# **New bike policy** carries hefty fine

A year after the ineffective dismount zone, UK officials are giving cyclists a choice: park your bike or pay the price.

Fines of \$25 will be issued to any person riding on pedestrian walkways or sidewalks. Bikes parked anywhere but the 14 clusters of bike racks will be immobilized or impounded, in addition to being ticketed.

"We are hoping we will get people's attention." said Joe Burch, vice president for University Relations. "It's not a revenue generator. It costs us more than we'll ever generate in revenue."

The new bike policy will be in effect 24 hours a day. Cyclists also cannot ride inside University buildings, inside parking structures or anywhere restricted by signs. While on streets and roads, cyclists will be confined to bike lanes.

UK police will issue warnings for the first week of classes to those caught riding their bicycles or rollerblading outside the bike lanes. After warnings are issued, police will begin to issue citations to offenders.

Two years ago, a committee of cyclists and non-cyclists, students, faculty, and staff was formed to look at what other colleges and universities have done about the increasing number of bikes on campus

"The first thing that occurred to us was that we needed to move the bicycle racks away from areas where we don't want students to ride," Burch said.

In order to accommodate bike racks, approximately 25 to 30 parking spaces were turned into bike parking. Unlike parking tickets, students won't be allowed let bike tickets pile up throughout the semester. If students park their bikes in a restricted area, they will be immobilized until students pay the fines.

# **Audit claims McCoy stole** from council

An assistant dean of students and financial adviser to UK's fraternities resigned last month when UK learned he had misappropriated
more than \$11,000 from a fraternity bank account.

Jay T. McCoy, 35, of Lexington, supervised 25-30 agency
accounts for student organizations and served as financial adviser for
the Greek Activity Steering Committee and the Interfraternity
Council.

According to a University audit, McCoy wrote 30 ehecks to himself from the Interfraternity Council bank account between January
20, 1995 and May \$1,996, totaling \$11,107.

Following discovery of the misappropriation, a management
review was ordered by James Kuder, vice chancellor for Student
Affairs.

Affairs.

According to that review, McCoy admitted forging the signatures of the IFC president and the vice-president of internal relations, which he needed to gain access to the account.

The Dean of Students Office first became aware of a problem when PNC Bank, which held the IFC's account, notified the office he account was overdrawn, he review state.

Confronted by the audit's findings, McCoy admitted to writing several checks to himself. He was immediately placed on administrative suspension, and on July 15, citing personal reasons, McCoy resigned.

In his resignation letter, McCoy said "personal concerns have grown to the point where I must take time for myself and my family and consider a career change..."

According to the review, along with the \$11,000 missing from the IFC account, McCoy also received reimbursement from the University for expenses incurred during University-related trips and conferences.

The audit cited several instances when McCoy wrote checks to himself on the IFC account and then subsequently billed the University for his meals, lodging and airfare, constituting a double reimbursement.

During the search of McCoy's office following his resignation, student affairs personnel uncovered 13 un-cashed checks totaling \$530, written by various fraternities and individual students to the United Way. McCoy was responsible for turning all donations, checks and cash, into the United Way.

McCoy would not comment on the investigation. Elisabeth Zinser, chancellor of the Lexington campus, said UK has always been strongly committed to the United Way and deeply regress that these contributions channeled through the campaign did not reach the agency.

"The integrity of this institution is of the utmost concern to us always," Zinser said. "Stealing is totally unacceptable."

Following completion of the audit, the Dean of Students turned the matter over to the UK police for investigation and appropriate

the matter over to the UK police for investigation and appropriate action.

"We're getting close to the end of our investigation now," said UK Police Chief, W. H. McComas. "We've completed our local interviews, but we still have to do at least one more out-of-state interview before turning the case over to the commonwealth attorney for prosecution."

McComas did not name a specific date for his office's completion of the investigation, but said it would most likely be "very soon."

The review completed this month was critical of the Dean of Students Office, stating "inadequate internal and management controls exist in the Dean of Students Office, which allowed for unauthorized and unrecognized control by a University employee over a student organization account comprised of non-university funds."

UK spokesman Ralph Derickson, said the university is in the process of examining what can be done to prevent this type of incident. "We accept the management review recommendations and are proceeding to take action and examine other management improvements to prevent this from happening again," Derickson said.

