

Washington, Aug 21, 1841.

Wise made a speech to-day in which he abused Mr Clay, denounced the Whig press and stigmatized the "Cabinet as traitors at suppene;" &c &c.

Proffit, Mallory and Grevin go with Wise, who is at work to produce an explosion.

The Bank bill comes out of committee on Monday. It will pass the Senate but is not sure to be signed by the President.

There is an amendment pending to the Land Bill which averts the distribution when Congress imposes a duty of more than three per cent upon importations.

The President is surrounded by a "malign influence." He has been too long resting in seclusion to comprehend either his own position or the interests of the country.
