

CAMBRIDGE, George Wm. Frederick Charles,
Duke of, *Kaim'-bridj*, first cousin to Queen
Victoria, early entered the army, and in 1837 was a
colonel of infantry, and successively commanded a
regiment of dragoons and the Scots Fusiliers. In
1852 he was appointed inspector-general of the
army, and in 1854 became lieutenant-general,
with the command of a division, with which he
proceeded to the Crimea. He fought at the
battles of Alma and Inkermann, and in 1855
returned to England. On the death of Lord
Hardinge, in 1856, he became commander-in-
chief of the British forces. In 1857 he was
presented by the citizens of London with a
sword of honour, accompanied with the freedom
of the city. B. at Hanover, 1819.
