UK comes to terms with city over Rupp

The ongoing saga between UK, the City of Lexington and the Lexington Center Corp. came to an end Tuesday night with the announcement that UK will have a renegotiated lease of Rupp Arena set to begin on July 1, 1998.

The new six-year agreement calls for UK to pay a reduced leasing fee that will save the University \$265,000 a year. In addition to the lower rate, UK will have 189,000 a year from revenues generated by UK basketball games. The proposal could also have up to a \$200,000 impact on the city's budget. UK will have the opportunity to purchase Rupp Arena after July 1, 2000 for a price that would be determined through appraisals by representatives from both UK and the Lexington Center. The buying of Rupp would require the approval of both Kentucky General Assembly and UK's Board of Trustees.

Lexington Mayor Pam Miller, UK President Charles Wethington and Lexington Center Corp. Board Chairman Cecil Dunn all said the agreement was the best possible option of all involved.

"The major yof the Lexington community thinks it is in our best interest to keep the University of Kentucky down-town with the control of the Community of the Lexington Community thinks it is in our best interest to keep the University of Kentucky down-town, Miller said. "The proposal meets the needs of the Gown, Miller said the agreement is a major happening in the Lexington Community, and said approval by the Lexington-Fayette County Urban County Council should not be a stumbling block.

"This is a tremendous event for the community," Miller said. "When UK, the City of Lexington and the Lexington Center Corp. can come together and reach an agreement, it is great for the community and fans of Kentucky basketball. The council has also had a favorable response and should make a decision in future weeks."

The proposal is being greeted with strong approval from Wethington, who also said the negotiations and subsequent agreement serve everyone's best interests.

"We are very pleased we have reached an agreement to continue to play basketball downtown at Rupp Arena with a favorable lease and the option to purchase," Wethington said. "I will strongly encourage the proposal be adopted and approved. It truly is a win-win situation for all parties concerned,"

Wethington, who said a tentative pact was reached late last week, said despite the new agreement, UK would not rule out the possibility of an on-campus arena in the future.

"The interest of the University is in determining the future of our program's facilities," Wethington said. "So far as I'm concerned, no decision has been made about the option of new facilities." Putting off the decision on whether or not to purchase Rupp Arena for two years will allow UK to better research its options before committing to such a deal.

Legislation: Do the crime, pay for jailtime

Proposal asks for payments to go toward counties

Called The Comprehensive Crime Restitution and Reimbursement Act, the bill recommends changes that would give county officials more direct funding for law enforcement and prosecution, while reducing local taxes.

"I think convicted criminals should pay for their crimes," said Michael Walker, a public service and leadership junior.

New crime legislation to make convicted criminals pay for their own stay in county jails will be introduced this legislative session in Frankfort.

Not only does the bill propose charging the criminal for the cost of their time in jail, it creates a "crime impact fee," a fine that goes into the county budget instead of the state gen-

junior.

Most share this attitude, because people do not like being taxed to pay for the rising costs of crime and law enforcement, said Carrard County prosecutor Mark Metcalf, who authored the bill. Finding a way to alleviate the cost of crime on the taxpayer is one of his goals.

"This bill will help the county governments deal with rising costs," he said.

But those who study the law say the bill may contain legal and social stum-bling blocks. "I see a problem," said third-year law student Joanne Talbot. "If we give prose-cutors incentive to go after, wealthire criminals ... I'm not sure that should be done."

done."

Talbot also questioned the need for additional fines, which can cost up to \$100 for a traffic offense. "I don't like that at all. It seems to me a convenient way to get around the ughy word tax," she joked. Scott Gelfand, a visting assistant proficesor of philosophy who specializes in legal issues, highlighted the bill's social problems.

"Where are those convicted of crimes going to get the money, and how are they going to get it? They don't have it,"

Gelfand said. "This may push people coming out of jail back into some type of illegal activity, and I don't know if that is a good thing." Gelfand also said he understood the positive motivation behind the bill, but he questioned if this penalty would deter crime.

crime.

"After all, if going to jail is not a deter-rent, why would paying \$26 a day be a deterrent?" he said.

Law Professor Paul Salamanca said problems may occur if a person decides to to aw.

Law Froksawa may occur if a person decides not to pay.

"As far as I know, you may not be able to hold someone on a contempt charge (in this case, a failure to pay) longer than the original sentence allows," he said, "It's not open and shut."

Although this bill aims to reduce

expenses for county governments, the aftermath may not be so desirable. Currently all fines go to Frankfort and are distributed statewide. County officials are then left with county taxes to fund most of their court systems and jails.

But the bill is unclear as to how these new fines are to be calculated as the potential conflict of interest involved could be seen as a problem, said Jennifer Segal, an assistant professor of Political Science.

"There may be problem.

"There may be problems for the courts such as determining the fines," she said. "Politics between judges and prosecutors could have negative consequences for defendants."

State representatives will review it for possible amendments and will vote on the measure later this legislative session.

