Messrs W. C. Killigins and H. P. Morrison were excused from Physical Geography, Mr. Cullough's request to be excused from Eng. Grammar was left to his teacher.

It having been reported to the Faculty that Henry Hamilton had missed some money and ^{that} it was thought that Messrs. Hocker and Boy had taken it, the three were brought in and questioned concerning the matter.

Nothing however was found out definitely and the case was left for further investigation at another meeting. Mr. Smith reported great disorder above his room by Mr. J. N. Foster and others. Mr. Foster in his remarks showed a spirit of insubordination and used unbecoming language toward the Faculty. After a short deliberation it was resolved that Mr. J. N. Foster be publicly dismissed for general disorder. There being no further business the Faculty adjourned.

February 21st This meeting was called to consider some suggestions made by Regent Bowman. He stated 1st That the Cottages at Highlands have been considerably damaged this season. 2ndly That it was very desirable to have a reorganization of some of the classes to quit the working department. 3rdly That he was anxious for some changes to be made in Prof. Munson's department.

4th That there had been considerable complaint made to him in regard to the Admission fee into the Clubs during the second term of the session.

The damages to the Club houses consisting mostly

of pencil and chalk marks Prof. Heron, Mr. Smith, and Maj. Tobitt were authorized to require the occupants of the building to remove those marks. Upon consulting a few minutes it was found that a reorganization of some of the classes could be effected. The third suggestion was considered but nothing definite was decided upon.

In regard to the fourth suggestion it was resolved;

The Admission fee into the Clubs during the second term of each session shall be three fifths ($\frac{3}{5}$) of that for the first term. This resolution, of course, does not apply to the Admission of those who have entered the Clubs during the present term.

An honorable discharge was granted to each of the following Cadets, viz: J. Wifford, J. B. Snow, Bramlett, and J. A. Cooper. A. J. Snow was dishonorably dismissed for leaving without permission.

There being no further business the Faculty adjourned.
