"We are sorry to observe the Kerner management has seen fit to give the disgusting subjects of venereal diseases and sexual matters so much prominence and to spread your views in large head lines on your front page..." With this "opener" the writer launches into an attack on health doctors and deplores the fact that "our sons and daughters are induced to become human guinea pigs for the experiments of these laboratory medicos."

A Faulty Presentation—
It is discouraging to find that a faulty presentation of the program has led to such rank misinterpretation. The entire campaign had as one of its prime objectives the establishment of venereal diseases as diseases, not as "disgusting subjects." The program was instigated by the Krest, not by the health doctors, although they have given generously of their time, money and equipment in conducting the tests. How the guinea pig idea enters is hard to understand because the tests are given as personal check-ups, for the benefit of students—even as tuberculin tests are administered to all entering freshmen. No "experimenting" is done. The tests have been used for years by private physicians and in clinics for diagnosing syphilis.

The Kernel's Investigation—
Another point upon which the writer dwells is that the "children" must submit to an investigation. But syphilis is dangerous and more prevalent than typhoid, diptheria, or tuberculosis. It was becoming more dangerous until health authorities started fighting it in the open. To fight it, you must know about it, and this paper felt that college sudents were the logical ones to lead in the educational campaign.

Test Not Conclusive—

The writer further states that the test is not conclusive and emphasizes the fear, worry, and unnecessary medical treatments that would follow a false positive report. It is true that the tests are not conclusive, and you can say the saines for almost any kind of diagnosis for any kind of

show cases which would not be indicated by the Wassermann. If a blood specimen is at all doubtful, both tests are used. And if their still is any question, a complete physical examination and additional tests are given. It is ridiculous to assume that an individual would be treated for the disease if he did not have it.

A Ferrent Hope—
As indicated by this letter, there seem to be a lot of people who think that an editor's consuming desire is to "blow the lid off" of something. They cannot realize that most college editors would much rather publish a story staring that no cases of syphilis were found than to make a grand expose of "existing conditions." We sincerely hope that the "father and alumnus," and others who feel as he does, will try to understand the actual purpose behind the campaign and will join our side in the fight against veneral diseases.


