

Law Schools during a period of at least ninety weeks, and the successful completion of at least 1080 hours of class room instruction in law, are required of all candidates for the degree.

Senate also approved the following recommendations of the Rules Committee:

1. "Before submitting the list of candidates for degrees to the Senate, the Registrar shall obtain the approval of the names from the faculty of the college in which the degrees are to be obtained."

2. That in the future excuses for absence from class on account of sickness, other than those certified to by doctors or dentists or handled entirely by the resident physician or resident nurse, to be issued by the deans of the colleges.

The object of this recommendation is to relieve the resident physician of much of the labor that can be handled as well by the dean's offices."

MINUTES OF THE SENATE MAY 29, 1924

The University Senate met in the Little Theatre Thursday, May 29.

Consideration of the following report from the Rules Committee was postponed until the beginning of the first semester of next year:

"All cases of cheating shall be reported to the head of the department in which the cheating occurs, who shall immediately investigate all circumstances and determine the guilt or innocence of the student charged. If the student is adjudged guilty, he shall be dropped from the class in which the cheating occurs with a grade of E. This fact is to be reported in writing by the head of the department to the student's dean and to the Registrar who shall certify on the student's record: "Dropped with grade of E, because of cheating."

It shall be the duty of the registrar to acquaint the parent or guardian of the student (or the student, if he is of age) with the fact of the record. The decision of the head of the department shall be final.

It shall be the duty of the Dean of the College, when such report is made to him, to admonish the student and inform him that if he is dropped for cheating as a second offense, he will be reported to the Discipline Committee and be liable to suspension or expulsion from the University.

If a student is dropped from class for cheating as a second offense, the registrar shall report the case to the Discipline Committee."

The following recommendations from the College of Education were approved

1. ✓ Education 163, Current Problems in Home Making Education.
2. ✓ That Education 184, Community Studies and Their Application be raised from two to three credits.  
 ✓ That Education 18, Modern Educational Problems, be raised from one credit to two credits.
3. That the following changes be made for the summer session 1924:
  - (1) That three subjects, Oil, Gas, Mining, be combined into one course, under the title, Oil, Gas and Mining.
  - ✓ (2) That the subject Bills and Notes be added, to be given by Mr. Scarborough five times a week for three credits.
  - (3) That the schedule of hours be changed so that Bills and Notes may be given at the hours assigned to Municipal Corporations and that the latter subject be set for the hour assigned to Oil and Gas.
