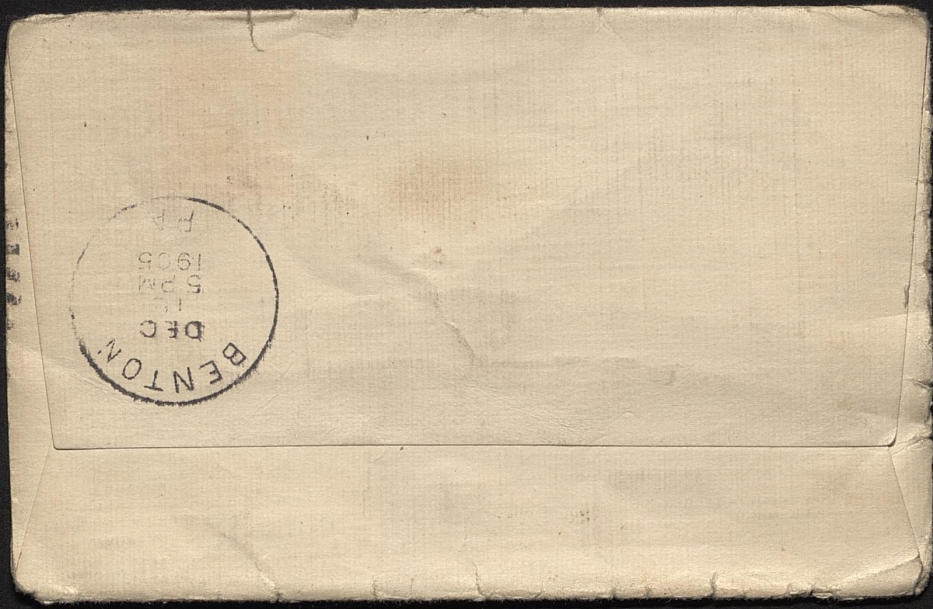

I am talking from experience. Mrs Stanley offered us tickets to go to the opera tonight but I refused

to go so I could write
to you. I am glad you
got home safe but if I
had a knew that you
was going to shoot mach
with those guns I dont
think I would of slept
much. I was down after
your ring and he said
he couldnt put my
name inside that lovice
he said the f would spoil it
so I just had my initials
I hope it will suit you.
I priced the set \$2.50. What
do you know about that.
How I wish you was
here tonight it seems

so long since I last
saw you. I wish you
would come over here
if you dont come soon
I am coming home it
is too lonesome without
you. I would like to
come home for xmas

received your letter

hospital this morning

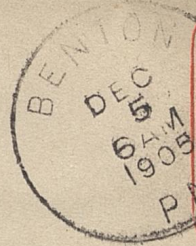
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to form a operation on

pictures of schools.

