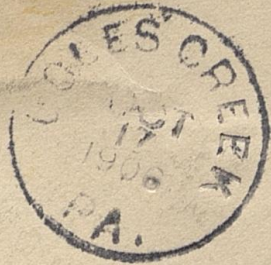
I would of written to you sooner but I could not
