**LE JEUNE, Henry**, English painter, b. 1819; head-master of the Government School of Design, 1845-48; appointed curator of the painting school of the Royal Academy, 1848. Painted 'Samson bursting his Bonds,' 1841. Elected A.R.A. 1863. 189.66V.5

LE JEUNE, Henry, *le(r)-zhoon*, a painter of considerable merit, who commenced his career as an artist by obtaining the gold medal of the Royal Academy in 1841, for a fine picture of "Samson bursting his bonds." In 1845 he was appointed head master of the Government School of Design, but he relinquished this post in 1848 to become curator of the painting school of the Royal Academy, an office which he retained until 1864, having been elected A.R.A. in the previous year. Among the best of his later paintings may be named "The Sisters of Lazarus," "Noon," "Autumn," "The Eft," "The First Dip," "Early Flowers," "The Storm," "The Wounded Robin," "The Loiterer," "The Young Warreners," "The Bird's Nest," "The Ride," "Tickled With a Straw," "Burning Leaves," "Rather Shy," "Water Lilies," and "The Pet Pigeon."
