a post card. Yes, I know a post card is small and you can't write much on them.

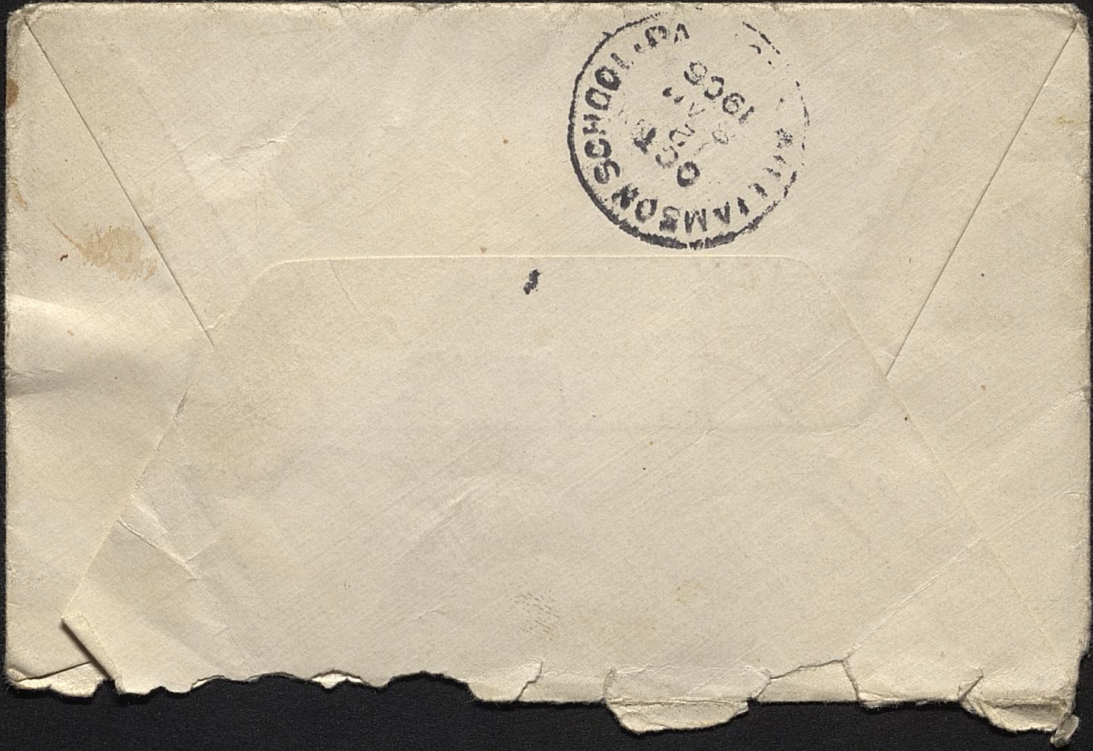

Amfried.

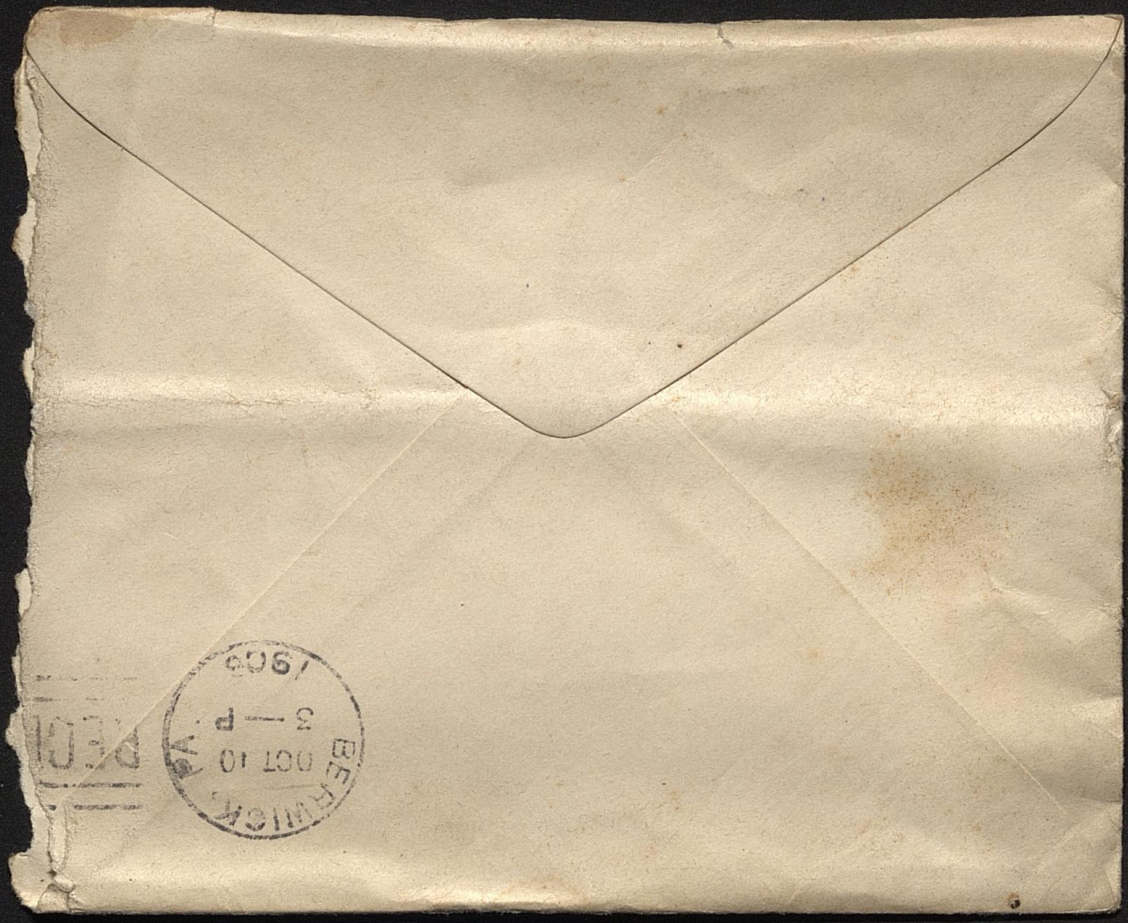
