISTRAR APPOINTS A LOCAL REGISTRAR FOR EACH REGISTRATION DISTRICT, IN-CLUDING INCORPORATED CITIES AND TOWNS, FOR A TERM OF TWO YEARS,

REMOVABLE BY THE STATE REGISTRAR FOR CAUSE. EACH LOCAL REGISTRAR APPOINTS A DEPUTY, AND IN RURAL DISTRICTS, WHEN NECESSARY FOR THE CONVENIENCE OF THE POPULACE AND WITH THE CONSENT OF THE STATE REGISTRAR, A SUBREGISTRAR, WHO IS REMOVABLE BY THE STATE REGISTRAR AT ANY TIME FOR CAUSE. (R. C. 1928, PAR. 2726).

LOCAL REGISTRARS SUPPLY BLANK FORMS OF CERTIFICATES TO SUCH PERSONS AS REQUIRE THEM, AND EXAMINE ALL CERTIFICATES OF BIRTH OR DEATH WHEN PRESENTED FOR RECORD. WHEN A DEATH CER-TIFICATE IS PROPERLY EXECUTED AND COMPLETE, THE LOCAL REGIS-TRAR ISSUES A BURIAL OR REMOVAL PERMIT. IF, HOWEVER, THE DEATH OCCURRED FROM INFECTIOUS OR CONTAGIOUS DISEASE, THE PER-MIT IS ISSUED ONLY UNDER SUCH CONDITIONS AS MAY BE PRESCRIBED BY THE STATE BOARD OF HEALTH. IF A BIRTH CERTIFICATE IS IN-COMPLETE, THE LOCAL REGISTRAR IS REQUIRED TO NOTIFY THE IN-FORMANT IMMEDIATELY, AND REQUIRE HIM TO SUPPLY THE MISSING ITEMS OF INFORMATION IF POSSIBLE. CERTIFICATES OF BIRTH AND DEATH ARE NUMBERED CONSECUTIVELY, IN TWO SEPARATE SERIES, BE-GINNING WITH ONE FOR THE FIRST BIRTH AND DEATH OF EACH CALEN-DAR YEAR. THE LOCAL REGISTRAR ATTESTS EACH CERTIFICATE AND KEEPS AN ACCURATE AND COMPLETE RECORD OF IT IN A BOOK SUPPLIED FOR THAT PURPOSE BY THE STATE REGISTRAR, WHICH BECOMES A PER-MANENT RECORD OF HIS OFFICE. ON OR BEFORE THE TENTH DAY OF EACH MONTH THE LOCAL REGISTRAR TRANSMITS TO THE STATE REGIS-TRAR ALL ORIGINAL CERTIFICATES REGISTERED BY HIM FOR THE PRE-CEDING MONTH (IBID., SECS. 2738, 2739). EACH LOCAL REGISTRAR IS REQUIRED TO MAKE AN IMMEDIATE REPORT TO THE STATE REGISTRAR OF ANY VIOLATION OF THE LAW REQUIRING REGISTRATION OF BIRTHS AND DEATHS COMING TO HIS KNOWLEDGE. LOCAL AND SUBREGISTRARS ARE UNDER THE SUPERVISION OF THE STATE REGISTRAR, AND MUST AID HIM, UPON REQUEST, IN INVESTIGATING VIOLATIONS OF LAW AND RE-PORT SUCH VIOLATIONS TO THE COUNTY ATTORNEY (IBID., PAR. 2742).

IN PIMA COUNTY THE COUNTY SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH IS THE LOCAL REGISTRAR FOR THE TUCSON DISTRICT. HIS DEPUTY AT AJO IS LOCAL REGISTRAR FOR THAT DISTRICT. RECORDS OF THE TUCSON DISTRICT ARE IN THE OFFICE OF THE COUNTY BOARD OF PUBLIC HEALTH, LOCALLY CALLED THE HEALTH DEPARTMENT.