# **New structure to aid with parking**

Approximately 15,000 parking spaces exist on the Lexington Campus for the more than 39,000 people in the campus community.

The parking situation is at its worst in the fall because many students park in the Commonwealth Stadium lot until K-permits are required spept. 16, said Don Thornton, director of parking.

Parking spaces have decreased this year due to the closing of employee and resident lots on Hillton Avenue. and loss of about 200 communetre and employee spaces due to the road-widening project on Virginia Avenue.

Thornton said the lots on Hillton Avenue closed the control of the con

"The plan is now to come back with four lots for employees and two residential student lots," Thorn-ton said.

To ease parking, a new 1,000 space parking structure will open on Limestone Street in December, About 600 of the spaces are for employees, 300 are for students and the remainder will be reserved for visitors, Thornton said.

"It's going to help out," he said. "When you add another 1,000 spaces it can't hut."

Thornton expects the structure to "create a migration" of employees and commuting students from Central and North Campus lots, freeing those from the South Campus overflow and helping to move more people closer to campus from Common-

wealth Stadium parking.

Joyce Evans, an employee at the Wenner-Gren Research Lab on Rose Street, said now that the Hilliton to plots are also closed "most people in this lab need 45 minutes to find a parking and library construction officials should have at least waited until the new structure was completed before closing the lots.

"The stupidity of shutting down the parking lots on Hillton for construction is that the library won't be done until the fall of '97. "Evans said.

In order to pay for the structure and improvement to lots, parking fees have increased since the plan was implemented. In 1994, resident permits cost 880 per year. This year they cost \$112.

Eight thousand parking spaces go to students.

Resident and commuter students are assigned to "R" and "C" lots. Students eligible can still apply at the parking office on Euclid Avenue for late issuance permits as long as they are available.

Thornton said everyone needs to check the signs posted at lot entrances to check control hours. Students who are unable to receive "R" or "C" may apply for "K" permits for the Commonwealth Stadium lot through Sept. 13. The cost is \$72.

Thornton said students who park in the stadium lot need to remember to move their cars by 9 a.m. on days of home football games or they will be towed.

# Officials say carbon monoxide detectors a must

When a Lexington family died earlier this month from apparent carbon monoxide poisoning, shock was felt around the city. Questions were raised about how it happened, why they did not leave the house and what was the

source of such a poisonous gas.

An unusual hazard because of its colorless, odorless nature, carbon monoxide is extremely dangerous because the symptoms are often easily mistaken as something

Experts recommend that peo-ple buy carbon monoxide detec-tors to prevent the fatal mistake.

"It is a worthwhile investment of pend \$30 for a carbon monoxide detector," said Dominic Giambri, assistant to the industrial bygeinsis.

In addition, UK Fire Marshal Garry Beach recommended that people regularly check to make sure their carbon monoxide and fire detectors are working.

A few surprises can be found when researching safety in campus apartments, houses and residence halls. For example, although people generally need one carbon monoxide detector, it is necessary that they have multiple smoke detectors.

"A minimum of four in a three-bedroom apartment," Beach said. "You need to have a fire extinguisher — it's common knowledge."

If you have a gas stove, Beach advises getting a maintenance check every year. This annual check-up can alert you to any obstructions in the gas line or drafts that may cause the pilol tight to go out.

'Obviously make sure that you don't have any leaks," Beach said.

And make certain that the fame is blue because this ensures that you have the right combination of elements.

Gas stoves are not the only worry when it comes to older houses that have been converted into apartments.



# Team hopes to bring 'inclusive learning' to campus

After a rise of racial tension to the surface last spring, a rally to "break the silence," and student suggestions to administrators, UK has formed a team to make UK a more "inclusive learning commu-niv."

more inclusive learning community.

Beginning in the spring and working through the summer, a group consisting of administrative, student and faculty representatives has already implemented some ideas proposed last spring and has plans to consider additional faculty and curriculum changes in its working report.

"We're on the starting block for some new things that are going to happen this year," said Elisabeth Zinser, chancellor of the Lexington campus and member of the new inclusive learning community team.

