The first World's Fair Since 1939 will open in Brussels, Belgium, April 17 and run through October 19, 1958.

In order to afford Kentuckians an economical trip to Europe and the World's Fair, and in order that the State of SMITH D. BROADBENT, JR. Kentucky may receive some world-wide recognition, KENTUCKY DAY at the World's Fair has been tentatively scheduled for July 17. 1958.

> Kentucky products will be on display on that day and a special luncheon, reception, etc. will be set up by the Brussels Chamber of Commerce.

At this writing there are no plans for other states to be so recognized, although a few cities are planning similar programs.
