

AOM College of Kentucky May 31-1905.
President Patterson called a meeting of the
faculty at 8 AM. all present except Prof. Roark.

The minutes of the three recent meetings of
May 5, May 8, and May 29 were read and approved.

Case of
Karl Dietrich

Prof. Norwood asked permission to make a
statement with reference to an article which
appeared in the morning paper to the effect that
among the diplomas taken by him to Frankfort
was one for Karl L. Dietrich which was signed
by the Governor. Prof. Norwood said that this
published statement was untrue & that he did
not even take Mr. Dietrich's diploma to
Frankfort for the governor's signature.

President Patterson read communications from
Messrs Shanklin and Stoll to himself a letter of
apology from Mr. Karl Dietrich to the Faculty and
a copy of Mr. Dietrich's letter to his class.

After some discussion of these communications
participated in by Profs. Wernicke, Mackenzie, and
Anderson the last named, Prof. Anderson moved
that the communication of Mr. Dietrich be deemed
an apology and that we reinstate Mr. Dietrich
in good standing in his class. Seconded by Prof. Kastle.

After discussion Prof. Kastle withdrew his
second to Prof. Anderson's motion and offered the
following which was seconded by Prof. Anderson.

"Moved that Mr. Dietrich's communication be
received and filed." Carried.

Prof. Kastle moved that we reopen the case of
Mr. Dietrich and give the young man a chance to
make a verbal statement. Prof. Anderson seconded
the motion and an aye and no vote taken as follows.
Ayes - Profs. Kastle, Pryor, Anderson, Mathews, Miller,
and Paig. Ayes 6.

Noes - Prof. White, Niece, W. K. Patterson, M. L. Puce,
Wernicke, Brooks, Mackenzie Norwood and Barth.

Noes 9

The motion was declared lost.

that no student of the Senior class shall
be considered eligible for graduation who
has any condition at the beginning of the
