Bridger Goodrich, Bermuda; *m.* Mary Ann, *d.* of Charles Cotesworth, R.N., Liverpool. *Educ.*: St. John's Coll. Camb. Select Preacher University of Oxford, 1896; Hon. Canon Norwich Cathedral; Hon. Fellow St. John's Coll. Camb. and of Worcester Coll. Oxford. Curate of Papworth St. Agnes, Cambridgeshire, 1848-54; Headmaster of Helston Grammar School, Cornwall, 1855-59; Headmaster of King Edward VI.'s School, Norwich, 1859-79; Rector of Scarning, 1879. *Publications*: editor of *Essays in Divinity* by John Donne.
