 Upon motion of Prof. Anderson, it was ordered; - "that the following modification be made in the requirements for post-graduate work in the departments of Mechanical and Electrical Engineering, Civil Engineering, and Mining Engineering; - Those students contemplating taking the degree of Mech. Engineer, C. E. or Mining Engineer, must signify their intention of taking this degree at least one year before the degree is conferred, and in no case will such advanced degrees be conferred for non-resident upon any graduate who has not been engaged in professional Engineering work for a period of at least three years."
