MEYRICK, Sir Samuel Rush, Ll.D., F.S.A., was educated at Oxford, and afterwards practised for many years as an advocate in the Ecclesiastical and Admiralty courts; but his real study and pursuit was that of antiquities and archæology; and in his residence, Goodrich Court, Herefordshire, he gradually accumulated a very large collection of armour, which is now deposited in the South Kensington Museum. His two great works, which are standard authorities on the subject they treat of, are, 'A Critical Inquiry into Antient Armour, as it existed in Europe, but particularly in England from the Norman Conquest to the reign of Charles II.; with a Glossary of Military Terms of the Middle Ages,' 3 vols. 4to., 1824, and again 1844; and the letter-press portion of Joseph Skelton's 'Engraved Illustrations on Ancient Arms and Armour' in his collection, 2 vols. 4to, 1830, and again 1854. Sir Samuel also published 'The History and Antiquities of the County of Cardigan,' and edited Lewis Dunn's 'Herafdic Visitations of Wales.' Died 2 April, 1848, aged 65.
