The Senate stood for a moment of silence in acceptance of the Resolutions and in honor of Dr. Eckstrom.

Hartley C. Eckstrom

(1911-1968)

Hartley Eckstrom was born in Fargo, North Dakota on May 15, 1911. He received the B.S. degree in Chemical Engineering from North Dakota State University in 1934 and went on to earn his M.S. and Ph.D., from the State University of Iowa in 1935 and 1937 respectively. For ten years (1937-47) he was instructor, then assistant professor, of physical chemistry at Brown University before changing to industry. For the next eleven years he was Research Section Supervisor at the Pan American Petroleum Corporation in Tulsa, Oklahoma and then he left industry to join the faculty at the University of Kentucky as associate professor in 1958, being promoted to full professor in 1961.

He was an earnest and friendly person, always willing to listen to problems of students and colleagues and offer sound advice. His interest in the University was legend and much of his time and energy went into the various committees to which he was appointed during his ten years of service to the University. He served his country in World War II as an officer in the Chemical Corps and retired as a Lt. Colonel. His major hobby was horseback riding and he was an active member of the Bluegrass Riding Club.

Hartley Eckstrom had a great love for chemistry with emphasis on Thermodynamics (which he taught) and Spectroscopy. He was a member of Phi Kappa Phi and Phi Lambda Upsilon honorary societies and the American Chemical Society, the American Institute of Chemical Engineers and Sigma Xi. His vigorous research activities led to the contribution of over 25 publications in leading scientific journals. Since 1961 he had directed a research project supported by the Atomic Energy Commission on the Infrared Studies of Chemisorbed Molecules.

His passing came April 18th after an illness of nearly a year although he was quite active in teaching and research for a large part of that time. He will be sorely missed by the University he served so well, the Department of Chemistry, his graduate students, his many friends, and especially his wife, Doris.

Dr. Rudd, Secretary of the University Senate Council, recommended, on behalf of the Senate Council, that the Senate approve the following statement and that the Secretary, University Senate, be directed to transmit a copy to President Oswald. The Senate unanimously approved the statement as read and directed that a copy be sent to the President.

At this, the last meeting of the current academic year, the University Senate wishes to express its appreciation to Dr. John W. Oswald for the quality of leadership which he has given to the University during the last

five years. His zeal for excellence and his enthusiastic support of well-conceived innovations have resulted in rising goals of academic achievement. His espousal and development of the Community College system have greatly enlarged the sphere of service of the University. Dr. Oswald's view of the University as a center for the creative arts has enlivened the spirit of the University, of the Community and of the Commonwealth. His concern with the role of students as participants in the University has been rewarded by increasing and responsible sharing by students in decision-making in the University. Further, Dr. Oswald's concept of the University as an area for the exploration and development of diverse points of view has resulted in an enlarged horizon for the students and faculty of the University. His personal vigor, verve and warmth have been a gracious gift to the spirit of the University.

The Senate, while cognizant of the meaning of the loss of Dr. Oswald's services to the University, cannot question his decision to move to another position of great responsibility. The Senate, on behalf of the entire University faculty which it represents, wishes Dr. Oswald and Mrs. Oswald and their family Godspeed and good fortune.

On behalf of the Senate Council, Dr. Rudd presented a recommendation that the University Senate approve the following statement of Commendation relating to the Statement on the Nature and Purposes of a University, which the President and Vice Presidents of the University of Kentucky had presented to the Board of Trustees at its meeting of May 7, 1968, and that a copy be transmitted to the President with the request that copies be forwarded to each of the Vice Presidents and members of the Board of Trustees. The University Senate unanimously approved the statement of Commendation as presented and directed the Secretary of the Senate to send a copy to President Oswald together with a request that he forward a copy to each of the Vice Presidents and members of the Board of Trustees.

The University Senate, on behalf of the entire University faculty, commends the President and Vice Presidents of the University for the clear and well-considered statement of the nature and purposes of a university presented to the Board of Trustees on May 7, 1968. Throughout the free world, the issues involved in this statement of principles are of paramount concern to vigorous faculties and student bodies. Therefore, we, the Senate, express our considered and unequivocal endorsement of those principles outlined in the statement to the Trustees.

Further, the Senate wishes especially to commend the judgment and wisdom of the Board in its timely affirmation of this statement of principle and position. The Senate recognizes this action as consistent with other actions taken by the University of Kentucky Board of Trustees in creating and maintaining a climate which has made possible impressive progress in the University in recent years.

On behalf of the University Senate Council, Dr. Rudd presented a motion that the proposed statement concerning speakers from off-campus, which was circulated to the teaching faculty under date of April 29, 1968, be approved and recommended to the President and the Board of Trustees as a policy statement to be incorporated in the Governing Regulations of the University. Dr. Michael Adelstein stated that since the Senate Advisory Committee on Student Affairs was charged with some responsibility in this area, he, as Chairman of that Committee, wished to present, on

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that Committee's behalf, three amendments to the proposed statement, as follows:

1. that the policy be entitled "Policy of the University of Kentucky Governing Guest Speakers".
2. that paragraph three, page one, be changed as follows:

Guest speakers may be invited to use University facilities unless there is a definite indication that:

- (1) a law or governing regulation of the University will be violated,
- (2) the meeting will interfere with the peaceful and orderly functioning of the University,
- (3) the proposed speech will not be relevant to the educational mission of the University.

The University will act responsibly in inviting speakers and expects its guests to act responsibly.

3. that the following clause be added to the last sentence of the section on page two, entitled "Speakers Brought by Faculty":

and the three provisions of University policy stated above have been followed.

The University Senate approved amendment 1. governing change in title of policy.

Following extensive discussion an amendment to the amendment was presented to delete item (3) from proposed amendment 2. The Senate approved deletion of this item by a vote count of 49 to 39. The Senate then returned to consideration of the proposed amendment as amended. After some further discussion a member of the Senate challenged the presence of a quorum for further transaction of business. Following a head count which revealed the absence of a quorum, the Senate adjourned at 5:15 p.m.
