Clark. Col. Clark stated that the Cadet Companies have been so thinned out in numbers that it was impossible to drill them properly. The cadets working on the farm having been excused from drills heretofore, it was ordered that all cadets, whether working or not, must hereafter drill at least two hours per week, the days to be fixed by Col. Clark (Tuesday and Friday). Several proposals to change the hour for drills having, on examination, been found impossible to introduce at this time, the hour for drills was left unchanged.
