Eastwick, Edward Backhouse (b. 1814, d. 1883), Orientalist; entered the Indian army; held political posts in Scinde; was professor of Hindustani at Haileybury; went to Persia in 1860 as secretary of legation; became private secretary to Lord Salisbury, and was member of Parliament for Penrhyn and Falmouth (1868-74). He has translated Sadi's Gulistan (1852) and much Persian literature, and written The Journal of a Diplomate in Persia (1864), etc.
