ABOUT THE LIBRARIES

Children's book exhibit:

"Four Centuries of Children's Book Illustration" is the title of the current exhibit in the Department of Special Collections. The exhibit attempts to give an historical perspective on the development of children's book illustration from the 17th to the 20th century, demonstrating changes in society's attitude toward the child.

Better than 40 books and 19 original illustrations are in the exhibit. The illustrations are from the De Grummond Collection of the University of Southern Mississippi Library. The books are on loan from the Edgar W. King Collection of the Miami University Library, from the Transylvania University Library, and from our own collection at MIK.

The exhibit has been mounted by Joy Terhune and Anne McConnell of the College of Library Science in conjunction with the current conference ("What Turns Them On") on children's and juvenile literature sponsored by the Office for Continuing Education.

Some important microform series at MIK:

MIK has on microfilm the following series, issued by University Microfilms:

*American periodicals, 1700-1800: all issues of all periodicals that could be located for the years 1741-1800.

*American periodicals, 1800-1850: the most important publications of the era. On standing order, to be completed in 1977.

*American periodicals, 1850-1900: selective titles.

*Early English books, 1475-1640: almost all of the 26,500 titles listed in the Pollard & Redgrave SHORT-TITLE CATALOGUE and the REVISED SHORT-TITLE CATALOGUE. On standing order, about 80% complete.

*Early English books, 1641-1700: selected from Wing's SHORT-TITLE CATALOGUE. On standing order, about 35% complete.

English literary periodicals: more than 200 essay journals, magazines and reviews, 1681-1900. Completely catalogued.

British periodicals in the creative arts, 1770-early 1900's. On standing order, to be complete in 1977. Completely catalogued to date.