Wethington said there are no plans for retro-fitting Rupp at this time.

"As we stand, plans to retro-fit Rupp are not in this deal," Dunn said. "I can't say what will happen in a year or so, so I wouldn't rule out anything in the future. It's just not on the table right now."

"Appraisals from both parties on the value of Rupp will take some time, but will begin immediately, Dunn said.

"The appraisals will start very soon, as soon as we can get an actual legal document drawn," Dunn said. "Facilities like this aren't sold everyday, so it'll take some time."

The much ballyhoosed faculty and staff opposition to a new arena or renovation of Rupp did not play a role in the agreement announcy exterday, Wethington said.

"Anytime there is an issue, the University community wants to make their felings known," Wethington said. "I hear from everyone, but I eapcet that. In this case, I have been listening to people express opinions for over a year."

Wethington said he welcomes those opinions.

Unsane's new CD no musical genius

Death. Destruction. Pestilence. Blah, blah, blah. Occupational Hazard, the latest album from New York noise rock trio Unsane, sounds like every other hardcore album released to date. They have similarities to Slayer, Pantera or Biohazard and don't bring anything original to the table.

Unsane has toured with the likes of Neurosis, Orange 9mm and Slayer since forming in 1988. Occupational Hazard is the sixth release (the fourth LP) for the band. A seventh album was made but never released to the public.

The new album begins with "Committed," a driving, guitar-heavy track laced with frontman Chris Spencer's insane vocals. Screaming what sounds like a bad impersonation of Beavis and Butthead's "Cornholio" into a wet paper sack and simultaneously scratching your fingernails down chalkboard isn't musical it's not even close.

Unfortunately, the rest of the album follows the precedent set by "Committed." Not a single track has any sort of musical compliment to the vocals, which frankly brings into question the validity of the entire genre, but normally there is something good musically satisfying about a good hardcore album.

This could come in the form of interesting guitar riffs or just that plain rock attitude, yet Occupational Hazard lacks these qualities.

Tracks like "This Plan" and "Over Me" are much like the first one, except they are in half the time.



Helping a child is worth more than a few extra dollars

trend in social debate has been disturbing me recently. That trend is the categorization of people, of human beings, as cash flow.

This can be expected from those whose careers revolve around money but it is unexpected from the general public. And it is reprehensible in all cases.

My disquast is currently targeted on the welfare debate which continues in both government and the media.

On a recent airing of the ABC argue-drama "Politically Incorrect," the subject of government support for children on welfare was broached.

The loudest argument came from an advisor for former President Bush who decried the idea that government was not there to allow people to "make as many mistakes as they want."

Though the other guests argued with him, nobody seemed to note the sheer viciousness of the language he used. In human terms children are so rarely mistakes that it should never be mentioned.

Yes, children can be unexpected, unplanned, premature or accidental. They can be traumatic, lost or tragic. But they are not mistakes, at least not in the terms of human interaction.

The joy and love that a new child brings to the world cannot be a mistake; a child is always a costive.
To them, once a child is born that child is a "mistake," one who should never be born. If it costs him money (in the form of higher taxes) then he will abandon that child to the winds of the world for the

crime of being born poor.

I understand the argument that children should not be brought into this world that can't be taken care of.

However, the United States is a wealthy nation; there is no child born here who cannot be provided for.

The monetary means needed to take care of a child can be substantial, often beyond the capabilities of many poorer families.

But refusing government assistance to poor children because their parents are unable, even temporarily, to provide adequate food or housing is self-defeating.

That is, if you want to create a generation of healthy, socially conscious people. However, if you want to forget a group of mistakes? in order to save yourself some money then it makes perfect sense. And if people equal cash flow, then it becomes a necessity.

The welfare debate over the last few

years has ranged from disturbing to unbe-lievable. The term "welfare queen" was invented to imply connotations of idle wealth and a worry-free existence. Anybody who has ever spent time in or near a government housing project knows the reality. And the constant reference to small children as mistakes rectified by cutting social aid is just the latest step on a journey which leads to social poverty for all.

a journey which reads to social potenty so all.

In an age where we pride ourselves on compassion, the discussion over government aid has centered not on how to provide useful help or what problems are the most difficult to manage but on money, as in "less welfare for them means more money for me."

A few bad apples are thrown to the news magazine wolves to prove how irresponsible and lazy all welfare recipients are; all the better to save your conscience when you deny money to everyone

unlucky enough to not find a high-paying job for life. Or unfortunate enough to be their child. All of the talk and empty prattle about private charity picking up where the gov-ernment leaves off is shameless guilt dodging.

I have never, repeat never, heard one advocate of welfare cuts say, "Give me my money backs of can donate it to the poor the way! see fit."

No, the reason is always, "Let me spend my money may," which is fine to a point.

But to refuse help to your fellow citizens is to forget why we live in a society; we gather in civilizations for the mutual assistance that we can contribute is a whole, which is much more than an individual can provide.


