

MINUTES OF THE UNIVERSITY SENATE  
Dec. 11, 1933

The University Senate met in the Lecture Room of McVey Hall Monday, December 11, with President McVey presiding.

The minutes of November 20 were read and approved.

The Committee on Duplication of Work presented the following new courses and changes in courses, which were approved:

College of Arts and Sciences

New Courses

Music 41a, b. Methods and Materials for Orchestra and Band. A laboratory course for Orchestra and Band, for those on the waiting list for Orchestra and Band and those registered for 14b (Conducting and Orchestration). Open to freshmen who have adequate knowledge of their instruments. Credit will not be given for both 41a, b and 14b. Men on music scholarship are required to take 41a, b without credit. (Two hours per week. One credit per semester.)

Changes in Courses:

Mathematics and Astronomy 151. Practical Astronomy. This course will include problems of latitude, longitude, time, eclipses and occultations, etc. Three hours per week. Three credits.

Note: This course is to replace Mathematics 52a, b, Practical Astronomy (Three hours per week, three credits per semester.)

History 135a. The British Empire. Review of the various elements affecting Great Britain and her Empire between 1783 and 1860; The Industrial Revolution; the French Revolution; Development of British Sea Power. The early growth and development of Canada, Australia, New Zealand, South Africa, and India. Lectures, class discussions, readings, reports. Three hours per week. Three credits.

History 135b: The British Empire, continued. A continuation of 135a. Great Britain and the growth of the Dominions and the Commonwealth since 1860. Particular attention given to the history of the Canadian Dominion and the extension of the idea to other portions of the Commonwealth; their relations with the rest of the World. Three hours a week. Three credits.

Note: 135a, b are to supersede 135, The British Empire, three credits.

College of Agriculture

New Course

Horticulture 114. Landscape Gardening. A continuation of Horticulture 113, which is prerequisite. To be given alternately with Horticulture 118, Flower Garden and Home Grounds. Three credits.

College of Education

Expansion of Course

Education 193, Directed Teaching in Commercial Subjects raised from five credits to six credits.

Change in Course Title

That the title of Education 35, Survey of Education, be changed to Classroom Management, to conform to the certification requirements of the State Department of Education.

New Course

Education 214. The Secondary School. A course in secondary education, dealing with the program through grades seven to twelve. It considers problems of junior and senior high school administration. Three credits.

Note: This course is being offered to take the place of Education 226, the Junior High School and Education 250, the Senior High School.

College of Commerce

New Course

Commerce 145. Problems in Office Management. The theories and principles underlying office management and control. The course is designed for superintendents of schools, high school principals, registrars, office workers, and others. Three credits. Summer Session.

The petition from students in the College of Agriculture for permission to organize a Dairy Club, recommended by the University Council, was presented and approved by the Senate.
