

MINUTES OF THE UNIVERSITY SENATE - FEBRUARY 22, 1937

The University Senate met in the Lecture Room of McVey Hall, Monday February 22, President McVey presiding. The minutes of January 18 and 29 were read and approved.

The Committee on Duplication of Work presented the following new courses and changes in courses which were approved:

College of Agriculture

New Course

Home Economics 34, Dietetics for Nurses. Three credits. Prerequisite: Anatomy and Physiology 6.

The purpose of this course is to give students fact information on normal nutrition; to give principles of simple food preparation; to give an appreciation of the importance of good nutrition, both in relation to maintenance of health and to recovery from illness; to give an appreciation of the importance of food that is well prepared and well served; to create an attitude that recognizes and gives due consideration to all the factors necessary for good nutrition. The course includes a study of food and its relation to energy production by the body, growth of new tissues in the body, and regulation of body processes. Other factors studied are the relation of good preparation of food to good utilization and the relation of good serving of food to good utilization.

College of Education

Education 81 - Analysis of Learning Difficulties in Industrial Education. This course has been planned to meet the needs of teachers of vocational subjects in the field of industrial education. An analysis will be made of the learning difficulties encountered in teaching trade and related subject courses and remedial measures will be studied. 2 cr.

College of Commerce

Change in Course

Commerce 202a-b, Seminar. Three credits a semester to Commerce 202a to f, Seminar. One credit a semester.

The report of the committee appointed to outline the duties of advisers to student organizations as given further consideration and the Dean of Women stated that she had presented this report to the Women's Self Governing Association as requested by the Senate. The Woman's organization has asked for more specific information as to the organization that were to deposit money with the business agent. The Senate referred this report to the committee with the request that they discuss this matter with the business agent, Mr. Peak, and present another recommendation to the Senate.

Minutes of the University Senate - Continued, February 22, 1937

Dr. Miner presented the following report of the Committee on Study of Ability and Training, which was approved:

"At the last meeting of the Senate a suggestion was made that a few advanced students be utilized to tutor certain students who were in danger of failing in certain subjects. On motion of the Senate this suggestion was referred by the President to your Committee on the Ability and Training of Students. The Committee invited the President and the deans of the colleges interested, the Dean of Women and the Dean of Men to meet with it for consideration of this matter.

After listening to various suggestions made, the Committee wishes to recommend that an experiment of this kind be approved as undertaken this semester under the supervision of Mr. Lysle Croft, to supplement the work in counseling and guidance which he has been carrying on the past semester."

The Rules Committee presented a recommendation concerning the general requirements for admission to the University. After general discussion the Senate voted to table the motion.
