UK CLIS REUNION AT ALA

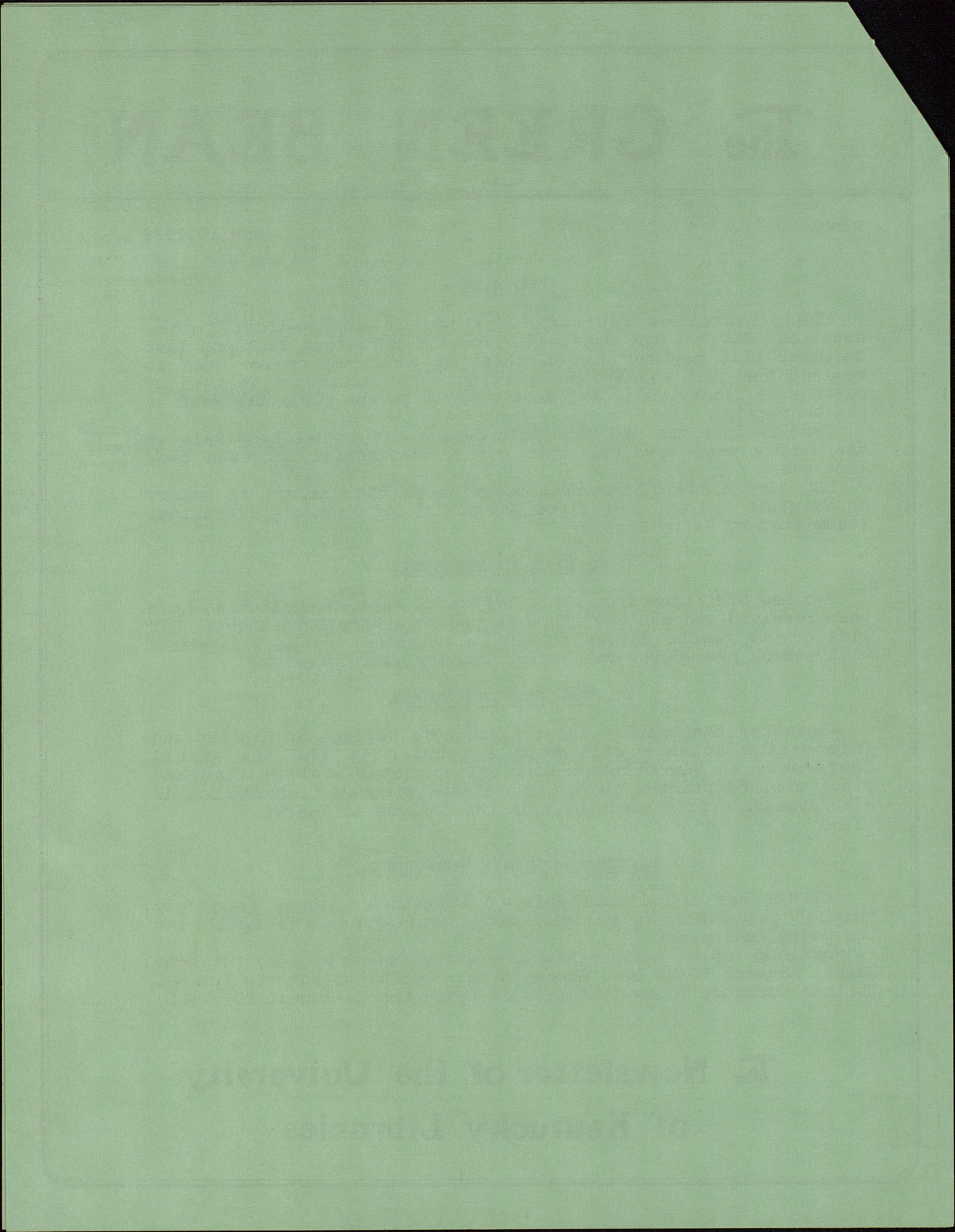