XXIV. COUNTY OLD AGE PENSION COMMISSION

IN 1933 THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF EACH COUNTY WAS CON-STITUTED THE COUNTY OLD AGE PENSION COMMISSION, TO SERVE AS SUCH WITHOUT ADDITIONAL COMPENSATION. THIS COMMISSION WAS REQUIRED TO RECEIVE EACH APPLICATION FOR A PENSION; TO DE-TERMINE WHETHER SUCH SHOULD BE ALLOWED; TO REVIEW ANNUALLY EACH AWARD AND TO REVISE SAME WHENEVER CONDITIONS WARRANTED; TO ISSUE TO THE PENSIONER A CERTIFICATE SETTING FORTH HIS NAME AND RESIDENCE, AND THE AMOUNT AND DATE OF ISSUANCE; TO CER-TIFY SUCH FACTS TO THE STATE AUDITOR AND THE COUNTY TREASURER AS A BASIS FOR DRAWING THEIR WARRANTS FOR MONTHLY PAYMENT OF SUCH PENSIONS; TO REVOKE OR REDUCE PENSIONS FOR CAUSE; TO PRO-VIDE UNDER CERTAIN CONDITIONS FOR THE BURIAL OF DECEASED PEN-SIONERS; TO CAUSE THE COUNTY ATTORNEY TO INQUIRE INTO ALLEGED IRREGULARITIES IN THE RIGHTS OF RECIPIENTS OF PENSIONS; AND TO REPORT TO THE STATE AUDITOR THE TOTAL NUMBER OF PENSIONERS. THE AMOUNT PAID, THE NUMBER OF APPLICATIONS AND OF PENSIONS GRANTED, DENIED OR CANCELED DURING THE YEAR, AND SUCH OTHER INFORMATION AS THE AUDITOR MIGHT REQUIRE. THE COMMISSION WAS EMPOWERED TO MAKE PROPER RULES AND REGULATIONS AND PURCHASE NECESSARY SUPPLIES AT THE EXPENSE OF THE COUNTY. THE MAXIMUM AMOUNT OF OLD AGE PENSION WAS \$30.00 MONTHLY, OF WHICH TWO -THIRDS WAS PAID BY THE STATE AND ONE-THIRD BY THE COUNTY (L. 1933, CH. 34). IN 1937 THE COUNTY OLD AGE PENSION COMMISSION WAS ABOLISHED (L. 1937, CH. 70, SEC. 28). IN 1937 THE LEGISLATURE REPEALED THE ACT OF 1933 AND CREATED THE ARIZONA BOARD OF SOCIAL SECURITY AND PUBLIC WELFARE, TRANS-FERRING TO SUCH BOARD THE POWERS AND FUNCTIONS OF THE ARIZONA STATE BOARD OF PUBLIC WELFARE (L. 1937, CH. 69, P. 298), AND REQUIRING IT TO ADMINISTER THE ACT FOR ASSISTING THE NEEDY BLIND (IBID., CH. 71), THE ACT FOR ASSISTANCE TO DEPENDENT CHILDREN (IBID., CH. 72), AND THE ACT FOR OLD AGE ASSISTANCE (IBID., CH. 70). THE COUNTY OLD AGE FENSION COMMISSION WAS AB-OLISHED (IBID., CH. 70, SEC. 28). A COUNTY BOARD OF SOCIAL SE-CURITY AND PUBLIC WELFARE WAS CREATED, CONSISTING OF ONE MEMBER OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS AND TWO CITIZEN MEMBERS, RESIDENTS OF DIFFERENT COMMUNITIES OF THE COUNTY, APPOINTED BY THE COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS, TO SERVE FOR TERMS OF THREE YEARS. BOARD MEMBERS SERVE WITHOUT PAY, EXCEPT FOR NECESSARY TRAVELING EX-PENSES. (IBID., CH. 69, SEC. 10, SUBD. A).

