

# **UK Athletics was reasonable in ticket price increase**

When UK Athletics raised ticket prices last week, Athletics Director Mitch Barnhart said in a Kernel article that it's a necessary increase to give UK Athletics the resources it needs to con-tinue to succeed in the Southeastern Confer-

ence. Though nobody wants to spend more for the same tickets, Barnhart is right: UK Athletics currently ranks 11th in the SEC in annual fundraising. In order to continue to compete athletically and academically, UK Athletics will have to bring in more money and recruits in the

While season ticket prices for both football and basketball will increase, student ticket prices will remain the same. Because students

aren't typically the ones pouring money into UK Athletics, the department was wise in only raising season ticket prices. Student attendance is vital to the atmosphere of games, and raising student ticket prices may have lessened turnout. Barnhart said that UK Athletics has no intention of making tickets for UK sporting events the costlest in the SEC, according to the Kernel article. The Athletics Department isn't losing money or going bankrupt, so it is only raising prices enough to keep up with changing times. The prices will only raised from \$1\$ to \$30 for football games and \$6\$ to \$108 for bas-ketball games.

Neither of these raises are likely to make people drop their season tickets. Once you're shelling out \$500 for basketball season tickets, you'll likely spend the extra \$100 to keep from losing the tickets.

K-Fund dues will also increase when the ticket prices change. The K-Fund, which is used for scholarships and renovations of athletic facilities, will increase required donations by \$100 for men's basketball games, according to the Kernel article.

tra \$675,000 that the increase will produce, new scholarships can be made available, and UK can continue to get the best recruits.

A small raise in basketball season ticket prices isn't going to keep die-hard fans away from Rupp Arena. Now that the football team is actually playing like a football team, fans are going to fill Commonwealth each week. Profits, not just from raising season ticket prices, but also from extra concessions, more sales of merchandise and better media contracts will all help UK Athletics stay a contender in the SEC.

UK Athletics made the right decision to not raise prices by a large amount, to keep student ticket prices fine same and to only raise ticket prices in the two most profitable sports on campus.

When a professor is granted tenure, they essentially cannot be fired, except in extreme circumstances. When the university is deciding who will receive tenure, they examine their research output and essentially take a gamble that the quality of work done so far will continue.

You may be thinking that this whole tenure thing sounds like a really bad idea — and you may be right. There are very important advantages to the system, however. If a professor has tenure, he or she is free to voice their opinions without the fear of repercussion from the administration or colleagues. This is especially important for female and minority professors. Having tenure also allows professors to research potentially controversial subjects. In a nutshell, the tenure system protects faculty members, giving them academic freedom and job security.

But what happens when a pro-fessor is tenured and does not continue with a high level of per-formance? What happens when a professor is given tenure based on his or her research, even if this person has received horrible teaching evaluations from stu-dents? Although I recognize the important benefits of a tenure sys-tem, there are also very clear be-tiended to the control of the con-trol of of the con-

field.


Even with tenure, all professors should undergo extensive evaluations, at least every five years. This is even more critical at the level of dean. Although freedom of expression and academic integrity are among the most important aspects of a research university, the education provided to students is equally as critical.

A periodic evaluation system would encourage professors to continue researching, especially after receiving tenure. Although most faculty members do continue in their empirical pursuits long after receiving tenure. Although most faculty members do continue in their empirical pursuits long after receiving tenure, the additional interest and support from the university would encourage them to do so even beyond what is normally expected in the tenure process. They are used, however, to determine salary increases. While this makes sense, teaching should not be left out of the tenure process. After all, a large part of a professor's responsibility is conveying their knowledge and research findings to students.

Faculty members need some sort of job protection to make sure they are free to pursue their academic interests without fear of making the administration mad. That being said, the university has a responsibility to receive the best on conjugate to the professor. 

# **UK Hockey disadvantaged** compared to Division I schools

The UK Cool Cats traveled to Lynchburg, Va., this weekend and fell to the Liberty Flames twice at the LaHaye fee Center.

The Cool Cats (20.7-3), who had won 14 of their past 16 games, lost Friday, 5-1, and Saturday, 8-3.

Liberty entered the weekend ranked 8th in the nation in the American Collegiate Hockey Association poll of Division I teams. The Cool Cats are ranked 6th in the Southeast Region, but play in the ACHA's Division II.

In most collegiate sports, the talent differences between divisions can be large. In the ACHA, that's not the case, said UK head coach Rob Docherty.

And while Division I schools like Liberty receive between \$100,000 and \$150,000 from the school, the Cool Cats receive only \$500 from the university, Barness said. The added funding allows Division I schools to stretch their recruiting across the U.S. and into Canada.


