This semester we will fulfill that promise on Feb. 5 with Listen up Legislators, and the Rally for Higher Education on Feb. 7. Bonding authority is a critical issue for UK; it provides us

with the ability to fund our own projects such as dining hall and dormitory improvements, and a bigger and better student center, without relying on state money. Kentucky is one of five states without bonding authority.

Feb. 8 is the annual Valentine's Gala. The event will be in the Student Center Grand Ballroom to allow for more students to attend this annual tradition. All students are invited to the gala. There will be a silent auction to raise money for UK's largest philanthropy, DanceBlue.

I also promised to build a better working relationship between Student Government, the Urban County Council and the Mayor. I have already met with Mayor Newberry about possible joint projects, one of which is an off-campus safety walk that we will be hosting in February. I have also met with Mayor Newberry regarding the Town & Gown projects, and we have discussed various ways to incorporate student life into downtown Lexington, and create an even safer environment around campus.



Tennis tries to bounce back from tough Fall

The UK men's tennis team, which qualified for the NCAA tournament last spring, has struggled to match last season's success.

Over the weekend, in West Lafayette, Ind., both Purdue and New Mexico shut down the Catvin both singles and doubles competition. UK managed only two wins in the entire tournament. In September, the team went a combined 6-10 in singles matches in the Cincinnati Invitational.

The fall season wasn't the start head coach Dennis Emery had hoped for, especially after last year's successful season.

This spring season, the team hopes to re-bound off that disappointment - starting today at the Southeastern Conference Indoor tournament in New Orleans - and continue what Emery con-siders an annual goal of reaching the NCAA quarterfinals. But the road won't be easy.

Of the 29 opponents the team will face before the postseason, 17 of them are ranked in the In-tercollegiate Tennis Association rankings, includ-



ing four teams in the top five. Every team in the SEC is ranked and Georgia is ranked first overall. UK is ranked No. 33 in the ITA rankings. "The league is really strong — the SEC is the best conference in the nation." Emery said. "Four teams will probably be in the top ten by March and we have a young team so we'll have to see how we do."
