Dear Eunice. 1876

As Henry has so much to hurry and worry him, and has hardly time to read thro' letters when he gets it, I write and send this editorial to you & ask you to take care of it & give it to him when he can attend to it. In the last Union I gave an account of the Union meeting of Christians in England & at the same time I opened a correspondence with some leading ministers in England who were friends of Mr Ryders asking of them an account of the recent Mission work in Nottingham. In reply I got this letter from Revd G R Thornton which I have introduced into this editorial. I have also planned to write to Revd S Mordaunt in Paris & to a leading minister in Scotland.

Switzerland & get intelligence