The overall goal is to make UK an "inclusive learning community." Their report defines the community as "the active engagement of students, faculty, staff and alumni in the pursuit of learning in an environment of equality, civility, academic freedom, security and mutual respect for the rights and responsibilities of all members of the community."

An additional section on diversity has been added to UK 101 to increase new students' exposure to race. The Black Student Union has had its budget increased by \$5,000. The first annual African American convocation will be held this fall. In addition, a social justice forum will be held the spetember, and new faculty and teaching assistants will receive extra orien-

tation on diversity and familiarized with a new teaching-learning handbook.

The inclusive learning community team is working on additional responses to last spring's proposals to be implemented this year. These responses include the development of a racial harsesment policy, drafting a University Creed, including additional classes under the cross cultural requirement and establishing a support fund to recruit senior African American faculty members.

Lauretta Byars, vice chancellor for minority affairs and a team members, said many of the responses initiated by definition of the control of the con

Zinser said the team's progress is a result of student input from the last semester which "accelerat-ed progress" on equality issues already on the table, narrowed the focus and expanded the campus community.





# **Library Microlabs News**

A number of changes and improvements have been made in the Library Microlabs that will begin with the start of the Fall Semester. These changes include an upgrade to Windows95 and memory upgrades on many machines; a new Printing Management System, including a charge for printing; a new streamlined system to apply for a computing account; and expanded access to full-test databases via the World Wide Web. For more details, stop by any Microlab, or access the Microlab Web site at http://www.uky.edu/MicroLabs/.



# **Printing Management System**

All UK Libraries and Microlabs are open to the university community and the public, and each day, nearly 20% of all Library and Microlab transactions - including printing - is carried out by non-university users. The dramatically increased demand for printing, coupled with abuse of free printing by some patrons, necessitated a Printing Management System that will 1) create an equitable system for managing printing, 2) reduce printing delays due to unnecessary printing, and 3) reduce the tremendous waste of paper that was occurring in the Microlabs. Beginning this Fall semester, \$.10 will be charged per black and white laser print in all of the Microlabs and in the King Library Reference and Periodicals Departments. Effective September 5, each full-time student will receive their first 50 copies per semester free. \$.50 per page will be charged for color printing. Students will no longer be subsidizing abusive printing, and funds saved on printing costs will be redirected to further improvements in the Microlabs.

Benefits of the system include:
-the addition of color printing
-new printers in the Microlabs
-guaranteed reliability and quality of printing
-environmentally sound - less waste of paper and toner
-printing by others no longer subsidized by students
-better access to PLUS account services via three new locations
for adding funds to accounts
-consultants will have fewer printing problems to solve and will
have more time to assist students
-money saved on printing will be applied toward improving
computing services for students
-drop from \$.25 to \$.10 per page for printing full-text journal service

During the first few weeks of school there will be express stations set up in the Labs to generate accounts, and instructions to establish the account will be available on site. Accounts that were established last year remain valid for 1996-1997. Faculty and staff only will set up their accounts at McVey Hall.



# **Full-Text Journal Service**

There will be expanded access to research information this Fall in the Library Microlabs, the Reference and Periodical Departments, on UKOnline, and in several other libraries around the campus. Through the World Wide Web, students will be able to access full-text and graphics of articles from two databases: Expanded Academic Index, which includes indexes and abstracts for 1500 titles and over 500 periodicals, and Business and Company Profile, which includes directory listings for more than 180,000 companies, as well as information on trade, finance, new technologies, trends and more from over 950 publications. 





from. If copies were made from the needed articles, they then could be purchased for a nominal charge, making me and my pocketbook happy.

I know some professors have sordid visions of their students going home and reading the book from cover-to-cover, but we both know it doesn't happen.

I have had instances, where a single class has cost more than \$150. Then at the end of the semester not a single book is purchased back. That's outrageous!

Students who take classes in Arts and Sciences are especially hit hard, and I'm talking Mit Tyson punch-to-the-face hard. In many instances classes are only taught once a year so at the

end the semester the books have no value.

These instances are almost as frustrating as the unused book.



