COMMUNITY COLLEGE LIBRARY NEWS

Construction for the new campus of Jefferson Community College--Southwest will be completed by Fall 1980. The library for the Southwest campus will open with a COM catalog. Through centralized cataloging using the SOLINET terminal located on the Downtown Campus, the SW library has been able to convert its entire collection into machine readable form. The COM catalog will be a first in the Community College System.

OCCASIONAL PAPERS SOLICITED

The University of Kentucky Libraries will issue an irregular publication called "University Of Kentucky Libraries Occasional Papers." The first issue is planned for early spring, 1980. Manuscripts for inclusion in this series are invited.

"Occasional Papers" will deal with any phase of librarianship and is a channel through which librarians, library staff, library school faculty and students may communicate their research results on aspects of University of Kentucky library operations, collections, etc. Papers should demonstrate knowledge of the literature on the subject, where appropriate. Descriptive papers, annotated bibliographies and other topics of interest to the library community will be considered if of sufficient interest or usefulness.

Manuscripts for consideration should be typed, double-spaced and generally not longer than 30 pages, including footnotes and bibliography. Send to Vivian Hall, Geology Library, 100 Bowman Hall, University of Kentucky.