THE COUNTY BOARDS, UNDER THE DIRECT SUPERVISION AND CON-TROL OF THE STATE DEPARTMENT, PERFORM SUCH DUTIES AS MAY BE PRESCRIBED BY THE STATE BOARD (IBID., CH. 69, SEC. 10, SUBD. B). IT IS THE DUTY OF THE COUNTY BOARDS TO ASSIST THE STATE DEFART-MENT IN THE ADMINISTRATION OF WELFARE AND RELIEF WORK IN THEIR RESPECTIVE COUNTIES; TO KEEP THE STATE DEPARTMENT FULLY IN-FORMED WITH RESPECT TO SOCIAL WELFARE CONDITIONS THEREIN; TO COOPERATE WITH LOCAL PRIVATE RELIEF, WELFARE AND CHARITABLE OR-GANIZATIONS; TO ADVISE COUNTY AND MUNICIPAL AUTHORITIES ON QUESTIONS OF WELFARE, RELIEF, DISTRIBUTION OF FUNDS, AND SOCIAL SECURITY, AND GENERALLY, WITH THE APPROVAL OF THE STATE BOARD, TO DO THINGS NECESSARY AND PROPER, WITHIN THEIR RESPECTIVE JUR-ISDICTIONS, TO CARRY OUT THE FURPOSES OF THE ACT (IBID., CH. 69. SEC. 10, SUBD. C). EACH COUNTY BOARD SELECTS A CHAIRMAN FROM ITS OWN MEMBERS, AND EMPLOYS A FULL-TIME SECRETARY, WHO MAINTAINS AN OFFICE AT THE COUNTY SEAT IN QUARTERS ASSIGNED OR PROVIDED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS, AND OTHER EMPLOYEES AS MAY BE NECESSARY FOR THE DISCHARGE OF THE DUTIES OF THE BOARD (IBID., CH. 69, SEC. 10, SUBD. OF PUBLIC HEALTH, WHICH SUPERVISES PREVENTIVE MEDICINE FOR THE
COUNTY. THIS IS A TUBERCULOSIS PREVENTORIUM AND SCHOOL FOR
CHILDREN HAVING, OR IN DANGER OF CONTRACTING THE DISEASE, WHO
ARE WITHOUT FINANCIAL MEANS OF OBTAINING PROPER TREATMENT
OTHERWISE. THE PREVENTORIUM IS STAFFED BY WORKS PROGRESS ADMINISTRATION WORKERS. FOOD IS FURNISHED BY THE COUNTY BOARD
OF SOCIAL SECURITY AND PUBLIC WELFARE, AND FUNDS BY COUNTY,
CITY AND PRIVATE CONTRIBUTIONS.

IN 1868 THE LEGISLATURE CREATED THE OFFICE OF SURVEYOR. THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS WAS REQUIRED TO APPOINT A SURVEYOR TO SERVE TEMPORARILY UNTIL AN OFFICER COULD BE ELECTED AND QUALIFIED AT THE NEXT GENERAL ELECTION. THEREAFTER SURVEYORS WERE ELECTED TO HOLD OFFICE FOR TWO-YEAR TERMS. IT WAS MADE THE DUTY OF THE SURVEYOR TO KEEP A RECORD OF THE PLATS AND FIELD NOTES OF EACH SURVEY MADE BY HIM OR UNDER HIS AUTHORITY, ARRANGED FOR EASY REFERENCE, AND TO FURNISH CERTIFIED COPIES OF THE SAME TO ANY PERSON UPON PAYMENT OF THE FEE. HE WAS ALSO REQUIRED TO PRESERVE HIS ORIGINAL FIELD NOTES AND CALCU-LATIONS, AND DELIVER THEM TO HIS SUCCESSOR. A HIGH DEGREE OF ACCURACY IN HIS WORK WAS MANDATORY. (L. 1868, PP. 22, 23), WHEN ORDERED BY THE COURT OR THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS, HE WAS REQUIRED TO MAKE SURVEYS, AND ON APPLICATION OF ANY PERSON, HE WAS AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED TO SURVEY AND REESTABLISH THE LINES AND CORNERS OF LANDS IN HIS COUNTY WHICH HAD BEEN SUR-VEYED BY THE UNITED STATES AND TO SUBDIVIDE SUCH LANDS (R. S. 1887, ch. 10). The surveyor was required to furnish the BOARD OF SUPERVISORS WITH ALL MAPS AND PLATS TO BE USED BY THE ASSESSOR IN MAKING ASSESSMENTS (R. S. 1901, TITLE 14, сн. 9).