Those white diamonds painted on the sidewalk is a University regulated path, no longer are cyclists able to ride directly to their building, instead the University has built bike lots around campus. Campus officials say it will improve pedestrian safety. Both parties agree with that premise, what's at stake here is the question of whether the new policy is the way to go. I do think that cooperation with these changes from all students will provide a safer environment on campus for students who are pedestrians and cyclists and take one step closer to getting bikes where they belong the sidewalks and on the road.



# Hitchcock solo album possibly his best ever

"And her living words were her dying words she said, 'Yeah'."
And maybe that could sum up Robyn Hitchcock in his own words without burrowing into biography, liner notes, musical events, alcohol, tentacled professors etc.

Then again, who's to say a few words or a few thousand might even touch the event, the occurrence of Robyn and a melody, his guitar, a few good musicians.

cians?

Between the few thousand and the few few, Robyn Hitchcock is one of the reasons alternative (in sense of the literal, not commercial) pop and college radio

fritchcock is one of the reasons alternative (in sense of the literal, not commercial) pop and college radio exists.

Springing out of the Cambridge scene of the mid-70s, Hitchcock's first band, The Soft Boys, were amalgamation of psychedelic mutant blues, inspired by jangly psychedelic '60s B-sides, Byrds-ish harmonies and Captain Beetherart dadaism. The Soft Boys didn't go on to sell a lot of records. They did, however, influence a number of bands on both sides of the Atlantic such as R.E.M. and the Replacements in the U.S. and a large part of the psychedelic revival in '80s Britain.

After the Soft Boys' imminent demise, Hitchcock went solo, crafting some of the grandest pop that should've been a hit. Of course, it wan't a hit and by 1992 Hitchcock recorded his last album with his backing band, the Egyptians (which were the Soft Boys imminus their lead guitarist Kimberly Rew). So now that a green, fuzzy thing called Moss Elixir has crept out of Warner Bros, can you see the reason for excittement. Moss Elixir is easily one of Hitchcock sets solo records. Mostly acoustic in nature, it recalls 1944's 10fen Dram of Trams and 1998. Eye The main impetus for this simplicity was the last record with the Egyptians, Repet, which Hitchcock originally intended "...to be recorded with the musicans sitting around the table and singing into a bowl of fruit......

In some respects this album is a complete departure from Hitchcock's previous records. Normally

there's a density of sound, but here everything seems stripped down to the most basic elements, producing a diversity of style with a minimum of instrumentation.

For example, there's the opening furred jangle
entitled, "Sinister But She Was Happy," with gorgeous violins swooning energetically courtey of
Deni Bonet and Hitchcock on bass and guitar.

Then the record delves into the pertitious realms
with "Devil's Radjo," lyrically and musically quirky
and an airy ballad about a sun-loving plant with only
Hitchcock on guitar.

The other unique, enjoyable element of Hitchcock is his lyrics.

Inspired by the strange, sci-fi writings of his
father, Hitchcock looks at very "normal" subjects
(sex, death) and puts them through a unique lens;
thus the love song has tentacles, a man has a woman's
shadow, a happy bird is a filthy bird.

So all that would (could) be Robyn Hitchcock. Or,
as Captain Beefheart said, "a squid eating dough in a
plastic bag is fast and bulbous. Get me?"



# Cats face long, difficult road in championship defense

UK to face 12 tourney teams

The UK men's basketball team has a tough road ahead of them in the 1996-97 season, according to the schedule released earlier this month. The defending NCAA Division I national champions will play 31 games this season, including at least 13 games against teams in last year's NCAA Tournament. "This is another traditional and demanding schedule for the University of Kentucky," said UK Athletics Director C.M. Newton in a press release accompanying the .schedule. "It's a national schedule that will help us in our quest to defend our national title in March."

UK coach Rick Pitino believes that the schedule will help his team in their title defense. "This will be a challenging schedule," Pitino said in the release. "Needless to say, our schedule will require the maximum effort to succeed on the rout. Our players will once again have to dedicate themselves to hard work and sacrifice for us to defend our title,"

The Cats will also face half of the Final Four teams from a year ago — including a Thankgiving Day showdown against title game foe Syracuse in the Great Alaska Shootout. UK will play Southeast-ern Conference rival Mississippi State on Jan. 7 at Rupp Arena, when they face the Athletes in Action. The second exhibition game will take place after the regular season starts on Nov. 20 when UK plays the Australian National Team.




