UK coach Tubby Smith will not be forced to start a freshman this season, but he's also not afraid to rely on Kentucky's reigning Mr Basketball as his floor general.

With starting point guard Cliff Hawkins academically ineligible for the fall semester, true freshman Brandon Stockton could see significant playing time to non-conference season.

"Brandon is an outstanding point guard with extraordinary ball handling skills," Zuberer said. "He takes good care of the ball. His height isn't going to be a factor. ... he seems to find ways to get his shot off in traffic and among the tall timbers."

Zuberer compared Stockton to past short, stocky point guards — Connecticut's Khalld El-Amin and Ohio State's Scoonie Penn, who both starred on teams that reached the 1999 Final Four.

Much has ben made of Stockton's 5-foot-8 frame. But Stockton bristles at the mention of his height.

Sinth, who expresses the same confidence in Stockton's ability doesn't think it will make a difference either. "Tm more concerned with the heart than the height."

Stockton said there is no pressure about logging quality minutes at point guard so early in his collegiate career and said he can make a major contribution.

"The new offense is more two-guard, meaning there is less pressure on me to bring the ball up the court," he said. "I can handle the ball, shoot from the outside and stretch the defense. I feel I can bring a lot of offensive skills. I just try and improve everyday."

Sophomore Chuck Hayes has confidence in Stockton. "Brandon is going to be a great player. He really takes good care of the ball."

Smith is pleased with Stockton's progress as a freshman, praising the rookie's maturity.

"Brandon is really coming along. He is mature beyond his age in both bis demeanor on and off the court."

Under'cats': UK predicted to finish third in SEC Eastern Division for first time since league expanded to 12 teams in 1992

The last time UK was not picked to finish in the top two of Southeastern Conference Eastern Division by the media, the television media could not even broadcast the team's games.

In 1989, UK was punished by the NCAA and SEC for recruiting violations. One of the penalties was a one-year ban on television broadcasts. That team finished 10-8 in the conference before the expansion to 12 teams in 1982. Ever since, UK has finished in the top two of the division, and was always predicted to do so.

But this season the media at SEC media day picked the Florida Gators and Georgia Bulldogs to end that streak.

"It's always tough to compete in the SEC." UK sophomore Chuck Hayes said.

"Idon't think that we just have the east to worry about stream that the stream of the stream of

the conference. Rolando Howell, Tony Kitchings, Marius Petravicius and Carlos Powell give Dave Odom experience and depth at the forward position.

Vanderbilt also boasts a solid corps of big men. Versatie Matt Freije can post up and shoot from outside, while Brian Thornton will command attention in the paint.

"I think in the conference every team is going to be good and have a chance at the championship," said UK senior guard feeth Bogans. "I don't think that just one team will come out and be overpowering because they are all very good."

Florida was picked by the media to win the division followed by Georgia, UK, South Carolina, Tennessee and Vanderbilt.

"Being picked to win the SEC is great, but all that's

Hayes, a junior, averaged 18.6 points a game last season. With teammate Ezra Williams' 16.5 average and transfer Damien Wilkins also the Bulldogs explosive offense will be a challenge for SEC opposing defenses. And defense is what typically wins games, and titles, in the SEC.

"There are not any dominant teams in the league," Hayes said. "Teams that finish last on each side, could win the SEC Tournament. The defense in this league is outstanding. All the teams piay good defense and that makes the SEC standout."



Rupp Arena debuts true colors tonight

New look: Students will cheer from behind the goal, while others will cheer from Wildcat-blue seats

Fans filing into Rupp Arena tonight to see the UK basketball team tip off its 100th season against Athletes in Action will also see a new look to the 27-year-old home of UK hoops.
Sections 38 to 41 behind the basket closest to UK's bench—recently named the Erupption Zone—will be standing room only and hold 750 students, including the pep band.

tor Bill Owen said the \$2 tor Bill Owen said the \$2 million changes were made to model Rupp Arena after other college basketball venues, such as the Univer-sity of Morth Carolina and Notre Dame.

"We wanted to include the students into the game situation," he said.

"The first 11 rows will be

The first 11 rows will be risers for students to stand on, but enough room was left for fans sitting in the 12th row to see over the standing students, Owen said.

Alvis Johnson, associate athletics director, said he hopes the new student section will be more intimidating for UK's opponents. "We want to create a situation where it's truly a home advantage for our basketball team," he said. The change doesn't stop with the standing section. Fans choosing to have a seat for the game in the lower arena will be seated in brand new wildcat-blue seats. Previously, Rupp contained alternating sections of blue, orange and red seats.

said he's glad to see Rupp in-

stall blue seats.

"Those orange seats looked so out of place for Kentucky," he said.

The seats are the same width as the old ones, but new seats are equipped with armrests and cup holders, Owen said.

The baseline around the Rupp Arena court will be less cramped, with the press row moving from the side proposite the team benches to a new overhang attached to the upper arena façade. The area, which has permanent desktops and Internet and phone connections, will hold 55 members



Dean urges bio-terrorism course work

Preparation: College faculty hears recommendations from expert

UK should add classes to its Health Sciences curriculum that educate students about biological threats, a bio-terrorism specialist said Friday.
Students need to know how to handle bio-terrorism attacks and how to recover from them, said Donald J. Gordon, chair of Emergency Medical Technology at the University of Texas Health Science Center.

