BUCKS ARE FIRST ON 16-GAME CARD

A practice-less Kentucky baseball team, with less than a week of intense practice under its belt, will make the first step on a round-16 game war-card against Ohio State Buckeyes tomorrow afternoon on the Stoll diamond.

The game, first of a two game series, is billed to start at 2:30 and student admission will be the activity book.

Hampered in outdoor drills by bad weather and lack of a practice lot, the Cats will open with a mere skeleton squad. The diamond was not ready for actual fielded practice until yesterday afternoon and several of the performers Coach Frank Moseley is expecting to play leading roles have been unable to report for practice due to football and basketball spring rehearsals.

On the other hand, Ohio State will field a team that has been practicing for some two months in their spacious field house. Although the power of the Buckeyes is not known, they annually rank as one of the big 19's fastest clubs.

Staff Kelly, sophomore right hander, is expected to get the starting nod in today's battle, with George Tognocchi opening on the mound tomorrow. The pitching staff, like the remainder of the team, has been handicapped by lack of practice, and Coach Moseley has indicated that the other three members of his corps, Carl Staker, Lincoln Ellington and Alan Rathbone, will also see action in one or both games.

Potentially the Cats are a powerful team, but they can't expect to go far until practice has removed most of the winter kinks. Like the man with the new zipper suit, Coach Moseley won't know what to do until he sees how his gadgets work. At present several uncertainties in his eyes are dancing before his eyes and the starters are not certain.

The only certainty is Wilce Carnes, who Wednesday afternoon was elected captain of the team. Carnes, a product of Withrow high school in Cincinnati where he was captain of the football, basketball and track teams, is a second baseman and last season ended the campaign with a batting average of .31.

To fill the graduated first base position of Randall Phillips, who is now spending his afternoons with Baltimore, the Cats will probably look to Grover Cardwell, Charley White or the Shepherd will receive the call at third base, while either Shepherd or Noland Navarre will sing third base. In case he does not open at third, Navarre may be moved into the outfield.

Be Willoughby seems sure to start in right field, while Charley Martin or Ray Graves will probably handle the other two vacancies. Billy Black, who has shown plenty of batting power in the few practices he has been able to attend, may also receive the call for duty in the outfield. Either Eddie Fritz, a regular last year, or Ted Myer will open behind the bat.

Last year, first baseball season for the Cats in seven years, Kentucky presented a team that was a powerhouse at bat but as shaky as a hula dancer with a chill in the field. As a result the season's report card showed only 5 wins in 12 times out.