THE CONSTITUTION OF ARIZONA INCLUDED THE SURVEYOR AMONG THE ELECTIVE COUNTY OFFICERS, AT THE SAME TIME PROVIDING THAT OFFICES THUS CREATED ARE SUBJECT TO CHANGE BY LAW (CONST., ART. 12, SEC. 3). IN 1913 THE LEGISLATURE ABOLISHED THE OFFICE OF SURVEYOR AND THE OFFICE OF SUPERINTENDENT OF ROADS, EFFECTIVE JANUARY 1, 1915, AND CREATED IN LIEU THEREOF THE OFFICE OF COUNTY ENGINEER (L. 1913, 2ND. S. 5., SECS. 1, 10).

XXVII. ROAD OVERSEER

IN 1871 THE LEGISLATURE GAVE THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS AUTHORITY TO DIVIDE THE COUNTY INTO ROAD DISTRICTS AND TO APPOINT FOR EACH DISTRICT A ROAD OVERSEER WHO WAS AUTHORIZED TO COLLECT TWO DOLLARS FROM EVERY ADULT MALE RESIDING WITHIN THE DISTRICT WHO ELECTED NOT TO PERFORM ONE DAY'S LABOR A YEAR REPAIRING OR MAKING ROADS IN HIS DISTRICT (L. 1871, P. 116, FF.).

THE ROAD OVERSEER HAD POWER TO LET ROAD CONTRACTS UP TO TWO HUNDRED DOLLARS AFTER POSTING NOTICE FOR A WEEK, AND COULD LET CONTRACTS UP TO FIFTY DOLLARS FOR REPAIR OF ROADS AND BRIDGES WITHOUT ASKING FOR SEALED PROPOSALS. ALL IM-PROVEMENTS ON THE COUNTY HIGHWAYS WERE MADE UNDER THE SUPERVISION OF THE ROAD OVERSEER AND NO CONTRACTOR WAS PAID IN FULL UNTIL THE ROAD OVERSEER HAD ACCEPTED THE JOB (L. 1871, P. 117, SECS. 13, 14). IN 1909 THE OFFICE OF ROAD OVERSEER WAS ABOLISHED (L. 1909, CH. 63, SECS. 1-3).

XXVIII. COUNTY SUPERINTENDENT OF ROADS

IN THE SAME ACT WHICH ABOLISHED THE OFFICE OF ROAD OVER-SEER, THE LEGISLATURE CREATED THE OFFICE OF COUNTY SUPERIN-TENDENT OF ROADS, TO BE FILLED BY APPOINTMENT BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS. THE SUPERINTENDENT WAS REQUIRED TO BE SKILLED AND EXPERIENCED IN THE CONSTRUCTION OF ROADS AND HIGHWAYS. HE WAS GIVEN CHARGE OF ALL PUBLIC ROADS AND HIGHWAYS IN THE COUNTY SUBJECT TO THE ORDERS OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS. HIS SALARY WAS TO BE NOT MORE THAN \$1,800 ANNUALLY, AND NOT LESS THAN \$500. (L. 1909, CH. 63, SECS. 1-3).

THE CONSTITUTION PROVIDED FOR EACH COUNTY A COUNTY SUFER-INTENDENT OF ROADS, SUBJECT TO CHANGE BY LAW (CONST., ART. 12, SEC. 3). IN 1912 THE SUPERINTENDENT WAS EMPOWERED, BY AND WITH THE ADVICE AND CONSENT OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS, TO APPOINT SUCH NUMBER OF DEPUTIES AS IN THE JUDGMENT OF THE

BOARD WERE NECESSARY TO PERFORM PROPERLY THE DUTIES OF THIS OFFICE (L. 1912, ch. 93, sec. 3). In the following year, the LEGISLATURE ABOLISHED THE OFFICE OF COUNTY SUPERINTENDENT OF ROADS AND THAT OF SURVEYOR, EFFECTIVE JANUARY 1, 1915 (L. 1913, 2ND S. S., ch. 48, sec. 1), AND IN LIEU THEREOF CREATED THE OFFICE OF COUNTY ENGINEER (IBID., ch. 48, sec. 10).

