Dear Sir

I understood my friend Mr. Stevenson that he had forgotten to ask you a question when you were in Sheffield which chiefly concerned me - I have it in contemplation to publish a neat pocket Volume of somewhat more than 200 pages, connected with Derbyshire - The size the same as the little pamphlet you have seen of mine "Modern Gtatsworth" - and I wish to know what will be your charge per Sheet of 16 pages for 500 copies and also for 750 - The matter will be partly original and partly selected and compressed from my Peak Itinerary, and as a companion for Derbyshire Travellers it will contain an ample account of all the places within the Peak district, usually visited by Tourists.
