Thank you much for your letter &  
for sending me your book. I ~~have not~~  
had time to read the latter, but I do  
not think I shall at all agree with  
the last few chapters.

With regard to S. Paul my points  
are:-

1. That he was not an Apostle to  
the Hebrew Gentiles; - that his work  
was detaching the proselytes from  
the Synagogue.
  2. That it was the loss of their proselytes  
(a source of revenue) that caused  
him to encourage the enclosure of the  
Asiatic & other Jews.
  3. That the mind of S. Paul was  
formed in a Rabbinic mould &  
that his arguments are Rabbinic,  
& only carry force in so far as they  
have been brought up in Rabbinic schools.
- These three points I believe I mean,  
& no critic has attempted to confute  
them.
