"Little did he know that when he stepped off the witness stand, he stepped into a page of history" said Linda Brown Thompson.

"My grandchildren say to me," (Granny I know you couldn't have looked like that, you were a child." Thompson told the audience that since the case her life has been one extraordinary experience. She told the audience that she had to endure many obstacles on her way to school.

She recounted how her father, a mild-mannered black man, had to walk his daughter four blacks away to a white school, only to get turned down because of the color of their skin.
