I was some time back, favored with a call from Lord Gosford, but was unfortunately from home; had he saw many of his Pictures, with which I conders that he was well pleased, I shortly afterwards addressed a few lines to his Lordship, acquainting him that the two whole length frames, were so worn eaten & decayed, (which were black frames, with a gold edge), that nothing could be done with them, & wishing to know, if a couple of frames of the same kind should be made for them, and at the same time acquainting his Lordship, that the Pictures and Frames would be complet and ready for delivery, by the middle of this month, requesting his answer also, in what way I should be wout down.

I have been favoured with ^{his} answer, wishing the
frames to be done, and in respect to their being
returned, the Lordship mentioned, you will
have the goodness to give Directions on that point,
and as they will be ready for packing in about
ten days or a fortnight, should be glad to be
favoured with your Instructions, should you
think it equally convenient, to have three
or four of the Cases, sent one week & the
others the week following, it would make
it more convenient for the packing here
should be glad to be favoured with your answer
as soon as convenient, I am happy to say
I have got the Pictures, in the a very nice state,
and Dr. Phillips, has this Morning been
to look at them, & thought I had done very well
to them. & was much pleased, with their appearance
& to see they had cleaned out so well — there
still remains, four Pictures, that are not

Cleaned, which Mr Phillips some thought worth
the doing, but that, he said this Morning, Lord
Godolphin might decide upon, Portrait of a Lady
in Black, that is so damaged, as to be past
recovery, — but the others, an old Mans head
with a beard, & D. in l.t. Drap., & young man
in D. want only clearing & would be a fine
each, the frames I believe would be perhaps
something more — I send his Lordship with them
done, as Family Portraits, your early answer
will enable me to do them, in time to pack
with the others.

Sir I have been favoured with your
Letter, I have also recd. the Case, with
the picture, it certainly is in a very
bad state indeed, but I hope I shall be
able to restore it in some degree, Tho' a great
deal of repairing & repainting will be neces-
sary; the Head, fortunately is not in so bad
a condition, & can be restored, without much
touching, or perhaps scarcely any, excepting
a ^{few} strokes, that may, requiring carefully filling
in with the point of the Pencil, this will by no
means hurt, the original Character & I will
endeavour, to preserve the original writing as
much as possible, the Expense of it altogether
shall come within the sum you mention, &

will endeavor to get it done, as soon as I
can - I hope you liked the little picture
I thought I had been very successful in
repeating it, I have not had the pleasure
of seeing Mr Phillips since his return, but
expect I may in a few days. -
