My Dear Sir

I very much regret that I shall not be able to attend the Meeting of the Members of East Surrey this Evening at the Bridge House Hotel —

May they of you be assured the Meeting that nothing on my part shall be wanting to promote the Election of any Liberal Candidate they may determine to support. —

I need hardly deny to you My Dear Sir that the Bills pushed in Surrey with my name as a Candidate were done without my knowledge, & will you please give it a flat contradiction to the Meeting, ^(loud cheer) for I have too high an opinion of the Constancy of Southwark ever to leave them so long as they have confidence in me, I remain the firm supporter of those Principles for which I have three times ^{been} so unanimously
