

From early life he indulged in the composition of verses.

He possessed the friendship and at length the parental kindness of Edmund Burke. He also acquired the friendship of Charles James Fex, and the Duke of Rutland made him his domestic Chaplain, but he was indebted to Lord Thurlow for his clerical proformatis. His success as a poet, seems to have roused him to extent, and his works have been stamped with the public approbation. He now ranks among our legitimate poets.