"I's important to remember that the unthinkable will always happen," said Gordon, who is an international consultant on issues related to bio-terrorism and weapons of mass destruction, referring to the Sept. 11 attacks.

Gordon spoke at the College of Health Sciences' eighth annual convocation at the UK Boone Faculty Center.

He said that bio-terrorism, which has been used since as early as 4000 B.C., is a huge threat to the United States and that citizens not knowing how to protect themselves will make things worse.

"We are only as vulnerable as our jenorances," Gordon said.

When the FBI assessed the risks of terrorism to the United States, biological toxins came in second to conventional weapons and explosives, Gordon said. Anthrax, smallpox and botulinum are a few







Michigan continues to lead by example

The University of Michigan experienced what its president called "a great day of shame" when it placed its basketball program on probation Thursday. But it used the opportunity to prove why it's one of

The school imposed the penal-ties after a federal investigation re-vealed that UM booster Ed Martin had given a total \$616,000 to four basketball players

As a result, UM banned itself from the NCAA and National Invita-tional tournaments and forfeited 112 wins, including its victory against UK in the 1993 semifinal

UM will also no longer mention Chris Webber, Robert Traylor, Mourice Taylor and Louis Bullock in its programs and media guides. And officials removed banners from the school's 1992 and 1993 Fi-nal Fours, the 1997 NIT title and the 1998 Big Ten Tournament title. While these sanctions aren't groundbreaking, UM's decision to

give back the \$450,000 it received for appearing in the postseason is. Opponents of traditional NCAA

sanctions argue postseason bans mark.

unfairly punish the players. This is a valid point, but it's also true that they're one of the most effective ways to hit a program where it ways to lift a program where in hurts — in the pocket. For example, because UK is banned from postseason play this season, it will miss its share of the millions of dollars the Southeastern Conference will receive for bowl appearances.

ceive for bowl appearances.

The penalties will no doubt make some UM fans unhappy, but they prove the school's class. UM also deserves praise for its decision to distance itself from the "Fab Five" temps of the 1000 the Five" teams of the 1990s that are an

invaluable recruiting tool.

UK and its fans, meanwhile, continue to complain about Hal Mumme and Claude Basset wrecking the program. But UK publications tout the bowl appearances Mumme led UK to during his tainted tenure. And the money earned from the Outback Bowl no doubt helped to cover the cost of a 1999 renovation of Commonwealth Stadium.

Michigan chose not to engage in similar hypocrisy. And in doing so it proved itself a worthy bench-

The case for local water ownership

By the time this reaches the Kernel, the election will be over. But the water ownership issue will not.

The outcome of the local elections may have speeded or impeded the process, but the process will continue. The next step will be the city's receipt of the consultant's report with his estimate of the value of the water company. The step after that is the steep one — whether to begin condemnation proceedings.

concennation proceedings.

"Condemnation" Horrid word. "Takeover," another horrid word. But RWE, the company that is willing to spend millions of dollars to convince us that "takeover," is a really bad idea, says, on page 35 of its 2001 annual report, "Once the takeover is consummated, American Water Works will contribute to an increase in earnings per share (before goodwill) in its first year of consolidation."

consolidation."

That quote raises at least two questions. One is how can "takeover" be a good word when it applies to RWE's desire to purchase and a bad word when applied to our local government's desire to purchase?

The other is how can RWE show that kind of return when it is offering to pay 37 percent above market value to purchase our water system? The likely answer is that, with a single source monopoly like a water franchise, where profit is guaranteed, corporate efficiency is designed to increase the return for stockholders at the expense of ratepayers and customer service.

ratepayers and customer service.

The other horrid word is "condemnation." It does sound terrible, and the coalition against government ownership suggests the further terror that the city might next condemn, if permitted to condemn the water company, Kroger of Target or your favorite barber shop. But the company, Kroger of Target or your favorite barber shop, and the company, the condemnation of the con

necessity and welfare, which government in this country can condemy.

Without that power of eminent domain, no streets could be widened, no new roads could be built, schools could only be located where an owner was willing to sell his land for a reasonable price and utility easements (utilities, not incidentally operated primarily by private companies) would be impossible to secure where needed.

You might ask, if everyone else's water is privatized, why shouldn't Lexington's be also? The facts are these: only 15 percent of the water resources in the United States are operated by private franchisees; 95 percent of major American cities own and operate their own water systems; and 86 cities in Kentucky also own and operate their own water systems.

By a circumstance of history, Lexington's water is operated by a private company. And there were no significant complaints either with Kentucky-American or with its mother company. American Water Works.

But when a few international speculators, numbering no more than there are oil rich OPEC countries, want to get control of what they call "blue gold" or "liquid gold," and which they refer to as the oil riches of the future, only surer, then it is time to look to our own welfare.

Finally, the water company predicts that the city will have to spend a million dollars to win its case. Probably true. And the company is spending a million dollars and more to whip up citizen resistance to the city's purchase. So what's at stake that is worth this kind of expenditure? For RWE, it is the \$5 million in annual net profit that Kentucky-American yields already, even before cost cutting efficiencies. For the city, it is primarily the assurance of continued good water service, plus an additional \$5 million in city revenue, which could be used to increase municipal salaries where needed and provide and respond to other citizen demands not now affordable.
