

UK's campus is experiencing some major overhaufs as it rapidly gains more new buildings and renovations; growth provides many new oppurtunities for students

There's a whole lot of digging going on — on campus, that is.
Current UK construction projects include a new career center, a communications and network facility, an animal research center, the enclosed Commonwealth Stadium and a new fraternity house, not to mention small projects like adding fire escapes to Pence Hall and Barker Hall and stones to deteriorated walls in front of Patterson Office Tower and Virginia Avenue.

UK's new 14,000 square foot career center will contain 15 larger, up-to-date recruiting rooms, a 1600 square foot career library and a comprehensive planning library.

"There are about 500 companies that interview here on campus every year," said Lawrence Crouch, director of student services, "so the recruiting rooms will be helpful."

The center will also contain three video teleconference rooms that will enable employers to access students, and students to access the internet for online job searches.

"This will probably be the most state-of-the-art career center in the country," Crouch said.

The new communications and network systems facility hopes to combine two aspects of the campus into one team working together.

"The major goal of the computer science department is re-

combine two aspects of the camputer science department is re-gether. "The major goal of the computer science department is re-search," said Mirek Truszczymski, chairman of the computer science department. "But we have expertise in networking, so we work with campus communications."

This facility will include offices for the communications de-partment, visiting faculty and corporate partners and offices and labs for 11 science and electrical engineering staff, said Doyle Priskney, associate vice president of information sys-tems.

"This location (Maxwell and Rose Street) is a combination of an outreach to the community and internal computing network services," said Ken Clevidence, senior director for procurement and construction.

UK Agriculture is adding to its farm supply.

An animal research center is being buil: in Woodford County and will contain a beef, sheep and swine unit.

"In 1987, we wanted to develop an old farm into a research industrial campus to work with the university," said Guy Kiracofe, chairman of the animal science department. "This Woodford County farm was the closest to UK, only 16 miles from campus.

"This is Phase I of the project." Kiracofe said, "We will later add a dairy unit, teaching/learning center and a feed mill."

The project will also contain research facilities, labs and full-time employees from UK undergraduate and graduate schools.

Athletics is no stranger to construction. Commonwealth stadium is still getting its facelift.

The new renovations will include enclosed end zones, 40 viewing boxes (10 in each corner) and add about 11,000 more seats.

"We will have the ability to expand further in the future," said Russ Pear, assistant athletic director for facilities.

Sigma Alpha Epsilon will be back this fall, after being suspended for two years for a hazing incident, and a new 250,0 square foot 2AE house is currently being completed.

This house will be the largest Greek house in the Southeast.

"The most recent fraternity house was built in 1960," said

Dorms to get wired up for internet access

Soon, UK residence hall students will be able to access the Internet, watch cable television and talk on the phone all at the same time.

"The goal is to provide to every student living in a residence hall cable and Internet access," said Ben Crutcher, director of auxiliary services.

The Intermedia cable and Ethernet internet wiring cost will be included in the cost of student room and board, which will increase \$126 from last year. This extra cost must be paid by all residents, even if students choose not to use the package.

"The extra \$126 increase pays for the rising cost of utilities, cable cost \$(\$20 per room) and the installation of the cable and







Housing.

Which brings up the problem of the sign. Again, the last sentence reads: "UK Food services is self sup-porting and derives all funds from food sales." While UK Food Services may have

While UK Food Services may have its own financial accountability, to say all funds are derived from food sales is something of a stretch. Truth be told, 47% of UK Food Services income is brought in by the mandatory Diner Account for campus residents, according to Raitz. And at the end of each semester, students cannot retrieve their un-spent balance from that deposit. The Diner Account deposit is a contractual base for operation established in connection with UK Housing, which is also "self supporting." but students who wish to live on campus have no choice.

And to live on campus is not required by any means, but it is the offi-

cial UK living arrangement.
Further, the mezzanine is simply furnished and maintained by Food Services, according to Raitz. The University still owns the Patterson Office Tower and does not collect rent for occupation of the facility.
Food Services, especially the Intermezzo, is in a sticky position. There are not enough seats to accommodate everyone in the mezzanine, so a defense has been established against one-patron seating.

— nearly half of which comes mandatorily from the students dwelling on campus.

The signs in the Intermezzo seem to imply it is a privately-owned business, which is not true. The building and the business are UK property.

Whether Food Services generates funds for its own budget or not is simply a paper chase to ensure accountability in each department at UK.

In the end, it all belongs to the University.

Sit and study, bring in your own food, or do whatever you would do anywhere else on campus in the Intermezzo — it will be hard to kick you off you have a side of the property.