XXIX. COUNTY ENGINEER

IN 1913 THE LEGISLATURE CREATED THE OFFICE OF COUNTY ENGINEER, TO BE FILLED BY APPOINTMENT BY THE BOARD OF SUPER-VISORS. THE COUNTY ENGINEER HOLDS OFFICE AT THE PLEASURE OF THE BOARD. (R. S. 1913, TITLE 10, CH. 13). HE MUST BE A COMPETENT CIVIL ENGINEER AND ROAD BUILDER. TO HIM IS GIVEN CUSTODY OF ALL RECORDS AND PROPERTY THERETOFORE PERTAINING TO THE OFFICES OF SURVEYOR AND COUNTY SUPERINTENDENT OF ROADS. Under the direction of the Board of supervisors, HE IS GIVEN CHARGE OF THE LOCATING, DESIGNING, AND CONSTRUCTING OF ALL HIGHWAYS, BRIDGES, CULVERTS, DITCHES, LEVEES, AND ALL OTHER ENGINEERING UNDERTAKINGS ON BEHALF OF THE COUNTY, AND THE MAK-ING OF SURVEYS, MAPS, PLANS AND SPECIFICATIONS REQUIRED BY THE BOARD (L. 1921, CH. 59, SEC. 1; R. C. 1928, SEC. 883). SUBSE-QUENT LEGISLATION HAS MADE AN EXCEPTION IN THE EXCLUSIVE SU-PERVISION OF THE COUNTY ENGINEER OVER COUNTY HIGHWAYS, WHERE THE SAME ARE UNDER CONTROL OF A COUNTY HIGHWAY COMMISSION (L. 1921, CH. 59, SEC. 1).

THE COMMISSIONER OF IMMIGRATION WAS EMPOWERED TO GIVE INFORMATION TO ANY PERSON DESIRING TO IMMIGRATE TO THE COUNTY; TO OPEN CORRESPONDENCE WITH IMMIGRATION BUREAUS; TO DIRECT THE IMMIGRANT AS TO THE CHEAPEST AND MOST EXPEDITIOUS METHOD OF REACHING THE COUNTY; TO ISSUE FROM TIME TO TIME SUCH MAPS, PAMPHLETS, AND REPORTS ON MINING, FARMING, GRAZING, LUMBER AND OTHER RESOURCES OF THE COUNTY AS MIGHT INDUCE IMMIGRATION AND THE INVESTMENT OF CAPITAL; TO DISTRIBUTE IN THE CITIES AND RAILROAD CENTERS OF THE EASTERN STATES, CANADA AND EUROPE, SUCH DOCUMENTS AND IN SUCH MANNER AS TO INSURE THEM THE WIDEST AND MOST USEFUL CIRCULATION; AND TO BE AT ALL TIMES PREPARED TO GIVE SUCH FACTS AND STATISTICS REGARDING THE COUNTY AS THE IMMIGRANT, SETTLER OR CAPITALIST MIGHT DESIRE (R. S. 1901, APPENDIX A, No. 45, Pp. 1467-68, SEC. 80, SUBDS. 1-5).

XXXI. COUNTY AGRICULTURAL AGENT

IN 1914 CONGRESS PASSED THE SMITH-LEVER ACT PROVIDING FOR THE CARRYING ON OF COOPERATIVE EXTENSION WORK BY COLLEGES RECEIVING THE BENEFITS OF THE ACT. SUCH WORK INCLUDED THE GIVING OF INSTRUCTION AND PRACTICAL DEMONSTRATION IN AGRICULTURE AND HOME ECONOMICS TO PERSONS NOT RESIDENT AT SUCH COLLEGES THROUGH FIELD DEMONSTRATIONS, PUBLICATIONS AND OTHERWISE. IT WAS FURTHER PROVIDED THAT THIS WORK SHOULD BE CARRIED IN SUCH MANNER AS MIGHT BE AGREED UPON BY THE SECRETARY OF AGRICULTURE AND SUCH COLLEGES (U. S. STATUTES AT LARGE, VOL. 38, PART 1, P. 372),

