

CHANDLER, RICHARD, D.D., was born. 1738, and educated at Magdalen College, Oxford, where he obtained a fellowship, and proceeded to his degree of D.D., 1773, after which he was presented to the living of Worldham, Hampshire, and next to that of Tilehurst, Berkshire. His first publication was the 'Marmora Oxoniensia,' 1763. The year following he went out, at the expense of the Dilettanti Society, to make observations in Greece and Asia, the result of which appeared in 1769, in an imperial folio, entitled 'Ionian Antiquities.' In 1774 Dr. Chandler published 'Inscriptiones antiquæ, pleræque nondum editæ, in Asia Minora et Græcia, præsertim Athenis collectæ.' The next year came out his 'Travels in Asia Minor,' which volume was followed by his 'Travels in Greece,' and 'The History of Ilium, or Troy.' His last work was the Life of William of Waynflete; but this was not published till the year after his death, which happened 9 Feb., 1810.