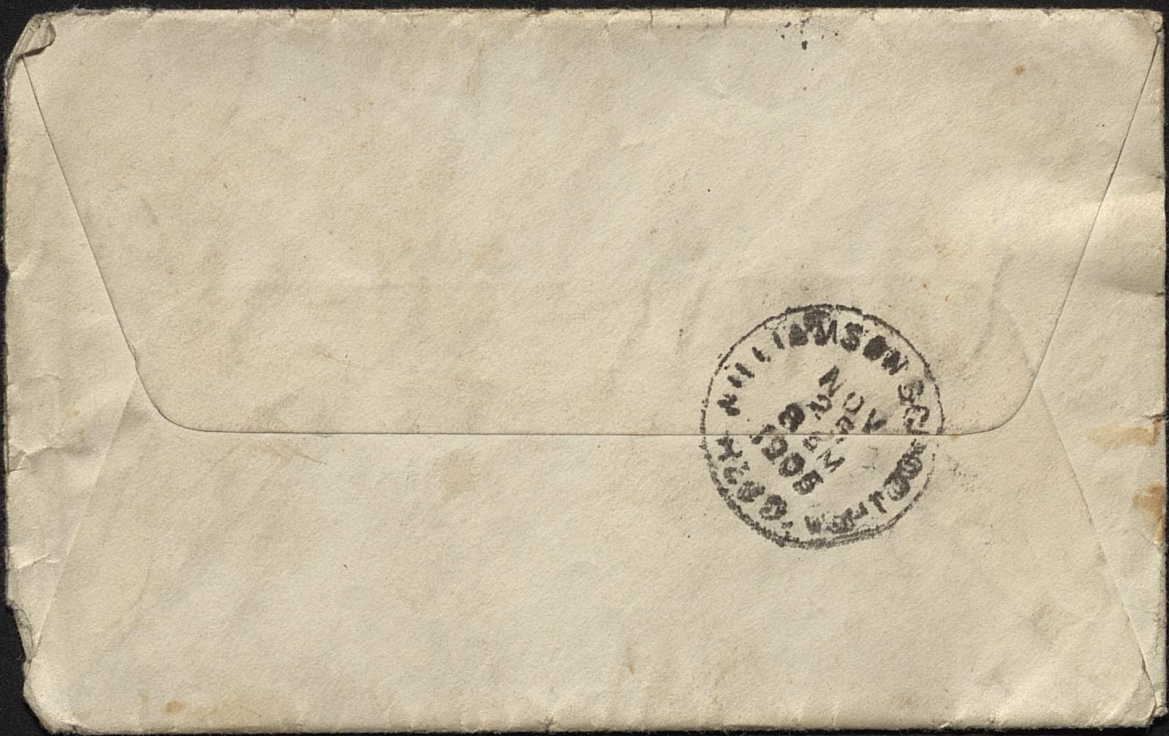
I had my school taken

Wednesday morning 8.45

Dear Winifred

I suppose you will be shocked
as well as I were. Harry came
home last night on eight
he was dismissed from school
on Sunday or Monday morning
he says for slipping in through
the kitchen to dining room
he did not hear dinner bell
(first one) was laying down
and thought he would go in
that way and get some thing
to eat and was eating when
Supt. spied him and gave
him a calling down, and
dismissed him he said one
of the matrons said Harry if you

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ask they will compromise and take you back but said he would not do that, ^{they} never even notified me he had done wrong till I got the letter yesterday from Shrigley saying he was dismissed, he says it was Bidding that done it and it made Harry so mad he would not ask to be taken back

he says some of the boys had begged to stay but he would not do it. I feel awful bad about it just think Floss just quitting her school and now Harry, he said he told every one he had Holiday leave till after Christmas commencing with Thanksgiving I hope H.S. sends for us by that time. I was quite sure he would come

home so La Rue went to meet
him last night if he had
not come I would of been
mar crazy he said once if
I ever am fired I wout
ever come home but I told
him that would only make me
feel worse, said he thought of
what I said, and came home,

He said Floss had got your
silk but that he could not
bring it now that you got a
blue silk I dont think I
would get a blue tailor made
or any blue get so gray you
have had Brown & light gray
get some dark gray some
thing on the order of Wells
a sort of Plaid they are so
fashionable and that would

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don't you, you could come home and get it fit and I could make it if Floss comes home, which Harry says she will come next week. she writes me Louis is sick and says Dr ordered him out of the city for a few weeks and that could he come home with her, now I am will to have him come but it certainly will cause talk him coming with her. I wish they had got married. then they could not said any thing I have not told any one she left the school yet.

my aunt they blow around Burton + our neighbors also, I could not refuse to have Louis up being sick they have been good to Floss suppose you wont come till she

comes, or will you come
this Sat, if she comes Wed
next best wait till Sat next
for you will want to come
then or can you come for
Thanksgiving & stay till Monday
or Sunday night, I wish they
would not come till after
for Lucia I suppose will
expect a waste but he wont
get it here, what little I have
will have to pay for, Harry fare
home he borrowed, said he
will go right to work, either
for Will Knouse or over at
Still House, on the bond house
laying Brick, but that will
be so early & late for I want

him home, must stop
they were out hunting got
one, La Rue came in to carry
mail, must stop and as
it is time sent your waite
yesterday, was so busy
forgot it, only cooked 47
meals in nine days for
extra ones no wonder I was
busy. When Lola George & Howard
came Sat night stayed till
Sunday night, and then she
acted as though she did not
want to go, now enough
a good bye Lovingly