IN 1915 THE LEGISLATURE GAVE ITS ASSENT TO THE SMITH-LEVER ACT. THE EXTENSION SERVICE OF THE COLLEGE OF AGRICUL-TURE OF THE UNIVERSITY OF ARIZONA WAS CREATED, AND AUTHORIZED TO ENTER INTO COOPERATIVE AGREEMENTS WITH THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE TERMS OF THE ACT (L. 1915, CH. 25). PURSUANT THERETO, THE EXTENSION SER-VICE, WITH THE APPROVAL OF THE BOARD OF REGENTS OF THE UNIVER-SITY, APPOINTS A COUNTY AGRICULTURAL AGENT FOR PIMA COUNTY. APPROPRIATIONS ARE MADE BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS TO THE BOARD OF REGENTS TO ASSIST THIS WORK (IBID., SEC. 3). THE INFORMATION DISSEMINATED BY THE COUNTY AGRICULTURAL AGENT IN-CLUDES DATA ON IRRIGATION, NOXIOUS WEED CONTROL, EROSION, SOIL ANALYSIS, BUTTER AND CHEESE MAKING, STOCK BREEDING, HORTICUL-TURE, FRUIT AND VEGETABLE PRESERVING, MEAT CURING, AND OTHER SUBJECTS RELATING TO THE INTERESTS OF RURAL RESIDENTS OF THE COUNTY.

IN 1921 THE LEGISLATURE PROVIDED THAT SUCH EXTENSION WORK SHOULD BE CARRIED ON AS MUTUALLY AGREED UPON BY THE BOARD OF REGENTS AND A COUNTY FARM BUREAU IN EACH COUNTY (L. 1921, P. 134). THE FIMA COUNTY FARM BUREAU WAS INCORPORATED FOR THIS PURPOSE IN 1921 AS A PRIVATE NON-PROFIT CORPORATION.

THE FARM BUREAU ACTS IN AN ADVISORY CAPACITY IN CONNECTION WITH THE AGRICULTURAL EXTENSION WORK. IN AN OPINION RENDERED TO THE ARIZONA CORPORATION COMMISSION IN 1921, THE ATTORNEY GENERAL OF ARIZONA ADVISED THAT THE COUNTY FARM BUREAU IS A QUASI-MUNICIPAL CORPORATION HAVING CORPORATE POWERS SUFFICIENT TO ACHIEVE THE PURPOSES FOR WHICH IT IS CREATED, THAT IT COULD OWN REAL AND PERSONAL PROPERTY, BUT COULD NOT SUE OR BE SUED.

The county agricultural agent is housed in the same offices with the home demonstration agent. These two officers cooperate in their work, but administration of the office is under direction of the county agricultural agent. Since 1936 the agricultural extension service of Pima and Santa Cruz counties have been combined, with offices in the Pima County Counties.

THE COUNTY AGRICULTURAL AGENT HAS PARTICIPATED IN SOME OF THE RECENT ACTIVITIES OF THE DEFARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE IN ITS AGRICULTURAL ADJUSTMENT PROGRAM, AND RECORDS RELATING THERETO ARE FOUND IN THE AGENT'S OFFICE.

LIKE THE COUNTY AGRICULTURAL AGENT, THE HOME DEMONSTRATION AGENT IS APPOINTED BY THE EXTENSION SERVICE OF THE COLLEGE OF AGRICULTURE OF THE UNIVERSITY OF ARIZONA, AND ACTS UNDER LIKE AUTHORITY AND IN COOPERATION WITH THE PIMA COUNTY FARM BUREAU. THE HOME DEMONSTRATION AGENT SPECIALIZES IN GIVING INSTRUCTION AND PRACTICAL DEMONSTRATIONS IN HOME ECONOMICS TO RURAL RESIDENTS. SINCE 1936 THE AGRICULTURAL EXTENSION SERVICE OF PIMA AND SANTA CRUZ COUNTIES HAVE BEEN COMBINED.
