HARE, Augustus John Cuthbert, small landowner; *y. s.* of Francis George Hare, Hurstmonceaux, Sussex, and Gresford, Flintshire, and Anne Frances Paul, his wife; adopted s. of Maria Leycester, widow of Augustus W. Hare, his father's 2nd b. Resided at Hurst-

monceaux till 1860, when he removed to Holmhurst. *Educ.*: Harrow; Univ. Coll. Oxford.
