When the National Champion harmer was displayed last night in Rupp Arena, Asteria Steele was just glad she could be there.

She had one request when the title game started.

"Oh Lord, not another close one," she said. "Not another overtime."

With the Cats down by ten at the break, Steele and seven others piled into a van in Harlan Co, on a direct route to the team welcome in Rupp. The van was stuffed to the maximum with random family members and friends sitting in every available spot, including Charity Wilkerson taking up a piece of carpet at everyone's feet.

The group got in line at 1 a.m. and were the fourth group there. The result: front row seats for Steele's first-ever visit to Rupp.

"It's so big," she said, looking around at the jerseys hung overhead. "I'm just so amazed."

The Cats piled out of the charter bus, led by Coach Tubby Smith, and headed into the circle of chairs. With Kool and the Gang's "Celebration" piped into

### **McGinnis** says youth can lead

Immediately, he began talking about his plan to build up down-town. McGinnis wants the area to offer a greater variety of services and entertainment.
"I want to make it look like it is not a ghost town," he said.

"It can be done. If someone tells me I can't do it, I tell them I can and I will because where there's a will there's a way," McGinnis said. How? Make the inmarts economically productive, McGinnis said. Other prisons have done this in the past by such jobs as making license plates.

This would make it possible for the inmates to learn a trade and pay for their stay in prison. This can appeal to inmates who, for example, could make 100 "agagets" and for exercisin material rewards.

"People have already been victimized by the crime, and then they are victimized again by having to pay the taxes for the criminals to live," McGinnis said. This plan would save millions in tax dollars, which he says can be used to improve downtown or soot of the control of

#### Service models itself after the movie 'Animal House'

Students can now navigate through their problems online.

A new website, http://www.animalhouse.com, is an online guide to college survival.

"The people at animalhouse.com thought that there were no web sites devoted to the problems that college students find important," said Stephanie Rudnick, of Edelman PR World-

wide. "They are making the resources they wish were available to them in the '70s and '80s."

"We are trying to make a community for college students, and our technology can make life a lot easier," said Jay Samit, president of Animalhouse com, which gets its name from the cult movie, "Animal House.

The site has several areas that students might find useful. One section of the site has a TV guide and schedule maker, allowing students to plan their TV watching

Another page has a place to sub-mit resumes and writing samples. Rudnick said almost 1,000 compa-ny sponsors have agreed to look at resumes from the site, including Microsoft, CBS Sportsline, Daily Variety, Tribune Media Services, Women's Wire and Commtouch. A termpaper database allows students to get ideas and examples for effective essays. Shopping and cooking databases lists recipes and coupons to make picking up food easier.

Pages including the latest news allows students to "Break away from the microcosm that they sometimes feel themselves enter," Rudnick said.

The travel page gives weather information to travelers, as well as a carpool bulletin board.

Most of the content of the site comes from students, however.

With students input, animal-house.com will have the best information on "where to park illegally on campus, where to pound the cheapest slammers and chow down the greasiest burrito," Rudnick said.

"We want to fill the site up with stuff from the students' campus, from the best place to hang out to the best and worst professors."

One main advantage of the site is the ability to communicate with friends in other places, Samit said.

Animalhouse.com allows college students to communicate in several ways, including free e-mail for life, classified sids, free uncersored ways, and ways is the content of the ability to use voice/video conferencing over the Internet for free, said Greg Kaufman, campus administrator for Animalhouse.com.

"It's neat to see people making web pages, sending mail through buddy lists, and filling up the site with content," Kaufman said.

"You can call all of your friends and it won't cost you a dime," Samit said.

Currently UK does not have a representative on the site. The representative is in charge of getting more people to add content to the site, and in return can win free long distance calls and other incentives, Samit said.

Each student who signs up to the site is asked to be representatives until they fill the position.
"Al tot of services charge money for the content we give college students," Kaufman said, "and they don't have the same attitude that we have."

"Sales are going absolutely great, stupendous," Behr said. "Almost all of our merchandise is here right now, but we will get more in."

The shirts at Kennedy's come in youth and adult sizes, and range in cost from \$13.99 (for youth) to \$15.99 and up (adult sizes). Shot glasses are \$4.49 a piece, which is much less expensive than the embroidered sweatshirts, which ring up at a pricey \$79.99.

Despite the expense of some of the items, UK fans have not given a seculd drought to shelling out different work. The big thing so far has been nail orders. We have had people from all over the country calling in orders and paying Federal Express a lot of money for overnight delivery."



Tristar, producer of the hit romantic comedies, Jerry Maguire and 4s Good as it Gets, will become a part of Columbia in the restructuring, which includes the business, legal and story departments of the two studios.

Columbia, which celebrates its 75th anniversary next year, was established in 1924 and produced

But Smith did consider not coming to Kentucky — not because of family.


