

The University Faculty met in the Assembly Room of Lafferty Hall Monday, May 10, at 4:00 p.m. President Donovan presided. Members absent were C. A. Anderson; A. E. Bigge, L. H. Carter, Leo M. Chamberlain, Louis Clifton, C. B. Crawley, John Corckett, May K. Duncan, William C. Eaton, A. E. Evans, W. D. Funkhouser; * J. W. Martin, L. H. Pardue, and M. Scherago.

The minutes of April 12 were read and approved.

Following the reading of the minutes, Dean White announced to the Faculty that the inspectors sent by the Army had not required the members of the ROTC to miss any classes during the inspection, in spite of the fact that the Faculty had approved their being excused from classes.

Dean White presented for the College of Arts and Sciences the following recommendation, which was approved by the Faculty:

Reduce Geology 10a from 3 semester credits to 2 semester credits, and Geology 107a-f from 3 semester credits to 2 semester credits, each.

Assistant Dean Horlacher presented for the College of Agriculture and Home Economics the following change in course material:

Change Agronomy 12, Soil Conservation, from two semester credits to three semester credits. The course will consist of two lectures and one laboratory.

The University Faculty approved the recommendation of the College of Agriculture and Home Economics.

Dean Taylor presented the following recommendations from the College of Education:

To the University Faculty:

The faculty of the College of Education is recommending that the following increases in credits in student teaching courses be authorized to comply with certification requirements for teachers on the secondary level:

Education 169a, b, Student Teaching in Physical Education, three semester hours each, to four semester hours each

Education 177a, b, Student Teaching in Music, Three semester hours each, to four semester hours each

Education 142, Student Teaching in Art, from six semester hours to eight semester hours

The faculty recommends further that Education 169c, which was dropped

by the University Faculty on November 10, 1947, be reinstated for summer session purposes in 1948 only and that it carry two semester hours of credit.
