Prof White called attention to some difficulties
 and conflicts brought about by the recent
 revision of the schedules of the courses of
 study.

Voted on motion of Prof. McKenzie seconded by
 Prof. Anderson that during the current year
 all students in the Junior^{year} of the Chemical
 Course be required to take German instead
 of English.

Ordered on motion of Prof. Mathews that
 students of botany be required to study botany
 one term, that they be relieved of Botany and
 required to study German during the other two
 terms.

Ordered on motion of Prof Kastle that the
 question relative conflict between German and
 English in the course in Physics be referred
 to Prof White and Prof Pence

Ordered that the question relative conflict between German and English in the Classical Course be referred to Profs Neville, McKenzie and Wernicke.

Ordered on motion of Prof. McKenzie that the blank in 4th hour, first term, sophomore year of the Classical and the Scientific Courses be given to English.

The question of English in the afternoon was referred to the Classical faculty.

Ordered on motion of Prof. Anderson that the faculty recommend ^{that} Laboratory Physics be taught in the afternoon from 2:30 to 3:30, during the first term.

Ordered on motion of Prof. Kastle that Prof. Anderson, White and Mathews be made a Committee to make provision for instruction in drawing.

The chair appointed Prof. Roark, Mathews and Peuce to constitute a Board of Supervision of the ^{the} mess club.

Profs. Anderson, Brooks, Miller, Kastle and ~~A~~ Fryer were appointed as members of the Committee on Athletics.

A letter from ~~Rev~~ James Red Fern was referred to the Classical faculty for its consideration and report.

Ordered on motion of Prof. Anderson that the signal bells be rung at the end of full hours, it being understood that Prof. White will have the control of the bells until further orders.
